Executive Summary

The pandemic COVID-19 has been spreading rapidly around the world. The whole mankind is in huge problem and uncertainty about the severity and spread of pandemic Covid-19. Many countries are struggling to contain the spread of the pandemic COVID-19 while implementing various proactive measures to revive economic activities. Therefore, Governments around the world are undertaking decisive steps to limit the human and economic impact of pandemic COVID-19.

The Government of India has been undertaking proactive and fast track measures to combat the impact of pandemic COVID-19 on economy, trade and industry. We appreciate the recent reform measures by the Government in terms of fiscal support of Rs. 1.70 lakh crore, Rs. 15,000 crores towards the build-up of health infrastructure, issuance of Rs 18,000 crore pending refunds of income-tax, GST & customs by the IT Department, among others.

We welcome the extension of the lockdown in the country for a further period of 2 weeks with effect from May 4, 2020. The decision has been taken after a comprehensive review and in view of the Lockdown measures having led to significant gains in mitigating the impact of COVID-19 situation in the country. Further, the move to exit the Nationwide lockdown in a graded manner by giving equal importance to lives and livelihood of Indian citizens, and allowing selected economic activities in all zones, Red (hotspots), orange and green, based on the intensity of the spread of COVID -19 is highly inspiring.

The lock down 3.0 will restart economic activities in a staggered, yet planned, way by granting permission for activities even in the Red Zones (hotspot), like construction activities limited to in-situ construction (where workers are available on site), private offices can operate with upto 33% of strength, food processing units, all agriculture activities, all plantation activities, among others, will go a long way in uplifting the sentiments of the stricken Indian Industry, helping the daily wagers, poor and the needy earn their livelihood and also revive India's economic growth trajectory. Further, the Government's decision to bring back to bring back Indian Nationals stranded abroad in this extremely difficult time and ensuring the necessary arrangements for their testing and quarantine in India is highly applaudable.

While worrying about the severity of pandemic COVID-19, Governments and tax authorities provided various tax relief measures in response to the pandemic COVID-19. The relief measures and easing of compliance deadlines will enable businesses to sustain themselves in the current atmosphere and is likely to have a positive impact on economic activities and more importantly remove uncertainty in the system.

The CBDT vide Circular No. 09/2020 dated April 22, 2020, has clarified the provisions of Direct Tax Vivad Se Vishwas Act, 2020. The 'Vivad se Vishwas' Scheme was announced to provide for dispute resolution in respect of pending income tax litigation. Pursuant to Budget



announcement, the Direct Tax Vivad se Vishwas Bill, 2020 (the Bill) was introduced in the Lok Sabha on 5th Feb 2020. Subsequently, based on the representations received from the stakeholders regarding its various provisions, official amendments to the Bill were proposed. These amendments sought to widen the scope of the bill and reduce the compliance burden on taxpayers.

The CBIC has further extends the validity of E-Way Bill till May 31, 2020, for those E-Way bills which has been generated under rule 138 of the CGST Rules, 2017 on or before March 24, 2020, and its period of validity expire's during the period March 20, 2020 to April 15, 2020 and extends the time limit for furnishing of the Annual Return i.e. Form GSTR-9, specified under section 44 of the CGST Act, 2017 read with rule 80 of the CGST Rules, 2017, electronically through the common portal, for the Financial Year 2018-2019 till September 30, 2020.

The State Governments have been providing various relief measures to mitigate the impact of covid-19. Various states have issued new guidelines regarding inter-state travel, movement of stranded migrant labours, tourists, students and other international visitors, expanding the number of beds in hospitals, among others. Each state has been successfully undertaking taking proactive measures by charting a concrete roadmap to simultaneously move ahead in containment of coronavirus and rejuvenate the growth of respective state economy.

PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry stands in complete solidarity with the Government and pledges to extend its wholehearted support, in whatever means required and possible, to help the Nation stand against the wild tide of pandemic COVID-19, overcome its adverse impact and come out victorious by defeating the deadly virus.

1. Relief Measures provided by the Central Government to mitigate the impact of Pandemic COVID-19

- Government of India has decided to facilitate the return of Indian nationals stranded abroad and Indians, who want to travel abroad on compelling grounds in a phased manner. The travel would be arranged by aircraft and naval ships. The Standard Operating Protocol (SOP) has been prepared in this regard. The travel would begin in a phased manner from May 7, 2020.
- MHA issued new guidelines to regulate different activities in extended lockdown period (4th May 2020 to 17th May 2020), based on the risk profiling of the districts of the country into Red (hotspot), Green and Orange Zones. The guidelines have permitted considerable relaxations in the districts falling in the Green and Orange Zones.
- MHA notified that private offices can operate with upto 33% strength as per requirement, with the remaining persons working from home. All Government offices shall function with senior officers of the level of Deputy Secretary and above at full strength, and the remaining staff attending upto 33% as per requirement.
- MHA allowed all industrial and construction activities in rural areas, including MNREGA works, food-processing units and brick-kilns are permitted; animal husbandry activities, including inland and marine fisheries; plantation activities; all health services; a large part of the financial sector; among others.
 - O Most of the commercial and private establishments have been allowed in the Red Zones. These include print and electronic media, IT and IT enabled services, data and call centres, cold storage and warehousing services, private security and facility management services, and services provided by self-employed persons, manufacturing units of essential goods, among others.
 - O In the Orange Zones, in addition to activities permitted in Red Zone, taxis and cab aggregators will be permitted with 1 driver and 2 passengers only. Inter-district movement of individuals and vehicles will be allowed for permitted activities only. Four wheeler vehicles will have maximum two passengers besides the driver and pillion riding will be allowed on two-wheelers.
 - In the Green Zones, all activities are permitted except the limited number of activities which are prohibited throughout the country, irrespective of the Zone.
 However buses can operate with upto 50% seating capacity and bus depots can operate with upto 50% capacity.
- MHA has notified that all goods traffic is to be permitted and no State/ UT shall stop the
 movement of cargo for cross land-border trade under Treaties with neighbouring
 countries. No separate pass of any sort is needed for such movement, which is essential



- for maintaining the supply chain of goods and services across the country during the lockdown period.
- Special Trains to be operated for Movement of Stranded Persons across the Country, due to Lockdown Restrictions to fight COVID-19
- On 29th April 2020, the Centre permitted the movement of persons including migrant workers, pilgrims, tourists, students and other persons are stranded at different places in the country. The Government allowed them to move between one State/ UT to another State/ UT, after the concerned states consult each other and mutually agree to.
- Giving relaxation in the category of Commercial and private establishments, MHA has
 issued an order to all States/UTs, to allow opening of all shops registered under Shops &
 Establishment Act of respective States/ UTs, including shops in residential complexes,
 neighborhood & standalone shops.
- Government has exempted additional agricultural and forestry items, shops of educational books for students and shops of electric fans from lockdown restrictions to fight COVID19. Further, MHA has also issued SOPs on sign-on/sign-off for Indian seafarers at Indian ports and their movement for the same.
- Union Power Ministry has advised the State/UT administrations to allow construction activities in the power projects outside Municipal limits during nation-wide lockdown for COVID-19 outbreak as per the guidelines issued Union Ministry of Home Affairs on 15.04.2020.
- Union Minister of Road Transport & Highways and MSMES Shri Nitin Gadkari has called upon all the States/UTs to take urgent action so that blockades of trucks and lorries at inter State/UT borders is cleared at the earliest possible, as smooth movement of essential goods to various parts of the country is essential.
- MHA issued SOPs issued for sign-on and sign-off of Indian Seafarers at Indian Ports and their movement
- Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) has issued Standard Operating Procedure (SoP) on 21st April, 2020 to streamline the sign-on/sign-off of Indian Seafarer at Indian Ports for merchant shipping vessels.
- In reference to the guidelines issued by MHA on 15th April 2020, Ministry of Power advised States/UTs to allow construction activities in the power projects outside Municipal limits during nation-wide lockdown for COVID-19 outbreak after observing health protocols.
- National Testing Agency (NTA) to extend / revise the dates for submission of online application forms for various examinations.


