


MESSAGE



President's Message

Friends,

As my tenure as the President of this prestigious, 114-year old, institution comes to a close, I must reflect on the glorious year gone by, the achievements made and the path undertaken. It was indeed a very stimulating time with many objectives catalyzed and feats accomplished, through our association with the government, commerce, trade and industry. And this journey has only just begun...

The Indian electorate has re-elected a stable and a decisive government at the center, led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, with an unprecedented mandate and a promising vision to lead 'New India' into the league of developed nations. This is a matter of great pride. We, at the PHD Chamber, are highly motivated and look forward to an enriched nation during the Modi 2.0 government, to drive India to become a USD 5 trillion economy by 2025 with "Spasht Neeti, Sahi Disha" (clear policy, right direction).

I am pleased to mention a few bold structural steps undertaken by the Modi government in the last five years, towards upliftment of domestic businesses and creating a globally competitive industry. The economic growth during the last 5 years has moved in tandem with the absolute fiscal discipline and benign inflationary conditions. Despite the global headwinds, foreign direct investment inflows surpassed USD 60 billion for the first time in India's economic history.

The big ticket economic reforms announced by Hon'ble Finance Minister, Ms. Nirmala Sitharaman such as recapitalization of Public Sector Banks, merger of 10 Public Sector Banks into 4 Banks, rollback of enhanced surcharge on Foreign Portfolio Investors, liberalization of 100 percent FDI in coal mining, contract manufacturing, digital media, insurance intermediaries, payment of pending GST refunds to MSMEs within 30 days, remission of duties and taxes on exported products, withdrawal of Angel Tax provisions for Startups and their investors and more credit support for purchase of houses, vehicles and consumption goods are inspiring and would go a long way to foster strong, stable and inclusive growth in the country. These initiatives shall address tax issues, raise consumer demand and investments, lift credit flow, improve interest rate transmission, and thereby reduce non-performing assets. Further, these timely reform measures would mitigate the impact of emerging global headwinds such as bleak global economic outlook, US-China trade war and a looming BREXIT's knock-on effect on the economy.

Implementation of the Goods and Services Tax (GST) with a pledge of "One nation One tax" has subsumed all the indirect taxes except few multi-stage production processes. Further reforms in GST such as shifting

items from higher to lower tax slabs and simplifying procedures would further help improve the Ease of Doing Business environment in the country and reduce transaction costs. I felt reassured by the Prime Minister's address to the nation on the 73rd Independence Day that continuous reforms will help India break into the position of top 50 countries- 'Ease of Doing Business' World Bank ranking.

It is praiseworthy to note the commendable tax reforms of the government such as introduction of faceless and jurisdiction-less income tax assessment which started in 2018 and already over two lakh assessment cases have been handled online by the Income Tax Department. Such proactive efforts by the government have led to a significant increase in direct tax revenue by more than 78 percent in FY 2018-19, as well as creating a new record of all-time high of 49,29,121 Income-Tax Returns e-filed in a single day on August 31, 2019.

Not forgetting its promise, the government has earmarked Rs. 90,000 crores for the Kisan Samman Nidhi, which will greatly improve the condition of



farmers. With the looming water crisis across the Indian subcontinent, it is reassuring to note that the government plans to allocate Rs. 3.5 lakh crores on its 'Jal Jeevan Mission', to provide access to piped potable water to every rural household by 2024. The Government's most successful program, Swachh Bharat Mission' affecting the health and dignity of the poor, and the open defecation-free campaign, by October 2, 2019, the 150th anniversary of the birth of Mahatma Gandhi is an applause-worthy effort. Over 9 crore toilets have already been built.

The focused approach of the government for developing modern infrastructure over the next 5 years with an allocation of Rs. 100 lakh crores is a major breakthrough to boost economic growth and create jobs. The Real Estate (Regulation and Development) Act 2016, combined with well-developed physical and digital infrastructure in the form of modernized green field airports, roads, smart cities, and electrification and high speed train corridors has been another major accomplishment which would give a big push to urbanization and economic growth.

An important low hanging fruit is India's tourism sector, as it has the potential to create millions of new jobs in the coming times. This concurs with the PM's suggestion of creating 100 tourist destinations in the country as well as requesting people to visit at least 15 tourist destinations within India by the year 2022. Liberalization of the e-Visa scheme along with low Visa charges for even 5-year Visas is a welcome decision to increase the inflow of tourists.

The steps undertaken by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) including a significant reduction in the repo rate by 110 basis points in the last few quarters, launch of repo rate/ external benchmark linked loan products, Rs. 30,000 crores liquidity support to HFCs and transfer of Rs. 1.76 lakh crore by the RBI to the government would create immense scope for government spending in various promising sectors of the economy.

It also gives me immense pleasure to report that the Reserve Bank of India has accepted our recommendations for Priority Sector lending to MSMEs by Non-Banking Finance Companies. A notification was issued last month whereby MSMEs will now be able to avail credit up to Rs. 20 lakhs at concessional rates, benefiting thousands of MSMEs.

Going ahead, I believe that further initiatives in ease of doing business at the ground level, especially for small and medium sized enterprises, along with desired reforms in labour laws, such as fixed-term employment for flexibility in hiring by industry across the States would be crucial in strengthening the manufacturing sector as part of the 'Make in India' programme and creating employment opportunities for our growing young workforce while infusing growth impulses into the economy.

The past few months have been historical. From the Resolution scrapping of Article 370 in Jammu and Kashmir, a defining moment for India, to passing of the Triple Talaq Bill for protecting the rights of Muslim women, this Government has witnessed an overwhelming support

of the countrymen due to PM Modi's determination and decisiveness to build a united and developed India. Going ahead, I must say that it was indeed an honor for us as a nation that our Prime Minister was invited by French President Macron to be a guest at the G7 Leaders' Summit held in France, August 24-26, 2019.

Given the Chamber's 360 degree vision and focus on all major sectors of the economy like agriculture, industry, education, skill development, etc, the past year saw many mega programs brought together, in coordination with the PHD state chapters, like the Agriculture Summit at Sonipat, organized with the Haryana government, graced by Shri Ram Nath Kovind, Hon'ble President of India, as the Chief Guest for the valedictory session. As an endeavour to promote skilling, employability and entrepreneurship among the youth, we put together the 'Global Skill Summit' at Ranchi for the government of Jharkhand.

Taking a peek into our international outlook, the Chamber undertook foreign missions and expos to our partners in US, Chile, Germany, Poland, Kenya, Ghana, Georgia, Russia, Iran, Azerbaijan, China, Thailand, Malaysia, Nepal, Bangladesh and many more including the Horasis meeting at Spain, to reinforce our international and economic bonds.

With the Chamber's 114th Annual Session on "Towards an Inclusive and Prosperous India," the Annual Awards for Excellence and the AGM, scheduled for September 30, 2019, I urge all our members to attend this grand session which will be graced by the presence of Cabinet Ministers and experts who will be enlightening the audience with their views and making it an enriching experience for one and all. We have also had various luminaries addressing our Managing Committee Meetings. Among them were the Chairman-TRAI, Chairman- Competition Commission of India, Chief Election Commissioner of India, CEO-Niti Aayog and others.

I believe that our vision is perhaps our greatest strength. It has kept us alive to the power and continuity of thoughts through the centuries. I am happy that our Prime Minister has embarked upon a journey of hope and aspirations, driven by the collective efforts of 1.3 billion people. I am positive that the country will move ahead at a fast pace while undertaking the right path towards becoming a USD 5 trillion economy with sustainable growth ahead.

To conclude, in the apt words of Abraham Lincoln, "Leave nothing for tomorrow which can be done today", I bid adieu with the confidence that the Chamber shall continue to take forward the nation towards Progress, Harmony and Development.

in vital areas such as boosting public and private investments, ease of doing business, bolstering manufacturing with a special focus on MSMEs, state-of-the-art infrastructure, revitalizing exports and creating job opportunities for the growing young workforce in India.

While extending a warm welcome to dignitaries from government and industry, Mr Rajeev Talwar, President, PHDCCI said that the role of states' has become crucial to explore the potential of our vibrant country and to achieve a size of USD 5 trillion economy in the next five years. Mr. Talwar congratulated the officials from the states' on their excellent contribution in enabling a business environment to enhance the economic growth of the country. Going ahead, he said that the states' can contribute significantly in the areas of skill development, improving the supply chains and harmonizing the industrial and workforce relationships.

Dr D K Tiwari, Chief Secretary, Govt. of Jharkhand said that Ease of Doing Business (EoDB) should be enhanced across the country to strengthen the states' economies and the overall economic growth of the country. Jharkhand is the first state with the first steel plant of India; India produced around 106 million steel in 2018. New avenues of growth in the country need to be found for achieving a target of US \$ 5trillion economy, added Dr Tiwari. He appreciated PHDCCI's remarkable work in Jharkhand and for hosting the States' Policy Conclave that creates the most impactful interface between the government and industry.

Ms. Vini Mahajan, Additional Chief Secretary, Govt. of Punjab said "India prospers when center and states work together". Highlighting the achievements of Punjab, she said that Punjab was one of the states to do full electrification in the state and is a power surplus state. She added that healthy competition amongst

states' is one of the key drivers of India's economic growth. She shared her moment of pride for being a citizen of the state of Punjab which is known as the food bowl of India and the fact that the state readily helped the citizens of the country whenever the country needed it.

Mr. Devender Singh, Additional Chief Secretary, Govt. of Haryana said that providing monetary support to the MSME sector is crucial. He mentioned that the state is consistently growing more than 10% per annum during the last many years and has recently launched a scheme to diversify and conserve the crop pattern in the state. He said that this is an opportunity to take advantage of the ongoing trade war between US and China and increase the contribution of India's exports to a substantial level. He said that the country should have a focused approach on its core strength sectors which include agriculture, IT, textiles and garments.

Dr Shamika Ravi, Member, PM's Economic Advisory Council, India and Director-Research, Brookings India said that India is an economy majorly influenced by the states' and UTs and it is important to think about the potential for each and every state and UT to participate more in the global economy and to achieve the US \$ 5 trillion economy.

Dr D K Aggarwal, Senior Vice President, PHDCCI said that over the last five years, the State Governments have played a crucial role in creating an enabling environment for boosting investments across the country.

Mr. Sanjay Aggarwal, Vice President, PHDCCI said that the Indian economy is on the path of becoming a USD 5 trillion economy and effective center-state co-operation would be crucial to achieve inclusive growth and development.

Mr. Vipin Kumar, Resident Commissioner, Govt. of Bihar said that the Government of Bihar has introduced a Single Window System, new policies and initiatives to promote investment.

Ms. Monalisha Dash, Additional Resident Commissioner, Govt. of Sikkim highlighted that Sikkim was conferred by UN for FAO's Future Policy Gold Award for 100% organic farming for its achievement in becoming the world's first totally organic agriculture state.

Ms. Bhavna Saxena, Special Commissioner, Andhra Pradesh Economic Development Board, Govt. of Andhra Pradesh said that Andhra Pradesh is number one in the country in the Ease-doing-business rankings and is an attractive destination for investors in the areas of automobiles, electronics and pharmaceuticals. The state has set up a Skills Development Corporation and is setting up 500 skill development centers across the state to ensure ready availability of work force.

Mr. Sham Lal Goyal, Investment Commissioner, Govt. of Maharashtra shared that the Maharashtra Government is diligently working on the socio-economic development of districts such as Marathwada water grid, Samruddhi Marg from Nagpur to Mumbai covering 21 districts and identifying new cities. He said that identifying new cities will increase the scope of infrastructure and investment in the state.

PHD Chamber organized a Post Budget Interactive Session 2019-20 on July 10, 2019 at PHD House, New Delhi. The Chief Guest of the Session was Mr. Akhilesh Ranjan, Member (Legislation), CBDT while the Guest of Honour was Mr. Prabhash Shankar, Principal Chief Commissioner of Income Tax, Delhi Region.

Chief Guest, Mr. Akhilesh Ranjan, Member (Legislation), CBDT assured industry stakeholders that a task force has been set up to look into issues raised by industry on the budget announcements. He mentioned that large-scale credible tax schemes and tax administrative reforms are in the offering for India Inc. and tax payer. He said that compared to other world economies, Indian taxes are still very moderate. He reiterated the need for reducing the levels of inequalities, which are a great concern for the Indian economy and said that the tax on the super rich would help the government to address the

issue to some level.

Mr. Prabhash Shankar, Principal Chief Commissioner of Income Tax, Delhi Region thanked the Chamber for their cooperation and support in contributing to increase in revenue collections. He stated that last year's target revenue collections from Delhi have been achieved. He mentioned that for achieving this year's target, co-operation from industry is needed.

Mr. Rajeev Talwar, President, PHD Chamber in his welcome remarks lauded the Budget announcements and said that the new budgetary exercise is more of a vision, a blue print for a speedy growth for the desired vision of a USD 5 trillion economy by 2024 and USD 3 trillion economy by the end of this fiscal year. He added that we do aspire to become a rich country and hopefully in our life time we do see the Indian economy with a size of 15 to 20 trillion dollar economy. As a result of which infrastructure development will be there, forex reserves and exports will

grow in the coming times. He mentioned that the MSME sector is the main driver of economic growth which should be boosted along with focus on agriculture, food processing industries and logistics sector. Affordable housing, real estate sector and a new rental policy are path breaking changes for the economy. He stated that creating a New India is a target which involves contribution from everybody. He concluded by saying that the government has done an excellent task not only in GST but in IBC and through good education, skill development, industrial growth and overall economic prosperity.

Dr. D K Aggarwal, Senior Vice President, PHD Chamber stated that the Indian economy has already grown at US\$ 2.7 trillion size and remains to expand for another US\$ 2.3 trillion in the next five years which is conveniently achievable with its prospective growth rate of nominal 12%. He appreciated the budget by saying that if Indians have to be rich, we cannot



depend on consumption as a growth driver, it is investment which will drive the growth and generate employment. He added that the government has accepted long-term structural growth driven by investment as against short-term fiscal stimulus. He also mentioned that the real interest rate is too high and there is a need to reduce it, push private investment in the economy, generate employment opportunities and boost foreign portfolio investments in the coming times.

Mr. Sanjay Aggarwal, Vice President, PHD Chamber said that the Union budget is a path breaking budget and more of a vision statement. He stated that the proposal to streamline multiple labour laws is encouraging and opined that simplification of labor laws is necessary at this juncture to provide a big relief to the industry. He emphasized on higher education policy, affordable housing and Direct Tax Code amendments. He also suggested that a lot of deliberations should take place before introducing and implementing the same.

Mr. Anil Kumar Chopra, Chairman,

Direct Taxes Committee, PHD Chamber threw light on the recent amendments in the provisions of Income Tax Act which are favorable to the assesses along with few concerns. He appreciated the proposals related to 25% corporate tax rate, capital gain exemptions, promoting cashless economy, E-vehicles, pension scheme among others. Further, he also briefed on taxation amendments including Minimum Alternate Tax (MAT), Income Computation and Disclosure Standards (ICDS), TDS on cash withdrawal and suggested that income tax deduction on interest paid on home loans should be extended for 3 to 5 years instead of March 31, 2020.

Mr. Bimal Jain, Chairman, Indirect Tax Committee, PHD Chamber stated that customs duty rates are being rationalized to promote "Make in India" and to protect domestic manufacturers. He appreciated the government for introducing the GST, which has brought India to become one

nation, one tax and one market instead of multiplicity of taxes or double taxation. He also admired GST Council's working system for taking major decisions related to automated refund of tax, E-invoicing system for specific sector and most importantly return simplifications. He also mentioned that a new scheme has been announced in the Union Budget "sabka vishwas legacy dispute resolution scheme 2019" so that tax payers can come forward and settle down and get benefit from tax payable.

Mr. Ashwani Taneja, Co-chairman, Direct Taxes Committee, PHD Chamber delivered the vote-of-thanks to the esteemed guests and dignitaries. 

The PHD Research Bureau of PHD Chamber organized an open house discussion on 'Post Election Market Outlook of Various Asset Classes' on June 7, 2019 at PHD House, New Delhi. The aim of the open house discussion was to discuss the sentiments and trends of the Indian stock market post Lok Sabha Election results.

While welcoming the eminent speakers and the delegates, Dr D K Aggarwal, Senior Vice President, PHD Chamber, stated that GDP growth for the last quarter 2018-19 was 5.8% which is lowest in the last 5 years and India is no longer the fastest moving economy. The overall annual growth rate stands at 6.8% and unemployment rate has been at a 45 year high at 6.1% in FY 2017-18. Further, he talked about the fundamentals of the economy and mentioned that inflation which stands at 2.9% and WPI at 3.1% are comfortable numbers for a developing economy.

Mr. Vijay Mehta, Chairman, Capital Market Committee, PHD Chamber, expressed that markets today are bullish in the long-run with some roller coaster rides going on depending on the technical conditions in the market. But at the same time, he said that good shares of large corporations were expected to give very good returns to long-term investors.

Mr. Ajay Mehra, Chairman of Gems and Jewellery Committee, PHD Chamber expressed his views on Gold as an asset class and the importance of this Industry with respect to its contribution to the

economy. He opined that private equity players should now look towards this promising industry as an apex industry, with maximum money required only for inventory and not machines and tools as it requires human skills and machinery, with a cost of funds of 3% per annum.

Mr. B. K. Sabharwal, Chairman of Capital Market Committee, PHD Chamber mentioned that in today's scenario, everything is about the capital market and asset classes. He pointed out that India has one of the lowest percentage share of people who invest, less than 4%. He mentioned that the need of the hour is the provision of investor education in tier 2 and 3 cities, as this would also cause more investors to come into the Indian market.

Mr. Ambuj Jain, Co-chairman, Economic Affairs Committee, PHD Chamber mentioned that the markets of US, Germany and India have been the strongest stock markets. He estimated that SENSEX- would likely to be in the range between Rs. 36000- 40000 for many months and USD/ rupee would likely to be above Rs. 69/USD during 2019.

Mr. Sanjeev Bhasin, EVP, Market & Corporate Affairs, India Infoline) stated that the markets have been up lately, however, only selected stocks have pulled the market up. He mentioned that despite low investments, among others, India's political stability has been the strongest since India became a republic. He stated that the Indian market will outgrow these negatives.

Mr. Pankaj Sangal, General Manager,

Bombay Stock Exchange (BSE), stated that despite having brains, assets in India trading does not happen at a huge level. He stated that the BSE (Bombay Stock Exchange) is a first universal exchange and they have the vision to address all the asset classes, be it gold or gold bond.

Mr. Navin Pathak, Senior Partner, Entry India in his perspective of India from an international view, called India a land of Galapagos (an island in the Pacific where Charles Darwin wrote his theory of evolution) because of vast number of opportunities that it offers to businesses with the given resources. He said that opportunities exist but having an opportunity alone does not mean that you make money out of it; implementation and efficient execution is required at the same time.

Mr. Yogesh Mathur, Senior Advisor, Grant Thornton believed that today the US economy is a consuming economy and the largest economy in the world and if the Indian economy is benchmarked to the US Economy in terms of consumption then the future of Indian economy is very bright as India would be a much larger consuming economy.

Dr S P Sharma, Chief Economist, PHD Chamber, discussed about the objective of the Open House Discussion on Post Election Market outlook after the oath of Modi 2.0 and various developments that have taken place, such as volatility in markets, slowing down of GDP growth to 5.8% and India not being the fastest moving economy at this juncture.

Open House Discussion on RERA Act: Its Impact and Implications

The Housing and Urban Development Committee of PHD Chamber organized an Open House Discussion on RERA Act: Its Impact and Implications on August 20, 2019 at PHD Chamber, New Delhi.

Mr. K K Khandewal, Chairman, Real Estate Regulatory Authority, Gurugram while explaining the RERA Act opined that legislation formed should be sector specific, comprehensive and address the objectives it is suppose to address. He suggested PHDCCI to make recommendations to the Government for necessary amendments in RERA Act to make it fruitful for both builders and buyers of dwelling units.

Mr. Balvinder Kumar, Member, U.P. - Real Estate Regulatory Authority stated that a large number of complaints registered under UP RERA have been addressed. UP RERA has received a total of 17000 complaints, out of which 10,100 have been addressed. He also stated that there are many builders who want to complete their projects with the right earnest but have no money at all, as banks/NBFCs are reluctant to lend money to the real estate developers. He assured that the RERA team is doing their best to recover money from the defaulting builders and compensate the allottees. UP RERA has set up a consulting agency to advise on implementation of a single window system.

Dr D K Aggarwal, Senior-Vice President, PHD Chamber stated that the real estate sector is the second largest employment generating sector. He reiterated the need for successful implementation of RERA that includes compulsory registration, speedy redressal of complaints, accountability, transparency and quality projects at the given time.

Mr. Sanjay Aggarwal, Vice President, PHD Chamber said that the RERA Act is an encouragement for earnest and high quality developers, as he is unable to differentiate his product from the other defaulting developers and is a victim of the Halo effect created in the builder community.

Mr. Manoj Kapoor, Konsultantz LLP (Consultant on Real Estate Policy making to the state governments of Haryana, Punjab, M.P. and Rajasthan) gave a presentation on impact and implications of RERA. He highlighted two case studies of Haryana- licensed plotted colony and

Tax Aspects of Business Reconstructions & Acquisitions, Mergers-Demergers and Slump Sale

The Direct Taxes Committee of PHD Chamber organized a conference on “Tax Aspects of Business Reconstructions & Acquisitions, Mergers-Demergers and Slump Sale” on August 7, 2019 at PHD Chamber, New Delhi.

Mr. Sanjay Aggarwal, Vice President, PHD Chamber while presenting the welcome remarks said that mergers and acquisitions are used as instruments of momentous growth and are increasingly getting accepted by Indian businesses as critical tool of business strategy. Efforts of the income tax legislation in India are quite development oriented for domestic companies going for merger or amalgamation and acquisition. He also stated that Business Reconstructions are also an accepted strategy for corporate growth. While they may create value, they also mitigate agency problems associated with a firm’s free cash flow, enhance the firm’s market power, or help utilize tax credits. He added that the tax impact of properly structuring the disposition and acquisition of a company can have a very material impact on the economics of the transaction to both parties and there are numerous tax planning opportunities that allow each party to obtain its specific tax and economic objectives without harming the other party.

Mr. Anil Kumar Chopra, Chairman, Direct Taxes Committee, PHD Chamber shared his views on issues and challenges faced by assesses under Business Reconstructions & Acquisitions, Mergers-Demergers and Slump Sale. He stated that simplifications and efficiencies in

laws enabling provisions are good for the business as well as for the economy. He mentioned that mergers and acquisitions are increasing both domestically and globally. He also gave a brief view on tax aspects of Business Reconstructions and Acquisitions, tax concepts of amalgamation, Mergers-Demergers, Slump Sale, unabsorbed depreciation, set off and carry forward losses, litigations and all sections related to these topics .

Ms. Gouri Puri, Partner, Shardul Amarchand Mangaldas & Co. shared her views on Tax Aspects of Acquisitions. She highlighted some key features correlated with seller and buyer considerations. She explained all the key aspects of acquisition structures related to asset sales, slump sale and share sale. Further, she explained key issues of asset transfer, slump sale and share sale by referring some cases. She threw light on global acquisitions -

direct and indirect transfers and taxation of earn outs. Further, she discussed about the importance of due diligence and tax insurance along with highlighting on evaluating enforceability of tax indemnities, representations and warranties and tax indemnity payments etc.

Mr. Suraj Malik, Partner, BDO India LLP. gave a presentation on Tax Aspects on Slump sale. He explained slump sale vs. demerger and slump sale vs. itemized sale in detail, its concept, consideration, nature of gain, taxability, time frame etc by referring various case examples. Further, he shared few practical considerations related to section 47 benefits, stamp duty on business transfer agreement, treatment of section 43B items, sections 50C, 50CA, 56(2)(x) and so on with the participants.

Mr. Rohit Jain, Partner, Vaish Associates Advocates shared a presentation on tax aspects of merger and reverse merger.

He also discussed about the concept of reverse merger which occurs when a private company that has strong prospects and is eager to raise finance buys a publicly listed shell company, usually one with no business and limited assets. He stated that in case of reverse merger, the profits of the amalgamating company would be set off by the losses of the amalgamated company.

Mr. S.R. Patnaik, Partner, Cyril Amarchand Mangaldas shared his views on Tax Aspects of Demerger. He also briefly explained the essentials of a tax neutral demerger and implications of tax related to (Section 72A) the accumulated business carry forward and set of losses and unabsorbed depreciation of the demerged. He stated that the key advantages of demergers are enabling streamlined operations and management accountability by segregation of business, increased focus on core competency, value creation for shareholders, increase in market capitalization, tax exemptions on fulfillment of conditions, among others.

Mr. Manish Kapur, Partner, International Tax & Deal Advisory, M&A Tax, BSR & Co. LLP gave a presentation on Tax Aspects of Cross border aspects of Mergers & Demergers. He explained the typical issues in cross border Mergers and acquisitions related to finance the deal, MNC issues,

Mr. Ashwani Taneja, Co-chairman, Direct Taxes Committee, PHD Chamber briefly explained the concept of merger, amalgamation and integration. He stated that all the factors like Investors of both sides, creditors, employees and tax partners (Government) plays an important role in the process of merger and amalgamation.

Conclave on Dispute Resolution Scheme, Key Advance Rulings and GST New Return Systems

The Eighth Conclave of the GST Series was held on “Dispute Resolution Scheme, Key Advance Rulings and GST New Return Systems” on August 26, 2019 at PHD House, New Delhi.

Mr. Bimal Jain, Chairman, Indirect Taxes Committee, PHDCCI appreciated the government for bringing in lots of procedural changes in New GST Return Format. He highlighted that in the New GST Return Format, taxpayers would be required to file FORM GST RET-1/2/3 on the basis of option selected. He mentioned that Goods and Services Tax Network has released a trial version of New Returns Offline Tool of Form GST ANX-1, Form GST ANX-2 (with matching tool built in it) and a template for purchase register which will be used to import data of purchase register for matching.

Ms. Kanupriya Bhargava, Advaita Legal in her presentation on “Advance Authority Ruling and Divergent Legal Jurisprudence and Way Forward” discussed the Composition of AAR in pre-GST era and under GST regime. He discussed the cross charge related concept and its applicability including valuation related aspects along with the industry wide practice. She also discussed the Taxability of Employer-Employee services.

Mr. Mathivanan N, Lakshmikumaran & Sridharan discussed the two main components of the Sabka Vishwas-Legacy Dispute Resolution Scheme, 2019. The dispute resolution component is aimed at liquidating the legacy cases of Central Excise and Service Tax that are subsumed

in GST and are pending in litigation at various forums. The most attractive aspect of the Scheme is that it provides substantial relief in tax dues for all categories of cases as well as full waiver of interest, fine or penalty. The Scheme is especially tailored to free the large number of small taxpayers of their pending disputes with the tax administration.

The Conclave was graced by Mr. Prabin Dokania, CFO and Mr. Vivek Kumar, AVP (Services). They discussed in details about the preparation of GST ANX-1 by using Excel/csv template, Creation of JSON File of GST ANX-1, Downloading the auto-drafted GST ANX-2 from GST Portal, Importing the Purchase Register in the Offline Tool, Use of Matching Tool in the

tool, Taking actions of Accept, Reject or Pending on GST ANX-2 and Creating JSON file of GST ANX-2.

Mr. Puneet Bansal, Nitya Tax Associates in his presentation said that GSTN has come up with a web-based prototype which is an interactive demo version of the “Offline Tools of New Return”. Since this is an interactive prototype, it will allow a user to navigate between various pages and use several functionalities like invoice upload, drop-down menus, purchase register upload for matching with inward supplies (system-created), etc. He mentioned that the new return system will replace GSTR-3B, GSTR-1; this user-friendly prototype will give the user a feel of how the tool will look like.

Seminar on EB5 Visa

The Americas Committee of PHD Chamber organized three Seminars on EB5 visa to USA at New Delhi on August 27, 2019; Ahmedabad on August 28, 2019 and Mumbai on August 30, 2019. The EB5 investor visa program is administered by the USCIS (United States Citizenship and Immigration Services). The objective of the seminars was to make delegates aware of the following:

- 1) Current US Immigration Paths and Potential Changes in Various Visa Category;
- 2) Introduction of EB-5 Program;
- 3) EB-5 Process Timeline and Application Stages;
- 4) Source of Funds Documentation and 5) Investment Opportunities.

Mr. Aaron Hammon, Vice President of Operations, Behring Capital, United States called upon the members of PHD Chamber to come forward and pro-actively explore investment opportunities in the United States as it is one of the most open markets in the world which provides for conducive investment climate. He mentioned that US administration now sees India as one of the major beneficiaries of this programme because of Indian entrepreneurs' skills.

Mr. Aaron Hammon and Mr. Peter Bibler, American Attorney provided an insight and made the audience aware on how foreign entrepreneurs may benefit by exploring the great opportunities associated with the EB5 Visa program through investing in a commercial enterprise in the United States by Behring Capital. Under this visa program, entrepreneurs, their spouses and unmarried children under the age of 21, are eligible to apply for a green card (permanent residence) if certain investment conditions are met. This in turn provides a unique opportunity for both the US and foreign nationals/entrepreneurs to benefit in the long-run.

The speakers also advised the potential investors to detail their homework and study pros and cons of the EB5 programme of US administration so that investments are well protected and their returns become reasonable because of stringent laws of the land, non-compliance of which might create problems for investors.

The session concluded with an intense networking discussion through which the queries of the audience were





India has become the sixth-largest economy in the world and is on course to become the fifth largest in 2019 by pipping the United Kingdom. We are set to become a USD 3 trillion economy in the current fiscal, and with structural reforms, the current government aims to reach USD 5 trillion in the next few years. The growth has come on the back of many big reforms, such as indirect taxation, bankruptcy code and real estate regulator.

Riding on the wave of reforms, the Indian economy grew at a healthy rate in the last fiscal year. The 8.2% growth recorded in the first quarter, however, eased to around 7.3% in subsequent quarters. This easing was a result of several factors ranging from rising global volatility to shock waves from deepening trade disputes around the globe.

Some concern areas are the continuing NBFC crisis and de-growth in the auto sector. However, with a continuity in the government and a clear mandate, I am sure that they will continue to undertake structural reforms to kick start the economy and set it back on the growth path.

Impact on the Insurance Industry

The non-life insurance industry is poised to expand further with growing middle class and wealth accumulation. This will give rise to the need for protection of their assets and health. Having said that, technology will continue to play a crucial role for the insurance industry as it strives to add more customers in a country that remains largely under-insured. Tech-enabled servicing initiatives for customers and sales force will help to streamline the insurance processes.

The regulatory and legislative intervention also opened newer possibilities for the industry. For example, diseases such as HIV and mental illness were brought under policy covers, long-term third-party motor insurance became mandatory and the Government launched an ambitious Ayushman Bharat scheme to cover almost 50 crore people with basic health cover.

These and many other initiatives such as the introduction of easy-to-understand and customer-friendly products will help to further strengthen the reach of insurance in the country.

IFFCO Tokio Initiatives

Tech-enabled services will be the focus area for IFFCO Tokio. Recently the company launched AI tools to assess the

The customer app also has several other features like a repository of all policies, facility to track and set renewal reminders, buy or renew policies etc. This single app can help in managing all insurance-related services like buy/renew to claim settlement of motor and health insurance.

To offer innovative and customer-friendly products, IFFCO Tokio General Insurance Company Limited has recently launched a Bank Locker Protector Policy, which is the first policy in the industry to protect the contents of a bank locker such as jewellery and other valuables. The policy offers a cover against various risks including fire, earthquake, burglary, holdup, infidelity by bank staff or any act of terrorism. Challenges and Road Ahead

In FY 2018-19, the gross premium of the industry grew by 14%. There will, however, be a few challenges going ahead. With the thrust of the government on electric vehicles and tightening of credit norms by the banks, the auto industry is going through a tough phase. According to the latest statistics, private car numbers are down by 18 per cent and passenger vehicle segment by 23 per cent in June.

Though the auto industry is going through a tough phase, the Indian insurance industry is expected to grow on the back of deeper penetration of retail products, such as health insurance in the coming years. This will be a big opportunity for the insurance industry to tap, given the rising healthcare costs. In addition to this, there are other opportunities like liability insurance especially the D & O insurance, cybercrime insurance, etc. which can propel growth. The renewed impetus to infrastructure in the recent budget also will open up new opportunities of growth in the insurance sector.

To sum it up, the insurance industry is poised to expand further with a growing young population and awareness boosting by the regulator and the industry, towards the need for protection.

Failure of mediation in Mahabharata: Let us not repeat the history

Who does not know the long lasting, devastating and frightening results of war of Mahabharata? Though very candid and expert mediator, Lord Krishna tried his best to solve the dispute of Pandavas and Kauravas and even proposed Kauravas to give only 5 villages to Pandavas. Arrogant and non-compromising Kauravas did not agree to even that. See what happened? It is an example that dispute devastated the whole kingdom, killing everybody associated with dispute one way or other leaving damage of property and remaining the ruins in the whole region. Time has come to learn from the mistakes and not to repeat the mistakes of past. With social development, technical advancement and growth of materialistic life, dispute has become a way of living happening at each and every step of all walks of life of this global village.

Look at the legal scenario of India where approximately 3 crores cases are pending and many more to be added in future. This situation is not likely to improve in near future. Arbitration as mode of dispute resolution also has not taken-off in spite of toll claims to make India as an arbitration hub. It means India has to look for alternate to arbitration and courts which can be mediation as most accepted mode of dispute settlement.

Mediation has been the mode of dispute resolution right from the birth of human life on this earth and has been quite effective. Somebody either voluntarily offers to be a mediator or disputants agree to accept somebody as mediator which is very simple to resolve the dispute based on common agreement with a win-win situation. Contrary to this, today majorly litigation through courts and arbitration through arbitration mechanism are being adopted by the disputants which is not only time consuming but also very costly. Comparatively litigation/arbitration has much more disadvantages to mediation. But question comes when other modes of dispute resolution are not better than the mediation, then why mediation has not become the major mode of dispute resolution? Mediation is not only most economical, quick without breaking the thread of relationship but win-win situation for all the disputants. If so, then let us plan how to make mediation as strongest mode of dispute resolution in every walk of dispute.

Having said the above, mediation in general and institutional mediation in specific has still not taken-off properly in India in comparison to

some acceptance of arbitration. For instance, ICC Singapore, Malaysia, France, Switzerland and LCA, London are few glaring examples of excellent institutional arbitration forums and are known for their excellent performance and arbitration awards but world fame mediation institutions in India are still missing. Many Indian disputants are going to these centers for resolution of their disputes rather than adopting mediation as mediation mode of dispute resolution in India.

Measures for making mediation as strongest mode of dispute resolution.

1. Make it mandatory for every dispute to pass through mediation before it is entertained by a Court or Arbitrator.
2. Keep the clause in every contracts / agreements that any dispute will be first resolved through mediation.
3. Every country should pass an act elaborating the procedure and guidelines for robust mediation.
4. Every country should create, develop and train professional mediators to do the job skillfully.
5. Special training institutes to be created for mediators.
6. Every country should have an apex body to govern, monitor and facilitate mediation through National Council of Mediation.

World class mediation Institutes should be established

It is essential that good professional mediation institutions should be established to undertake the following initiatives:

- i. Formulate simple & practical rules/procedures for conducting mediation.
- ii. Develop an exhaustive system to empanel experienced and competent mediators with techno-legal expertise/domain knowledge for dealing with various disputes.
- iii. Tie-up with the best mediation institutes operating abroad for synchronizing and fine tuning the procedures, system and administration of the institute accordingly to achieve world-class quality operations of the institute.

- iv. Collaborate and tie-up with local universities/colleges/institutes to develop & train new generation of mediators with various domain knowledge.
- v. Develop the website of mediation institutes.
- vi. Mediation institutions should develop system and facilities of online mediation.
- vii. Mediation institutions should have centers located in other major cities and state capitals to make its access easy for the disputants located in that area.
- viii. Conduct trainings, seminars, workshops for mediation and disputants not only at centers but all also at the premises of large corporates at very economical prices.
- ix. Initially institutes must appoint local representatives/for networking and facilitations to bring mediation cases to the Institute rather than going to arbitrators/courts.
- x. Mediation Institutes should have a provisions of emergency mediation on 24 hours basis.

Additional initiatives by Government of India on Institutional Mediation:

The Govt. of India also should take the following initiatives:

- i) Advice all central PSUs, autonomous bodies, ministries and all departments to adopt as mediation mode of dispute resolution before approaching to arbitration/courts based on the agreement clause in all contracts without any fail.
- ii) Ban and remove all anti-mediation environment, policies and practices which are contravention to basic notion of mediation. For Govt. of India, Central and states PSUs, independent and authorized mediation committees should be constituted whose members should not be from the organizations but from the government sector.

With the aforesaid approach and actions, it is possible to develop good mediation institutes in India and make institutional mediation a major mode of resolving disputes in India.

It is being ensured by the health worker that menstrual hygiene is being maintained by the school girls on a regular basis. Besides above, computer classes and English speaking classes have also been introduced in these schools.

GDP slump signals significant deceleration in investment

India's GDP growth was behind China's 6.2 per cent in April-June, its weakest pace in at least 27 years

India's economic growth dropping to an over six-year low of 5 per cent in April-June 2019 is indicating a "significant deceleration" in both investment and consumer demand, industry body Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and Industry (Ficci) said today.

Expressing "deep" concerns over sluggishness in the growth momentum, Ficci president Sandip Somany said: "The latest GDP growth numbers are below expectations and point towards a significant deceleration in both consumption and investment demand." He, however, hoped that a series of measures being taken by the government and the central bank to reverse this slowing trajectory would help improve economic situation in the subsequent quarters, according to a Ficci statement.

"The mega bank consolidation plan, liberalisation of FDI guidelines and the stimulus package are comprehensive and address the key pain areas of the economy," Mr Somany added.

With a mix of both broader measures and sector-specific interventions, the Indian economy and the industry would come out of this weak patch soon, he said.

The PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry said the recent economic reforms undertaken by the government

and the RBI will create a strong and resilient economic environment in the country and rejuvenate GDP growth rate in the coming quarters.

PHDCCI president Rajeev Talwar said: "The big ticket economic reforms including recapitalisation of public sector banks, rollback of enhanced surcharge on foreign portfolio investors, payment of all pending GST refunds to

MSMEs... are inspiring and would go a long way to foster strong, stable and inclusive growth environment in the country."

Going ahead, he said, further reforms in ease of doing business at the ground level especially for the small and medium sized businesses along with desired reforms in labour laws such as fixed term employment for flexibility

in hiring by industry across the states would be crucial to strengthen the manufacturing sector.

India's economic growth has slumped for the fifth straight quarter to an over six-year low of 5 per cent in the three months ended June as consumer demand and private investment slowed amid deteriorating global environment.

Having lost the tag of the world's fastest-growing economy earlier this year, India's GDP growth was behind China's 6.2 per cent in April-June, its weakest pace in at least 27 years.

Meanwhile, Fitch Group's India Ratings and Research chief economist Devendra Parth said: "The growth also got downgraded by private final consumption expenditure, which grew 3.1 per cent only (18 quarter low). Investment demand also remained lacklustre and fixed capital formation grew 4.6 per cent (4QFY19: 3.6 per cent). Only government expenditure provided support to growth and increased by 8.8 per cent."

Banks must transmit rate cut by RBI to boost investment: Corporate India

With the RBI slashing the repo rate by 35 basis points, corporate India today said its swift and full transmission by banks in the form of lower lending rates will be crucial to lift consumption and investment in the economy.

The Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) Monetary Policy Committee today cut the interest rate by 35 basis points - the fourth successive reduction - to a nine-year low level, in an attempt to boost an economy growing at its slowest pace in nearly five years.

"With today's cut, the RBI has lowered the policy rate (repo) by 110 basis points in the current calendar year. The central bank has also kept liquidity in the surplus mode, and it is now critical for banks to move fast and transmit this ease in policy rate in the form of lower

lending rates.

"Unless the transmission is swift and full, we may not see a change in the consumption and investment trajectory," Ficci president Sandip Somany said. PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry president Rajeev Talwar said the repo rate cut will help rejuvenate consumption and increase competitiveness of the producers with reduced cost of capital.

"However, at this juncture, transmission of the cut in repo rate with an effective reduction in lending rates by the banking sector would be crucial to materialise the benefits at the ground level," said Mr Talwar. The repo rate is the rate at which the RBI lends to banks. According to the Indian Chamber of Commerce, reduction in the repo rate will transmit to cheaper loans which will boost the economy at large, especially sectors such as real estate and auto-

mobiles, and spur the latent consumer demand in these segments. Higher disposable income in the hands of consumer will also fuel the growth in domestic demand going forward. "We believe that this announcement might result in a further reduction in home loan rates and will provide an impetus to the government's initiative of affordable housing," Mr Anshuman Magazine, chairman and chief executive officer (India, South East Asia, West Asia & Africa), CBRE, said. Exporter's body EEPFC India chairman Pavi Selgal said the central bank should also ensure easy credit disbursement to the exporters, especially in the MSME sector and transmission by the banks of the earlier reductions in the lending rates.

Expert comments: Terming the RBI's decision as unconventional, banking and

financial experts on today said the intent is to support growth while keeping inflation at sub-4 per cent level. They also pointed out that further initiatives are needed to boost consumption and investment to stimulate economic growth.

SBI chairman Rajnish Kumar said the RBI's decision to cut repo rate by an unconventional 35 basis points is perhaps a recognition that the monetary policy works best with unanticipated surprises to the market.

Yes Bank chief economist Shubhada Rao said that growth concerns "beget unconventional monetary easing."

"In a departure from usual convention of changing benchmark rates by 25 bps (or multiples thereof), the repo rate was reduced by 35 bps to 5.40 per cent (the lowest since Jul-10)," the Yes Bank chief economist said.

India Inc hails resolution, says it will draw 'large-scale investments' to Jammu & Kashmir

Mumbai (New Delhi, August 3) Industry leaders on Monday hailed the Centre's decision to scrap Article 370.

The industry leaders also saw the development as the BJP fulfilling its election promise.

"Of course, it will pave the way for Jammu and Kashmir to attract large scale investments," PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry President Rajeev Talwar told PTI.

He said since doing away with Article 370 was a part of the BJP's manifesto, it has the support of a majority of people who voted it to back to power.

Preferential trade deal with India soon, says Iran envoy

New Delhi, 28 August

Iran will soon sign a preferential tariff agreement with India that will slash tariffs on a large number of traded goods, Iranian ambassador to India Ali Chegeni said on Wednesday.

Many important items will be made zero duty as part of the deal, with a commitment to reduce tariffs on many others, he said, addressing Indian investors at the PHD Chamber of Commerce.

Till now, four rounds of negotiations have been completed and the last one was held in March in Tehran, where both countries discussed a draft text of the pact. Sources said the next round will soon be held in New Delhi.

Along with the trade deal, a bilateral investment protection agreement and a double taxation avoidance agreement are also in the works and Iran is confident of signing off on all three deals by end-2019, diplomatic sources said.

Betting on trade

Bilateral trade stood at \$17 billion in 2018-19 with exports from India at only \$3.5 billion.

Apart from petroleum, major imports from Iran, include fertilisers and chemicals, while exports include cereals, tea, coffee, spices and organic chemicals.

India is the 5th largest source of imports for Iran, while being the 6th largest destination of exports. "While the majority of outbound trade from Iran continues to be crude oil and related items, non-oil exports from Iran to India rose by 18 per cent in 2018, as compared to the year before," Economic Counsellor in the Iranian Embassy Asghar Omid said.

While Indian exports of man-made textiles are slowly increasing, Indian companies have been unable to use market access in pharmaceuticals, according to the Federation of Indian Export Organisations.

Tehran also remains hopeful of initiating a rupee trade mechanism with India, and later expanding it to include Russia, commerce department officials said. New Delhi had also been hopeful of using the domestic currency to pay for Iranian crude.

While experts and traders have suggested the mechanism as the best possible way to cut India's dollar exposure as well as shore up the value of the rupee, which has continued to plummet, the recent sanctions have also put off optimism from India.

Investment tangle

Tehran continues to command the titles of the second-highest proven reserves of natural gas and 4th largest crude producer globally.

While Indian businesses are keen to capitalise on Iran's \$2-million market, the economic sanctions imposed by the United States that are currently in place have dampened the mood.

As a result, Iran has instead channelised Indian interest in trade and investment into the Chabahar port, which remains outside the purview of sanctions. "The more than 600-km long railway between Chabahar port and the major city of Zahedan will open by early-2021," Chegeni said.

India's Journey towards a \$5 Trillion Economy

Seventy years after we became a Republic, India is poised to rise steadily on the path of becoming a global power. Our actions hold tremendous possibilities both for our people and the world in general. This presents us with both the opportunity and mandate to envision New India we aspire to create and the world order we wish to shape.

India's rise is an opportunity to reimagine an India in consonance with our highest civilizational ideals: joy, sustainable prosperity, responsible freedom, inclusive growth, peace and mutual respect. These ideals, when they influence our foreign policy, have the potential to shape a plural global order. As potential leaders and shapers of tomorrow, the current global environment calls on us to envision an inclusive global order and then strive to make it a reality. India needs a dream, an overarching vision to bring

coherence to our actions, to act as a balancing power and connect with individuals, nations and regions for achieving sustainable prosperity and progress.

India's Foreign Policy Approach

If we look very closely within this theme, India's foreign policy approach has been undergoing a paradigm shift with economic and strategic relations gaining significant cultural underpinnings. The new approach is reflected in the foreign policy pillars of Panchsheel - Samman (dignity and honour), Samvaad (engagement and dialogue), Samridhi (Shared Prosperity), Saralata (regional and global security) and Sandeh evam Sabhyata (culture and civilizational linkages). Panchsheel has begun to influence our international outreach. This has found place in our global engagements through the 'Neighbourhood First' and 'Act East' approach, as evidenced by Prime Minister inviting the heads of all

SAARC countries to his swearing-in ceremony in 2014 and his counterparts in the ASEAN for India's Republic Day in January 2018.

More recently in the second term of this Government, the emphasis has shifted from SAARC to BIMSTEC and Indian Ocean Region (IOR), in particular. The BIMSTEC is fast replacing SAARC as the primary focus for India's regionalism. India's interest in the Bay of Bengal and its enduring focus on Indian Ocean island states underline the emerging maritime dimensions of India's neighbourhood policy.

In line with the stated policy, the Prime Minister undertook his first visit to the Maldives and Sri Lanka. He reiterated the priority India attaches to its 'Neighbourhood First' policy and the SAGAR Doctrine. SAGAR refers to 'Security and Growth for All in the Region', a doctrine conceptualised by the Prime Minister aiming to keep the Indian Ocean region peaceful and secure. This move is a reflection of the Indian Ocean island states are the key to India's strategic geographical security. A beginning in this regard was made in 2015 when the Prime Minister travelled to Seychelles, Mauritius and Sri Lanka and outlined the SAGAR concept. The presence of the Prime Minister of Mauritius during the out-taking of the Prime Minister of India in 2019 was a significant indicator in that direction.

Achieving a \$5 Trillion Economy
At the Governing Council Meeting of the NITI Aayog recently,

Prime Minister announced the target of a \$5 trillion economy for India by 2024. It is essential to think big when seeking to make a difference, for transformation does not come from modest plans. Keeping in mind the aspirations of New India, what would we like to see in the proposed \$5 trillion economy? Certainly, it will require design, funding and governance. The Economic Survey has pegged a GDP growth rate of 7 per cent for FY20, up from 6.8 per cent in the previous fiscal. And to achieve the \$5 trillion economy, the Economic Survey has laid a road map where it says India must grow at 8 per cent.

The Survey has the formula for achieving a 'shifting of gears', "to ensure the objective of becoming a \$5 trillion economy by 2024-25". It makes the case for investment, especially private investment as key driver, that drives demand, creates capacity, increases labor productivity, introduces new technology and generates jobs. It also suggested that "exports must form an integral part of the growth model because higher savings preclude domestic consumption as the driver of final demand". The Survey stated "vicious cycle or a virtuous cycle". It says "when the economy is in a virtuous cycle, investment, productivity growth, job creation, demand and exports feed into each other and enable mutual spirits in the economy to thrive".

There is a need for the Government to focus on smoothing the process for private investments into infrastructure and other areas. Government has continued to create an enabling environment by setting in motion structural reforms, clarity in policy and processes, efficiency in allocation risk and resources. We need to focus on job creation and skill development in a fast-changing global economic order. There is a need to support the capital market through well-considered policies for the markets to play a greater role in funding economic activity.

Focus on MSME Sector

The significance of 65 million MSMEs who create about 120 million jobs and 30 per cent of the country's economic output and around 30 per cent of total employment generation cannot be underestimated. Keeping this in mind, the Government has

undertaken several transformational reforms in MSME sector recently.

New manufacturing operations will allow India to become part of few global value chains and help in rising exports to a trillion dollar mark. India has to focus on setting manufacturing ecosystems for product groups and take steps like setting up machinery that manufacture the products, specialty materials, biologics, nanotechnology, integrated circuits, embedded systems, medical imaging devices etc. Not to forget computers, TVs, mobile phones, and telecom equipment, auto components, toys, furniture, footwear and apparel. These skill and labour-intensive products can absorb part of surplus people from the agriculture or informal sector. There is a need to emphasize on flexible labour laws as there are an essential precondition for large-scale manufacturing.

Focus on Agriculture Sector

Sixty per cent of India's population lives in rural areas and is mostly engaged in agriculture. The Government has committed to double Farmers' income by 2022. The real issue is not the level of productivity but how produce can be converted into value that will decide farmers' income. Today, an industrialized nation can survive without agriculture. Globally, 60 to 80 per cent movement of goods is around agriculture or its products.

The focus has shifted from increasing per acre productivity to gradually employing farm households in other farm-related activities and to improve post-production value-addition by pooling of land and aggregation of farmers' produce to give farmers better bargaining power in the market. There have been several measures in recent times towards upgrading and harmonizing agricultural, agro-processing and agri-marketing. One of the many steps towards selling farmers' produce in better prices is creation of Organic Agriculture Markets (OAM) and linking them with the electronic farm-to-market, eNAM, to sell their produce nationally.



And to do this the Government has focused on development of sustainable and efficient cold-chain infrastructure in India for which National Centre for Cold-chain Development (NCCD) has been working with private sector, Ministry of Agriculture and Ministry of Food Processing Industries.

Focus on Services Sector

Services contribute to 56.5 per cent of GDP but create only 38 per cent of jobs. So far, IT sector has been the mainstay, exporting over 80 per cent of its \$150 billion turnover. But it is slow to be seen that more than 50 per cent of IT revenues come from the US, therefore the future looks challenging at the backdrop of current US policies.

Now the sector needs to develop expertise in IOT, AI, VR and their applications. Travel and tourism, health and professional services can be the other key service sectors. Faster delivery of infrastructure, education and essential services would also create a large number of jobs and growth.

The travel and tourism sector created 40 million jobs and contributed a significant 10 per cent to the GDP. Considering the variety of experiences India offers, the sector can grow manifold with project-driven investments in budget hotels, medical tourism, tourist safety and creating new tourist attractions.

Another big opportunity comes in global healthcare and wellness which is a \$8 trillion industry and would require over 100 million health workers in the next 15 years. There is an opportunity

in covering India's 600 district hospitals as medical training and pharmaceutical schools to train 5 million doctors, nurses and para-medics to meet the global requirement, who in turn can reap billions of dollars foreign currency every year. There is a huge potential in construction sector which contributes 10 per cent to India's GDP and it is the largest job generating sector after Agriculture.

A Trillion Dollar Opportunity in Digital India

Digital India initiative was launched by the Prime Minister on 1st July 2015. With a strong foundation of digital infrastructure and expanded digital access through Digital India initiative, India is now poised for the next phase of growth — creation of tremendous economic value and empowerment of citizens as new digital applications permeate sector after sector. India can create up to \$1 trillion of economic value from the digital economy in 2025, up from around \$100 billion currently generated.

India's digital consumer base is the second largest in the world and growing

at the second fastest rate amongst major economies. Our inclusive digital model is narrowing the digital divide within the country and bringing benefits of technology to all segments of people. Half the potential economic value of \$1 trillion in 2025 could come from new digital ecosystems in diverse sectors, including financial services, agriculture, healthcare, logistics and transportation, jobs and skills market, e-governance and other areas.

Finally, there is no doubt that how quickly policymakers are able to provide the policy push will decide how fast we can achieve our goal of \$5 trillion economy by 2024.

The Prime Minister has seen a dream of a 'New India' which will be a \$5 trillion economy and a model of Good Governance for the world. PM has set the following Vision for New India:

1. To be free from poverty, ill of prosperity,
2. To be free from discrimination, filled with equality,
3. To be free from injustice, enmeshed in justice,
4. To be free from spirals covered with darkness,
5. To be free from corruption, complete with transparency,
6. To be free from unemployment, enriched with employment,
7. To be free from atrocities against women, fill with respect for women, and
8. To be free from dependency, full of hope.

His vision of "Transforming India" is to touch each citizen's life and make India one of the top three economies in the world.

To conclude, it is absolutely essential to work on a framework that provides ease of business and profitability. It is also time to redirect energies on providing the environment to encourage private sector investments and innovation.

Shri Arun Jaitley

Mr. Jaitley as Finance Minister (2014 to 2019), carried out landmark reforms such as Goods and Services Tax, the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, Public sector banks recapitalization, merger of smaller banks with larger ones, disinvestment of PSUs and demonetisation.

Mr. Rajeev Talwar President, PHD Chamber termed Jaitley as the best Finance Minister who gave the country fiscal prudence and financial consolidation par excellence and is credited for historic reforms, among others. Smt. Shiela Dikshit

Ms. Shiela Dikshit, Senior Congress leader and three-times Delhi's Chief Minister passed on July 20, 2019.

She was one of the longest serving Chief Minister of Delhi, between 1998 and 2013. Subsequently, she was sworn in as Governor of Kerala in 2014.

Ms. Dikshit started her political career from Uttar Pradesh as a Member of Parliament from Kannauj constituency between 1984 and 1989 and also served as Union Minister from 1986-1989. Ms. Dikshit made immense contribution towards the development of Delhi and ushered in an era of all-round development that transformed Delhi into a world class capital through infrastructure up-gradation. It is due to her efforts that the National Capital, boasts of a network of flyovers, successful metro, world class-airport and international sports facilities.
