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## Building consultants make a comeback

CONSULTANTS IN NAMIBIA'S PUBLIC CONSTRUCTION SECTOR HAVE RECEIVED A WELCOME REPRIEVE WITH THE CENTRAL GOVERNMENT'S NATIONAL BUDGET INCREASE FOR FEASIBILITY STUDIES, DESIGN AND SUPERVISION BY 70.5% TO OVER N\$456 MILLION IN 2021/22 - REVERSING LAST YEAR'S EIGHT-YEAR LOW OF N\$267.6-M TO A SIX-YEAR HIGH. - PAGE 2

## EXPERTS BID ON PLANNING N\$2-B WATER PROJECTS IN THE NORTH

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The handsome increase in voted expenditure on feasibility studies, design and supervision in 2021/22 goes some way in compensating for the recent contractions in FSDS allocations, considering that its latest revised N\$267.58-m for 2020/21 was N\$138-m or 34% below 2019/20's actual N\$405.5-m.

Consultants in Namibia's public construction sector have received a welcome reprieve with the central government's national budget increase for feasibility studies, design and supervision by 70.5% to over N\$456 million in 2021/22 – reversing last year's eight-year low of N\$267.6-m to a

six-year high.

Despite the enormous increase, this year's N\$456-m FSDS budget is still only two-thirds 2015/16's N\$749-m, which was the highest since 2013/14.

Nevertheless, this year's 70.47% or N\$188.567-m increase in voted expenditure for feasibility studies, design & supervision in

## Building consultants

2021/22 is by far the biggest within central government procurement spending this year, which has suffered a 17% decrease, with sharp reductions in current procurement as well as construction and development expenditure, alongside an insignificant increment in capital procurement spending.

From last year's revised N\$267.58-m when it accounted for only 2.27% of the N\$11.8-b procurement total, voted FSDS expenditure has risen to N\$456-m, more than doubling its share

to 4.65% of 2021/22's N\$9.8-b procurement total – in fifth place out of eight procurement spending categories.

Also welcome, is the far higher increase in FSDS expenditure in the education and health clusters this year, compared to the administrative, economic and security clusters.

Last year's N\$267.58-m revised expenditure on feasibility studies, design and supervision (2020/21) was an eight-year low compared to actual expenditures of:

- \* N\$405.5-m in 2019/20;
- \* N\$385-m in 2018/19;
- \* N\$354.6-m in 2017/18;
- \* N\$398-m in 2016/17;
- \* N\$749-m in 2015/16;
- \* N\$613.4-m in 2014/15; and
- \* N\$400.775-m in 2013/14.

### Procurement expenditure in 2021/22

Namibia's central government has slashed its procurement budget from an all-time high of N\$11.8 billion last year, by over 17% or N\$2-b to N\$9.8-b in 2021/22.

The 17.2% reduction in procurement expenditure is far higher than the 5.76% reduction in the national budget to N\$68-b from 2010/21's revised N\$72-b and the 0.77% reduction in central government's personnel expenditure to N\$28.46-b from last year's revised N\$28.68-b, both of which are in sharp contrast to the 9.85% increase in debt servicing costs to N\$8.5-b from last year's revised N\$7.7-b.

As a share of procurement, current operational expenditure has increased by 11 percentage points over the past three years – from 38% to 49%, compared to operational capex, which has increased by only 0.4 percentage points from 7.2% to 7.6%.

In sharp contrast to procurement spending's miserable 1.12% average annual increase over the past nine years, government's debt servicing costs have ballooned by 41.35% annually, overall budget expenditure by 5%, government remuneration by 6.55%, accompanied by a 2.8% average annual decline in domestically-funded development expenditure, which has fallen by 14% to N\$5.55-b in 2021/22 from last year's revised N\$6.456-b.

There are eight heads of procurement spending:

- \* Construction, renovations and improvements (CRI) and feasibility studies, design and supervision (FSDS) are both channelled entirely through the development budget.
- \* Expenditure on materials and supplies (M&S) and other services and expenses (OSE) are items of consumption spending, provided for mostly as part of current operational expenditure, but with some allocations channelled through the development budget to specific projects.
- \* Expenditure on operational equipment, machinery and plant (OEMP), furniture and office equipment (FOE) and vehicles (V) is classified as capital expenditure under the operational budget, with some allocations to

specific development projects.

Since 2019/20, the budget has itemized 'purchase of buildings' - as part of development expenditure.

\* Although the N\$3.124-b 2021/22 budget for construction, renovations and improvements accounts for the - usual - biggest share of procurement expenditure, it is at a nine-year low and suffered the second-most severe reduction of all procurement categories on last year's revised expenditure (after 'other services and expenses').

\* 'Other services and expenses' has the second-biggest share of 2021/22's procurement budget with N\$2.7-b, accounting for 27.55% of the procurement total after a 35.44% decrease on last year - the biggest reduction within the procurement budget.

\* The 2021/22 budget for materials and supplies totals N\$2.4-b in third place, accounting for 24.6% of procurement expenditure - a 3.24% increase on last year.

\* N\$1.05-b has been voted for operational equipment, machinery and plant in 2021/22, accounting for 10.7% of the procurement budget in fourth place, after a 9.95% increase over last year.

\* Voted expenditure for feasibility studies, design and supervision has been increased by 70.47% to N\$456-m, more than doubling its share to 4.65% of 2021/22's procurement total, in fifth place.

\* N\$51.3-m voted for furniture and office equipment (including ICT) in 2021/22 accounts for a dismal 0.24% of the procurement budget, following a 26% reduction on last year.

\* N\$500,000 budgeted for vehicle purchases in 2021/22 is an 11% increase over last year's revised all-time low of N\$450,000.

\* N\$2-m has been voted for the purchase of buildings in 2021/22 is 94% less than last year's revised N\$35.6-m.

## Fluctuating FSDS fortunes

The handsome increase in voted expenditure on feasibility studies, design and supervision in 2021/22 goes some way in compensating for the recent contractions in FSDS allocations, considering that its latest revised N\$267.58-m for 2020/21 was N\$138-m or 34% below 2019/20's actual N\$405.5-m, according to 2021/22's budget book.

And here too, FSDS has a lower turnout for last year than at the time of 2020/21's midyear revisions, which increased its allocation to a slightly higher N\$275.3-m (than N\$267.58-m reflected in this year's budget).

At the time of 2020/21's midyear revisions, the N\$17.7-m or 6% cut-back in expenditure on feasibility studies, design and supervision

from N\$293-m to N\$275.3-m, reduced its share of the procurement budget from 2.57% to 2.33%.

Feasibility studies, design and supervision had its lowest allocation of N\$267.58-m in eight years in 2020/21, accounting for its smallest, 2.3% share of overall procurement spending over the eight-year period to 2013/14.

In 2020/21, FSDS suffered a severe 34% reduction to N\$267.58-m from 2019/20's actual N\$405-m, its share of procurement expenditure almost halving from 4.3% of N\$9.3-b to 2.3% of 2020/21's revised N\$11.8-b.

It was also the procurement spending head with the biggest reduction on 2019/20 and the only one with a reduced ceiling in 2020/21 - in addition to construction (and less importantly, vehicles).

In 2019/20, FSDS expenditure was increased by 4.3% from N\$571.9-m to N\$596.7-m midyear its 5.12% share of the initial N\$11.2-b procurement total, increasing marginally to 5.18% of the lowered N\$10.2-b total in 2019/20 - still in fifth place.

FSDS's updated actual expenditure

**Education, Arts & Culture retained its second-biggest allocation for FSDS in 2021/22, with N\$86.9-m accounting for 19% of the N\$456-m total - a 51% increase over last year's revised N\$57.57-m when it accounted for a higher 21.5% of the total.**

in 2019/20 has fallen even further to N\$405-m (from N\$464-m at the midyear), compared to N\$385-m recorded as actual spending in 2018/19.

Its initial mild 4.33% increase in 2019/20 to N\$572-m was little compensation for its 52% lower allocation on 2018/19's further revised N\$1.2-b - its biggest allocation since independence which turned out to be a damp squib at only N\$385-m actual expenditure.

The expenditure ceiling for FSDS in 2017/18 was slashed by N\$316.3-m or 27% midyear to N\$872.5-m, however, reducing its share of procurement spending to 9.2% of the revised N\$9.446-b procurement total.

Despite the lowered expenditure ceiling for FSDS post-midyear to a 9.2% share of procurement spending from 11.6% at the beginning of the year, FSDS retained its fourth place in 2017/18 - repeated the following year, before dropping to fifth.

However, 2020/21's initial N\$293-m voted for FSDS was the lowest over the past eight years prior to 2021/22 and less than half its all-time N\$749-m high in terms of actual expenditure in 2015/16, when it accounted for 9.5% of that year's N\$7.9-b actual procurement total.

This was a 22% increase over

**As usual, Transport (Vote 24) has the lion's share of the FSDS budget in 2021/22, with N\$271.9-m accounting for 59.6% of the N\$456-m total - more than double its N\$119.376-m revised expenditure last year.**

2014/15's N\$613.4-m actual FSDS total, accounting for 4.42% of that year's N\$13.87-b procurement budget, which had been a 53% increase over 2013/14's N\$400-m (actual) when it accounted for 4.48% of the N\$8.945-b procurement total.

From 2015/16's high, FSDS actual expenditure plunged by 46.86% to N\$398-m the following year - 4.86% of the N\$8.2-b procurement total.

It then declined by a further 10.9% in 2017/18 to N\$354.6-m, accounting for 3.24% of N\$11-b procurement expenditure.

There are thirteen votes with allocations for feasibility studies, design and supervision in 2021/22, compared to only ten last year and twelve in 2019/20.

## Transport

As usual, Transport (Vote 24) has the lion's share of the FSDS budget, with N\$271.9-m accounting for 59.6% of the N\$456.147-m total.

This more than double its N\$119.376-m revised expenditure last year - 127.8% or N\$152.56-m more to be precise.

Its revised 2020/21 expenditure accounted for 44.6% of the N\$267.58-m FSDS total and followed a 57.5% or N\$161.7-m reduction on 2019/20's N\$281.1-m actual expenditure, when it accounted for 69% of the N\$405.5-m total.

Its initial N\$359.4-m budget for FSDS in 2019/20 was 4.78% higher than 2018/19's revised N\$343-m and accounted for 62.8% of the N\$572-m total, compared to 2018/19's 34.8% of N\$872.5-b in second place when Urban & Rural Development - unusually - had the biggest share with 49%.

Transport's initial N\$343-m FSDS allocation in 2018/19 was a healthy 63% increase over 2017/

18's revised N\$210.68-m, when it had a 57% share of the N\$369.6-m total (unchanged from its original allocation at the beginning of that year), accounting for 56.4% of the total N\$373.3-m.

## Education, Arts & Culture

Vote 10 retained its second-biggest allocation for feasibility studies, design and supervision in 2021/22, with N\$86.9-m accounting for 19% of the N\$456-m total.

This is a generous 51% increase over 2020/21's revised N\$57.57-m when it accounted for a higher 21.5% of N\$267.58-m, which had been a 35% increase over 2019/20's N\$42.67-m actual expenditure, accounting for only 10.5% of the N\$405.5-m total.

Vote 10's N\$57.57-m FSDS expenditure in 2020/21 was in line with its original allocation, unaffected by 2020/21's midyear adjustments.

Its FSDS allocation at the beginning of 2020/21 was N\$7.123-m or 14.12% more than its revised N\$50.4-m in 2019/20, now restated as a considerably lower N\$42.67-m.

Vote 10 started 2019/20 with a N\$69-m expenditure ceiling for FSDS, restated as N\$100.2-m in the midyear budget (an extra N\$31.15-m), but has since evaporated into less than half, with N\$42.67-m, according to this year's budget (2021/22).

Its initial N\$69-m FSDS allocation in 2019/20's main budget tabled at the beginning of the year had been 38% higher than 2018/19's revised N\$50-m.

Education was the only vote with a lower revised FSDS allocation for 2018/19 than its original ceiling, the difference being N\$1.54-m.

Its original N\$51.64-m in 2018/19 accounted for 4.3% of the N\$1.2-b FSDS total and only 2.05% higher than 2017/18's N\$50.6-m.

## Health & Social Services

In third place, Health & Social Services (Vote 13) has N\$55-m to spend on feasibility studies, design and supervision in 2021/22 – more than double last year's revised N\$26-m.

The 111.4% increase raised its share of the FSDS total to 12% of this year's N\$456-m from 9.75% of 2020/21's N\$267.58-m.

But Vote 13's revised N\$26-m for last year is considerably less than the N\$42.8-m with which it started 2020/21, when it accounted for 14.5% of the N\$293-m total at the time – also in third place.

This allocation was slashed by N\$16.724-m or 39% midyear in October 2020 to N\$26-m however, reducing Vote 13's share to 9.5% in fourth place – behind the Police Vote.

This midyear reduction in Vote 13's FSDS allocation was one of only two and by far the biggest – compared to a N\$1-m reduction for the Office of the Prime Minister (Vote 2).

Health & Social Services' FSDS voted expenditure at the beginning of 2020/21 was a significant 19% or N\$6.8-m increase over 2019/20's revised N\$36-m, now restated as a lower N\$34-m actual expenditure in the 2021/22 budget.

In current terms, its revised N\$26-m FSDS expenditure in 2020/21 was 23.35% or N\$8-m below 2019/20's actual N\$34-m, its share of the FSDS total rising, however, from 8.4% of N\$405.5-m actual expenditure in 2019/20 to 9.75% of the following year's N\$267.58-m revised total.

Vote 13's eventual N\$34-m FSDS expenditure in 2019/20 turned out to be 55% lower than 2018/19's N\$75-m, when it also ranked third.

Its N\$75-m allocation at the beginning of 2018/19 amounted to a 54.2% increase or N\$26.4-m over 2017/18's N\$48.64-m.

## Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety & Security

Introduced this year, the new Vote 39, merging Home Affairs (Vote 5) and Safety & Security (Vote 6), has the fourth-biggest share of the budget for feasibility studies, design and supervision in 2021/22, with N\$12.15-m, accounting for 2.66% of the N\$456-m total.

This is a huge, 60.7% decrease from 2020/21's revised N\$30.56-m expenditure by the discontinued Safety & Security Vote (police and prisons), when it commanded 13% of the N\$267.58-m FSDS budget – which had been a 57.5% increase on 2019/20's N\$22-m, accounting for 5.4% of the N\$405.5-m total.

### The former Police Vote

In its final year as an independent vote, Safety & Security (Vote 6 – briefly renamed 'Police' last year, separated from Correctional Services) overtook Health & So-

cial Services (Vote 13) into third place midyear in 2020/21 after its N\$34.56-m FSDS allocation was left intact midyear, compared to a reduction in Health & Social Services (Vote 13)'s budget for feasibility studies, design and supervision by over 39% (see above).

Coming from nowhere, Police (Vote 6) was initially ranked fourth at the beginning of 2020/21, with its first FSDS allocation in several years – we were led to believe.

Its N\$34.56-m allocation in 2020/21 was a generous 57.78% increase over 2019/20's revised N\$21.9-m, accounting for 11.8% of 2020/21's initial N\$293-m FSDS total – nearly treble 2019/20's 4.7% of N\$464-m.

As a result of 2020/21's mid-year reduction in overall FSDS expenditure, the Police Vote's share increased to 12.55% (from 11.8%).

But 2019/20's N\$21.9-m FSDS expenditure by Vote 6 (with its proper title of 'Safety & Security') came as a complete surprise, since, according to both the main and revised budgets for 2019/20 this vote had no allocation whatsoever for feasibility studies, design and supervision.

Until 2019/20, Vote 6 was Safety & Security – (briefly separated from Correctional Services in 2020/21 (Vote 21 – now restored to 'Judiciary') – as it used to be the case until 2015/16.

On the other hand, the sudden appearance in 2020/21's budget of the FSDS amounts for 2020/21 and 2019/20 for Vote 6, came as a revelation, since before its restructuring, Safety & Security – we were repeatedly led to believe – had no funding for FSDS at the tabling of 2019/20's main and revised budgets, as had – supposedly – been the case over the previous two years: an implausibility we consistently pointed out during those years.

As we noted already in 2017/18, it was hardly plausible that Safety & Security had no FSDS allocations whatsoever, considering the ongoing construction of police stations and prisons that require constant building supervision.

The last time Vote 6 had a budget for feasibility studies, design and supervision was N\$1.543-m in 2016/17 – a 28.6% increase over 2015/16's N\$1.2-m when Vote 6 was Police and Vote 21 Correctional Services (both of which had no funding in 2015/16).

### The invisible Home Affairs

Home Affairs & Immigration (Vote 5) – also discontinued from 2021/22 – has had no allocation for feasibility studies, design and supervision in 2020/21 or the previous year, which is rather odd, since it was completing its N\$800-m new head office in Windhoek, which must have involved considerable project supervision.

In fact, Home Affairs has not had any allocation for feasibility studies, design and supervision

since at least 2015/16.

## Office of the Prime Minister

Ranked fifth, Vote 2 has N\$6.8-m to spend on feasibility studies, design and supervision in 2021/22, accounting for 1.5% of the N\$456-m total.

This is a threefold increase on last year's revised N\$1.676-m, accounting for 0.6% of the N\$267.58-m total. The OPM had no FSDS expenditure in 2019/20.

Vote 2 started 2020/21 with N\$2.676-m – 46.48% or N\$2.3-m less than 2019/20's N\$5-m, before being reduced by N\$1-m midyear, with 2019/20's N\$5-m turning into a zero in the latest, 2021/22 budget book.

## Environment, Forestry & Tourism

The newly repurposed Vote 18 – Environment, Forestry & Tourism (forestry was added last year) – has the sixth biggest allocation for feasibility studies, design and supervision in 2021/22, its N\$6-m accounting for 1.3% of the N\$456-m total, following a 6.7% or N\$376,000 increase over last year's revised N\$5.6-m or 2% of the N\$267-m total.

Its FSDS allocation last year was 77% or N\$2.45-m more than 2019/20's N\$3-m actual expenditure with 0.78% of the N\$405.5-m total.

Its initial 2020/21 allocation had been a 33.6% or N\$1.4-m increase on 2019/20's revised N\$4.2-m, when Vote 18 was limited to Environment & Tourism.

This N\$4.2-m has now been reduced to N\$3-m – still a massive increment on 2018/19's insignificant N\$300,000.

## Office of the President

The Office of the President (Vote 1) is the only remaining vote with over 1% of the FSDS budget in 2021/22, with N\$5-m accounting for 1.1% of the N\$456-m total in seventh place out of thirteen.

According to this year's budget book, the presidency had no FSDS expenditure in the previous two years.

But its N\$5-m initial allocation in 2020/21 accounted for 1.7% of the N\$293-m total also in seventh place initially and 1.8% after midyear, when it was not affected.

This had been a 100% increase on 2019/20's revised N\$0 allocation, its initial N\$8-m FSDS allocation was wiped out midyear.

Vote 1's N\$8-m at the beginning of 2019/20 had been a generous 38% increase over 2018/19's revised N\$5.8-m and which accounted for 1.4% of the N\$572-m FSDS total in sixth place in 2019/20.

This was a reversal of 2018/19 when the presidency's N\$5.79-m allocation for construction-related consultancies was unaffected midyear.

Its funding in 2018/19 was 70%

below 2017/18's revised N\$19.2-m, when it ranked a much higher fourth place overall with a 5.2% share.

## Justice

Vote 16 has N\$4-m allocated for feasibility studies, design and supervision in 2021/22 in eighth place, accounting for 0.88%, compared to no FSDS expenditure last year, and N\$7.2-m actual expenditure in 2019/20, which accounted for 1.8% of the total.

Yet, Justice started 2020/21 with a N\$2.7-m FSDS budget, unaffected midyear, but wiped clean in this year's budget book.

This N\$2.7-m, had been a near-60% reduction on 2019/20's revised N\$6.7-m (now reflected as N\$7.2-m – compared to N\$6.45-m in 2018/19).

## Works

In ninth place, Vote 23 has a N\$2.57-m FSDS allocation in 2021/22, accounting for 0.56% of the total.

This is 180% or N\$1.655-m more than last year's revised N\$0.918-m actual expenditure, compared to 2019/20's N\$863,164.

## Water

Separated from the now defunct Agriculture, Water & Forestry (Vote 20) in 2020/21, the new Water Vote (Vote 38) had no budget for feasibility studies, design and supervision in its first year, but has N\$2-m in 2021/22 in tenth place, accounting for 0.44% of the N\$456-m FSDS total.

The nil allocation in 2020/21 was surprising, since it had a N\$649.44-m budget for construction, renovations and improvements – increased by N\$40-m in the midyear reallocations, the N\$689-m accounting for over 17% of last year's N\$3.987 billion revised CRI budget.

## Agriculture & Land Reform

Ranked eleventh in 2021/22, Agriculture & Land Reform (Vote 37) was placed fifth with its FSDS budget last year.

Vote 37 has only N\$1.9-m to spend on feasibility studies, design and supervision in 2021/22, accounting for 0.42% of the N\$456-m FSDS total – an 88% or N\$14-m reduction on last year's revised N\$15.9-m when it accounted for 5.95% of the N\$267.58-m FSDS total.

With its functions now split under Water (Vote 38) and Environment, Forestry & Tourism (Vote 18), the now-defunct Agriculture, Water & Forestry (Vote 20) also had no FSDS allocation in 2019/20 – its final year.

### The former Land Reform Vote

In its final year as an independent vote, the associated now defunct Land Reform (Vote 25) had a N\$6.1-m revised FSDS allocation midyear in 2019/20, but this is now reflected as a mere



## budget for a second year

N\$397,120 actual expenditure in the 2021/22 budget.

Land Reform started 2019/20 with N\$7.425-m – unaffected midyear – a 23.75% N\$1.425-m increase on 2018/19 – but which was restated as N\$6.1-m in 2020/21 before being virtually negated this year.

Its original N\$6-m FSDS allocation in 2018/19 was unaffected by October 2018's midyear revisions.

Land Reform (Vote 25)'s original N\$6-m FSDS allocation in 2018/19 accounted for 0.5% of FSDS spending, increasing to 0.69% post-midyear relative to changed allocations of other votes.

Its initial allocation in 2019/20 was double the previous year's and accounted for 1.3% of the N\$572-m total in 2019/20.

### Mines & Energy

Ranked twelfth, Vote 15 has an FSDS allocation of N\$1-m in 2021/22 with a 0.22% share – half of last year's revised N\$2-m (a 0.75% share), which had been an 80% reduction on 2019/20's N\$10-m actual expenditure, accounting for 2.47% of the FSDS total in fourth place.

### Gender Equality, Poverty Eradication & Social Welfare

Vote 36 has a new title, after it was named Gender Equality, Poverty Eradication & Marginalized Affairs upon its creation in 2020/21.

It is ranked last out of thirteen votes in 2021/22 with an FSDS allocation of N\$700,000, 81.85% or N\$3.1-m less than last year's revised N\$3.856-m when accounted for 1.4% of the total – ahead of three other votes.

Its revised expenditure last year is the same as its initial FSDS allocation in 2020/21, which was in line with the now defunct Vote 12 – Gender Equality & Child Welfare's zero allocation compared to 2019/20's revised N\$1.125-m, subsequently reflect as nil in the 2021/22 budget.

The now-defunct Gender Equality & Child Welfare had N\$1.6-m to spend on feasibility studies, design and supervision in 2018/19 – 53.8% below 2017/18's revised N\$3.5-m.

### Again No Urban & Rural Development

Just as it has been starved of funding for construction, renovations and improvements (see last week's *Bulletin* 1403), Urban & Rural Development (Vote 17) has no budget for feasibility studies, design and supervision in 2021/22 – as was the case last year.

This is a major relegation from its initial fourth ranking in 2019/20, revised N\$16.9-m, but is now reflected as only N\$2.6-m actual expenditure.

Consultancy funding for township development must now all supposedly be channeled through

local authorities – as in the case of construction of town services.

This has been a trend over the past four years, following Vote 17's massive N\$684.3-m revised FSDS allocation in 2018/19, when it accounted for 57.6% of the N\$1.2-b FSDS budget in that year (which subsequently turned out to be a damp squib).

Vote 17's revised N\$16.9-m in 2019/20 according to the 2020/21 budget, was a restatement of 2019/20's revised N\$11-m expenditure, to which its original N\$38-m FSDS allocation was reduced midyear, paradoxically increasing its relative share of overall FSDS spending moderately from 1.86% (of N\$591-m) to 2.08% (of N\$527.6-m), after beginning the year with an initial 6.6% of N\$572-m.

Its already dismal N\$38-m to spend on feasibility studies, design and supervision at the start of 2019/20 (before being restated as N\$11-m and now only N\$2.6-m) had been a devastating 98% reduction on 2018/19's revised N\$684.3-m when it ranked first with a 57.6% share of the N\$1.2-b total – unprecedented since independence but subsequently restated as N\$527-m and again as N\$464-m in the 2020/21 budget.

Vote 17's initial N\$38-m to spend on FSDS in 2019/20 followed a 94.5% reduction on 2018/19's revised N\$684.3-m.

It then ranked fourth in 2019/20 with a lowered 6.6% share of the N\$572-m FSDS total.

Its N\$684-m in 2018/19 amounted to a 100% increase over 2017/18, when this vote had

**Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety & Security has the fourth-biggest share of the FSDS budget in 2021/22, with N\$12.15-m, accounting for 2.66% of the N\$456-m total – a 60.7% decrease from 2020/21's revised N\$30.56-m expenditure by the discontinued Safety & Security Vote, when it commanded 13% of the total.**

no funding – either originally or revised.

In fact, Vote 17 had not been allocated any FSDS at all for a number of years, because funding for planning land servicing and housing development had in the past been channeled by the finance ministry through local government councils and the National Housing Enterprise.

### And then there were none

Other votes that had FSDS allocations in 2019/20 but none in 2021/22 or last year are:

- \* Defence (Vote 8) – N\$998,583 – half of its N\$2-m in 2018/19 – original and revised;

- \* Veterans Affairs (Vote 31) – N\$491,300;

- \* Sport, Youth & National Service (Vote 27)'s N\$13.7-m FSDS expenditure in 2019/20 has disappeared completely in the 2021/22 budget.

Excluding votes that have become defunct, there are nineteen that have no FSDS allocations over the current three-year period, compared to seventeen last year.

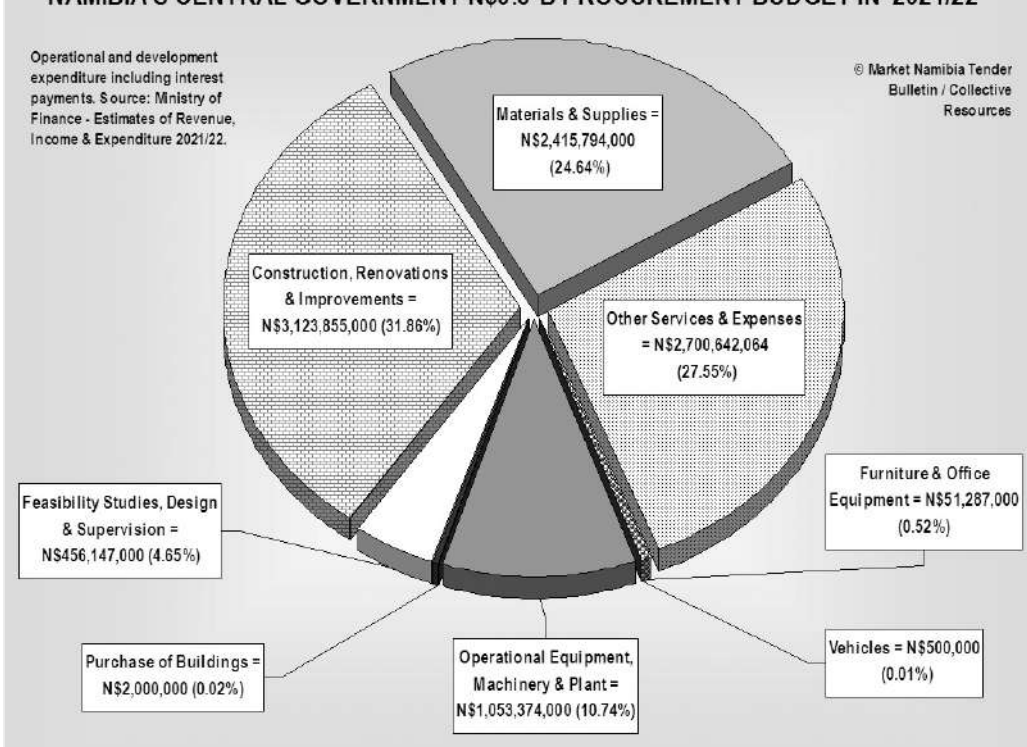

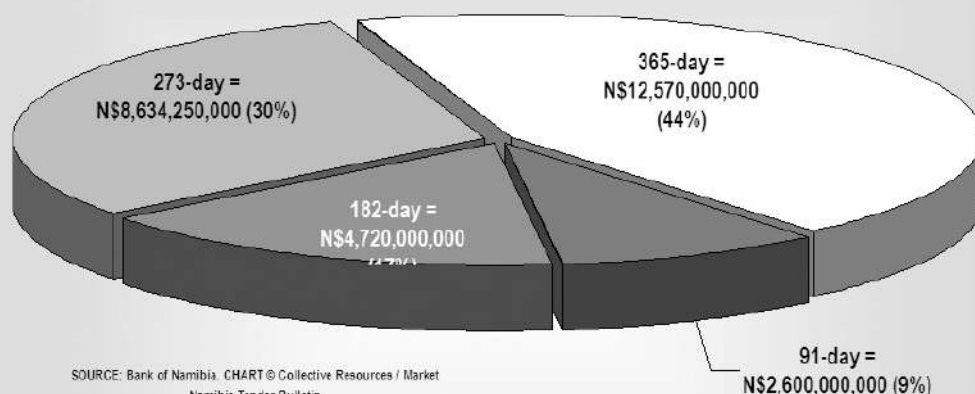

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# Consultants bid on N\$2-b water projects in the North

Sixteen consultants out of 138 have submitted technical and financial offers for three bulk water supply projects in northern Namibia.

The bids were received by Namwater on 11 and 18 May after three expressions of interest for consulting services for the three water projects had closed at the Namibia Water Corporation head office in Windhoek on 22 January 2021.

Twelve bids were received on 11 May for consultancy services for extensions to the Oshakati Purification Plant and Rundu Water Treatment Plant and four bids were received on 18 May for the development of the Ohangwena 2 Wellfield.

The three EOIs were issued in December by Namwater as Project Implementation Unit for the AfDB-funded projects resorting under the Ministry of Agriculture, Water & Land Reform.

A total of 138 offers were received for the three EOIs in January - mainly joint ventures involving local and international firms.

The Government of Namibia, through the Ministry of Finance, has received financing from the African Development Bank towards the cost of the Namibia Water Sector Support Programme and part of the agreed amount of this loan will be used for payments under these contracts.

The Project ID Number is P-NA-E00-005 for all three projects under financing agreement reference 2000200004682. This refers to a US\$121.7 million (N\$1.893 billion) loan plus a €3 million (N\$54-m) grant the African Development Bank approved in March 2020 from Rural Water Supply Sanitation Initiative Trust Fund to support Namibia's 'Water Sector Support Program'.

Details on the three projects and the EOIs received were published in *Bulletin 1385*.

## Oshakati Purification Plant Extension

rural areas of the Oshana, Ohangwena and Oshikoto regions.

## Project outline

Rundu is the largest town in the Kavango Region situated on the southern side of the Okavango River on the border with Angola.

At present the total capacity of these two schemes is about 840m<sup>3</sup>/hour. Both Schemes are old and are running at maximum capacity.

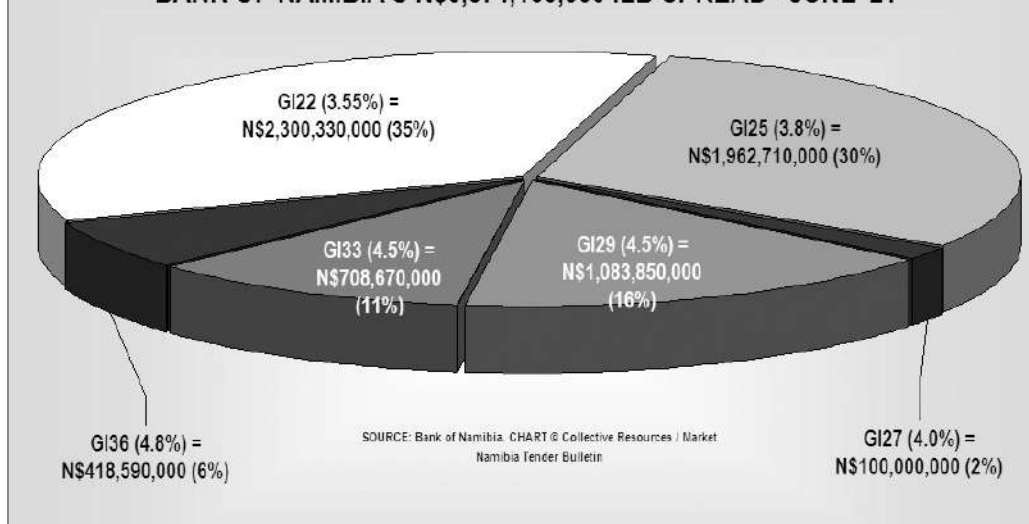

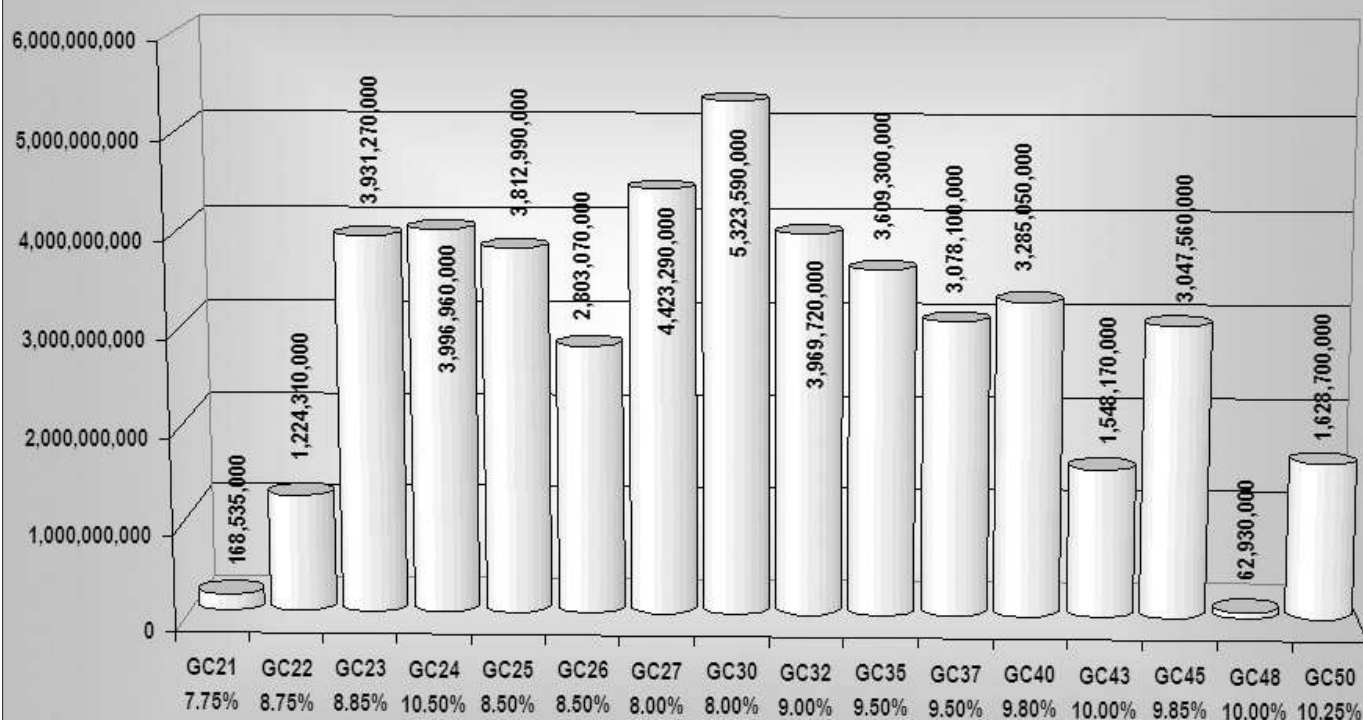
