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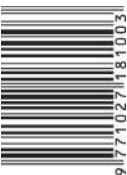

VACCINATIONS DRIP-FED THROUGH N\$1.6-B IMF LOAN

NAMIBIA'S CENTRAL GOVERNMENT HEALTH AND SOCIAL WELFARE CLUSTER IS THE ONLY ONE WITH A BIGGER BUDGET IN 2021/22, OVERTAKING THE SECURITY CLUSTER FOR THE FIRST TIME IN YEARS, AFTER REDUCTIONS ACROSS THE BOARD EVERYWHERE ELSE. AND THIS EXCLUDES THE N\$1.6-B PORTION OF AN IMF LOAN FOR THE COVID-19 VACCINATION CAMPAIGN - PAGE 2.

PROMISES, PROMISES ON PANDEMIC SPENDING TRANSPARENCY

THE NAMIBIAN GOVERNMENT HAS PROMISED THE IMF FULL DISCLOSURE ON HOW ITS N\$3.8-B LOAN IS SPENT ON COMBATING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC. BUT SUCH EXTRAVAGANT ASSURANCES OF TRANSPARENCY ARE A BIG ASK, GIVEN THE SYSTEMIC DEFICIENCIES IN PUBLIC PROCUREMENT - INCLUDING THE HEALTH MINISTRY'S DODGY TRACK RECORD - PAGE 2.

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N\$1.6 billion of Namibia's N\$3.8 billion rapid financing instrument (RFI) loan from the IMF will be spent on Covid-19 vaccinations, but this is all channeled through the Ministry of Finance and not Health & Social Services in 2021/22.

Namibia's central government health and social welfare cluster is the only one with a bigger budget in 2021/22, amidst cross-the-board reductions in all other sectors.

In the process, the health and welfare cluster has overtaken the security cluster for the first time in several years. And this excludes the N\$1.6-b of a N\$3.8-b IMF loan to cover the Covid-19 vaccination campaign.

Health and welfare lies third in its share of combined operational and development voted expenditure for 2021/22 – behind the administrative and education clusters.

This cluster's combined N\$13.688-b operational and development expenditure ceiling

in 2021/22 (including interest payments) is N\$55.238-m or only 0.41% more than last year's revised N\$13.63 however, its share of overall budget spending increasing marginally from 2020/21's 18.9% (of N\$72-b) to 20.14% of this year's N\$68-b – a 1.24% relative improvement in its share of the budget.

The N\$1.6-b to be used in the vaccination roll-out for Covid-19 this year as part of the IMF's N\$3.8-b loan to Namibia was not mentioned in finance minister Ipumbu Shiimi's budget speech on 17 March prior to the Fund's announcement on 31 March that it had approved the loan.

This N\$1.6 billion is channeled through the Ministry of Finance and is not reflected in the budget

Covid vaccinations drip-fed

estimates for the Ministry of Health & Social Services (see separate report).

The health and welfare cluster's allocation last year had been a remarkable 15.12% or N\$1.8-b increase over 2019/20's actual N\$11.8-b, when it accounted for 17.57% of the N\$67.4-b national budget – a 1.34% relative improvement in its share of total expenditure.

N\$1.6 billion of Namibia's N\$3.8 billion rapid financing instrument (RFI) loan from the International Monetary Fund announced on 31 March will be spent on the Covid-19 vaccination roll-out currently underway.

In the 2021/22 national budget estimates, the Covid-19 vac-

ination roll-out amounts to only N\$484-m in 2021/22.

Ranking the clusters

* The administrative cluster's N\$17.26-b operational and development budget in 2021/22 accounts for 25.4% of the N\$68-b total and is 9.84% or N\$1.88-b lower than last year's revised N\$19.145-b, when it accounted for 26.55% of the N\$72-b total.

Prior to this year's 9.84% decrease, the administrative cluster's N\$19.1-b revised ceiling in 2020/21 was a generous 17.6% or N\$2.87-b above 2019/20's actual N\$16.275-b expenditure, accounting for 24% of the N\$67.4-b budget total – still in first place.

This was the biggest year-on-year increase of all clusters over the three-year period.

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IMF'S N\$3.8-B LOAN FOR BUDGETARY

PROMISES, PROMISES ON

The Namibian government has promised the IMF full disclosure on how its N\$3.8-b loan is spent on combating the Covid-19 pandemic. But such new-found promises of transparency are a big ask, given the ramshackle state of public procurement – including the health ministry's dismal track record.

The IMF loan, and the associated N\$2-b AfDB loan also approved in March - come with a warning: "Namibia's debt dynamics remain sustainable, but vulnerabilities have increased due to the COVID-19 shock and risks are significant", according to the latest IMF country report on Namibia.

N\$1.6 billion of Namibia's N\$3.8 billion rapid financing instrument (RFI) loan from the International Monetary Fund announced on 31 March will be spent on the Covid-19 vaccination roll-out currently underway.

But none of this is reflected in the expenditure estimates for the Ministry of Health & Social Services, but rather in the Ministry of Finance's allocations for 2021/22.

In Namibia's 2021/22 national

budget estimates, the Covid-19 vaccination roll-out is reflected as follows:

* N\$484-m for the Covid-19 vaccine in 2021/22;

* N\$752-m revised expenditure for the Covid-19 emergency income grant plus N\$325-m revised expenditure for the Covid-19 'Hospitality and Construction wage bill' – both last year.

According to the IMF's Country Report No. 21/76 published in April, "public finance governance mechanisms will ensure the appropriate use and monitoring of resources to address the COVID-19 crisis.

"All COVID-19 spending was appropriately budgeted and execution progress were presented in the FY20/21 mid-year budget review", the report states.

"A further progress report will be published in the FY21/22 budget and a final one will be published on the website of the Ministry of Finance by September 2021.

"All awarded COVID-19 related procurement contracts, including the names of the entities and beneficial owners, will be published online by end June 2021.

"A full audit of COVID-19 spending (including ex-post validation of

goods and services procured) will also be conducted and published online by the Auditor General, within 12 months of the end of FY20/21."

Promises accepted at face value

This is a word-for-word reiteration - at face value - of undertakings contained in a letter of intent appended in the IMF report, co-signed by Namibia's finance minister, Ipumbu Shiimi and Bank of Namibia governor, Johannes !Gawaxab.

In the letter, they undertake to "publish online, on the website of the Ministry of Finance, all awarded COVID-19 related procurement contracts, including the names of awarded entities and their beneficial owners, in accordance with Namibia's Financial Intelligence Act of 2012.

"Furthermore", the letter continues, "the Auditor General will conduct an independent audit of COVID-19 spending, including

ex-post validation of goods and services procured, as a part of our annual auditing of budgetary spending, within 12 months of the end of FY20/21."

This is a big promise, given that the auditor general's reports normally lag at least two years after the completion of any given financial year.

As the *Tender Bulletin* has reported on a number of occasions in the past, the urgency of these Covid-19-related spending needs has so far delivered - predictably - very little by way of transparency in public procurement, as we have already highlighted:

* Who's Looting behind the Lockdown – Bulletin 1345;

* Riding the Gift Horse Unbridled – Bulletin 1349;

* Health ministry's Quotations behind the 'Corona Curtain' – Bulletin 1365; and

* Health ministry polishes its Covid-19 procurement halo – Bulletin 1367 – where we reported that the Ministry of Health & Social Service was granted an exemption by the Finance Ministry from gazetted public procurement regulations during the Covid-19

administrative cluster in 2021/22, the **education cluster's** combined operational and development allocation amounts to N\$17.2-b or 25.32% of the N\$68-b total budget (including interest payments).

This is N\$801.3-m or 4.45% less than last year's revised N\$18-b of the N\$72-b total budget, when it accounted for 24.97%.

The education cluster's N\$18-b ceiling in 2020/21 was a 3.76% increase on 2019/20's actual expenditure, when its N\$17.35-b accounted for 25.74% of the N\$67.4-b total budget.

Although the education cluster received the biggest slice of Namibia's original 2020/21 national budget, its relative share of state spending fell by 0.77%, however, recovering by less than half that with this year's 0.35% increment.

* The **security cluster** has the fourth biggest allocation, with its N\$12.86-b operational and development ceiling (including statutory and interest payments) in 2021/22 - 7.4% or N\$1.028-b less than last year's revised N\$13.89-b, accounting for 18.93% of 2021/22's N\$68-b total budget, compared to N\$13.89-

b in 2020/21 when it consumed a higher 19.27% of the N\$72-b total in third place behind the administrative and education clusters but ahead of health/welfare.

It is the only cluster that dropped in its ranking of budgetary share in 2021/22.

The security cluster's 7.4% reduction in its 2021/22 allocation is the second-biggest, after the administrative cluster's 9.84% contraction.

The security cluster's N\$13.7-b actual expenditure in 2019/20 accounted for 20.33% of the N\$67.4-b total budget - higher than the following two years.

Its N\$13.89-b revised allocation in 2020/21 had been 1.37% or N\$187.4-m more than the previous year - a 1.06% deterioration in its relative share of total spending.

At the beginning of 2020/21, the security cluster was the only other cluster with an increase below the 6.8% overall budget increment.

But the security cluster then had the second biggest share with N\$13.885-b accounting for 21.58% of the total N\$64.329-b budget (excluding statutory pay-

ments and external funding).

This exceeded the health and welfare cluster's N\$13.4-b or 20.8% share - a repeat of 2019/20's revised budget when the security cluster's N\$13.739-b, accounting for 22.8% of all operational and development expenditure exceeded the health and welfare cluster's N\$12.116-b accounting for 20.1%.

* Ranked last in fifth place, the **economic cluster's** N\$6.9-b allocation for operational and development expenditure (including interest payments) in 2021/22, accounting for 10.2% of the N\$68-b budget total, is 6.7% or N\$498.704-m less than last year's revised N\$13.633-m, when it accounted for 10.3% of the N\$72-b total.

Its 6.7% decline on last year is the third biggest, after the administrative cluster's 9.8% and the security cluster's 7.4% - all above the 5.76% contraction in the overall budget.

In 2020/21, the economic cluster was the only one with a decline

on the previous year's expenditure, compared to increases in all other clusters, topped by the administrative cluster's 17.6% increase, which was almost treble the 6.97% increase in overall budget expenditure that year.

The economic cluster's revised N\$7.428-b allocation in 2020/21 had been a 9.75% or N\$802.788-m reduction on 2019/20's N\$8.2-b actual expenditure, when it accounted for 12.2% of the N\$67.4-b total budget - 1.9% more in terms of its relative share of overall expenditure. Its 10.2% share of this year's total budget is 2% below its share in 2019/20.

The economic cluster was the only one with less funding at the start of 2020/21, its N\$7.6-b (-13.8%) also ranking it last in fifth place.

The health and welfare cluster

state of emergency to speed up procurement of medical products and services needed for Namibia's response to the pandemic.

In the letter co-signed by Shiimi and !Gawaxab, the IMF is requested for emergency financial support under the Rapid Financing Instrument (RFI) "in the amount of SDR191.1 million (100 percent of our quota), in the form of budget support.

"... the RFI will be key to address our urgent balance of payments needs triggered by the COVID-19 shock.

"We request the RFI purchase to be made in the form of budget support to address our urgent financing needs in the health sector and provide the needed fiscal space to implement our targeted measures to respond to the health crisis and mitigate the severe socio-economic impact of the pandemic, especially on the most vulnerable, and implement our COVID-19 vaccination campaign."

In response to the request for funding, the IMF affirmed that the RFI was equivalent to 100 percent

of Namibia's quota and will cover about 52% of the anticipated balance of payments gap in 2021 and help catalyze financing from the African Development Bank (AfDB) to help mitigate the rest of the shortfall.

Namibia has no outstanding credit from the Fund and the country's capacity to repay is adequate, while debt remains sustainable, according to the IMF.

Transparent pandemic spending

The IMF report adds: "In line with the authorities' public finance governance mechanisms, they commit to ensure the appropriate and transparent use, monitoring, and reporting of pandemic-related spending.

"All COVID-19 spending thus far was appropriately budgeted, with a progress report on the execution presented at the FY2020 mid-year budget review.

"The authorities have committed to publish online all awarded COVID-19 related procurement

contracts, including the names of awarded entities and their beneficial owners in accordance with Namibia's Financial Intelligence Act of 2012.

"Furthermore, the Auditor General will conduct an independent audit of pandemic-related spending, including ex-post validation of goods and services procured, as part of the annual auditing of budgetary spending, within 12 months of the end of FY2020.

"The central bank has also committed to undergo a safeguards assessment in line with Fund rules", the IMF report continues.

The IMF loan of 191.2 SDRs (special drawing rights) translates into N\$3.8-b, supplemented by the AfDB's N\$2-b announced on 11 March, for the Economic Governance and Competitiveness Support Programme (EGCSP), also to strengthen Namibia's budgetary capacity.

As far as the IMF loan is concerned, nowhere in its report does the Fund disclose the interest rate. According to the *Tender*

Bulletin's estimates, Namibia has to repay the N\$3.8-b spread over six years between 2021 and 2026 plus N\$10.3 million in charges and interest (see accompanying table).

Emergency health and other spending

Health spending of N\$727 million was budgeted to respond to the health emergency, the IMF report states.

About 96% of planned emergency health spending has been executed, notably to acquire protective equipment and pharmaceuticals, conduct testing and contact tracing, and set-up quarantine facilities and step-up health personnel.

Education spending of N\$600 million aims at promoting sanitation and improving health facilities in public schools throughout the country.

About 87% of the planned COVID-19 education spending was executed at end-January 2021.

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The Health & Social Services Vote's N\$8.08-b allocation in 2021/22 accounts for 11.88% of the national budget and is only 0.36% more than last year, when it accounted for 11.2% of the national budget.

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Also ranked third at the beginning of 2020/21, health and welfare was the only other cluster with an increased allocation exceeding the 6.8% overall budget increase, with 10.55%.

The cluster's initial operational and development budget of N\$13.4-b at the beginning of 2020/21 accounting for 20.8% of N\$64.3-b overall expenditure was 10.55% more than 2019/20's revised N\$12.12-b when it accounted for 20.1% of N\$60.23-b.

Its revised expenditure in 2020/21 now stands at N\$13.6-b – N\$200-m more than originally voted.

The cluster's revised N\$12.1-b in 2019/20 turned out to be significantly higher than the N\$11.9-b voted at the beginning of that year.

Its operational budget was increased midyear by N\$381-m or 3.38% from N\$11.27-b to N\$11.65-b. But its development budget was reduced by over 43% or N\$210.4-m midyear from N\$486.4-m to just below N\$276-m, resulting in an overall midyear gain of N\$170.6-m to a total of N\$11.8-b in 2019/20.

This is equal to the health and welfare cluster's actual N\$11.83-b expenditure in 2017/18, which was reduced by 3.8% to N\$11.38-b in 2018/19.

In contrast, the security cluster's initial N\$13.885-b expenditure ceiling in 2020/21 after increasing only 1.06% on the previous's N\$13.738-b was still higher than the health and welfare cluster's N\$13.39-b, following its higher 10.55% increase on 2019/20's N\$12.12-b – which was also lower than that of its security counterpart.

Unlike the health and welfare cluster's higher revised turnout on 2019/20, the security cluster's revised expenditure for the year remained unaltered between its mid-year adjustments and its revised expenditure as reflected in the 2020/21 budget book - N\$13.738-b. But the year before – 2018/19 – again saw the security cluster with a higher allocation than health and welfare.

The security cluster had N\$12.348-b to spend on operational inputs and capital projects in 2018/19 with a 19.3% share of the total budget compared to the health and welfare cluster's

Labour Vote's budget

N\$11.38-b, accounting for 17.8% of overall spending.

This was despite a bigger 3.97% decrease on the previous year for the security cluster and a marginally smaller 3.84% decrease for health and welfare.

In the previous year – 2017/18 – the security cluster again out-ranked health and welfare, with actual expenditure at N\$12.859-b (a 19.68% share of overall spending) compared to the latter's N\$11.83-b (18%).

Previously consisting of four votes, the health and welfare cluster has been consolidated into three:

- * Vote 13 - Health & Social Services
- * Vote 14 – Labour, Industrial Relations & Employment Creation (retaining its original title after being designated as Labour & Social Welfare last year);
- * Vote 36 - Gender Equality, Poverty Eradication & Social Welfare – combines Vote 12 - Gender Equality & Child Welfare and Vote 33 - Poverty Eradication & Social Welfare.

diture in 2021/22, accounting for 59% of the N\$13.7-b cluster total and 11.88% of the N\$68-b national budget.

This is N\$29 million or 0.36% more than last year's revised N\$8.05-b when it accounted for the same 59% share of the N\$13.6-b cluster total and 11.2% of the N\$72-b national budget.

Vote 13's actual N\$6.8-b expenditure in 2019/20 accounted for a lower 57.6% of the N\$11.8-b cluster total and a lower 10% of the N\$67.4-b national budget.

N\$7.95-b voted expenditure for Health & Social Services at the beginning of 2020/21 – a 15.7% increase on 2019/20's N\$6.87-b, giving it a 59.4% share of the N\$13.39-b cluster total compared to the previous year's 56.78% of N\$12.1-b revised expenditure.

At a national level, the Health & Social Services vote's 12.36% share of the N\$64.33-b budget at the start of 2020/21 was also higher than 2019/20's 11.4% of N\$60.23-b.

But Vote 13's N\$6.82-b revised budget in 2019/20 was only 0.7% higher than its N\$6.82-b actual expenditure in 2018/19 and nowhere near 2020/21's 15.7% increment.

Its mediocre 0.36% increase

Health & Social Services

Within the health and welfare cluster, Vote 13 – as usual – has by far the biggest share with N\$8.08-b voted operational and development expen-

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N\$80 million was allocated to improve water provisions and infrastructure and has been fully executed.

A new social program – the Emergency Income Grant (EIG) – was rolled out in April 2020 to support low-income individuals and preserve their living standards during the COVID-19 crisis. The N\$772 million EIG targets about 800,000 individuals (about 35% of the Namibian population).

Under the EIG, a one-off cash transfer (N\$750 per person) is provided to eligible individuals of whom about 770,000 benefited at the end of January 2021, with 75% of the envelope executed.

The COVID-19 vaccination campaign

According to the IMF report, Namibian authorities have prepared a plan for the deployment of the COVID-19 vaccination campaign, targeting to cover 60% of the population.

This is expected to generate an overall fiscal cost of US\$115 million (N\$1.6-b - 1 percent of GDP) - 0.4% and 0.5% of GDP in FY20/21 and FY21/22, respectively (see accompanying table).

The overall cost to acquire the COVID-19 vaccines is estimated at US\$37 million, of which US\$12 million was to be incurred by end-

this year pales even further by comparison, but excludes the N\$1.6-b IMF loan portion for the Covid-19 vaccination campaign which is being channelled through the finance minister (see separate report).

Prior to 2019/20's midyear adjustment, Health & Social Services had an allocation of N\$6.9-b – a 5% increase on 2018/19 accounting for 57% of the cluster's N\$11.95-b total. But this allocation in 2019/20 didn't compensate for 2018/19's 8.2% decrease to N\$6.5-b from 2017/18's N\$7-b.

Its share of the cluster declined from 59% that year to 57% the following two years before recovering to over 59% in 2020/21.

Gender Equality, Poverty Eradication & Social Welfare

Introduced as a new Vote 36 in 2020/21 - Gender Equality, Poverty Eradication & Social Welfare - combines Vote 12 - Gender Equality & Child Welfare and Vote 33 - Poverty Eradication & Social Welfare which were discontinued in 2020/21.

The new, amalgamated Vote 36 has N\$5.444-b to spend on op-

erational inputs and development projects in 2021/22, accounting for 39.4% of the N\$13.688-b cluster total and 7.9% of the N\$68-b national budget.

This is just below N\$32 million or 0.6% more than last year's revised N\$5.412-b when it accounted for 39.7% of the revised N\$13.6-b cluster total and 7.5% of the revised N\$72-b national total.

Vote 36's initial N\$5.255-b to spend on operational inputs and development projects in 2020/21 compared to the combined N\$5.055-b of votes 12 and 33 the previous year – a meagre 3.96% increase that is a little over one third the health and cluster's 10.55% increment over the previous year.

The new consolidated 'welfare' vote accounted for 39% of 2020/21's post-midyear N\$13.39-b cluster total compared to 41.7% of 2019/20's N\$12.116-b, the 2.7% smaller share of the 'welfare' component accruing to the Health & Social Services Vote in 2020/21.

The 3.96% growth in part of 2020/21's 'welfare' budget is in line with 2019/20's increase in the (now defunct Vote 33) Poverty Eradication & Social Welfare Vote's allocation by 4.5% to N\$3.6-b from

Gender Equality, Poverty Eradication & Social Welfare has a N\$5.444-b allocation in 2021/22, accounting for 39.4% of the cluster total and 7.9% of the national budget - 0.6% more than last year, when it accounted for roughly the same share of the budget.

2018/19's N\$3.4-b – which had been a 3.5% increase on 2017/18's N\$3.3-b.

In the other 'welfare' vote (Vote 12, now also defunct), Gender Equality & Child Welfare's N\$1.3-b in 2019/20 had been 7% higher than 2018/19's N\$1.2-b, which had been a 1.4% decrease on 2017/18's N\$1.23-b.

Labour, Industrial Relations & Employment Creation

The remaining vote in the health and welfare cluster is Vote 14 – renamed Labour & Social Welfare in 2020/21 from Labour & Industrial Relations, before acquiring its ambitious new title in 2021/22 of Labour, Industrial Relations & Employment Creation.

Vote 14's N\$162.7-m allocation in 2021/22 is N\$5.86-m or 3.48% less than last year's revised N\$168.55-m, accounting for 1.2% of the cluster total as it did last year.

It revised N\$168.55 budget in

2020/21 was N\$6-m or 3.78% more than 2019/20's actual N\$162.4-m.

It started 2020/21 with N\$187.3-m, accounting for 1.4% of the N\$13.39-b cluster total, which had been a whimsical N\$262,000 or 0.14% decrease on 2019/20's revised N\$188.188-m.

It was originally allocated N\$190-m in 2019/20, representing a 2% decrease on 2018/19, following a 17.5% increase over 2017/18's N\$165-m.

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SUPPORT TO NAMIBIA'S COVID-19 MITIGATION

'SUSTAINABLE BUT VULNERABLE'

FY20/21, as the vaccines under the COVAX scheme are delivered to cover 20% of the population.

The remainder is expected to be incurred in FY21/22 to immunize additional 40% of the population.

Furthermore, fiscal costs of US\$77 million are expected for the deployment of the vaccination campaign, in particular for the purchase of needed infrastructure and capacity development and training of medical personnel.

Out of this envelope, US\$51 million was anticipated to have been incurred in FY2020.

The IMF report provides a breakdown of Namibia's vaccination campaign, totaling US\$115.1-m or N\$1.6-b, consisting of:

- * Vaccine acquisition (60% coverage) – US\$37.4 or N\$523.6-m;
- * of which contingencies amount to US\$5.6-m or N\$78.4-m;
- * supplies (e.g. syringes, etc.) - US\$0.9-m or N\$12.6-m;
- * cold chain and other infrastructure - US\$8.1-m or N\$113.4-m;
- * of which cold chain capex costs US\$4.4-m or N\$61.6-m;
- * of which other (e.g. for monitoring evaluation, supervision, etc.) amounts to US\$3.4-m or N\$47.6-m;
- * transportation costs are US\$3.3-m or N\$46.2-m;
- * capacity development and other training will consume US\$65.3-m or N\$914.2-m; and a
- * communication campaign for demand creation will require US\$0.1-m or N\$1.4-m.

Coping with the debt burden

“Namibia's debt dynamics remain sustainable, but vulnerabilities have increased due to the COVID-19 shock and risks are significant”, the report warned.

Namibia will continue to face significant financing challenges ahead, with the repayment of the 2010 Eurobond in US\$ (US\$500 million) falling due and SACU tax revenues expected to sharply decline by about 3 percentage points of GDP in FY21/22 and remain subdued in FY22/23.

“Namibia's public debt will sharply increase to 64.6 percent of GDP in FY20/21 (from 59.9 percent of GDP in FY19/20), reflecting exceptional budgetary financing needs to respond to the COVID-19 crisis and the real output contraction.

“As the impact of the COVID-19

crisis subsides, the authorities are committed to orient fiscal policy towards supporting debt sustainability, building on their track-record of implementing fiscal consolidation.

The IMF notes that the Namibian government had adopted in October 2020 a medium-term fiscal consolidation framework to stabilize and then lower the public debt-to-GDP-ratio. “This builds on gradually phasing-out the exceptional COVID-19 spending and implementing fiscal reforms to increase expenditure efficiency, strengthen tax administration, and mobilize additional tax revenues.” These measures consist of:

- * Containing the wage bill by freezing nominal wage increases in FY21/22, allowing for natural attrition, except in priority sectors and implementing a targeted early retirement scheme during FY22/23-FY23/24.

THE STATE OF PUBLIC FINANCE

* Improving the performance and management of state-owned enterprises (SOEs), with support from the AfDB, and divesting from selected SOEs (which includes the liquidation of Air Namibia).

“Preliminary estimates suggest that the SOEs reform could lead fiscal savings of about 0.7 percent of GDP over FY21/22-FY22/23 and privatization receipts of 1.7 percent of GDP in FY21/22, which will provide additional non-debt creating budgetary financing.”

* Strengthening tax administration to support mobilizing additional revenues, including through the operationalization of the Namibia Revenue Agency.

The IMF highlighted the importance of improving filing and payment compliance, broadening the tax base, and strengthening profit shifting and base erosion regulation.

Ever since the Ministry of Home Affairs & Immigration was merged with the Ministry of Safety & Security in 2020 they have virtually seen no need for any public procurement.

Instead, the new Ministry of Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety & Security recently published a 'Notice to Suppliers' requesting the submission of company profiles for the provision of goods, works and services to the MHAISS Procurement Management Unit to be procured through the 2021/22 financial year (*New Era* 04-May-21).

For reasons known only to the ministry's Procurement Management Unit this notice restricts companies to bidding for one 'business item' only, while also stating that a bidder is only allowed to participate in one of the fourteen regions!

This is the first time that the *Tender Bulletin* has come across such restrictive procurement participation criteria from a ministry, which are probably not even covered by the Public Procurement Act 15 of 2015 or the regulations from 2017.

The notice lists 55 items under 'goods', 19 under 'works', five under 'consultancy services' and 31 under 'non-consultancy services'. The supplier registration ends on

SECURITY TENDERS IN

Goodbye to the little we have seen of public tenders for police and prisons after merging with home affairs in a new twilight procurement zone all of their own.

07-Jun-21 15:00. Rather confusingly 'original certified copy' of various obligatory documents are also required by the PMU (details were published in *Bulletin* 1395 - subscribers can request the full list by email).

Presumably, the ministry intends to then invite suppliers registered on its database to quote as and when the need arises for certain goods and services, without having to advertise 'Open National Bidding' tenders.

Confusing classification

The classification of the 110 items is rather arbitrary and confusing. For example, item (55) 'auto electrical, mechanical engineering and installation services' is listed under 'goods' but under 'works' the list includes other vehicle related items:

- (1) repair of engines, gearboxes and cylinder blocks;
- (2) repair of hydraulic components;
- (4) panel beating service and repair of accident damages; "supply of" tyres, tubes and valves;
- (8) wheel balancing and alignment;
- (9) "supply of" spare parts for motorcycle and guard bikes as well as other supplies.

Under 'non-consultancy services' the MHAISS again lists several goods supply items that should not be classified as 'non-consulting

services', such as:

- (6) double-sided tape;
- (7) number plates, plate holders, logo, vehicle 'Namibian Police' and 'Namibian Correctional Service' badges;
- (9) motor vehicle accessories and
- (30) supply and service of sewing machines and accessories (needles, thread, zip, etc.).

Arbitrary restrictions

With only one item allowed per bidder and only for one region, MHAISS suppliers must now choose, for example, between 'goods' items: (18) computer supplies and related goods' or (21) 'cell phones, I-pads and other computer accessories', while (19) is 'data and communication networks and related equipment' - as if an ICT company cannot provide all of these related goods and services.

The MHAISS instructions also force a supplier to choose between: (25) refreshments or (27) fresh and dry rations or (28) dry ration packs or (29) Max-A-Meal ingredients or (30) maize grain - although these items are all food related.

Again, companies may only bid for one of the following ten textile / uniform related 'goods' items and suppliers must presumably open up an outlet in each region to supply such specialised items:

- (32) uniforms and accoutrements;

- (33) clothing material;
- (34) cut, make and trim "of the uniform";
- (35) discharge clothing;
- (36) safety clothing and equipment;
- (37) sport wear and related sports supplies;
- (41) rank insignia and ceremonial ranks;
- (42) leather materials;
- (43) offender uniform and
- (44) pantyhose.

Another example is the agricultural inputs under 'goods':

- (48) seeds, fertilizers and weed killers;
- (49) insecticides and pest control;
- (50) garden and workshop tools;
- (52) agricultural equipment.

According to the ministry's arbitrary participation criteria, only one of these items per bidder is allowed for one region.

Tender Board handled Safety & Security procurement transparently

N\$73-M SEKELDUIN SUBSTATION BUILDING

The tender for the construction of NamPower's Sekelduin substation building has been awarded to Nexus Building Contractors, according to the Central Procurement Board of Namibia, who issued the tender on behalf of the power utility.

Open National Bidding tender W/ONB/CPBN-09/2020 for the construction of the Sekelduin Substation building closed on 12-Feb-21 with 13 offers from N\$65.8-m to N\$90-m (bids in *Bulletin* 1385).

On 28-Jan-21 the CPB issued a notice to bidders regarding the change of procurement methods in line with Section 27(1)(a)(i) read together with Section 28(2) and Section 2(b) of the Act to "confer advantage to entities incorporated in Namibia with 100% shareholding or equity vested in Namibian citizens".

The tender was awarded on 06-Apr-21, according to the CPB's website, to the sixth lowest bidder, Nexus Building Contractor (Pty) for

* **Sekelduin Substation building tender awarded to Nexus Building Contractor for N\$73-m - well below cost estimate of N\$87.4-m.**

* **Nine of the eleven tenderers were disqualified for incorrect Performance Security Undertakings.**

N\$73,035,568.36 including VAT (corrected from N\$73,051,150.63 at the bid opening). The contract period is 18 months.

The cost estimate was N\$76,00,000 excluding VAT, which amounts to N\$87,400,000 including VAT.

The only other responsive tenderer was Namibia Construction with N\$84,389,263.52 (corrected from N\$84,389,668.32), whose offer was higher than the successful bidder's. This award notice was also published in *New Era* of 06-May-21.

The unsuccessful tenderers were all disqualified for submitting incorrect Performance Security Undertakings that were not in the required format. They were, in ascending order:

- * Ongoma Trading Enterprises = N\$65,814,250.27
- * Brumar Construction = N\$68,166,301.41
- * Palladium Civil Engineering = N\$70,481,016.93
- * Topaz Construction & Engineering = N\$71,560,495.52
- * Afrideca Construction Namibia = N\$73,032,523.90
- * Ndakalimwe Investment = N\$73,218,344.99
- * Radial Truss Industries / NGC Investments JV = N\$76,133,975.15
- * Walcon Construction = N\$78,981,394.74
- * MES Investment t/a EMS Contractors = N\$81,130,037.54
- * Premier Construction = N\$82,618,285.46
- * CVS Construction = N\$89,999,590.44.

The environmental impact assessment consultancy tender was issued in 2016 under tender NPWR/2016/36 and awarded to

Enviro Dynamics for the Sekelduin 132/66 kV Substation outside Swakopmund and a 132kV transmission line in the Dorob National Park, Erongo Region.

NamPower is developing a new servitude along its existing corridor from the Kuiseb substation via Walmund substation up to the new Sekelduin substation. It is part of NamPower's N\$7-b expansion plan to boost its power network to meet increasing industrial demand at the coast.

The additional transmission lines associated with the Sekelduin substation raised concerns amongst environmentalists who criticized the development of the transmission line with new service roads and pylons from Walmund substation to Walvis Bay inside the Dorob National Park (*Bulletin* 1385).

THE TWILIGHT ZONE

After going to ground on public procurement since last year, the recently amalgamated Ministry of Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety & Security now wants to restrict bidders to one of 110 items in one region only.

public tenders under competitive bidding for all to see.

However, the Tender Board never issued many public tenders for the Ministry of Home Affairs, which was presumably operating with exemptions most of the time.

Below is a list of public tenders that were issued through public bidding by the MSS up until 2017, when the new Public Procurement Act 15 of 2015 came into force, allowing ministries (Category 1 public institutions) to handle their own procurement for values up to:

* N\$15-m for non-consultancy services;

* N\$20-m for consultancy services;

* N\$25-m for goods and N\$35-m for works contracts.

No public (Open Advertised) tenders are required for smaller value procurement under the 'restricted bidding' method (for specific goods/services only available from a limited number of bidders up to N\$3-m for supplies and works and N\$2-m for non-consultancy services). At least five suitable suppliers must be invited to quote.

In case of the 'request for sealed quotations' method (for readily available standard goods, works and non-consultancy services up to N\$2-m) at least three suitable suppliers must be invited to quote.

'Direct procurement' applies in cases of a single source without competition for exclusive right holders for such goods, and 'small value procurement' applies without formal competition for goods, works and services not exceeding N\$15,000.

No procurement on the MHAISS website

Unlike other ministries and state owned enterprises, no information is available whatsoever on quotations, tender results or awards on the Ministry of Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety & Security website under 'procurement'.

Although there are sub-sections for 'Correctional Services' and 'Namibian Police Force' these do not even have procurement pages.

The only item listed on the MHAISS website is an old Procurement Plan for the Ministry of Home Affairs & Immigration for the 2019/20 FY until 31-Mar-20, totaling N\$393,004,000.

This plan shows that the MHA's preferred procurement method was - and probably still is - 'direct procurement' (DP), 'request for sealed quotations' (RFQ) and 'execution by public entity' (PE):

* S&T (N\$7,185,000 DP/RFQ);

* materials and supplies (N\$6,949,000 DR/RFQ/PE);

* transport (N\$9,577,000 DP/PE);

* utility (N\$35,201,000 DP and Open National Bidding ONB);

* maintenance (N\$45,497,000 DP/RFQ/ONB and emergency);

* property rental (N\$17,290,000 (DP));

* goods / other services (N\$5,262,000 (DP/RFQ));

* furniture / office equipment (N\$43,000 DP/RFQ);

* construction (N\$266,000,000 DP/RFQ).

Not much to show for public procurement since 2020

The lack of public procurement is borne out by the recent tendering history of the new MHAISS, which came into being last year after Home Affairs & Immigration was merged with Safety & Security.

During 2021 the MHAISS has issued exactly three public tenders under 'Open National Bidding' (advertised only in *New Era* of 12-Feb-21 without even stating the closing date):

* G/ONB/05-02/2021: Office furniture for the ministerial head office in Windhoek;

* G/ONB/05-01/2021: Supply, delivery and "commission" of 47 digital photocopiers over 36 months;

* NCS/ONB/05-01/2021: Security services to the Ministry at Rundu, Katima Mulilo, Swakopmund and Keetmanshoop.

In 2020 there were only two public works tenders issued by MHAISS for Correctional Services closing 21-Aug-20 - again only advertised in *New Era* 24-Jul-20:

* W/ONB/06-05/2019: Construction of high security fence at Walvis Bay Correctional Facility;

* W/ONB/06-07/2019: Construction of the new clinic at Evaristus Shikongo Correctional Facility, Oshikoto Region.

Separate procurement before 2020

In 2019, the Ministry of Home Affairs & Immigration was still on its own with one public works tender:

* W/ONB/05-01/2019: Completion of construction of new Regional Office at Opuwo, Kunene Region closing 23-Sep-19.

During the same year, the Ministry of Safety & Security managed to publicly advertise ten tenders for which public tender opening sessions were held:

* G/ONB/06-01/2019: EOI to supply 400 live cattle for slaughter to Evaristus Shikongo Correctional Facility closing 19-Dec-19;

* G/ONB/06-05/2019: Leasing 26 digital photocopy machines x36 months to MSS (Namibian Correctional Service) closing 21-Aug-19;

* G/ONB/06-06/2019: Rations from Oct-19 to 30-Sep-21 closing 19-Aug-19;

* W/ONB/06-02/2019: Construction of bulk electrical services infrastructure for Erastus Shikongo Correctional Facility in Tsumeb closing 12-Aug-19;

* W/ONB/06-03/2019: Upgrade oxidation ponds and septic dam for the Erastus Shikongo Correctional Facility in Tsumeb closing 12-Aug-19;

* W/ONB/06-04/2019: Upgrade oxidation ponds and septic dam for Divundu Correctional Facility, Kavango East closing 12-Aug-19;

* SC/ONB/06-01/2019: Consultancy for a feasibility study for the construction of a Police Village in Windhoek, Khomas Region closing 29-Jul-19; the first such tender SC/RP/06-01/2018/2019 had closed 04-Mar-19;

* W/ONB/06-01/2019: Security lighting around the security fence at Elizabeth Nepemba Correctional Facility, Kavango East Region closing 03-Jun-19;

* G/ONB/06-01/2018: Dry and fresh rations for trial-awaiting prisoners for Nampol closed 28-Feb-19.

In 2018 there was no public tender for the MHA but the MSS issued two public tenders:

* G/ONB/06-01/2018: Supply and deliver dry and fresh rations for trial-awaiting prisoners closed 31-Jul-18 (re-issued in 2019);

* Request for qualifications to establish vendor short list for the new Police Facility ICT Platform Project in Eros, Windhoek closed 26-Mar-18.

In 2017 the MHA issued only a request for the submission of company profiles for the creation of a list of companies for provision of goods, works and services for the financial year 2017/18, that closed on 15-Jul-17.

But the MSS managed eleven tenders including eight publicly advertised 'Requests for Quotations' for goods and works for Correctional Services, plus one 'Open National Bidding' tender:

* G/ONB/06-02/2017: Supply and deliver rank insignia metalletes (blue uniform, Special Field Force and Special Reserve Force) closed 06-Nov-17.

The MSS also had a request for the submission of company profiles for provision of goods, works and services to be procured during the 2017/18 FY, as well as another request to submit company profiles for the provision of group insurance services to MSS Procurement Management Unit.

Many more public tenders in the past

Before the Public Procurement Act 15 of 2015 came into force in 2017, there were many public tenders for the Police and Correctional Services, mostly issued by the Tender Board on behalf of the MSS:

In 2016 the *Tender Bulletin* is aware of at least 26 tenders for the Ministry of Safety & Security for anything from copiers, sleeping bags, laundry services, cell mats, coats, blankets, jerseys/jackets, uniforms, boots, neck ties, name badges, caps, fire fighting equipment, fresh rations, for the Namibian Police Force plus ploughs and farming implements, pre-fabricated housing, shoes and psychological tests for Correctional Services.

During the same year the *Tender Bulletin* also observed that the trend of tenders under exemption from public procurement was continuing, e.g. for rank insignia, badges, t-shirts and pantyhose for Nampol and boiler suits for the Namibian Correctional Service.

Tenders in 2015 and before

During 2015 the *Tender Bulletin* recorded 38 public tenders for the MSS (in addition to several works tenders by invitation only to security-cleared contractors). The public tenders issued by the Tender Board include 25 multi-year supply and service tenders:

* for the Namibian Correctional Service: fertilizers, discharge clothes, jerseys, flags, Max-a-Meal, tents, clothing materials, insignias, printing of newsletters, toiletries and clothing items, kitchen utensils, rations, refuse removal;

* for the Namibian Police: ration packs, camouflage uniform, blankets, police badges,

buttons, ranks and insignia, hats and caps, reflective traffic jackets, refuse removal, fire fighting equipment, cleaning materials, furniture.

At least nine tenders in 2015 were again issued under 'exemption' for anything from furniture, boiler suits, quad bikes, 4x4 SUV vehicles, cooler truck, motor vehicles and containers.

Four once-off 'formal' tenders issued by the Tender Board dealt with computer equipment and copiers for Nampol and Correctional Services.

The same transparency was evident before 2015, when regular supply and goods tenders were issued by the Tender Board for the Ministry of Safety & Security for anything from ceremonial swords to handcuffs, police forms, radio equipment, mosquito nets, sound equipment and band instruments, boats and pigs.

Until 2010 there were also plenty of public tenders for construction (including police stations) and vehicle supplies.

Hardly any Home Affairs tenders in previous years

The Ministry of Home Affairs has managed to get by without much public procurement in the past.

Not a single public tender was issued by the MMAI in 2016.

The only public tender in 2015 was issued by the Tender Board to print its 2013/14 and 2014/15 annual report.

In 2013 there was a public works tender for the construction of the Oshakati Regional Office for the Ministry of Home Affairs & Immigration and two Tender board tenders to print annual plan reports and supply computer equipment. Two similar tenders were issued by the Tender Board for the MHA in 2014.

There were two tenders in 2012 for the construction of new regional offices in Keetmanshoop and a quotation to draft regulatory framework for churches and marriage officers.

In 2011 there was still a tender for uniforms for the Department of Immigration.

In 2008, the ministry issued a computer equipment and two works tenders and in 2009 three construction tenders.

In 2006, there was an annual tender to supply and deliver official forms and in 1997 there was still a public tender for Namibian passports.

NIPDB to attract 'over N\$50-billion new investments over five years'

Established last year under the Office of the President, the Investment Promotion & Development Board has been launched with a N\$125-m allocation in the current budget year with which to improve Namibia's investment competitiveness.

Registered as a Non-Profit Association under Section 21 of the Companies Act, the NIPDB is based at the Ministry of Industrialisation & Trade's Brendan Simbwaye Square Block B with Nangula Uaandja appointed as Chief Executive Officer.

It commenced operations on 01-Jan-21 and took over the activities of the Namibia Investment Centre and SME Development programmes from the Ministry of Industrialisation & Trade "to accelerate and propel sustainable and impactful investment opportunities for Namibia", according media statements at the time.

Its mandate is to promote, attract and retain domestic and foreign investments and oversee SME operations to stimulate new ventures. The Board will develop investment strategies and "explore synergies with the public and private sector" to create a conducive investment environment.

The NIPDB held stakeholder consultations with the NGO sector, NCCI and One Voice members as well as the non-NCCI private sector in March, on the draft National Equitable Economic Empowerment Bill. The controversial bill's tabled in parliament is imminent.

During his state of the nation address on 15-Apr-21, President Hage Geingob praised the work already done by the NIPDB, including a portfolio of over 100 investment projects. The top fifteen

As if Namibia is not already blessed with an overpulation of state-owned enterprises - some of which are on the brink of collapse - two more parastatals have joined the family in recent months, replacing functions from the trade and finance ministries.

projects with a combined value of over N\$45-b have been presented to the Cabinet Committee on Treasury, Trade & Economic Development.

The board is mandated to attract more than N\$50-b in investments in the next five years, Geingob said. The country had received six written offers from international investors and local companies for the possible development of green hydrogen and ammonia, he disclosed.

In March, CEO Uaandja defended her decision to select former PWC colleagues for jobs and appoint Quest Consulting for management consulting services at NIPDB worth N\$900,000 - without following procurement guidelines. TransfoCoaching was then tasked by Quest to recruit the NIPDB executive team.

According to Uaandja, the task force set up to operationalise the board gave her permission to head-hunt one staff member and source a consulting firm to support her. This was done through a "word of mouth" approach where firms were invited to submit bids.

The other two companies that submitted offers were more expensive at N\$2.8-m and N\$3.9-m and did not satisfy the 'Namibianisation' requirement, she explained. She does not see having worked with someone at PWC as a conflict of interest, Uaandja added.

Two of the four public tenders issued last year by the Ministry of Industrialisation & Trade dealt with Namibia's country pavilion at the World Expo 2020 from Oct-21 to Mar-22 in Dubai, UAE:

(1) to develop digital audio-visual and print content and physical objects and (2) for the exhibition design and curation.

This function was taken over by the NIPDB, promptly requiring a familiarisation trip to Dubai by NIPDB staff in early May and the commissioner-general for the expo, Simon Maruta, being unceremoniously replaced by Uaandja (*New Era 22-Jan-21; New Era 22-Feb-21; The Namibian 25-Feb-21; The Namibian 26-Feb-21; Die Republikein 09-Mar-21; Namibian Sun 19-Mar-21; New Era 19-Mar-21, New Era 16-Apr-21; Namibian Sun 21-May-21*).

NamRA to clamp down on tax dodgers and implement tax policy reforms

The Namibia Revenue Agency became officially operational in April this year as a semi-autonomous tax administration body, assuming the responsibilities of the departments of Inland Revenue and Customs & Excise from the finance ministry.

NamRA is expected to improve efficiency in Namibia's tax revenue collection and broaden the tax base. For the current financial year N\$52-billion is anticipated in taxes - N\$6-b less than the 2020/21 FY.

With N\$79-m allocated in the 2021/22 budget, NamRA will also serve as platform for speedy implementation of tax policy reforms, which will "sharpen our institutional capacity and responsiveness to the complexities of an increasingly integrated regional and global economy", said president Hage Geingob at the official hand-over of revenue collection to NamRA on 07-Apr-21.

Establishing NamRA was central to Namibia's domestic

resources mobilisation agenda. The agency must assure that the right amount of tax is collected on time and enhance the overall efficiency of the tax system "in relation to its objectives and to strike a fine balance between taxation and socio-economic development objectives", Geingob added.

Finance minister lipumbu Shiimi stressed that all individuals earning over N\$50,000 must declare their income and pay taxes "irrespective of whether you are a minister, cleaner, taxi operator or hair salon owner". Namibia is one of the countries with a high tax to GDP ratio. Shiimi also said NamRA "is uniquely positioned to strengthen Namibia's arsenal to combat corruption in collaboration with other law enforcement agencies".

NamRA's commissioner, Sam Shivute, emphasised during the launch that revenue collection must be optimised to collect the fair amount of taxes and duties due. He also said risk management capacities will be strengthened to "focus on taxpayers and traders who pose the highest risk of non-compliance", while leaving honest taxpayers and traders to carry the can.

Full enforcement powers would be used for those who try to cheat the system. "This approach also extends to dealing with the cash economy," Shivute warned. Currently tax compliance in Namibia stands at 57%, "which is very low", he said. 'Transfer pricing' would become a thing of the past, he added.

When Shivute was appointed last year, he promised a world-class revenue agency and pledged that taxes would be collected without fear or favour (*New Era, Die Republikein 08-Apr-21*).
