

### World Forum of Local Economic Development

The V World Forum of Local Economic Development (LED) is expected to contribute to the process of activating and deepening the dialogue among the different levels of government, among these levels of government with national, regional and international organizations, with universities, civil society and the private sector through business chambers.

It is intended to promote reflection, debate and action to generate open and plural alternatives regarding new forms of development to influence the global agenda. In order to fulfil this aim, it will be appropriate to share experiences and generate networks that strengthen the role of the territories in the face of future challenges, mainly in the context of the Covid-19 pandemic.

Due to the security measures and health situation caused by COVID-19, this will be the first fully digital Global LED Forum. It will take place from May 26 to June 1, with a duration of 6 hours per day, where different activities will be carried out with the participation of international speakers.
