



Compendium of various relief measures provided by the States to mitigate the impact of pandemic COVID-19

The growing severity of widespread pandemic COVID-19 on our economy is a matter of deep concern. PHD Chamber of Commerce stands in complete solidarity and pledges to extend its all-out support to the Government in the fight for making India COVID-19 free. At this juncture, there is a need to maintain a growth trajectory at around 5% and therefore, a fiscal stimulus of at least 5% of GDP i.e. around Rs 11 Lakh Crores is necessary to mitigate the impact of Pandemic COVID-19 on economy, trade and Industry through various relief measures and benefits to India's trade and industry. An automatic increase of 25% in working capital without any procedure and application to reduce stress on businesses; to convert increased working capital in a term-loan with a provision of 3 years repayment period are crucial at this juncture.

The proactive and combative measures undertaken by the Government to curtail the spread of pandemic COVID-19 are highly appreciable. Immediate reduction in the lending rate by all the banks to percolate the full effect of recent 75 basis points cut in repo rate by RBI should be done. To defer the EMIs of the term-loans for 6 months, special interest subvention @ 3% in loans to MSMEs and other badly affected industries; to abolish all fixed charges of all the utilities and defer all utilities' bills by 3 months are crucial at this juncture. Release of outstanding payments of MSMEs, from the Government and PSUs; rationalisation of GST rate structure by merging 18% tax slab with 12% tax slab, among others are significant needed in this extremely difficult time.

The reforms undertaken by the Government to contain the spread of COVID-19 in India are highly encouraging. It is suggested that herbs dealers and packing material industries cum dealers should be permitted to work to maintain the smooth supply of raw material/packing materials for manufacturing of medicines by Pharma/Ayush sector. Some of the long terms measures that must be undertaken include reducing income tax of the proprietorship and LLPs firms to the level of 25% for old and 15% for new companies; reduce the customs duties on basic raw materials by at least 5 percentage points; further reduction of 100 basis points repo rate cut are necessary to enhance the competitiveness of manufacturers.

The proactive and fast track measures undertaken by the Government to combat the impact of pandemic COVID-19 on trade and industry are highly appreciable. We are quite optimistic that the Economic Response Task Force will combat the impact of pandemic covid-19 on India's economy, trade and industry. At this juncture, it is recommended that the consumption expenditure by the Government should be enhanced, even if fiscal deficit slips by 2 percentage points to revive the demand scenario in the economy.

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Executive Summary

India is currently battling its worst health emergency in the form of the coronavirus outbreak that is spreading rapidly across the country with vast number of new cases being reported every day. Though the government has maintained that India is yet not in the stage of "community transmission", new cases continue to be reported daily. Each week is crucial for the country as there has been a consistent spike in the number of new cases being reported, especially in states like Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu and Delhi. The scale of this health emergency is such that the entire country has been put under a further lockdown with only essential services being operational. The severity of pandemic COVID 19 is increasing each day. The whole mankind in the world is in huge problem and uncertainty about the severity and spread of pandemic Covid-19. In India, there is complete lockdown in the country.

PHD Chamber of Commerce industry is vigilant in tracking the impact of pandemic COVID 19 on the global and domestic trade and economy. We have compiled a one point information report on all the relief measures undertaken by the State Governments in their respective states. This health emergency has put immense pressure on the country's healthcare system and the economy has been severely disrupted. However, there has been a silver lining when the entire nation is in the grip of the pandemic. The government is planning a targeted approach to tackle the cases as most of them are concentrated in these few geographies.

Rajasthan's Bhilwara has, indeed, come a long way in its fight against the novel coronavirus pandemic, from being one of the most affected COVID-19 districts in India to not reporting a new COVID-19 case. The popular textile town reported its first COVID-19 case on 19th March 2020 and then quickly emerged as a hotspot, reporting 27 cases, becoming the worst-affected district in Rajasthan. Seeing the rapid growth in new infections, the district administration sprang into action swiftly and pursued an aggressive model of containing the spread of this virus, involving a variety of measures. The district administration took over four private hospitals and 27 hotels with 1,541 rooms. These measures began bearing fruit as the town has not reported a new case of COVID-19 since 30th March.

The success of Bhilwara in containing the transmission of coronavirus has now prompted the central government to adopt the 'Bhilwara model of containment' on a nationwide scale, particularly with the most-affected 62 districts in different states of India. On the other hand, Kerala has drawn heavily on its crisis management experience from the 2018 floods and fighting the Nipah outbreak. Its resilience in rebuilding after the devastating floods is illustrative of its communal amity and of a courageous and informed society. Going ahead, Indian states' governments are consistently taking proactive measures to support their residents and patients by providing real time medical aid, relief funding, food and shelter that are the necessity of the hour.



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1 Delhi

- The state government distributed 7.5 kilograms of ration per person to the needy, which would benefit 71 lakh people. Around 60% of the population had received it.
- The Delhi government has so far given Rs 5,000 each to 8 lakh beneficiaries under widow, differently abled and elderly pension schemes to help them overcome the crisis owing to the novel coronavirus pandemic.
- The economically weaker segments who are severely affected by the lockdown, such as construction workers, and auto rickshaw and taxi drivers will also receive Rs 5,000 financial assistance. The state government has opened 1,780 centres to feed the poor.
- Around 380 shelters have also been set up for migrant workers who are returning to their hometowns.
- The Delhi government has also launched a dedicated WhatsApp helpline number to provide people accurate information about COVID-19.
- The Government of NCT of Delhi vide Cabinet Decision No. 2819 dated 01-04-2020 has approved as follows: --Any person attending COVID 19 patients including Doctor, Nurse, Para-Medical Staff, Sweeper or any other staff, whether temporary or permanent employee, in Government or Private Sector, if expire by contracting the disease during discharge of his/ her duty, his/ her family shall be compensated with ex gratia amount of Rupees One Crore, posthumously. Upon receiving the recommendation from the Medical Superintendent/HOD/In-charge of the Hospital/Medical Institution, the recommendation will be processed by Health & Family Welfare Department, GNCT of Delhi and shall be put up through Minister (H&FW) for the approval of Hon'ble Chief Minister"
- The Cabinet vide Cabinet Decision no. 2815 has approved that procurement of PPE Kits may be made by the individual hospitals/ CPA from local manufacturers/ suppliers at market rate, provided the rates are less than or comparable to rates of HLL. The HLL has quoted a rate of Rs. 1087.47 per Kit.
- Delhi government to carry out operation 'SHIELD' in the identified hotspots of coronavirus.

2 Haryana

The Government of Haryana has announced setting up of various window to support and combat with pandemic COVID-19. They are as follows:



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COVID-19 (Financial support to unorganised workers)

COVID-19 (Haryana movement pass)

COVID-19 (Haryana Relief Camp Management System)

COVID-19 (Sangharsh Senani)

- An amount of Rs 35 crore was released as an instalment of subsistence financial assistance to 350621 workers at Rs 1000 per family per week through NPCI directly to the Aadhar linked bank accounts for the construction workers.
- The state had released standard operating procedure (SOP) for maintaining supply of essential goods. The availability of essential goods takes place through small local retail shops, large organized retail stores and e-commerce companies.
- The following standard operating procedure is suggested for ensuring smooth availability of essential goods.
- All facilities in the supply chain of essential goods, whether involved in manufacturing, wholesale or retail of such goods through local stores, large brick and mortar stores or e-commerce companies should be allowed to operate, ensuring strict social distancing.
- All such facilities as registered with the state government, UT under the shops and establishment registration regime which can be used to randomly verify the veracity of documents produced.
- While warehousing facilities with wholesalers and retailers of essential goods might have non-essential goods they should not be closed down for the fact that non-essential items are also stored.
- The retail end of the supply chain shall operate only in essential goods as specified in the orders of MHA, They will provide an undertaking to this effect and also allow subsequent audit of their records with a view to ensure compliance.



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3	<p>Punjab</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The Punjab government has announced a Rs10-billion relief package for the poor strata of the society besides waiver of Rs18 billion provincial taxes.• The government also announced an addition month's salary for doctors and paramedic staff attending to coronavirus patients in the hospital in the province.• The government had decided to provide Rs4,000 per family to 2.5 million households which would cost the Rs10 billion.• The government has also decided to give remission of 90 days to prisoners except those convicted in heinous crimes. Recommendations are being prepared for under trial prisoners and will be forwarded to the federal government soon• The government has decided to give Rs18 billion tax concessions to put the economy back on track after the end of coronavirus disease.• According to the suggestion of Hon'ble Punjab Chief Minister Captain Amarinder Singh utilization of ESIC, MGNREGA and other such funds by the Centre to provide part of the wages or lump sum financial assistance to industrial workers during the period of lockdown.• Across the state, cops have been ensuring that supply of food and other essential commodities is not subject to hampering and that police officials too must step in to distribute rations.• The state government has also launched a door-to-door drive to distribute 10 lakh packets of dry rations to daily wagers and unorganised labour. Each packet will contain 10 kg of flour, 2 kg of pulses and 2 kg of sugar.• The government has made arrangements to ensure harvesting, procurement and storage of wheat and other vegetable crops is not impeded.• A Dial 112 helpline has also been launched for doorstep delivery of food, medicines and essential commodities.• Few companies have announced a contribution of Rs one crore to the Punjab Government, to fight covid-19 in the state. The financial assistance to Punjab includes Rs 50 lakh paid directly to the Chief Minister's Relief Fund and another Rs 50 lakh for the critical medical supplies in the Government Hospitals.
4	<p>Himachal Pradesh</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The State Government has decided to provide several relief measures, with an expenditure of approximately Rs. 500 crore.• About 5.34 lakh social security pension holders of the state would be issued first quarter pension in the first week of April, 2020, which includes about 1.25



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	<p>lakh widows and disability pension holders, for whom monthly pension has been increased from Rs. 850 to Rs. 1000.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Department for the Empowerment of Schedule Castes, Other Backward Classes, Minorities and Specially Abled has also been directed to take immediate steps to provided pension to 50 thousand new eligible persons. • The state has also decided to provide one-time relief of Rupees two thousand to nearly one lakh fifty thousand workers registered with the Building and Construction Workers Board. • A few companies have contributed Rs 50 lakh to the Chief Minister's Relief Fund to help the State Government in fighting the ongoing menace of Covid-19 • Two months of flour and rice would be given to targeted public distribution system card holders, simultaneously.
5	<p>Rajasthan</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The hon'ble Rajasthan chief minister announced financial assistance to the tune of Rs 50 lakh to the family of any government employee in case of death. Employees working on a contract basis would also be covered under this financial assistance scheme. However, those healthcare workers for whom central government had announced Rs 50 lakh insurance cover will not come under this scheme. • The assistance will cover a multitude of workers from patwaris, gram sevaks, constables, contract employees including safai karmacharis, health workers and those employed on honorarium like home Guard, civil defence, Asha and Anganwadi workers. • In this direction, the states are supposed to use district mineral fund for COVID-19 medical expenses such as medical screening, facilities and health needs amid coronavirus outbreak.
6	<p>Uttar Pradesh</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The UP government has transferred Rs 1000 each to the bank accounts of 481755 daily wagers including street vendors and rickshaw pullers as "maintenance allowance" for the COVID-19 lockdown period. The beneficiaries of this relief measure have been identified by the state urban development department. • The state is planning to set up a dedicated fund to fight the coronavirus outbreak. • The proposed Covid fund will be in addition to the existing CM Relief Fund. • The government had allowed for the home delivery of consumables by e-



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	<p>commerce.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• More than 2,400 community kitchens have been set up in UP to distribute food packets to the poor even as the government simultaneously plans to operate about 2,500 community kitchens of its own over the coming days.• The state government has disbursed Rs 1,139 crore to the districts for the expenditure on medical purchases against coronavirus and more funds would be provided to meet further demand.
7	Uttarakhand <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The Government of Uttarakhand has issued regulation on pandemic Covid-19• The state government has declared novel coronavirus as an epidemic and shut all multiplexes, cinema halls, degree colleges and technical institutes.• The state government as a relief measure for all daily wage workers who are facing financial losses due to lack of work amid coronavirus outbreak and 'Janta curfew', decided to give Rs 1000 each to the daily wage workers. The amount will be transferred to the bank account. The state has over 3 lakh registered daily wage workers.• The state had issued an order for establishment of the Satellite Control Room for contract tracing and limiting the spread of pandemic covid-19.
8	Madhya Pradesh <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Madhya Pradesh government decided to transfer Rs700 crore earmarked for the International Indian Film Academy Awards-2020 (IIFA) ceremonies, scheduled to be conducted in Bhopal and Indore, to the Chief Minister's Relief Fund for Covid-19.• The state is providing free of cost food.• The state is also providing ration free of cost to the poor, irrespective of whether they have ration cards or not, for the next three months.• Few of the organisations contributed Rs 2.5 crore to state of Madhya Pradesh among other states.• Some companies contributed Rs one crore to Madhya Pradesh to fight the pandemic COVID-19.
9	Chhattisgarh



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- The Congress-led government has taken control of the privately-run Raipur Institute of Medical sciences (RIMS) for the treatment of Covid-19 positive cases.
- The state government is also initiating a drive to use drones for spraying of disinfectants in areas which could be prone to coronavirus spread, such as the vicinity of hospitals, market places with concentration of food, medical and essential commodity stores, etc. Distribution of free food packets to the poor has also been ordered across all districts.
- The Chhattisgarh government is among the few states that have adopted a liberal testing policy. National Mineral Development Corporation Limited, the 'Navaratna' PSU company have advanced royalty payment of INR 200 crores to the government of Chhattisgarh to help in their fight against COVID -19.
- The Chhattisgarh government will provide 100 beds each to all of 28 districts of the state to deal with coronavirus cases
- Raipur Institute of Medical Sciences College is being developed as a COVID-19 hospital where 500 beds are being arranged
- In a bid to provide relief to the poor amid an ongoing coronavirus pandemic, the Chhattisgarh government issued a notification stating that rice and dal will be distributed to ration card holders, students and others
- School children will also be allocated their quota of grains as per the mid-day meal scheme during the holiday period. Under this scheme, 40 days dry dal and rice will be supplied to the children of the school. Each student of primary school will be given 4 kg of rice and 800 grams of dal and 6 kg of rice and 1,200 grams of dal will be distributed to each student of higher secondary schools.
- As a goodwill gesture, the Chhattisgarh government has decided to give special allowance to the staff of the Health Department engaged in the treatment of the coronavirus
- The government has licensed two distilleries for industrial manufacture of alcohol-based hand sanitisers as part of measures to prevent coronavirus
- The time limit for renewal of a licence or permit has also been increased by a month in all urban bodies of the state. The last date for depositing property tax in urban bodies of the state has been extended from March 31 to April 30.

10

Jharkhand

- The government has ensured that poor and homeless persons within the jurisdictional areas are taken to government-run shelters where they can be provided with regular meals.
- The state government has also announced the home delivery of rations and essential commodities through the district collector's office.

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- Tata Steel Foundation (TSF) has contributed Rs. 10 crores to the Jharkhand CM's COVID-19 Relief Fund.
- As a significant portion of Jharkhand's population is employed as migrant workers in other states, the state government has been working to bring back any person of the state who is stranded elsewhere in the country along with implementing the below measures:
 - Rs. 200 crores have been earmarked towards expenditure in connection with the tests and setting up of other apparatus to deal with any emerging situation
 - The Jharkhand government has set up a 557-bed isolation ward for COVID-19 patients in different hospitals of the state. The state has also set up 1,469 quarantine centres at different places.
 - The state government has decided to provide two months ration in advance to the beneficiaries of the Public Distribution System, as the country entered the second day of the lockdown to contain the coronavirus outbreak.
 - The Jharkhand state government issued a rate-chart of essential items at the public distribution outlets, following reports that a few ration shops were charging higher prices for commodities and some others selling them in the black market, taking advantage of the lockdown.
 - The state administration has launched an app - VeggiGo - for people to place online orders for essential commodities.

11

Bihar

- Bihar has transferred Rs 184 crores into the bank accounts of around 18 lakh ration card holding families in the state to help them fight the outbreak of novel coronavirus. Each ration card-holding family was given Rs 1,000 from the Chief Minister's Relief Fund.
- Apart from the ration cardholders, the state Disaster Management officials have reached to every state resident stranded outside Bihar because of the ongoing lockdown. They too have been provisioned to be provided Rs 1000 through Direct Bank transfer.
- Apart from the first phase of the DBT, the state government has also promised to provide free one month ration to 1.68 crore families and Rs 1000 each to about 13 lakh registered construction workers.
- Besides, 87 lakh pensioners will also get three months pension in advance. This will help us provide direct relief to almost 30 to 40 per cent of the entire Bihar population.
- The state is expected to spend Rs 1000 crore to support the families hit by hardships due to coronavirus outbreak and the lockdown.



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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Bihar government ordered the shutting down of bus services, restaurants and banquet halls. However, home delivery and take home services of restaurants will remain functional.
12	<p>Odisha</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The state has announced the setting up of two hospitals, with a combined capacity of 1,000 beds, to exclusively deal with Covid-19 cases. The state government has also decided to transfer four months' advance salary for doctors, medical and paramedical staff. Odisha was one of the first states in India to put in place an "action plan" for dealing with the ongoing Covid-19 situation early in March. It set up a Covid-19 helpline number before the nationwide lockdown was even announced, thus, engaging in spreading awareness. More than 72,000 calls had been received on the Covid-19 helpline number 104 by March 22, a day before the nationwide lockdown was announced. Odisha had launched a dedicated website, covid19.odisha.gov.in way before the national portal the launched. The state government has been preparing to engage about 8,000 doctors, staff nurses, pharmacists, laboratory technicians, radiographers, health workers (male and female), keeping in view the future requirement in the worst case scenarios. The state government has been preparing around 500 beds with ICU facilities exclusively for Covid-19 patients in Ganjam district. Arrangements have also been made for setting up of similar hospitals exclusively for Covid-19 patients in different parts of the state including Sambalpur, Jharsuguda, Rourkela, Dhenkanal, Puri and Paradip. Apart from the state government, the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), Bhubaneswar has also set up an exclusive Covid-19 unit with 206 beds in its campus in the capital city. Moreover, the AYUSH complex of AIIMS, Bhubaneswar is also ready with 20 isolation beds and ten ventilators as part of measures to grapple with the emerging situation. The state government has also decided to transfer four months' advance salary for doctors, medical and paramedical staff.
13	<p>West Bengal</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The West Bengal government asked all the civic bodies in the state to conduct a door-to-door survey and prepare a map of regions where multiple people are suffering from fever, cough and other symptoms of COVID-19.



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- The hon'ble CM of the state announced a slew measures including the creation of state emergency relief fund to collect aid from those willing to donate.
- The West Bengal government announced that amid the Covid-19 outbreak, people who were getting rice and wheat at subsidized rates would now get a maximum of five kilos for free for the next six months. This is set to benefit 7.85 crore people in the state.
- The state set up a Rs 200 crore fund to tackle the COVID outbreak. The state government closed educational institutions, including government, government aided and private ones.
- The state has already placed orders for face masks, personal protective equipments (PPEs), ventilators and other requisite gear to fight the virus.
- The real estate sector in West Bengal has been badly hit by the nationwide lockdown imposed in the wake of the coronavirus outbreak. The real estate bodies of the state has sought from the central government demanding several relief measures.
- The industry body sought deferment of GST and income tax payments due in March, April and May by at least 180 days, besides waiver of interest and penalty on delayed tax payments for the current financial year.
- It also said that the government should give a moratorium of six months on all due and overdue EMI/interest on all loans, including term loans.

Gujarat

- Gujarat government has announced that 60 lakh families, who hold ration cards, will be provide free ration packets which include 3.5 kg wheat, 1.5 kg rice per person, and 1 kg of pulses, sugar and salt per family.
- The state government announced that state government employees engaged in work related to coronavirus will be eligible for Rs 25 lakh compensation in case they get infected and die in the line of duty.
- The government had earlier announced Rs 25 lakh compensation to the next of kin of front-line staff including police personnel, health and sanitation workers, staff of revenue and food supply department and fair price shopkeepers.
- The cover will be extended to all government employees who are involved in jobs related to the pandemic. Family members of such employees would be paid Rs 25 lakh compensation of the personnel contract the infection and succumb to it.
- The state government has allowed to keep operations of the cotton ginning mills as well the oil mills in the state during the lockdown period. It is also urged to seek approval through the local system for transportation and to take



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adequate care of social distance, hygiene, sanitization, etc. in the whole process.

- The state has decided to distribute 25 thousand N-95 masks free of cost through the Indian Medical Association to the private doctors treating the patients coming to their clinics or hospitals. It has been decided to provide 7500 N-95 mask each to private doctors in Surat and Rajkot as well 5000 N-95 mask to private doctors in Vadodara.
- During the lockdown the state has distributed 45.79 lakh liters of milk. 58,903 quintal of vegetables and 6969 quintal of fruits were also distributed. A total of 2 lakh 50 thousand passes have been issued so far for small merchant-retailers and those connected to essential services for the sale of essential goods.
- Some companies have given Rs 11 lakh to Gujarat to fight pandemic coronavirus.
- The Government of Gujarat has decided to provide certain relaxations for industrial and commercial activities from 20th April 2020. The relaxations shall not be applicable to areas declared as hotspots or containment zones in different cities of the state and the commercial activities and businesses can start functioning from 20th April 2020 with the procedures of safety and social distancing.
- In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 5 of the Factories Act, 1948 (LXIII of 1948), the state government has directed all the factories registered under the Factories Act 1948 to be exempted from various provisions relating to weekly hours, daily hours, intervals for rest, etc of adult workers under section 51, section 54, section 55 and section 56 with certain conditions from 20th April till 19th
 - No adult worker shall be allowed or required to work in a factory for more than 12 hours in any day and 72 hours in a week
 - The periods of work of adult workers in a factory each day shall be so fixed that no period shall exceed six hours and that no worker shall work for more than six hours before he has had an interval for rest of at least half an hour
 - No female workers shall be allowed or required to work in a factory between 7pm to 6 am.
 - Wages shall be in a proportion of the existing wages (eg if wages for eight hours are 80 rupees, then proportionate wages for twelve hours will be 120 rupees.



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15	Maharashtra <ul style="list-style-type: none">• An order by the state government directs that the lockdown orders vide notification dated 25th March 2020 shall now be extended upto and inclusive of 30th April, 2020.• The Government of Maharashtra under section 2 notified lockdown in the entire state of Maharashtra with the immediate effect till midnight 14th April, 2020.• The state announced that all shops supplying groceries, medicines and essential commodities will remain open 24X7 and transportation arrangements have also been made for people involved with the supply of such services.• The state government has set up 262 relief camps for migrant labourers where they will be provided food and shelter. The relief camps are providing shelters to 70399 migrant labour or the homeless people to ensure that they have food and a roof.• The state government considered to provide insurance cover to the medical staff treating COVID-19 patients in the state.• The government also plans to give monetary incentive to the staff.
16	Karnataka <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Karnataka government has announced several relief measures for the poor who have been badly hit by the COVID-19 outbreak.• Steps are being taken to provide relief and essentials to the unorganised labourers in the state. Milk will be supplied to the poor free of cost.• Beneficiaries under the PM Kisan Scheme will be entitled to get a sum of Rs 2,000. It will be deposited to their accounts latest by April 10, 2018,• The state has responded generously to pleas to contribute to the Chief Minister's COVID-19 Relief Fund.• A total sum of Rs 106.05 crore has been received as donations.• The Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike and Adichunchanagiri Math at Nagamangala have donated Rs 50 lakh each. The hon'ble CM himself has donated his entire one year's salary to the fund.• Karnataka government has erected 345 check-posts in Bengaluru and over 500 in the entire state to restrict the movement of vehicles and people to check spread of Coronavirus.
17	Tamil Nadu



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- The state government has announced a Rs. 3,280 crore package to provide relief to the poor, senior citizens, agricultural labourers, autorickshaw drivers, construction workers and daily wagers who would be affected by the lockdown.
- The state government has also decided that all ration card-holders would get Rs.1,000, along with free rice, dal, cooking oil and sugar. The state announced that his government will identify unorganised workers from other States and distribute 15 kg of rice, 1 kg of dal and 1 kg of cooking oil to their families.
- Food will be supplied through Amma Canteens. District collectors have also been directed to create common kitchens to cook and distribute food to the destitute.

18

Kerala

- Along with volunteer organization and companies, even prisoners in certain districts were trained and engaged to produce masks and sanitizers, clearly showing enormous community participation.
- Kerala government also launched a mobile application called GoK Direct for users to get information and updates regarding COVID-19. This initiative from the Kerala Startup Mission and the Information & Public Relations Department has been a huge success in disseminating information and alerts in real time without internet.
- Under the “Break the Chain” initiative, the government has installed water taps accompanied by sanitizers at public places implementing basic hygiene measures.
- To overcome the economic hardships and the damages of the potential pandemic, Kerala government has also announced a stimulus package of Rs. 20,000 crores which will be disbursed through various welfare schemes. This includes Rs. 500 crores to ramp up the healthcare sector during this crisis, Rs. 2,000 crore for loans and free rations, Rs. 2,000 crore for creating jobs in rural areas, Rs. 1,000 crore for families with financial difficulties, and Rs. 1,320 crore for paying two months pensions in advance.
- Heavily subsidised meals such as community low-cost food canteens serving food at Rs. 25, loans for Kudumbashree women and pensions for those who are not covered under any social security schemes, are some of the relief measures which covers all sections of the populace.
- With the current systems in place and scaled up efforts by the government, Kerala is able to provide its people the necessary care and intervention at the beginning of this virus outbreak.



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<p>19</p>	<p>Andhra Pradesh</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The state government has decided to provide Rs 1000 as financial assistance to BPL (Below Poverty Line) family during the COVID-19 lockdown. This one time relief of Rs 1000 will be given to 1.3 crore poor or needy and underprivileged families as per the Andhra Pradesh CM's office. • The state government has directed authorities in each district to start following the 'Gorumudda' menu to ensure that the workers stay healthy and ensure a continuous supply of all possible nutrients. The vast menu for the migrants include boiled eggs, egg curry, chickpeas, tomato dal, asparagus, Pulihora (tamarind rice), vegetable rice, aloo kurma and khichdi. • In Andhra Pradesh, 9,695 migrant workers have been identified who are being accommodated in the 218 relief centres. Of this 3,819 belong to various districts of the state while 5,876 hail from other states. • Andhra Pradesh Panchayati Raj and Rural Development Minister donated Rs 200.11 crores to the state's Chief Minister's Relief Fund to fight the deadly COVID-19 pandemic. • On the other hand, the employment guarantee and watershed department employees contributed Rs 1.50 crores and Society for Elimination of Rural Poverty (SERP) employees donated Rs 50 lakhs. • Andhra Pradesh government has to distribute 16 crore face masks free of cost as a preventive measure in the wake of the coronavirus outbreak (Covid-19). Each of the 5.3 crore people in the state will get three face masks free of cost. • The state government has also undertaken a slew of measures to ensure that the agricultural sector doesn't suffer, by setting up additional temporary Rythu (farmer) bazars and also converting AP State Road Transport Corporation (APSRTC) buses into mobile markets. • In a bid to tackle the situation and lack of access to transport, the AP government, under its 'COVI-Agri plan', has set up additional 471 temporary Rythu Bazars across the state, apart from the existing 100. • Apart from that, a total of 451 APSRTC buses have been converted into mobile Rythu Bazars, which are selling a wide range of essentials straight from the farm.
<p>20</p>	<p>Telangana</p> <p>The state announced the following regulations and measures amidst the wake of COVID-19:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All state borders shall be sealed other than for movement of essential and perishable commodities.

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- All public transport services including TSRTC buses, SETWIN, Hyderabad Metro, taxis, auto-rickshaws etc. will not be permitted. However, transport of passengers for accessing emergency medical services shall be permitted. Plying of private vehicles shall be restricted only to the extent of procuring essential commodities and activities permitted under this order. Operation of all interstate bus and transport services including those by private operators shall stand suspended.
- Government offices, shops and establishments permitted to operate during this period shall take steps to ensure social distancing such as through painting of foot marks at distances of 3 feet from each other near check out counters. They shall also ensure proper sanitation in their premises and ensure availability of hand sanitizers/hand washing facilities.
- The Chief Minister has ordered the release of water and power supply for crops sown over 50 lakh acres in the current harvesting season. He has assured farmers that the government would buy all their harvest directly at a Minimum Support Price (MSP). Farmers have to carry their bank passbooks at the time of selling their produce to get the money. Only government-operated agricultural markets will be available for consumers during this period.
- In coordination with the Agricultural Marketing Department (AMD), the state government has constituted a state-wide monitoring committee to arrange supply and stabilise prices and sale of vegetables and fruits to local Rythu Bazaars and mandis. The Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) has also set up a similar monitoring team to ensure retailers do not jack up prices.
- The state has prepared its infrastructure given the hypothetical scenario of positive cases touching the 60,000-mark. Arrangements have been made to accommodate more than 11,000 people in isolation wards, besides creating additional 1,400 beds in Intensive Care Units (ICUs). The government has already ordered 500 additional ventilators, according to officials. Currently Telangana has 12,400 beds including ICUs.
- Aurobindo Pharma contributed Rs 7.5 crores and sanitisers, and medicines totally worth Rs 3.5 crores, a release from Chief Minister K Chandrasekhar Rao's.
- Nava Bharath Ventures and Grand Pharma donated Rs 2.5 crores and Rs one crore, respectively to the Chief Minister's Public Relief fund for measures against COVID-19.
- Asian Institute of Gastroenterology (AIG) gave a donation of worth Rs 50 lakh. In addition to it, Mid-day meal workers in the state announced contribution of Rs 2.65 crores to the fund.



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- A donation of Rs 2 crore in the wake of the growing menace of the novel coronavirus in Telangana had been received from Microsoft CEO Satya Nadella's wife.

21 Jammu & Kashmir

- Government has issued an order under section 144 with a complete shutdown of all school; colleges; shops; gyms; businesses among others except for the essential services and supply chains to maintain the essential services.
- The Government issued a notification for a list of essential services and commodities which include supply of groceries; supply of fresh fruits and vegetables; dispensing of petrol; milk shops and dairies; banks and ATMs among others.
- The order pertaining to District Ramban state the exemption of teaching and non teaching staff; imposition of section 144; restriction of movement of three/four vehicles; closure of schools/colleges, constitution of committees to monitor the spread of COVID-19 among others.
- The Government has issued preventive measures to combat the spread of COVID-19 by maintain social distancing and government employees or their relatives with a foreign travel has to undergo with a quarantine.
- The government of Jammu & Kashmir have ordered that Government employees shall attend their offices on alternate weeks except those who are associate with corona virus control efforts and essential services.
- Financial assistance has been provided by the state government by providing overdraft facility in Jan Dhan Accounts; old age pensions; entertainment of bills; Ration under PDS and Mid-Day Meal scheme.
- The State Government, to prevent the spread of COVID-19 in the country issued guidelines regarding social distancing measures.

22 Goa

- An organisation named Vedanta Sesa Goa Iron Ore, has contributed Rs. 1 crore to Goa state COVID-19 Relief Fund as part of its endeavour to join ranks with the Government of Goa to combat the widespread outbreak of deadly COVID-19.
- The organisation in Goa has also been working in close- coordination with the District Management to help them in providing necessary infrastructure and provisioning of protective equipment across COVID- 19 medical facilities in the

Additionally, each of the estates will be provided with Rs 5,000 to sensitise the workers.
24	<p>Mizoram</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mizoram Building & Other Construction Worker Welfare Board(MBOCWWB) announced some relief measures for workers. • All workers registered under the Board would be given a month's supply of rice through the Food, Civil Supplies and Consumer Affairs Department as per their norms of BPL and AAY. • Workers who are BPL and AAY beneficiaries but not registered with the Board will also get this free supply of rice. • All workers who registered prior to December 2019 will be given a cash assistance of Rs. 3000(one time) through direct benefit transfer. The Board appealed to business owners to support workers by continuing to pay their salaries on humanitarian grounds in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic.
