This year's 21.66% reduction to N\$3.124-b for public construction works is far greater than the overall budget's -5.76% decline, the government's -0.77% smaller wage bill, the -17.2% cutback in procurement expenditure as a whole and the 14% contraction in domestically-financed development spending.

**N**amibia's national budget for public construction works has been reduced to a nine-year low of N\$3.124-b in 2021/22, with no funds provided for social housing and the security cluster once again walking away with an inordinate share.

The single biggest construction

cutback is in the economic cluster, where there is a zero allocation to the Urban & Rural Development Vote compared to last year's revised N\$407-m, through which funding for public housing programmes is channelled to local authorities.

N\$555.6 million or 17.9% of voted construction expenditure goes

to the security cluster's four votes (defence, justice, veterans, home affairs and security) – virtually equaling the combined construction budgets of the social cluster's N\$578-m, accounting for 18.6% of the N\$3.1-b construction total.

On its own, however, the education cluster's N\$281-m budget for construction across two votes (education, sport and youth) accounting for only 9% of the total, is a little over half the security cluster's four votes.

The health and welfare cluster's N\$296.66-m construction budget across two votes (health and gender equality, poverty eradication and social welfare) is also a little over half (53%) of the security cluster's, accounting for 9.56% of the total.

This means that the security establishment again has a bigger allocation for building courtrooms, police stations, prisons and military bases than the social sector has for schools, hostels, clinics, hospitals and facilities to alleviate poverty – as has been the case in recent years, although the gap has narrowed with this year's unusual decrease in the security cluster's CR1 allocation, accompanied by increases in the social clusters.

And although this excludes foreign funding in the case of educational infrastructure that is supported by a N\$1-b AfDB loan, the 21.66% cutback in the central government's domestically-financed construction budget is four times higher than the 5.76% reduction in the total budget.

The security cluster's N\$555.6-m construction budget in 2021/22 also overtakes the combined N\$511.755-m combined allocations to the administrative and economic clusters – if one excludes the Transport Vote's N\$1.5-b, which consumes half of the entire voted expenditure on construction by itself.

On its own, the administrative cluster's N\$131-m budget for construction across seven votes (presidency, prime minister, national assembly, foreign affairs, finance, works and communications) is less than a quarter of the security cluster's and accounts for only 4.2% of the total.

Excluding the Transport Vote, the economic cluster's N\$372-m across six votes (mines, energy, environment, tourism, forestry, industrialization, trade, fisheries, agriculture, land reform and water) is just over two-thirds of the security cluster's allocation.

## Procurement expenditure in 2021/22

**N**amibia's central government has slashed its procurement budget from an all-time high of N\$11.8 billion last year, by over 17% or N\$2-b to N\$9.8-b in 2021/22.

The 17.2% reduction in procurement expenditure is far higher than the 5.76% reduction in the national budget to N\$68-b from 2010/21's revised N\$72-b and the 0.77% reduction in central government's personnel expenditure to N\$28.46-b from last year's revised N\$28.68-b, both of which are in sharp contrast to the 9.85% increase in debt servicing costs to N\$8.5-b from last year's revised N\$7.7-b.

As a share of procurement, current operational expenditure has increased by 11 percentage points over the past three years – from 38% to 49%, compared

## to the sword

to operational capex, which has increased by only 0.4 percentage points from 7.2% to 7.6%.

In sharp contrast to procurement spending's miserable 1.12% average annual increase over the past nine years, government's debt servicing costs have ballooned by 41.35% annually, overall budget expenditure by 5%, government remuneration by 6.55%, accompanied by a 2.8% average annual decline in domestically-funded development expenditure, which has fallen by 14% to N\$5.55-b in 2021/22 from last year's revised N\$6.456-b.

Across the eight heads of procurement spending:

\* Construction, renovations and improvements (CRI) and feasibility studies, design and supervision (FSDS) are both channelled entirely through the development budget.

\* Expenditure on materials and supplies (M&S) and other services and expenses (OSE) are items of consumption spending, provided for mostly as part of current operational expenditure, but with some allocations channelled through the development budget to specific projects.

\* Expenditure on operational equipment, machinery and plant (OEMP), furniture and office equipment (FOE) and vehicles (V) is classified as capital expenditure under the operational budget, with some allocations to specific development projects.

\* Since 2019/20, the budget has itemized 'purchase of buildings' - as part of development expenditure.

\* Although the N\$3.124-b 2021/22 budget for construction, renovations and improvements accounts for the - usual - biggest share of procurement expenditure, it is at a nine-year low and suffered the second-most severe reduction of all procurement categories on last year's revised expenditure (after 'other services and expenses').

\* 'Other services and expenses' has the second-biggest share of 2021/22's procurement budget with N\$2.7-b, accounting for 27.55% of the procurement total after a 35.44% decrease on last year - the biggest reduction within the procurement budget.

\* The 2021/22 budget for materials and supplies totals N\$2.4-b in third place, accounting for 24.6% of procurement expenditure - a 3.24% increase on last year.

\* N\$1.05-b has been voted for operational equipment, machinery and plant in 2021/22, accounting for 10.7% of the procurement budget in fourth place, after a 9.95% increase over last year.

\* Voted expenditure for feasibility studies, design and supervision has been increased by 70.47% to N\$456-m, more than doubling its share to 4.65% of 2021/22's procurement total, in fifth place.

\* N\$51.3-m voted for furniture and office equipment (including ICT) in 2021/22 accounts for a dismal 0.24% of the procurement budget, following a 26% reduction on last year.

\* N\$500,000 budgeted for vehicle purchases in 2021/22 is an 11% increase over last year's revised all-time low of N\$450,000.

\* N\$2-m has been voted for the purchase of buildings in 2021/22 is 94% less than last year's revised N\$35.6-m.

### The contraction of construction

**The education cluster's N\$281.3-m budget for construction translates into a 9% share of 2021/22's N\$3-b - half the security cluster's.**

Although it retains the biggest share amongst eight expenditure categories with 31.86% in the N\$9.8-b overall procurement budget, construction's 21.66% or N\$864-m reduction on last year's revised N\$3.988-m is the second-most severe reduction of all procurement categories on last year's revised expenditure after 'other services and expenses'.

The N\$3.124-b 2021/22 budget for construction, renovations and improvements is at a nine-year low.

This year's 21.66% reduction to N\$3.124-b for public construction works is far greater than the overall budget's -5.76% decline, the government's -0.77% smaller wage bill, the -17.2% cutback in procurement expenditure as a whole and the 14% contraction in domestically-financed development spending.

Last year's revised N\$3.987-b voted expenditure for construction represented a marginal 0.69% increase on 2019/20's actual N\$3.96 - well below the N\$4.45-b revised total a year ago at the time of the 2020/21 midyear budget.

The N\$3.123-b voted for construction in 2021/22 is the lowest in the past nine years since 2013/14's N\$3.39-b and almost half of its N\$6.1-b peak in 2015/16, reflecting a 7.97% decline from 2013/14.

This 7.97% decline is in sharp contrast to the national budget's 45% increase over the same nine years, the 60% growth in civil service remuneration, the 372% expansion in debt servicing costs and the 10% increase in overall procurement expenditure.

But it is less than one third of the 25.5% decline in development expenditure over the same nine years:

\* N\$3.4-b expenditure on construction in 2013/14 increased by 53% the following year to N\$5.2-b, its share of the total national budget rising from 7.24% of N\$46.8-b to 8.8% of N\$58.8-b.

\* It increased by a further 18% in 2015/16 to N\$6.1-b, accounting for 9.5% of the N\$64.6-b total budget, before the rot set in.

\* Construction expenditure contracted by 21.3% in 2016/17 to N\$4.8-b, accounting for 7.8% of that year's overall budget.

\* In 2017/18 it fell by a further 27.2% to N\$3.5-b, its share of the budget dropping to 5.4%.

\* In 2018/19, construction's N\$3.46-b was a further 1.54% lower, commanding 5.3% of the N\$65.2-b budget.

\* In 2019/20, construction expenditure increased for the first time after three years of contraction, to N\$3.96-b, accounting for 5.88% of the N\$67.4-b total budget.

\* In 2020/21, spending on construction rose marginally by 0.68% to N\$3.987-b, consuming a lower 5.53% of the N\$72-b total.

To summarize, the past nine years have seen construction expenditure fall four times year-on-year and increase four times - resulting in an overall decline of nearly 8%.

It is also worth noting that central government's revised N\$3.987-b expenditure on construction last

year was below the N\$4.1-b voted at the beginning of 2020/21, when it enjoyed the biggest share with 36.15% of the N\$11.387-b procurement budget - already N\$329-m or 7.4% below 2019/20's N\$4.4-b when it accounted for 45.3% of N\$9.8-b procurement expenditure.

This N\$4.4-b CRI spending in 2019/20 has now been adjusted to an even lower N\$3.96-b actual expenditure, according to 2021/22 budget book.

Even before this downwards adjustment, 2019/20's CRI spending was 30.5% below the N\$5.7-b initially allocated at the beginning of 2019/20.

### Comparing the clusters on construction

The disparity in funding for construction, renovations and improvements in favour of the security cluster this year is made possible by the massive 276% reduction in the construction budget for the economic cluster to N\$372-m in 2021/22, from last year's N\$1.4-b, after a 27% increase from N\$1.1-b actual expenditure in 2019/20 - excluding the Transport Vote.

This year's N\$555.6-m construction budget for the security cluster is 3.5% lower than last year's revised N\$575-m, following a 34.66% decline from N\$880-m in 2019/20.

The construction budgets of the remaining clusters all enjoyed increases in 2021/22:

\* the education cluster's N\$281-m budget for construction in 2021/22 is more than double last year's revised N\$120-m (a 134% increase), which was almost half 2019/20's N\$232.37-m actual expenditure;

\* the health and welfare cluster's N\$296.66-m in 2021/22 amounts to a 40% increase over last year's revised N\$212-m, which had been a 46% increase over 2019/20's N\$145.34-m actual expenditure;

\* the administrative cluster's N\$131-m voted expenditure on construction this year represents a 27.8% increase over 2020/21's revised N\$102.5-m, which had been almost

double 2019/20's N\$56.7-m actual expenditure.

To summarise, while the administrative, education and health/welfare clusters have enjoyed consistent increases in their CRI budgets over the three years, the security cluster's CRI has declined.

### Security's place in the construction hierarchy

But despite this decline, the security cluster's share of construction expenditure still tops all other clusters except the economic cluster.

\* With the second-biggest CRI allocation this year (after the economic cluster), the security cluster's N\$555.6-m budget for construction translates into a 17.8% share of 2021/22's N\$3-b, despite its N\$19.5-m decrease over last year's revised N\$575-m when it accounted for 14.4% of the N\$3.98-b total, compared to its 22.2% share with N\$880.2-m out of N\$3.96-b in 2019/20.

It is worth recalling that at the beginning 2020/21, the security cluster's construction budget was N\$607.464-m compared to the social sector's N\$417.072-m - a N\$190.392-m difference in favour of the former.

After the midyear revisions in October last year, the security cluster had N\$575.06-m and the social sector N\$386.1-m - a smaller, but still significant N\$188.96-m difference.

\* With the third-biggest CRI allocation this year, the health and welfare cluster's N\$296.66-m budget for construction translates into a 9.5% share of 2021/22's N\$3-b (a little over half the security cluster's), following its N\$84.54-m increase over last year's revised N\$212-m when it accounted for only 5.3% of the N\$3.98-b total (a little over one third the security cluster's), compared to its 3.67% share with N\$145.34-m out of

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With its usual biggest allocation for construction, Transport has N\$1.487-b to spend in 2021/22, accounting for 47.6% of the N\$3.12-b CRI total, following a 3.3% reduction on last year.

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N\$3.96-b in 2019/20 (one sixth the security cluster's).

\* With the fourth-biggest CRI allocation this year, the education cluster's N\$281.3-m budget for construction translates into a 9% share of 2021/22's N\$3-b (half the security cluster's), following its N\$161.4-m increase over last year's revised N\$120-m when it accounted for only 3% of the N\$3.98-b total (¼ the security cluster's), compared to its 5.87% share with N\$232.4-m out of N\$3.96-b in 2019/20 (almost ¼ the security cluster's).

It is noteworthy that at the time of 2020/21's midyear budget revisions, the education cluster had its budget for construction reduced by 2.25% to N\$174-m – far higher than the N\$120-m revised expenditure recorded in the 2021/22 budget book.

In other words, N\$54-m of the education cluster's construction budget went missing between 2020/21's midyear revisions in October and March this year when the 2021/22 budget was compiled.

There are no such discrepancies in any of the other clusters.

\* With the smallest CRI allocation this year, the administrative cluster's N\$131-m budget for

construction translates into a 4% share of 2021/22's N\$3-b, following its N\$24.2-m increase over last year's revised N\$106.7-m when it accounted for only 2.68% of the N\$3.98-b total, compared to its 1.4% share with N\$56.7-m out of N\$3.96-b in 2019/20.

\* With its traditional biggest share of the construction budget – because of the Transport Vote – the economic cluster's N\$1.86-b budget for construction translates into a 59.5% share of 2021/22's N\$3-b, following its N\$1.114-b decrease over last year's revised N\$2.97-b-m when it accounted for 74.58% of the N\$3.98-b total, compared to its 66.88% share with N\$2.645-b out of N\$3.96-b in 2019/20.

\* Even without the Transport Vote, – the economic cluster's N\$372-m budget for construction would still overtake the education cluster's allocation, translating into a 12% share of 2021/22's N\$3-b, following its N\$1.06-b decrease over last year's revised N\$1.4-b-m when it accounted for 36% of

the N\$3.98-b total, compared to its 27% share with N\$1.07-b out of N\$3.96-b in 2019/20.

There are only six votes with over N\$100-m allocations for construction in 2021/22 compared to eight last year, nine in 2019/20 and ten in 2018/19.

### Transport

With its usual biggest allocation for construction, renovations and improvements, Transport (Vote 24) has N\$1.487-b to spend in 2021/22, accounting for 47.6% of the N\$3.12-b CRI total, following a N\$51-m or 3.3% reduction on last year's revised N\$1.5-b when it accounted for 38.57% of the N\$3.987-b CRI total – a 2.2% or N\$34.88-m reduction on 2019/20's actual N\$1.57-b expenditure when it accounted for 39.7% or the N\$3.96-b CRI total.

Its CRI allocation last year was unaffected at the midterm revisions.

It started 2019/20 with N\$1.878-b, accounting for 35.85% of the N\$5.7-b overall CRI total, which was 16.8% higher than 2018/19's

revised N\$1.6-b, accounting for 35.9% of the N\$4.5-b CRI total at the time.

Transport initially had 35% or N\$561-m cut from its original allocation in 2018/19 midyear to N\$1.05-b.

As it turned out, however, Transport's latest adjusted expenditure for that year is back to the N\$1.6-b allocated to it initially.

Transport was also privileged in 2017/18 when its original N\$1.18-b allocation was unaffected in that midyear's revisions.

### Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety & Security

This newly-created Vote 39 has the second-biggest CRI budget in 2021/22, combining the previously separate:

\* Vote 05 - Home Affairs & Immigration; and

\* Vote 06 - Safety & Security (police and prisons).

Vote 39 has a N\$341.55-m CRI budget in 2021/22, accounting for 10.9% of the N\$3.1-b total – N\$19.2-m or 5.3% less than last year's revised N\$360.76-m for the former separate votes, accounting for 9% of the N\$3.987-b CRI total, which had been N\$184.2-m or 33.76% less than 2019/20's N\$545-m actual expenditure when

they accounted for 13.76% of the N\$3.96-b CRI total.

This amounts to a considerable reduction in the construction allocation to this security sub-cluster – probably in the light of the near-completion of the new HQ for Home Affairs.

### The former Safety & Security

**S**afety & Security (the now defunct Vote 6) was briefly renamed Police last year before being subsumed under the new Vote 39.

It had the fourth-biggest CRI allocation in 2020/21, with a revised N\$294.2-m accounting for 7.38% of the N\$3.987-b total, following a 21.7% reduction on 2019/20's actual N\$375.7-m expenditure, accounting for 9.5% of the N\$3.96-b total.

Its initial allocation in 2020/21 was 33% or N\$148.158-m below 2019/20's N\$447.4-m now restated as N\$375.7-m.

Notably, however, the former Vote 6's 2020/21 CRI funding outranked each one of the education cluster's votes by far, as well as each of the health and welfare cluster's votes – in spite of its reduced CRI allocation from the previous year.

Vote 6 was ranked second in 2019/20 – before and after mid-year – after its initial N\$588-m with an 11.2% share of the total was reduced by N\$61-m or 10.4% to N\$527-m with a slightly higher 11.76% share.

Safety & Security's initial allocation in 2019/20 had been a generous 77.7% increase (N\$257-m) over 2018/19's N\$330.8-m when it enjoyed only 7.4% of the N\$4.5-b CRI total.

The Safety & Security Vote's construction budget in 2018/19 emerged unscathed from the mid-year CRI cutbacks.

### The former Home Affairs & Immigration

**P**rior to its absorption in the new Vote 39, Home Affairs & Immigration (Vote 5)'s N\$66.5-m revised expenditure in 2020/21 accounting for 1.67% of the N\$3.987-b CRI total, was a 60.7% or N\$102.7-m reduction on 2019/20's actual N\$169.256-m when it accounted for 4.27% of the N\$3.96-b total.

Its revised 2020/21 expenditure of N\$66.5-m resulted from a drastic 26% or N\$23.5-m midyear cutback from N\$90-m allocated at the beginning of the year, its share of all CRI expenditure falling from 2.2% to 1.65%.

This must have mostly to do with the near-completion of its gigantic new head office in Windhoek (awarded to a Chinese contractor without public tender), its ranking plunging from seventh in 2019/20 to tenth in 2020/21.

Its N\$266-m allocation at the beginning of 2019/20 had been a handsome 62% (N\$102-m) increase on 2018/19's revised N\$164-m, accounting for 3.66% of the CRI budget the following year in seventh place.

### Education, Arts & Culture

**B**riefly titled only 'Education' last year, Education, Arts & Culture (Vote 10) has the third-biggest budget for construction in 2021/22, with N\$265.9-m, accounting for 8.5% of the N\$3.1-b CRI budget.

This is a huge N\$160.475-m or 152.2% increase on 2020/21's revised N\$105.43-m when it accounted for 2.64% of the N\$3.987-b CRI total in sixth place, following a 53.6% or N\$121.86-m reduction on 2019/20's actual N\$227.3-m expenditure, accounting for 2.64% of the N\$3.96-b CRI total in eighth place.

Vote 10's N\$105.43-m revised expenditure for 2020/21 is a severe downgrade of the N\$159.4-m accounting for 3.95% of the national CRI total of N\$4.1-b at the time of last year's midterm revision, when its CRI allocation was not revised.

In seventh place before and after 2020/21's midyear revisions, Education, Arts & Culture's N\$159.4-m CRI ceiling at midyear was already a severe 33.4% or N\$80-m reduction in its allocation from 2019/20's revised N\$239.48-m when it accounted for 5.4% of the N\$4.445-b national CRI total in a higher, fifth ranking. Its actual expenditure in 2019/20 has now been further eroded to N\$227.3-m, however.

Vote 10's original N\$391.5-m construction budget in 2019/20 was almost 20% more (N\$65-m) than 2018/19's revised N\$326.5-m,

giving it a 6.9% share of the N\$5.7-b overall CRI total in fifth place – a decline from 2018/19's 7.3% share but in eventual seventh place.

It lost its third place ranking in construction expenditure at the beginning of 2018/19 after a 35.2% cut to its initial allocation by N\$138-m to N\$254.3-m – in fourth place.

Vote 10's accompanying vote – Higher Education (Vote 32) – has a zero construction budget in 2021/22, as has been the case over the past six years.

This is because the various tertiary education SOEs in this sector are supported through capital transfers from the finance ministry.

### Health & Social Services

**L**ying closely behind Education, Health & Social Services (Vote 13) has the fourth-biggest construction allocation in 2021/22, with N\$265-m, accounting for 8.48% of the N\$3.1-b CRI total.

This is a considerable 41% or N\$77.2-m increase over last year's revised N\$187.85-m, when it accounted for 4.7% of the N\$3.987-b total in fifth place, following a 34.3% or N\$47.95-m increase over 2019/20's actual N\$140-m expenditure when it accounted for 3.5% of the N\$3.96-b total in seventh place.

In 2020/21, Vote 13's initial N\$209.3-m CRI allocation was a 16.7% or near-N\$30-m increase over 2019/20's revised N\$179.3-m,

before it was reduced by 10.26% or N\$21.47-m to N\$187.85-m midyear for the remainder of 2020/21.

In 2019/20, Vote 13 was amongst the worst-affected when its initial N\$296-m allocation for construction, renovations and improvements was reduced by 48.5% or N\$143.7-m to N\$152.5-m midyear, its share of the overall CRI budget dropping three places from 5.65% in sixth place to 3.4% in eighth place.

At the beginning of 2019/20, Vote 13 was one of only seven votes with a reduced allocation for construction, renovations and improvements, amounting to a severe downgrade to N\$296-m for renovations and building new health infrastructure by 19% (N\$70-m) from 2018/19's N\$366-m.

This downgrade to N\$296-m for 2019/20 has now been improved by more than half to N\$140-m actual expenditure in the 2021/22 budget book.

### Agriculture & Land Reform

**C**reated in 2020/21, Vote 37 (Agriculture & Land Reform), lies in fifth place on construction ladder this year, with N\$165.235-m, accounting for 5.3% of the N\$3.1-b CRI total.

This is N\$4.7-m or 2.77% less than 2020/21's revised N\$170-m, when it accounted for 4.26% of the N\$3.987-b CRI total, its N\$170-m allocation unaffected midyear, in sixth place.

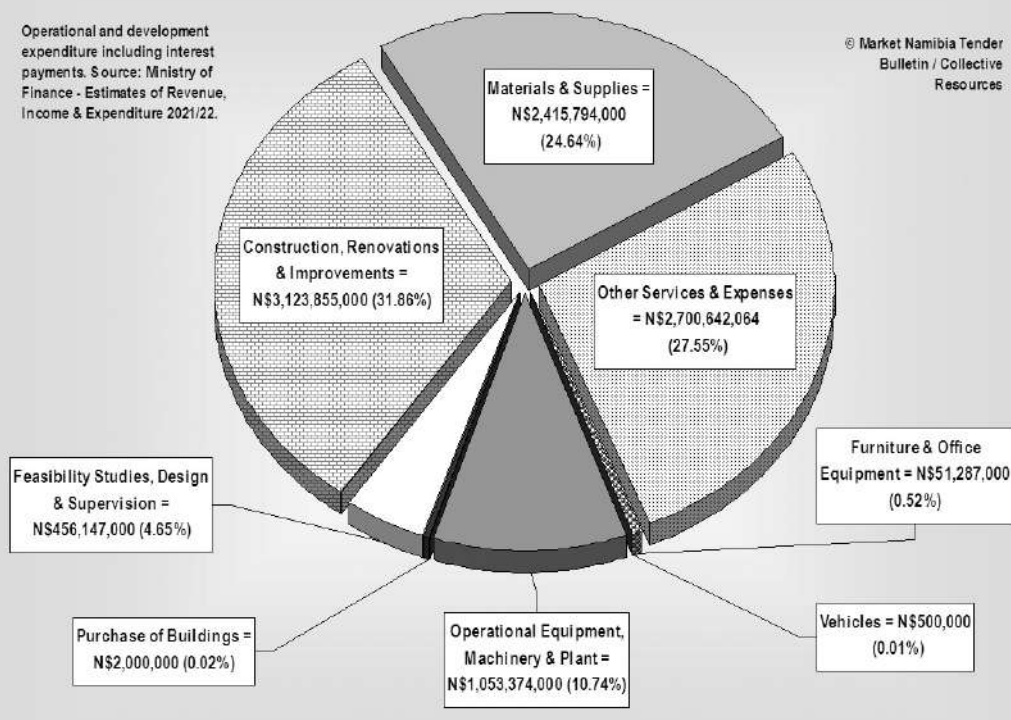
But these CRI allocations exclude the Water component, that was split off from the previous Vote 10 - Agriculture, Water & Forestry in 2020/21 (when Vote 10 became defunct).

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**Health & Social Services has the fourth-biggest construction allocation in 2021/22, with N\$265-m, accounting for 8.48% of the total – a considerable 41% increase over last year.**

**Agriculture & Land Reform has the fifth-biggest allocation of N\$165.235-m this year, accounting for 5.3% of the N\$3.1-b CRI total - 2.77% less than last year.**

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Combining the CRI allocations of the two votes (and ignoring the 'forestry' function that was combined with the Tourism Vote at the same time), the amounts for 2020/21 and the previous year are roughly in line with the former Agriculture, Water & Forestry (Vote 20)'s 18.85% share with N\$746.68-m or 2019/20's N\$3.96-b actual CRI expenditure.

Ignoring the 'forestry' function, the combined construction budgets of the new Agriculture & Land Reform (Vote 37) and Water (Vote 38) in their first year in 2020/21, amounted to N\$819.382-m initially and N\$859.4-m after midyear, accounting for just below 20% of the N\$4.1-b overall construction total at the beginning of the year.

Prior to its reconfiguration in 2020/21, Agriculture, Water & Forestry (Vote 20)'s N\$522.8-m (domestically-funded) construction budget at the beginning of 2019/20 had been a 28% or N\$202-m decrease on 2018/19's revised N\$725-m, its share of all construction spending declining from 16% to 9.98% at the beginning of 2019/20 before climbing to 11.3% post-midyear.

In 2019/20, (the now discontinued) Vote 20 dropped to third place from second in 2018/19 in terms of overall construction expenditure.

Its original N\$523-m (domestic) allocation in 2019/20 was reduced by N\$16.5-m or 3.2% to N\$506-m in October 2019's midyear reductions in third place.

#### Water

Separated from Agriculture, Water & Forestry (Vote 20) last year, the new Water Vote (38) has plunged from second place in its first year in 2020/21 to an insignificant number in 2021/22 – probably because the AfDB's

N\$1.893-b loan plus a N\$54-m grant for Namibia's 'Water Sector Support Program' has now kicked in, resulting in domestic funding for the water sector drying up.

The Water Vote (Vote 38) has only N\$33-m to spend on construction projects in 2021/22, accounting for 1.06% of the N\$3.1-b CRI total in tenth place, following a 95% or N\$656.3-m reduction on 2020/21's revised N\$689.44-m when it accounted for 17.3% of the N\$3.987-b CRI total in second place behind only the Transport Vote.

Its initial N\$649-m allocation in 2020/21 was supplemented midyear with a further N\$40-m for Covid-19 containment measures.

#### Defence

Defence (Vote 8) has N\$150.9-m to spend on construction in 2021/22, accounting for 4.8% of the N\$3.1-b CRI total in sixth place, following a N\$900,000 or 0.6% increase over its N\$150-m revised expenditure last year, accounting for 3.76% of the N\$3.987-b total in seventh place.

Its expenditure last year was 36% or N\$84.27-m below 2019/20's actual N\$234.27-m when it accounted for a higher 5.9% of the N\$3.96-b total in an even higher fourth place.

Initially ranked eighth last year, Defence's N\$155-m was reduced marginally by 3.2% or N\$5-m mid-year, its share of all construction expenditure falling marginally from 3.76% to 3.71%.

As was the case in 2020/21, it is the lowest-ranked vote with over

## No construction funds for

N\$100-m to spend on construction this year.

Because the Defence Vote was unaffected in 2019/20's midyear revisions, its relative share of the construction budget progressed from seventh at the beginning of the year to sixth.

Vote 8's N\$259-m construction budget at the beginning of 2019/20 was 25.6% (N\$53-m) more than 2018/19's N\$206.5%, giving it a 4.95% share of the N\$5.7-b CRI total in eighth place compared to 2019/20's 4.6% share in sixth place.

It progressed in relative terms, however, since then, with its original N\$206.5-m construction budget in 2018/19 also unaffected by mid-year reallocations, progressing from sixth place at the beginning of that year to fifth.

Its 6% share of all construction spending after 2018/19 midyear was an improvement on its initial 4.75% at the beginning of the year.

#### Environment, Forestry & Tourism

There are a further three votes with between N\$50-m and N\$100-m to spend on construction in 2021/22 (from four in 2020/21 and five at the beginning of that year), topmost of which is Vote 18 - as was the case last year.

Environment, Forestry & Tourism's N\$57.586-m CRI allocation this year accounting for 1.84% of the N\$3.131-b total is N\$14.6-m or 20.22% less than 2020/21's revised N\$72.2-m when it accounted for a smaller 1.81% share of the

N\$3.987-b total.

Its more than double allocation last year was N\$39.4-m or 120.4% more than 2019/20's N\$32.75-m when it accounted for only 0.83% of the N\$3.96-b CRI total.

Vote 18's much higher CRI allocation in 2020/21 was probably due to the addition of the forestry function it took over from Agriculture, Water & Forestry 18 that year.

#### Justice

Vote 16 has N\$55-m to spend on construction in 2021/22, accounting for 1.76% of the N\$3.1-b CRI total, following a 7% or N\$4.17-m reduction on last year's revised N\$59.3-m when it accounted for 1.5% of the N\$3.987-b CRI total.

This was 36.35% or N\$33.858-m less than 2019/20's actual N\$93.17-m expenditure, with a 2.35% share of the N\$3.96-b CRI total.

This falling allocation for construction is probably linked to the winding up of the Supreme Court building upgrade in Windhoek.

#### Mines & Energy

Vote 15's construction budget for 2021/22 is N\$51.1-m, accounting for 1.64% of the CRI total, following a 10.88% or N\$5-m increase on last year's revised N\$46.1-m when it accounted for 1.16% of the total, which had been a considerable 131.7% or N\$26.2-m increase over 2019/20's N\$19.985-m actual expenditure, with only a 0.5% share of the total.

Mines & Energy's initial N\$59-m CRI budget last year was reduced by 22.7% to N\$45.6-m midyear - still double its N\$23-m revised expenditure in 2019/20, since restated as an even lower N\$19.8-m in this year's budget.

## Urban & Rural Development

### Industrialisation & Trade

Vote 19's N\$47.6-m construction budget in 2021/22 accounting for 1.5% of the total is N\$5.6-m or 13.3% more than last year's revised N\$42-m (1.05% of the total), which had been 55.44% below 2019/20's actual N\$94.3-m, with a 2.38% share of the N\$3.96-b CRI total.

Its N\$42-m last year was below the N\$52-m at the time of 2020/21's midyear revisions.

Vote 19's N\$130.4-m CRI budget at the beginning of 2019/20 was 8.8% (N\$12.6-m) below 2018/19's N\$143-m when it enjoyed a 3.2% share of the overall CRI total in eighth place.

Its initial 2019/20 budget was slashed by N\$66-m or 50.6% midyear however, but has now been restated as N\$94-m actual expenditure.

### The presidency

The only remaining vote with over 1% of this year's depressed construction budget is the Office of the President (Vote 1), with N\$32.3-m (1.03% of the total) – a generous N\$9-m or 38.4% increase over 2020/21's revised N\$23.356-m (0.6%), following another generous 133.56% or N\$13.356-m over 2019/20's N\$10-m actual expenditure (0.25% of the total).

Discounting the reconfigured votes, there are ten with no allocations for construction, renovations and improvements in 2021/22 – the same ones as in the previous three years, except for Urban & Rural Development.

### No Urban & Rural Development

This is the first time in several years that Vote 17 has no budget for construction, renovations and improvements, which means there are no transfers through this vote to local and regional councils for housing infrastructure.

This is the only reasonable inference after scrutinizing the 2021/22 budget document, where not CRI allocations are to be found.

Finance minister Ipumbu Shiimi also maintained a deafening silence on this topic in his budget address.

Blame it on Covid-19?

This sudden and complete disappearance comes after Vote 17 ended 2020/21 with a revised N\$407-m on construction expenditure, accounting for 10.21% of the N\$3.987-b CRI total in third place.

This, in turn, had been a 138.5% or N\$236.3-m increase over 2019/20's N\$170.66-m actual construction expenditure, when it accounted for 4.3% of the N\$3.96-b total in sixth place.

Its initial N\$417.5-m allocation at the beginning of 2020/21 was 4.65% or N\$20.357-m less than 2019/20's revised N\$437.857-m – now grossly restated as only N\$170.66-m in this year's budget book.

At the time of 2020/21's midyear reallocations, Vote 17's CRI funding was reduced by N\$10.5-m or 2.5% to N\$407-m.

Urban & Rural Development's N\$552.4-m voted construction expenditure at the beginning of 2019/20 was a massive 399% (N\$441.6-m) increase over 2018/19's revised N\$111-m, placing it fourth with a

9.7% share of 2019/20's N\$5.7-b total compared to 2018/19's eventual 2.5% share in ninth place.

But according to 2019/20's midyear budget document, Urban & Rural Development started the year with N\$435-m – probably excluding foreign funding that was included in the original budget.

This was a less spectacular but still enormous 293% increase over 2018/19's revised N\$111-m, when it had a 2.5% share compared to 2019/20's restated 8.3% originally.

Vote 17 was unaffected by 2019/20's midyear adjustments, but its share of the construction total climbed to 9.7% in fourth place.

At the beginning of 2018/19, Vote 17 was the bottom ranked out of only nine votes with more than N\$100-m to spend on construction, suffering a 30% reduction of its N\$110.8-m allocation to N\$77.8-m.

But according to the 2019/20 budget, it retained its N\$110.8-m allocation, negating 2018/19's midyear cutback.

Urban & Rural Development had no budget for construction in 2016/17, 2015/16 or 2014/15 – so 2018/19's 400% increase made up for a lot of lost ground.

All those years of zero allocations for public housing services infrastructure were supposed to be filled through municipal budgets, but degenerated into localized patronage networks enriching connected property developers instead of delivering affordable housing for

low-income residents.

A second desalination plant "must" be built on Namibia's central coastline, in order to realize the government's vision to establish Walvis Bay and Swakopmund as regional logistics hubs and shift more development from the interior to the coast, according to Minister of Agriculture, Water & Land Reform, Calle Schlettwein.

During the launch of the upgrade of the (almost 50 year old) 76km Kuiseb Collector 2 - Schwarzekuppe - Swakopmund pipeline to be completed by 2023, Schlettwein said: "Investors do not react to promises but to factual situations. That is why we say the desalination plant is no longer a contention, it is a reality."

A suitable site between Swakopmund and Henties Bay has already been identified, according to the minister.

In addition to the pipeline, NamWater has also commenced with other projects in the region estimated at over N\$200-m, including boreholes, new pipelines and reservoirs.

The water utility had invested in excess of N\$1-b For over the past ten years to create and upgrade the water infrastructure in the region, Schlettwein said during his familiarisation tour of the coast.

Namwater CEO Abraham Nehemia, said at the same occasion that the pipeline was part of the project to interlink the three available sources of water supplying the coastal towns and mines: the Kuiseb Delta, Omaruru Delta and desalination.

## PPP for the new plant

The new desalination plant is to be built close to the existing Orano Desalination Plant near Wlotzkasbaken with new technologies. Both plants are needed to secure water supply in the long term.

Without going into detail, Schlettwein indicated that the new plant was a 'large project' and would be done through a Public Private Partnership, leveraging private capital and roping in private operational capacity, while Namwater would retain ownership of the water.

## The Namibian government is seeking public private partners to build a second desalination plant along the central coastline at an estimated N\$3.5 billion, including a water supply corridor to the interior, with a timeline of at least ten years.

Plans would be drawn up and completed as soon as possible, he promised.

The minister confirmed that the feasibility study for the construction of the new plant in the Erongo Region had been completed and showed that the project was viable.

Earlier reports indicate that the feasibility study was conducted by an Austrian company, ILF Engineering Consultants, together with local consultants Lund Consulting Engineers.

The study concluded that it was advisable to build another modern desalination plant instead of expanding the existing Arvea plant.

## Over N\$3.5-billion to implement the new plant

The second desalination plant and infrastructure would cost over N\$3.5-billion (US\$30.5-million) to implement, according to a draft feasibility report presented at a stakeholder workshop earlier this year.

The estimated cost includes the plant, transmission infrastructure and power supply to deliver over 36.5-million cubic metres annually.

According to Namwater spokesperson Johannes Shigwedha, the project could be implemented in phases, with the first phase costing about N\$2.5-billion to produce 20-million m<sup>3</sup> p.a.

The coastal mines consume about 50% (12-million cubic metres annually) of the current water supply in the region, while the rest is consumed by the coastal towns.

Statistics show that by 2050, the annual water demand for the coastal areas will increase to about 36-million m<sup>3</sup>, while Windhoek and en-route users will then need about 32-million m<sup>3</sup> annually.

## Partnering with Botswana and Sardarov

Namibia is also exploring the

option of partnering with Botswana on the project to extend the desalinated water pipeline into the neighbouring country. No agreements with Botswana are yet in place, however.

Botswana President Mokgweetsi Masisi, had visited Namibia in February to meet a 'potential investor' offering to desalinate water from the Atlantic Ocean.

The identity of the potential investor was confirmed only a few days later as Russian billionaire Rashid Sardarov, whose company Comsar Properties SA was allowed in 2018 to lease four farms of 17,000ha (valued at N\$43-m) in Namibia over 99 years. The Russian oligarch was invited by State House to present his investment proposal to the two heads of state - to the surprise of some cabinet ministers.

President Hage Geingob had stated publicly over the years that he would not deal with potential investors directly, in order to promote transparency. Investors should deal with the line ministries or concerned government agencies instead.

After Sardarov's presentation, the matter was referred to technical committees, according to the Namibian presidential spokesperson Alfredo Hangari.

## The Areva / Orano plant

Schlettwein also recently undertook a familiarisation visit to the Orano Desalination Plant, built by Areva for its Trekkopje Mine - which is under care and maintenance - and is operated by Orano Mining and Nafasi Water.

The plant was upgraded during the past years to deliver over 2,000m<sup>3</sup> per hour, augmenting Namwater's supply to the coastal mines.

Areva had offered to sell the plant to the government already in 2012, but was turned down in 2016.

Orano then spent the last five years again negotiating with the Namibian government to purchase its plant for N\$3-billion, which was again rejected.

The Areva plant was commissioned in 2013, with a design capacity of 54,800 m<sup>3</sup>/day. It has the capacity to increase its output from 20-million m<sup>3</sup> to 45-million m<sup>3</sup> annually.

In 2018, Namwater was still looking at the appointment of a transaction advisor to assist the water utility in the potential acquisition of the Areva desalination plant through an EOI that had closed on 27-Nov-18.

At the time, Areva, under a temporary water supply agreement, was delivering just over 12-million m<sup>3</sup> per annum to Namwater, which sold the desalinated water mainly to adjacent uranium mines (*Bulletin 1277*).

## Catering for the coast and central Namibia

As part of the EIA process for the proposed desalination plant and water carriage system with booster pumps and reservoirs, Namwater and Environmental Assessment Practitioner SLR Environmental Consulting, on 21-Apr-21 placed a notice in the local media that interested and affected parties could inspect the Draft Scoping Report (DSR) for the project.

According to the DSR, the new plant would be erected close to Mile 6 north of Swakopmund and secure water supply from the desalination plant to the Central Coastal Area (Swakopmund, Henties Bay and Arandis) and en-route users (Usakos, Karibib & Okahandja) to Windhoek via a 350km water pipeline and support infrastructure along the B2 highway.

Electricity for the pumping infrastructure was envisaged through solar PV plants.

The EIA notice stated that

## N\$56-M ROAD FUND ADMIN TENDER CANCELLED

02 JULY 2021

The Central Procurement Board of Namibia has cancelled its tender for the automation of the Road Fund Administration's Mass Distance Charges seven months after it had closed.

Tender G/OIB/CPBN-01/2020 closed on 30 September last year after it was issued by the CPB on behalf of the RFA.

According to the CPB's website, the Board accepted the Bid Evaluation Committee's recommendation on 26 May to cancel tender.

The tender was extended from the initial closing date of 05-Jun-20 as advertised in *Die Republieke* on 06-Mar-20.

## Seven months after it closed, the tender for automation of Mass Distance Charges is cancelled after all three bidders were found to be non-compliant

Almost seven months after the submission deadline, the CPB posted a cancellation notice, to which the wrong PDF document was initially attached.

The cancellation was made in terms of Section 54(1)(a) of the Public Procurement Act 15 of 2015 [this section deals with the cancellation of the bidding process if all bids are non-responsive].

The CPB had invited Open International Bidding tenders on behalf of the Road Fund Administration in line with Section 30 of the Public Procurement Act 15 of

2015.

According to the Executive Summary of the Bid Evaluation Report, the cost estimate was N\$56,300,550 including VAT.

But none of the technical or financial offers submitted were considered, because all three bids were found to be non-responsive on Stage 1(b) of the evaluation 'Substantial Responsiveness'.

Technical offers had to be submitted separately from the financial offers, which were published in *Bulletin 1374*.

Reasons for non-compliance of

all three tenderers were provided by the CPB as follows:

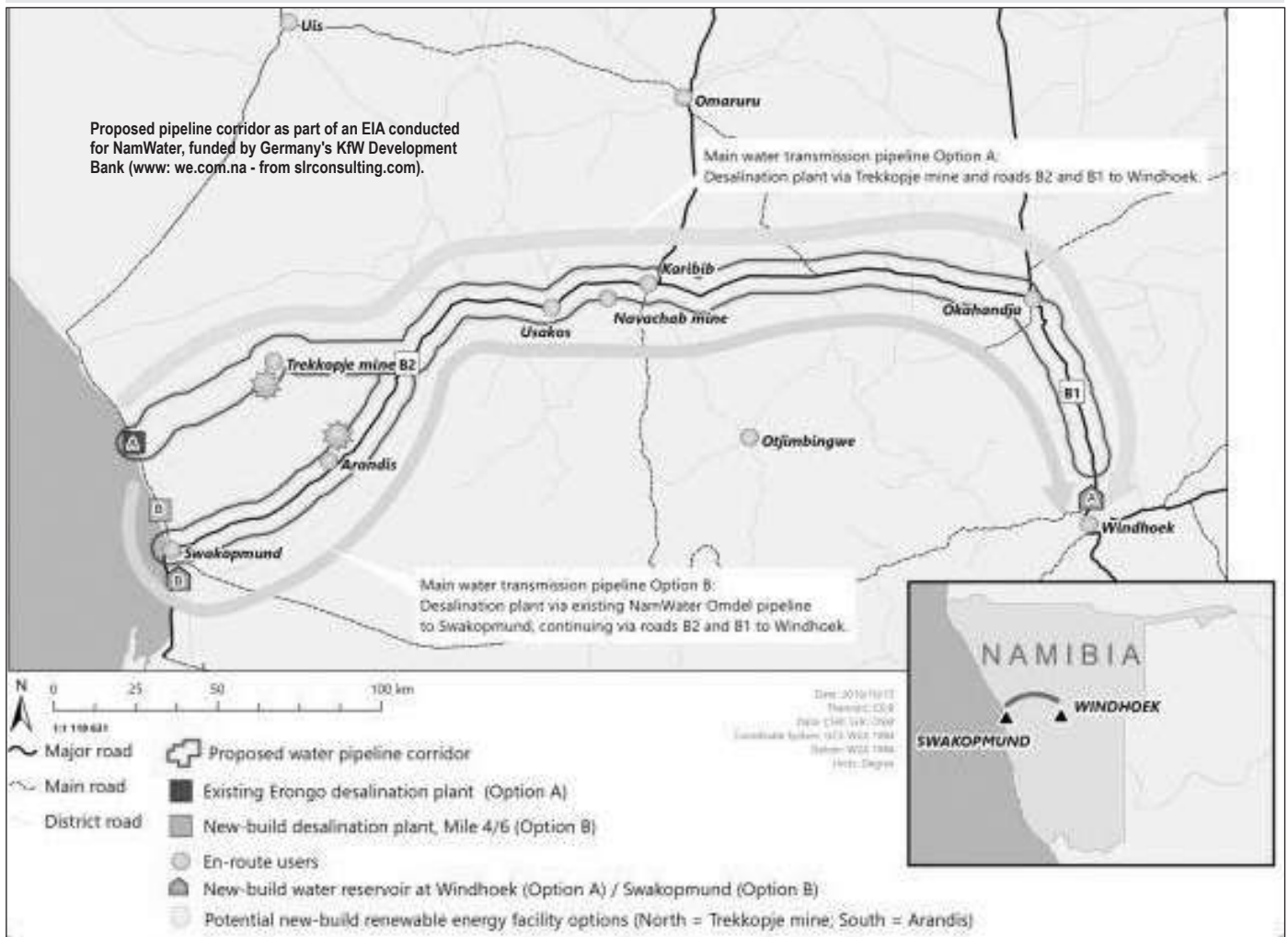
- \* Benzel & Partners Investments (BPI) Information Technologies (Pty) Ltd - no relevant information was reflected on the Form 2.4.10 submitted;
- \* Green Enterprise Solutions / National Toll Payment Services JV - did not submit letter from bank as per C23 under Financial Resources;
- \* Shine Technologies / Picobyte (New Zealand) / Protoclear (South Africa) joint venture - SPP (Pty) Ltd - bidder does not have experience in financial toll systems as required in Item C35 under 'specific experience'.

# DROP TO DRINK FOR THE NEXT DECADE



Namwater was proposing to develop the second desalination plant and water carriage system to secure water supply to the CCA and central Namibia.

The application for an environmental clearance certificate had already been submitted to the MAWF, which will ultimately be submitted to the Ministry of Environment, Forestry & Tourism, the EIA Process notice stated.

The deadline to submit comments / issues to be included in the final report was 21-May-21.

The project's planning phase could only commence after an extensive EIA had been conducted, whereafter the design, financing and procurement processes could commence, the DSR stated in April.

A Namwater source speculated that it would take at least ten years before citizens of the capital would taste desalinated water in their taps (*The Namibian*, 11-Jun-21; *New Era* 09-Jun-21; *The Namibian* 08-Jun-21; *New Era* 07-Jun-21; *Namib Times* 23-Apr-21; *Die Republiek* 21-Apr-21; *The Namibian* 04-Mar-21; *The Namibian* 03-Mar-21; *Namib Times* 26-Feb-21; *Die Republiek* 05-Jan-21).

## The EIA tender

Tender SC/OIB/NW-01/2018 for the pre-qualification of consultants for consulting services to conduct a feasibility study for the desalination plant and water carriage system to secure water supply to central coast, Windhoek and en-route users,

closed on 06-Oct-17.

Namwater was assigned by the Ministry of Agriculture, Water & Forestry as Project Executing Agency.

Funds for this project were secured through a N\$19.5-m KfW Development Bank grant on behalf of the German Government.

The objective of this feasibility study was meant to delineate the future water demand in the project areas, to assess the long-term availability of conventional and non-conventional water resources and to develop and design a comprehensive project concept that allows the substitution of future water deficits through a suitable seawater desalination and pipeline transfer scheme from the Atlantic coast to Windhoek.

According to the tender notice, the technical, technological, environmental, economic and financial results and recommendations of the study would assist the Namibian authorities to decide if, how and when the implementation of such a project would be feasible.

The target group of the project comprises "all people, commerce, administration and industry living in or being situated in Windhoek", the central coastal towns and communities located next to the planned transmission pipeline.

The current population in the region was about 445,000 but was expected to increase to about 1.08 million by 2045.

The planned project is of strategic importance for the Namibian water sector. The essential aspects

and main components of the project were stated as:

- assessment of long-term availability of existing water resources;
- analysis of current water consumption patterns and projection of future water demand;
- assessment of the work performance of the existing Areva desalination plant;
- evaluation of alternative desalination plant options under consideration of RO, MED and MSF technologies;
- status quo analysis of existing water transfer schemes along the coast and preparation of concepts for future integration;
- elaboration of concepts for solar power generation and/or energy supply through the national grid for the long-term operation of the desalination and water transmission scheme;
- planning and design of optimized technical, management and operation concepts for the required desalination plant and energy supply infrastructure and the pipeline transmission system from the coast to Windhoek;
- Environmental and Social Impact Assessment study;
- cost estimate, financial and sensitivity analyses and tariff study (details from *Bulletin* 1218).

Twelve offers were received when the EIA tender closed on 06-Oct-17 (names were published in *Bulletin* 1225).

## Tendering history since 1996

Namibia had planned to build a desalination plant since 1996, when an earlier feasibility study was completed.

This was followed by various rounds of tendering:

\* In **Nov-07** Namwater launched a pilot study with Rostek Associ-

ates of Florida as consultants; pre-qualified bidders were announced in Dec-07 but this tender was subsequently cancelled.

\* In **2007** the Tender Board also issued a Ministry of Works tender for a planned desalination plant at Möwe Bay - on behalf of the Ministry of Environment & Tourism.

\* Namwater issued two tenders in **Sep-08** for the EIA and EMP plans; this was awarded to CSIR of South Africa in **Nov-09**.

\* An EOI issued jointly by Namwater and the Ministry of Agriculture, Water & Forestry for financing and investing in the desalination plant closed in **Mar-09**, for which preferred bidders were short-listed before the process was put on hold again.

\* the Tender Board of Namibia issued another government tender for a desalination plant at Mile 7 to run over 20 years with Namwater as 30% shareholder under F1/18/1-1/2011, calling for the supply of desalinated water on a build, operate, own and transfer (BOOT) basis for the MAWF, that closed on **20-May-11**. The financial bids of seven companies were announced on **29-Jun-12**, but the tender was cancelled on **13-Feb-14** because all three short-listed companies had allegedly deviated from the technical details.

At the time, Germany had offered to build a desalination plant at the coast at no cost to the Namibian government, which was not accepted.

Details of the project history were published in *Bulletin* 1225.

The Central Procurement Board of Namibia cancelled its tender for the Anixas II power station in Walvis Bay on 16-Apr-21, according to a notice posted on its website, after EOI tender W/EOI/CPBN-01/2020 for the procurement of a contractor for the Engineering, Procurement and Construction of Anixas II Power Station in Walvis Bay had closed on 19-Oct-20.

The CPB had invited EOIs on behalf of NamPower in line with Section 35(2) of the Public Procurement Act 15 of 2015.

The CPB then informed all bidders on 16-Apr-21 that the procurement process was cancelled in line with the Review Panel decision of 24-Feb-21, which directed that the procurement proceeding be "terminated and started afresh". This followed a virtual meeting held by CPB with participating bidders on 07-Apr-21.

The nine EOIs received on 19-Oct-20 were published in *Bulletin* 1378.

On 05-Feb-21 the CPB posted on its website the four Chinese companies that had qualified for the next, 'Restricted Bidding' stage of tendering for NamPower's N\$1-b Anixas II 50MW project power station – all with Namibian firms as junior partners (details and scope of work were published in *Bulletin*

On 28-May-21, NamPower published its own invitation to bid in the local media under tender W/OIB/NPWR-03/2021 for the procurement of a contractor for the Engineering, Procurement and Construction (EPC) of the Anixas II Power Station. This 'Open International Bidding' tender closes on 03-Sep-21.

The successful contractor is expected to engineer, procure and construct a 50MW dual fuel Internal Combustion Reciprocating Engine (ICRE) power station on a turnkey basis in Walvis Bay.

It is not clear why NamPower was allowed to conduct its own procurement for such a high-value project without going through the CPB.

According to the Public Procurement Act 15 of 2015 the procurement threshold for Category 1 state entities such as Namport should not exceed N\$25-m for goods, N\$35-m for works, N\$20-m for consultancy services and N\$15-m for non-consultancy services.

# STATE MEDICAL AID SCHEME STILL ON CRUTCHES

02 JULY 2021

The Central Procurement Board has approved the Ministry of Finance's request to extend the contract for the administration of the Public Service Employees Medical Aid Scheme (PSEMAS) from 01 July 2021 until 31 March next year.

Under 'CPB decisions', the Board's website reports that it had approved a request by the Ministry of Finance for an extension of Tender FI/17-6/2009 for the administration of the state medical aid scheme on 20-May-21.

PSEMAS has been administered by Methealth Namibia Administrators after its merger with NamHealth in September 2003. In 2010 Methealth was awarded another new five-year contract to continue administering the government medical aid scheme. The contract was again extended until 31-Mar-20 after it was supposed to have expired on 30-Apr-19.

PSEMAS has been running at a deficit since 2016 with average yearly shortfalls of N\$400-m. The budget for PSEMAS was N\$8.5-b over the four years from 2015 to 2019, with an additional N\$1.7-b to cover annual shortfalls.

For the 2019/20 financial year, the Fund was allocated N\$2.7-b. Government expenditure on PSEMAS, accounting for about 1.4% of Namibia's GDP and 3.8% of government expenditure.

## All six bids non-responsive

On 02-Dec-20 CPBN Chairperson Patrick Swartz had informed tenderers that the procurement process for the hotly contested contract for the administration of the Public Service Medical Aid Scheme had

been cancelled because all bids were "non-responsive".

When the Open National Bidding tender NCS/ONB/CPBN-03/2020 issued on behalf of the Ministry of Finance closed at the CPB on 23-Sep-20, six offers were received from N\$140-m to N\$537-m – with one bid of N\$2.2-b – for the four-year contract period.

The submission deadline was extended several times from 22-Jul-20 and some specifications were changed in September last year.

According to the Executive Summary of the CPB Bid Evaluation Report dated 19-Nov-20, the estimated cost for the PSEMAS administration contract was N\$302,138,548.

None of bidders made it past Stage 1 of the bid evaluation because the mandatory documents were found to be non-responsive. As a result, the financial offers were not considered (details were published in *Bulletin* 1381 & 1369).

The reasons for non-compliance stated in the CPB Executive Summary are summarised below.

\* **Keyplot Investments (Pty) Ltd** = N\$139,919,752.35.

The company is 100% owned by the United Africa Group but no company documents were submitted for UAG nor CVs, qualifications and proof of HPCN registration for

essential personnel.

\* **NamHealth Administrator / Prosperity Health Namibia / Prosperity Africa Holding JV** = N\$298,629,204 - NamHealth (Pty) Ltd. This is a joint venture between Prosperity Afrika Holdings (Pty) Ltd (50%) and Prosperity Health Namibia (Pty) Ltd (20%).

According to the registration documents three entities hold 10% each in the JV: Donor Investment (Pty) Ltd, Kalahari Holdings (Pty) Ltd and National Youth Service.

Joint ventures were not allowed as per ITB 5.4. Certain obligatory documents for each JV entity were also missing.

\* **Prime Health Namibia (Pty) Ltd** = N\$355,899,516. This entity is owned by several ruling party-linked organizations:

- \* Namibia National Teachers Union (9%),
- \* Namibian Cultural & Tourism Village Management Company (Pty) Ltd (7%),
- \* Trading Enterprise cc (1%),
- \* Tulongeni Trading Enterprise (15%),

This is a JV, where 20% of the shareholding is vested with a foreign shareholder, Vivat Health Solutions from Zimbabwe and is therefore not compliant with Section 29(a) of the PPA, since joint ventures were not allowed as per ITB 5.4. Vivat also did not submit some obligatory documents.

\* **Amalgamated Fund Administrators Namibia (Pty) Ltd** = N\$536,898,936.

The company is owned by Associated Fund Administrators Botswana (Pty) Ltd (40% shareholding) and Namibian entities Tulive Reinsurance Brokers (Pty) Ltd (25%), Impala Health Services (25%) and Herbage Investment cc (15) [this adds up to 105%]. 40% foreign shareholding is not acceptable in terms of Section 29(a) of PPA. Tulive has a non-Namibian shareholder - Meklit S Demamu. Ownership of two trusts could not be ascertained.

\* **Maungo Consultancy cc t/a Gomed** = N\$2,204,160,000 excluding VAT. This is a JV consisting of:

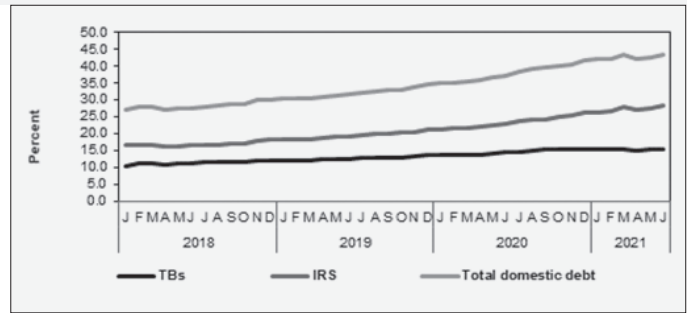
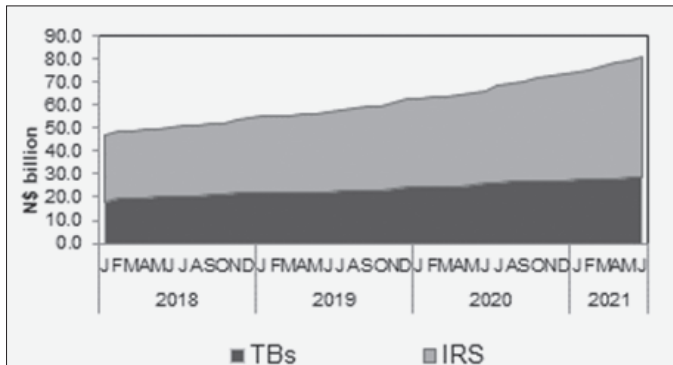


# DOMESTIC GOVERNMENT DEBT UP 22.3% TO N\$81-B

02 JULY 2021  
Namibia's domestic government debt reached N\$81 billion in June, according to the Bank of Namibia's latest monthly report.

The increase reflects a

growth of 1.9% from the previous month, as a result of both Internal Registered Stock (IRS) and Treasury Bills issued during the month, which rose by 2.4% and 0.9% respectively to N\$52.5-b and N\$28.5-b.



On an annual basis, domestic debt increased by 22.3% due to an increase in the issuance of both IRS and TBs, which rose by 30.3% and 9.9% respectively.

Two new bonds were floated during the month under review - the fixed-rate GC48 and inflation-linked GI27.

As percentage of GDP,

domestic debt increased both monthly and annually at the end of Jun 2021 by 0.8 percentage point month-on-month to 43.5%. On an annual basis, the ratio of domestic debt to GDP rose by 6.2 percentage points, reflecting increased ratios of both IRSs and TBs to GDP of 5.5 percentage points and 0.7 percentage point, respectively.
