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Defence spending gets its marching orders

NAMIBIA'S DEFENCE SPENDING HAS BEEN GIVEN AN UNPRECEDENTED HAIRCUT, REDUCED BY 12.8% TO N\$54-B, ITS SHARE OF THE NATIONAL BUDGET FALLING FROM ALMOST 10% TWO YEARS AGO TO BELOW 8% IN 2021/22, WHILE THE NEW SUPER-MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS, SAFETY & SECURITY HAS ONLY 4% LESS, WITH THE RULING PARTY'S DIEHARD VETERANS AFFAIRS BARELY AFFECTED - PAGE 2.

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The new Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety & Security Vote has a budget of N\$5.7-b in 2021/22, accounting for the biggest – 44.3% - share of the security cluster's N\$12.86-b budget – ahead of the Defence Vote, which traditionally has had the lion's share.

Namibia's central government security cluster has had its 2021/22 budget reduced for the first time in several years, with the ministry of defence suffering an unprecedented 12.8% haircut, while the new vote subsuming home affairs within the new Ministry of Safety & Security, was hardly affected.

As a result, defence no longer has the lion's share of vote expenditure in the security cluster.

In what appears to be a refreshing realignment of government spending priorities, the security cluster is the only one with a lowered share of the national budget for 2021/22 – relegated to fourth and second-last place ahead of only the economic cluster.

This is the first time in recent years that voted security spending has been overtaken by each of the education cluster and the health/welfare clusters separately.

It is also noteworthy that the security cluster's 7.4% reduced budget this year is the second-highest contraction and above the 5.76% reduction in the total budget from N\$72-b revised expenditure in 2020/21 to N\$68-b – like most other clusters, where the administrative sector's allocation is 9.8% lower, the economic cluster's 6.7% and the education cluster's budget is 4.45% below last year's, with only the health/welfare cluster enjoying a moderate 0.4% increase.

Ranking the clusters

* The **administrative cluster's** N\$17.26-b operational and development budget in 2021/22 accounts for 25.4% of the N\$68-b total and is 9.84% or N\$1.88-b lower than last year's revised N\$19.145-b, when it accounted for 26.55% of the N\$72-b total.

Prior to this year's 9.84% decrease, the administrative cluster's N\$19.1-b revised ceiling in 2020/21 was a generous 17.6% or N\$2.87-b above 2019/20's actual N\$16.275-b expenditure, accounting for 24% of the N\$67.4-b budget total – still in first place.

This was the biggest year-on-year increase of all clusters over the three-year period.

* With the second biggest share of operational and development budget expenditure after the administrative cluster in 2021/22, the **education cluster's** combined operational and development allocation amounts to N\$17.2-b or 25.32% of the N\$68-b total budget (including interest payments).

This is N\$801.3-m or 4.45% less than last year's revised N\$18-b of the N\$72-b total budget, when it accounted for 24.97%.

The education cluster's N\$18-b ceiling in 2020/21 was a 3.76% increase on 2019/20's actual expenditure, when its N\$17.35-b accounted for 25.74% of the N\$67.4-b total budget.

Although the education cluster received the biggest slice of Namibia's original 2020/21 national budget, its relative share of state spending fell by 0.77%, however,

recovering by less than half that with this year's 0.35% increment.

* The only cluster with an increase in its expenditure ceiling in 2021/22, **health and welfare** lies third in its share of combined operational and development voted expenditure – behind the administrative and education clusters.

This cluster's combined N\$13.6885-b operational and development expenditure ceiling in 2021/22 (including interest payments) is N\$55.238-m or 0.41% more than last year's revised N\$13.63, its share of overall budget spending increasing marginally from 2020/21's 18.9% (of N\$72-b) to 20.14% of this year's N\$68-b – a 1.24% relative improvement in its share of the budget.

The health and welfare cluster's allocation last year had been a remarkable 15.12% or N\$1.8-b increase over 2019/20's actual N\$11.8-b, when it accounted for 17.57% of the N\$67.4-b national budget – a 1.34% relative improvement in its share of total expenditure.

Also ranked third at the beginning of 2020/21, health and welfare was the only other cluster with an increased allocation exceeding the 6.8% overall budget increase, with 10.55%, ranked third.

* Ranked last in fifth place, the **economic cluster's** N\$6.9-b allocation for operational and development expenditure (including interest payments) in 2021/22, accounting for 10.2% of the N\$68-b budget total, is 6.7% or N\$498.704-m less than last year's revised N\$13.633-m, when it accounted for 10.3% of the N\$72-b total.

Its 6.7% decline on last year is

the third biggest, after the administrative cluster's 9.8% and the security cluster's 7.4% – all above the 5.76% contraction in the overall budget.

In 2020/21, the economic cluster was the only one with a decline on the previous year's expenditure, compared to increases in all other clusters, topped by the administrative cluster's 17.6% increase, which was almost treble the 6.97% increase in overall budget expenditure that year.

The economic cluster's revised N\$7.428-b allocation in 2020/21 had been a 9.75% or N\$802.788-m reduction on 2019/20's N\$8.2-b actual expenditure, when it accounted for 12.2% of the N\$67.4-b total budget – 1.9% more in terms of its relative share of overall expenditure. Its 10.2% share of this year's total budget is 2% below its share in 2019/20.

The economic cluster was the only one with less funding at the start of 2020/21, its N\$7.6-b (-13.8%) also ranking it last in fifth place.

The security cluster

The security cluster has the fourth biggest allocation out of five clusters, with its N\$12.86-b operational and development ceiling (including statutory and interest payments) in 2021/22, 7.4% or N\$1.028-b less than last year's revised N\$13.9-b, accounting for 18.9% of 2021/22's N\$68-b total budget, compared to N\$13.9-b in 2020/21 when it consumed a higher 19.3% of the N\$72-b total in third place behind the administrative and education clusters but ahead of health/welfare.

its marching orders

It is the only cluster that dropped in its ranking of budgetary share in 2021/22.

The security cluster's 7.4% reduction in its 2021/22 allocation is the second-biggest, after the administrative cluster's 9.84% contraction.

The security cluster's N\$13.7-b actual expenditure in 2019/20 accounted for 20.3% of the N\$67.4-b total budget – higher than the following two years.

Its N\$13.9-b revised allocation in 2020/21 had been 1.37% or N\$187.4-m more than the previous year – a 1.06% deterioration in its relative share of total spending.

At the beginning of 2020/21, the security cluster was the only other cluster with an increase below the 6.8% overall budget increment.

But the security cluster then had the second biggest share with N\$13.885-b accounting for 21.58% of the total N\$64.329-b budget (excluding statutory payments and external funding).

This exceeded the health and welfare cluster's N\$13.4-b or 20.8% share – a repeat of 2019/20's revised budget when the security cluster's N\$13.739-b, accounting for 22.8% of all operational and development expenditure exceeded the health and welfare cluster's N\$12.116-b accounting for 20.1%.

The security cluster in previous years

At the beginning of 2020/21, the Defence vote was allocated a 6.9% increase in its operational and development budgets to over N\$7-b – outstripping the national budget's 6.8% increment, almost seven times more than the security cluster's overall 1% growth and double the education cluster's 3.1%.

And the despite the fiscal pressures of the Covid-19 pandemic, the security cluster as a whole continued to enjoy the second big-

gest share of the national budget – ahead of health and welfare – as it had in recent years.

Testimony to the military establishment's consistent chokehold over the allocation of state resources, is the budget for the ruling party's war vets that consistently outstrips that of home affairs significantly, although the latter has a far wider governance mandate.

Since the merge of home affairs with safety and security in 2021/22, it is now more difficult to compare the Veterans Affairs and Home Affairs votes, where the former has consistently been allocated more funding than the latter – or any other security cluster vote for that matter.

The security cluster as a whole had the second biggest share with N\$13.885-b accounting for 21.58% of the central government's total N\$64.329-b budget (excluding statutory payments and external funding) at the beginning of 2020/21.

The security cluster's share of the national budget was then greater than the health and welfare cluster's 20.8%.

The combined N\$7-b budget of the Defence and Veterans Affairs votes was 6.9% more than 2019/20, accounting for just over half of the security cluster's N\$13.885-b budget in 2020/21.

This exceeded the health and welfare cluster's N\$13.4-b or 20.8% share in third place – a repeat of 2019/20's revised budget when the security cluster's N\$13.739-b, accounting for 22.8% of all operational and development expenditure exceeded the health and welfare cluster's N\$12.1-b accounting for 20.1%.

Prior to 2020/21's midyear reallocations, the security cluster still enjoyed more of overall expenditure than health and welfare, despite the latter's far bigger 10.55% increased allocation over 2019/20.

Its expenditure ceiling that year

Justice is the only vote in the security cluster with more to spend in 2021/22, its N\$491-m allocation is over 2.6% bigger than last year's revised N\$478.7-m, which, in turn, had been a whopping 46% increase on 2019/20's actual N\$327-m.

For the past four years - if not longer – Veterans Affairs has had a bigger budget than Home Affairs, which has a far wider governance mandate – testimony to the growing influence of the military establishment within the security cluster.

was 8.5% higher than 2018/19's N\$12.656-b, marginally below 2017/18's N\$12.86-b.

The security cluster's revised N\$13.78-b budget in 2019/20 (19.23% of the total) turned out to be N\$1-b or 7.8% more than its initial N\$12.8-b allocation in 2018/19, when it accounted for 19.3% of overall expenditure, compared to 2017/18's 19.68%.

By comparison, the education cluster's 27.66% share of overall spending at the start of 2020/21 was below 2019/20's 28.66%, although higher than 2018/19's 26% and above the previous year's 24%.

Defence, veterans and police

The amalgamation of Home Affairs & Immigration with Safety & Security now makes it more difficult to measure the combined budgetary allocations to the two armed sections of the security cluster – defence and police – as from the current, 2021/22 financial year.

But last year, the security cluster votes of Police, Defence and Veterans Affairs had a combined 2020/21 budget of N\$12.5-b, accounting for over 90% of the N\$13.885-b cluster total.

This was a marginal 1.2% increase over 2019/20 when they accounted for 88.8% with N\$12.17-b of the N\$13.74-b cluster total.

Within overall national expenditure, the N\$12.5-b budget of these three uniformed votes within the security cluster in 2020/21 accounted for 19.4% of the N\$64.3-b total.

In 2019/20, their combined N\$12.17-b expenditure accounted for 20% of N\$60.2-b (revised) and in 2018/19 their collective N\$11.967-b accounted for 20.6% of N\$58-b total national expenditure (actual).

Restructured security expenditure in 2021/22

In 2021/22, the security cluster consists of:

- * Vote 5 - Home Affairs & Immigration – now merged with the new Vote 39;
- * Vote 6 – Safety & Security (Police) – now also merged with the new Vote 39;
- * Vote 8 – Defence;
- * Vote 16 – Justice;
- * Vote 21 – Judiciary [briefly renamed Prisons & Correctional Services in 2020/21 after previously resorting under the Safety & Security Vote]

Between 2019/20 and 2020/21, the Home Affairs Vote's share of the security cluster fell by 1.2%, while that of Veterans Affairs grew by almost 1% (0.9%).

* Vote 31 - Veterans Affairs;
 * Vote 35 - Office of the Attorney-General – now merged with the Judiciary;
 * Vote 39 - Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety & Security – combines votes 5 and 6 from 2021/22, with little by way of an official explanation for the amalgamation.
 From independence until 2016/17, Police (Vote 6) and Correctional Services (Vote 22/23) were separate votes. They were consolidated into the Safety & Security Vote 6 in 2017/18 until 2019/20, separated again into Vote 6 and Vote 21 in 2020/21 before being re-merged with the new Vote 36 this year.

Within the security cluster, the defence vote bears the brunt of the reduction in voted expenditure for 2021/22, with a 12.78% smaller

allocation than last year – treble that of the 4.2% reduction in voted expenditure for home affairs, police and correctional services combined.

The Defence Vote's N\$5.4-b budget for operational and development expenditure in 2021/22 is N\$795.5-m or 12.78% less than last year's revised N\$6.2-b, which, in contrast, had been a N\$270.8-m or 4.55% increase on 2019/20's actual N\$5.95-b expenditure.

Consolidated for the first time in 2021/22, the new Vote 39 - Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety & Security – has N\$5.7-b to spend on operational inputs and development projects this year, compared to N\$5.7-b combined expenditure for Home Affairs (Vote 5) and Safety & Security (Vote 6) in 2020/21.

These revised expenditures last year for the two votes reflected a

With N\$491-m only Justice

23.36% reduction from N\$661.6-m to N\$507-m for Home Affairs & Immigration and a much more benign 0.57% reduction from N\$5.47-b to N\$5.44-b for Safety & Security (police and correctional services).

Veterans Affairs also had its budget for 2021/22 reduced – by only 0.99% to N\$861-m from last year's revised N\$870-m, which, in sharp contrast, had been a generous 18.24% increase on 2019/20's actual N\$735.75-m.

If the budgets of the Defence and Veterans Affairs votes are combined (since they both resort under the Ministry of Defence & Veterans Affairs), the security cluster's defence component consistently has a bigger share than the combined allocations of the Home Affairs, Immigration, Police and Correctional Services components.

Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety & Security

The new Vote 39 has a budget of N\$5.7-b in 2021/22, accounting for the biggest – 44.3% - share of the security cluster's N\$12.86-b budget – ahead of the Defence Vote, which had the biggest share last year.

This is N\$236.6-m or almost 4% less than last year's combined N\$5.95-b revised expenditure for Home Affairs (N\$507-m) and Safety & Security (N\$5.44-b).

Nationally, Vote 39 accounts for 8.4% of 2021/22's total N\$68-b budget for operational and development expenditure – much the same as last year when the combined N\$5.95 revised expenditure of the two now-defunct votes accounted for 8.3% of N\$72-b.

This is somewhat less than their 8.9% share of 2019/20's actual expenditure with a combined N\$6-b or N\$67.4-b, however.

Still combining the two defunct votes for purposes of comparison, their revised N\$5.95-b combined expenditure for 2020/21 had been a 2.5% or N\$185.6-m decrease on 2019/20's N\$6-b, consisting of a N\$154.5-m or 23.4% decrease from N\$661.66-m to N\$507-m for home affairs and only 0.57% or N\$31-m for safety and security – from N\$5.47-b to N\$5.44-b.

The two votes accounted for 42% of the cluster total in 2020/21 – below 2019/20's 44.5%. Nationally, they accounted for 8.3% of the national budget last year – well below 2019/20's 9%.

It's also worth noting that their (initially lower original) allocation of N\$5.6-b in 2019/20 had been 7.3% more than the previous year - two-and-a-half times higher than the education cluster's 2.8% increase over the same two years.

The same disproportionate treatment is continued this year, where Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety & Security's 3.4% or N\$200-m reduction in its spending allocation to N\$5.7-b, is significantly lower than the education cluster's bigger 4.45% or N\$800-m reduction to N\$17-b in its budget this year compared to 2020/21.

Defence

The Defence Vote's N\$5.4-b voted operational and development expenditure for 2021/22 is N\$795.5-m or 12.78% less than last year's revised N\$6.2-b, accounting for 42% of the N\$12.86-b security cluster total this year in second place behind the new Home Affairs, Safety & Security Vote's biggest, 44.3% share.

More in line with previous years, Defence's N\$6.2-b budget for 2020/21 amounted to the lion's share, accounting for most - 44.8% - of the N\$13.89-b security cluster total and reflected a 4.55% or N\$271-m increase over 2019/20's actual N\$5.95-m expenditure when it accounted for a smaller 43.4% share of the N\$13.7-b cluster total.

As a share of national spending, Defence's N\$5.4-b budget in 2021/22 amounts to 7.9% - far below last year's revised budget when its N\$6.2-b budget accounted for 8.6% of the N\$72-b total budget.

In terms of actual expenditure in 2019/20, the Defence Vote's N\$5.95-b accounted for a marginally bigger 8.8% share of the N\$67.4-b total.

Two years ago already, former finance minister Calle Schlettwein observed in his 2018/19 budget speech in the National Assembly: "Namibia's spending on Defence remains high as a portion of GDP and even here performance management systems should be rolled out".

Instead, the defence force has since become embroiled in a series of financial scandals, culminating in the resignation of defence minister, rear admiral Peter Vilho in April over his undeclared HSBC account in Hong Kong relating to

an earlier arms deal with China.

There is now mounting pressure on the defence ministry to open its books and those of its rogue business empire August 26, after keeping these from public scrutiny behind a smokescreen of 'national security interests'.

Prior to his resignation, Vilho had accused the auditor general of 'daylight espionage' over negative audit findings on 2018/19 FY.

AG Junias Kandjeke had reported in August 2020 that he was prevented from inspecting 'operational equipment, machinery and plant' valued at N\$506.4-m as part of the defence ministry's expenditure for the year, although his office is entitled to access the books of all government entities.

And in December last year, Namibia's Ombudsman John Walters said the Defence Force's business wing - August 26 Holdings - must be held accountable for public funds received since 1998.

August 26 is currently the subject of investigations after a number of cases of malfeasance were exposed (*Bulletin 1397*).

Home Affairs

It is noteworthy that for the past four years - if not longer – Veterans Affairs (Vote 31) has had a bigger budget than Home Affairs, which has a far wider governance mandate than Veterans Affairs – testimony to the growing influence of the military establishment within the security cluster.

The N\$861.34-m operational and development budget for Veterans Affairs in 2021/22 is only 0.99% or M\$8.6-m less than last year's revised N\$869.95-m – a much smaller reduction than the Defence Vote's 12.78%, Home Affairs, Safety & Security's 4.2% and well below the cluster's overall 7.4% contraction. Veterans Affairs resorts under the Ministry of Defence.

Also in third place last year as it is this year within the security cluster, 2020/21's revised expenditure for Veterans Affairs is significantly higher than the N\$847.65-m allocated at the beginning of 2020/21, meaning Vote 31 had a tidy midyear windfall of N\$22.3-m last year.

Its share of this year's N\$12.86-b cluster total is 6.7% - higher than last year's 6.2% of N\$13.89-b and 2019/20's 5.3% of N\$13.7-b.

In comparison, Home Affairs (on its own) had a 3.6% share last year ranked fourth – considerably lower than 2019/20's 4.8% when it also had the fourth highest share of the security cluster's budget.

This means that between 2019/20 and 2020/21, the Home Affairs Vote's share of the security cluster fell by 1.2%, while that of Veterans Affairs grew by almost 1% (0.9%).

Vote 31's revised N\$870-m last year translates into a generous 18% increase over 2019/20's actual N\$735.75-m.

The merger between the Home Affairs and Safety & Security votes this year now renders it more difficult to compare the allocations between the home affairs component of the new Vote 39 and the Veterans Affairs Vote.

In 2020/21, Home Affairs & Immigration (the old Vote 5)'s revised expenditure of N\$507-m was almost 42% less than that of the Veterans Affairs Vote's N\$870-m.

Home Affairs was initially allocated N\$677.1-m in 2019/20, 11.2% more than in 2018/19, [four times more than the education cluster's 2.8% increase] to "among others, complete its Head Office building [awarded to a Chinese contractor without public tender] and its Regional Office in Kunene Region", former finance minister Calle Schlettwein explained at the time.

Justice, the Judiciary and the Attorney-General

Justice (Vote 16) is the only vote in the security cluster with more to spend in 2021/22, its N\$491-m allocation is over 2.6% bigger than last year's revised N\$478.7-m, which, in turn, had been a whopping 46% increase on 2019/20's actual N\$327-m.

The only remaining security cluster vote is the Judiciary (Vote 21), which – rather ingeniously – has an identical allocation of N\$371.152-m in 2021/22 to what its revised expenditure reflects for 2020/21, which had been a 4% increase on 2019/20's actual N\$356.5-m expenditure.

The Office of the Attorney-General was merged with the Judiciary Vote in 2020/21, having recorded N\$198-m actual expenditure in its last year of operation as an independent vote.

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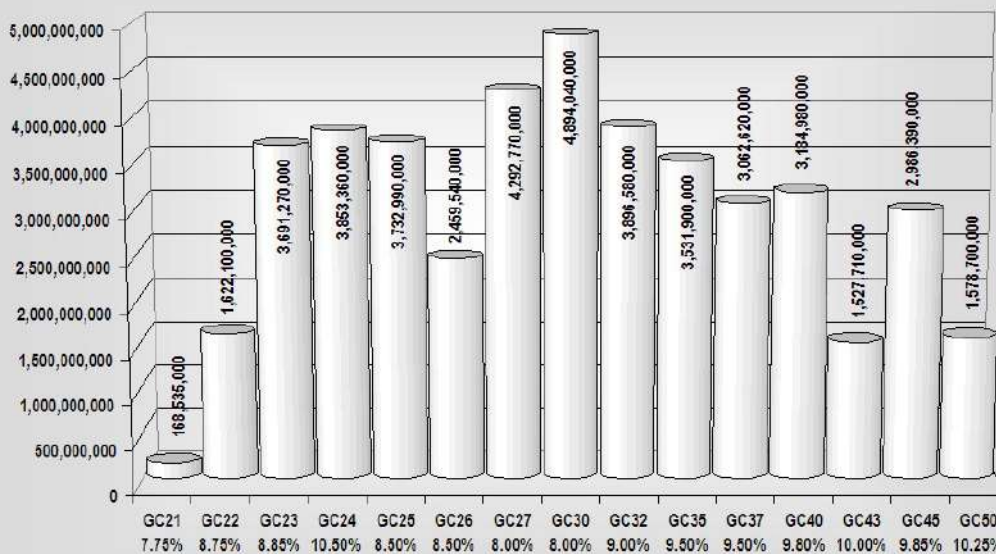

PERFORMANCE DEVELOPMENT CENTRE SCORES THREE MURD TENDERS

11 JUNE 2021

The Ministry of Urban & Rural Development has announced the awards of three tenders on its website and in some local newspapers, noting the stand-still periods for objections and listing the award notices (*New Era* 20-Apr-21; *Die Republikein* 21-Apr-21; *Die Republikein* 12-May-21; *Die Republikein* 14-May-21).

The three tenders were advertised in the media through Open National Bidding procedures.

In fact, the award notices were published in more newspapers than the original tender notices.

It is not clear which criteria MURD used in the selection for the awards, because in several cases the lowest substantially responsive tenderers were not awarded the contract.

Office air-conditioners for N\$625,608

Only five of 29 offers were responsive after ONB tender is issued with only three weeks' notice.

Only 19 of the 122 bidders for three tenders were found to be responsive, while for unknown reasons the successful bidder did not always tender the lowest responsive offer.

G/ONB/17-1/2020/21: Supply and installation of office air-conditioners closed 11-Jan-21 [this tender was advertised only in *Die Republikein* on 24-Dec-21 and should have run for 30 days under ONB procedures].

Twenty-nine offers were received but only five were found to be responsive:

- * Performance Development Centre = N\$625,608.05 - best evaluated bid and selected for award;
- * Shitti & Son Investment = N\$806,262.06;
- * Karoo Investment = N\$839,509.96
- * Gongaleni Investment = N\$861,512.05;

Office curtains/blinds for N\$330,237

PDC scores again but is not the lowest tenderer after only four of 20 offers were considered.

Twenty offers were received, six were responsive but two did not submit financial statements. The offers are listed in ascending order:

SILENCE BROKEN ON JUMBO SALE TENDER

11 JUNE 2021

The Ministry of Environment, Forestry & Tourism has finally broken its silence on the controversial tender for the sale of 170 elephants after receiving five offers in January.

Ministry spokesperson Romeo Muyunda told the *Namibian Sun* that the MEFT had completed negotiations and that tenderers were in the process of acquiring import permits for the elephants.

He did not disclose the number of successful tenderers nor the countries to which the elephants would be relocated, but said the permits formed part of agreements to be signed between the ministry and the buyers. These were currently with the attorney-general's office and are expected to be finalized for signature next week (*Namibian Sun*, 07-Jun-21).

Die Republikein (26-Feb-21) and *Namibian Sun* (26-Feb-21 & 03-Mar-21) reported that MEFT had received five offers from Namibian (95%) and South African buyers and the ministry hoped to generate at least N\$13-m from the sale to be paid into the Game Products Trust Fund for conservation and rural development projects.

One report quoted tourism minister Pohamba Shifeta as saying that the matter was 'sensitive'. A minimum bid per animal had been agreed upon but the contracts of sale had not yet been signed.

The identity of tenderers was not disclosed because of safety concerns 'due to the mounting opposition to the sale', the minister added.

The MEFT deputy executive director for the Department of Natural Resources Management, Colgar Sikopo, had promised that the ministry would share the results once the process was concluded, however.

More than two months later, Sikopo indicated that there were also non-SADC countries interested in buying the elephants, while MEFT spokesperson Romeo Muyunda confirmed that the contracts of sale had still not been signed.

"The bidders are yet to agree to the conditions of sale by the ministry. When this is achieved we will make an announcement", he added (*Namibian Sun* 14-May-21).

The elephant tender

The 'invitation to interested parties' for the sale of 180 elephants was advertised in early December 2020 and closed on 29-Jan-21.

The sale was under four lots:

- * Omatejete Area - 30 in 1-2 family groups including four adult bulls,
- * Kamanjab Area - 50 in 2-4 family groups including seven adult bulls,
- * Grootfontein-Kavango Area - 60 in 2-4 family groups including eight adult bulls and
- * Grootfontein-Tsumkwe Area - 30 in 1-2 family groups including four adult bulls.

Tenderers had to fulfill certain conditions, such as providing the name of the buyer and property where elephants will be kept (including an elephant game-proof fence certificate).

Tenderers also had to state the names of the Namibian-registered game dealers to be used for capturing and translocation.

Successful bidders had to find or build their own quarantine facilities (including electric fencing and ditches) and capture the entire herd as per lot size without leaving infants/juveniles behind in order not to disturb social groups.

Capturing and all related activities, including disease testing and boma care were for the buyers' expense, who also had to bear all risks during and after capture.

Tenderers wishing to export had to provide official proof that their respective conservation authorities would permit them to import elephants to their countries (*Bulletin* 1376).

International outcry

The tender led to local and international protests calling for the cancellation of the tender and questioned the reasons for wanting to sell the elephants.

The MEFT then issued a nine-page response on 01-Feb-21 to defend the sale of elephants from communal and commercial farming areas that was aimed at reducing the increasing number of elephants to mitigate the impact of drought and reduce human-elephant conflict.

According to this statement Namibia's elephant population is currently about 24,000, while in 1995 there were only 7,000 and in 2004 about 16,000 elephants in the country.

Exporting 170 elephants (about half of them occurring in the four hot spots) was less than 1% of Namibia's total elephant population, which was growing at about 5% annually, according to the statement.

In 2020, elephants had killed two cattle and chased thousands of livestock from their drinking water, while damaging 3,346ha of crops of rural communities and farmers, damaging grain storage facilities, the statement added, going on to described a 'nonsense', allegations of corruption and linking the sale to oil drilling in Kavango.

Only the MEFT statement regarding the elephant sale is visible on the Ministry's website and no other information has been made public.

Trophy hunting of 214 park animals

There is also no information available on an invitation to bid

for trophy hunting concessions under two lots, that the Ministry of Environment, Forestry & Tourism had advertised in *Die Republikein* on 23-Dec-20 with a closing date of 15-Jan-21.

This tender involved a wide range of game offered through trophy hunting concessions over a four year period on state land outside registered communal conservancies.

Tenderers had to submit financial offers indicating the price per individual animal for the first year. Fees as prescribed in the 'Conditions of Concession and Special Conditions for Specific Concessions', would be escalated by 10% per annum.

The concessions listed the huntable animals per year for each park as:

- (1) Mangetti National Park and Western Kavango Concession - 2x elephant; 2x leopard (over the 4-year period); 2x spotted hyena; 6x eland; 2x duiker; 2x steenbok; 3x blue wildebeest; 5x plain zebra (90 animals over four years);
- (2) Khomas Hochland National Park and Okahandja Nature Reserve - 10x Hartmann zebra; 3x blue wildebeest; 6x oryx; 4x kudu; 3x common impala; 2x eland; 3x warthog (124 animals over four years) (Details in *Bulletin* 1379).

At the time, MEFT spokesperson Romeo Muyunda brushed public concerns away by saying that professional hunters would have to adhere to the conditions stipulated by the MEFT for hunting in national parks.

During an aerial game count in these parks in 2020, about 3,021 game (excluding rhino) were counted and the hunting quota approved by the ministry made up less than 1% of the animal population.

According to Muyunda, the invitation was advertised in December because the marketing and sale of animals for trophy hunting normally takes place

until March each year. Some professional hunters were also informed directly and the response indicated that there was interest from various companies.

None of these hunting areas were new, he explained, but some companies that had been awarded a concession through an auction in 2018 for Mangetti and Daan Viljoen/Von Bach Game Parks had terminated their contracts late in 2020 (*Namibian Sun* 14-Jan-21; *The Namibian* 15-Jan-21).

Previous auctions

The MEFT held two auctions for trophy hunting concessions in 2018.

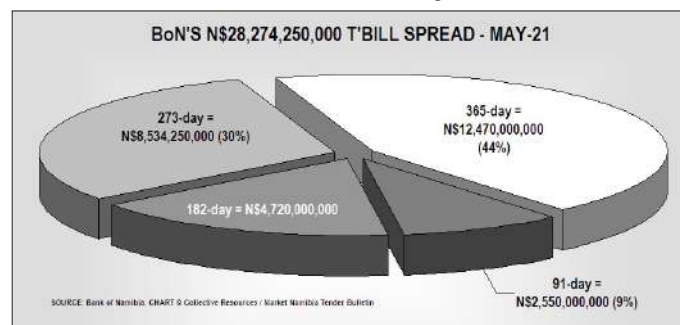
* The auction of hunting concessions on state land for the concession contract period 2019 - 2022 (possibly to 2023) closed on 11-Apr-18.

This was for concession areas located in Mahango Core Area (part of Bwabwata National Park), Western Kavango and Mangetti National Park, Waterberg Plateau Park, Daan Viljoen and Von Bach Game Parks and the Naukluft part of the Namib Naukluft Park.

Species included buffalo, leopard, elephant, giraffe, eland, hippopotamus, crocodile, roan and sable antelope, steenbok, kudu, oryx, lechwe, blue wildebeest, Burchell's and Hartmann's zebra, common impala, warthog, duiker, spotted hyaena, klipspringer and springbok.

* An earlier auction for trophy hunting concessions on state land for the concession period 2019 - 2022 (possibly to 2023) closed 23-May-18 but was only for the concession area in Mahango Core Area (Bwabwata National Park).

Species included buffalo, elephant, giraffe, hippopotamus, crocodile, roan and sable antelope, kudu, lechwe, blue wildebeest, Burchell's zebra, common impala, warthog and duiker.

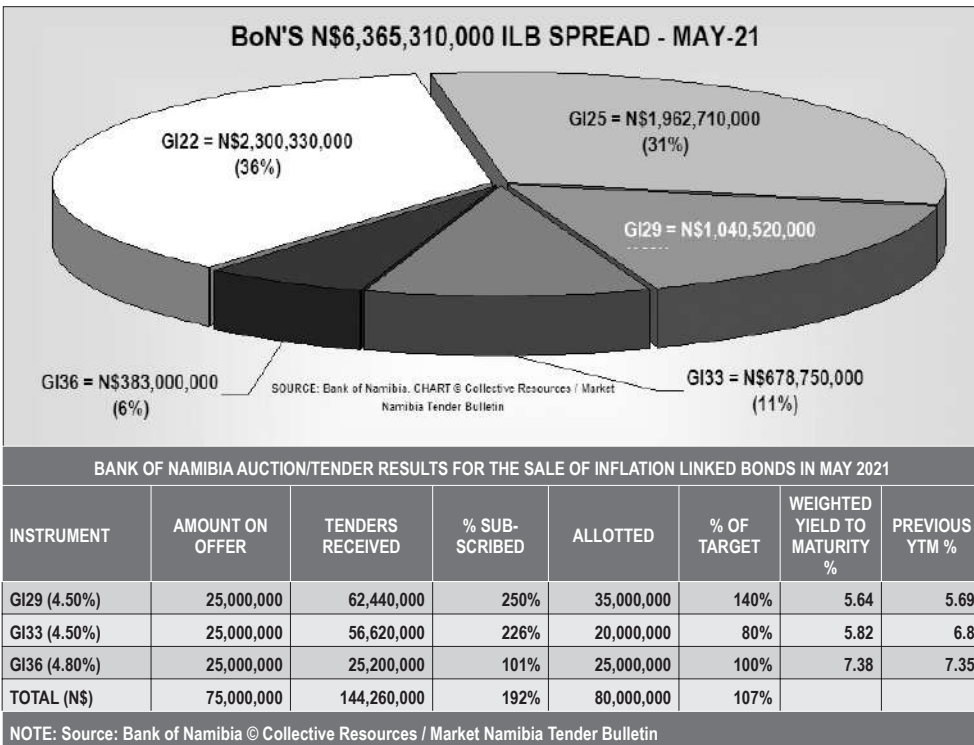
