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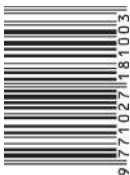
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The 2021/22 budget for materials and supplies totaling N\$2.4-b accounts for 24.6% of all procurement expenditure totaling N\$9.8-b in - a 3.24% increase on last year's revised N\$2.34-b within the overall 17.2% decrease in the procurement budget as a whole.

## Stores budget leaves

**N**amibia's medical stores have received a strong booster shot against the Corona virus, with almost 70% of the N\$2.4 billion national budget for the procurement of materials and supplies in 2021/22. But the defence ministry's - unchanged - second-biggest share of 15% outstrips central government

expenditure on educational consumables five-fold.

While central government's budget for consumable materials and supplies increased by 3.24% or N\$75.7-m to N\$2.4-b in 2021/22 from last year's N\$2.3-b, the Health & Social Services Vote's ceiling was raised by 27.24% or N\$359-m from N\$1.3-b to N\$1.677-m, its share of the overall M&S total rising dramatically from 56% to 69.4%.

The Defence Vote is again in sec-

ond place with 14.94% of the M&S total, despite its allocation decreasing by over 11% or N\$45.86-m to N\$360.8-m from last year's N\$406.7-m when it enjoyed over 17% of the M&S total.

The Basic Education, Arts & Culture Vote's ceiling for materials and supplies, on the other hand, is only in fifth place with a 2.7% share - less than one-fifth of the Defence Vote.

This is despite a 25.8% or N\$13.36-m increase to N\$65-m from 2020/21's N\$51.7-m - its share climbing moderately from 2.2% compared to the Defence Vote's 17.4% - eight times more than Education's in 2020/21.

The two votes ahead of Education, Arts & Culture in 2021/22 are Transport (Vote 24) and Gender Equality, Poverty Eradication & Social Welfare (Vote 36), each with M&S ceilings a little over N\$73-m and an identical 3.03% share of the N\$2.4-b M&S total in 2021/22, after both votes had their budgets reduced from last year's revised allocations.

Materials and supplies (M&S) relates to the acquisition of stores items of a consumable nature to be utilized in the process of government services/operations, such as provisions, spares, stationery and other materials, including medical and educational consumables. Many annual and multi-year tenders relate to this standard spending head.

The 27% increase in the budget for medical materials and supplies in 2021/22 is well ahead of the 17% higher expenditure last year to a 56% share of all materials and supplies expenditure, which was in line with its 55.7% share in 2019/20.

On other hand, expenditure on military materials and supplies last year amounted to a higher 17.4% of the total than this year's 15%, following the 11% decrease in voted expenditure on military consumable stores.

But this came in the wake, however, of last year's huge 49% increase over 2019/20 that saw Defence's share of the revised M&S budget rise from 13.5% to 17.4% of 2019/20's total expenditure on materials and supplies.

This 49% increase in the Defence Vote's M&S expenditure last year was almost treble the Health & Social Services Vote's 17% increase.

This is the opposite of the Education Vote's expenditure on materials and supplies between 2019/20 and last year, which fell by 16.25%, compared to the Defence Vote's 49% increase.

### Last midyear's M&S budget

**I**n fact, at the time of 2020/21's midyear adjustments, the budget for medical stores received a 16% shot in arm to N\$1.37-b, but was only 18% higher than the previous year, compared to a 48% increase to N\$406.7-m in military spending on materials and supplies, alongside a 15.5% reduction in funding for educational consumables at public schools to N\$52.5-m.

The government increased its budget for the procurement of materials and supplies by 8.8% or N\$193.48-m to N\$2.4-b midyear in 2020/21 - the highest increase amongst all seven procurement heads of expenditure totaling N\$11.8-b.

The biggest beneficiary of this midyear increase in spending on materials and supplies was the Health & Social Services Vote, whose budget for medical stores was boosted by 16% or N\$188.867-m to N\$1.37-b - accounting for 57.3% of the increased N\$2.4-b M&S budget. This brought its M&S allocation last year to 18% above 2019/20's N\$1.16-b.

The Defence Vote was still in second place, however, with a much higher 48% increase on 2019/20, its N\$406.7-m to spend on military consumables 7.7 times more than the Education Vote's N\$52.5-m to spend on school stationery - both of which were unaffected in the midyear reallocations on materials and supplies expenditure.

And it is worthwhile noting that 2020/21's midyear boost for medical stores came in the wake of only a 2% increase at the beginning of 2020/21 in the midst of the Covid-19 pandemic, compared to an exorbitant 48% increase for military materials and supplies, alongside a 15.46% reduction in funding for educational consumables in public schools.

Although it still accounted for over half the overall M&S budget at the beginning of the year, the health ministry's share of the N\$2.2-b total for consumable materials and supplies fell from 62% in 2019/20 to 53.75%, with the Defence Ministry rising from 14.6% to 18.5%, while education's share also dropped to 2.4% from 3.3% in 2019/20.

## Procurement expenditure in 2021/22

Namibia's central government slashed its procurement budget from an all-time high of N\$11.8 billion last year, by over 17% or N\$2-b to N\$9.8-b in 2021/22.

The 17.2% reduction in procurement expenditure is far higher than the 5.76% reduction in the national budget to N\$68-b from 2010/21's revised N\$72-b and the 0.77% reduction in central government's personnel expenditure to N\$28.46-b from last year's revised N\$28.68-b, both of which are in sharp contrast to the 9.85% increase in debt servicing costs to N\$8.5-b from last year's revised N\$7.7-b.

As a share of procurement, current operational expenditure has increased by 11 percentage points over the past three years – from 38% to 49%, compared to operational capex, which has increased by only 0.4 percentage points from 7.2% to 7.6%.

In sharp contrast to procurement expenditure's miserable 1.12% average annual increase over the past nine years, government's debt servicing costs have ballooned by 41.35% annually, overall budget expenditure by 5%, government remuneration by 6.55%, accompanied by a 2.8% average annual decline in domestically-funded development expenditure, which has fallen by 14% to N\$5.55-b in 2021/22 from last year's revised N\$6.456-b.

Across the eight heads of procurement spending:

\* Construction, renovations and improvements (CRI) and feasibility studies, design and supervision (FSDS) are both channelled entirely through the development budget.

\* Expenditure on materials and supplies (M&S) and other services and expenses (OSE) are items of consumption spending, provided for mostly as part of current operational expenditure, but with some allocations channelled through the development budget to specific projects.

\* Expenditure on operational equipment, machinery and plant (OEMP), furniture and office equipment (FOE) and vehicles (V) is classified as capital expenditure under the operational budget, with some allocations to specific development projects.

\* Since 2019/20, the budget has itemized 'purchase of buildings' - as part of development expenditure.

## Procurement expenditure allocations in 2021/22

Although the N\$3.124-b 2021/22 budget for construction, renovations and improve-

ments accounts for the – usual – biggest share of procurement expenditure, it is at a nine-year low and suffered the second-most severe reduction of all procurement categories on last year's revised expenditure (after 'other services and expenses').

\* 'Other services and expenses' has the second-biggest share of 2021/22's procurement budget with N\$2.7-b, accounting for 27.55% of the procurement total after a 35.44% decrease on last year - the biggest reduction within the procurement budget.

\* The 2021/22 budget for materials and supplies totals N\$2.4-b in third place, accounting for 24.6% of procurement expenditure – a 3.24% increase on last year.

\* N\$1.05-b has been voted for operational equipment, machinery and plant in 2021/22, accounting for 10.7% of the procurement budget in fourth place, after a 9.95% increase over last year.

\* Voted expenditure for feasibility studies, design and supervision has been increased by 70.47% to N\$456-m, more than doubling its share to 4.65% of 2021/22's procurement total, in fifth place.

\* N\$51.3-m voted for furniture and office equipment (including ICT) in 2021/22 ac-

counts for a dismal 0.24% of the procurement budget, following a 26% reduction on last year.

\* N\$500,000 budgeted for vehicle purchases in 2021/22 is an 11% increase over last year's revised all-time low of N\$450,000.

\* The N\$2-m has been voted for the purchase of buildings in 2021/22 is 94% less than last year's revised N\$35.6-m.

## Materials and supplies

The 2021/22 budget for materials and supplies totaling N\$2.4-b in third place accounts for 24.6% of all procurement expenditure totaling N\$9.8-b - a 3.24% increase on last year's revised N\$2.34-b, when it commanded only 19.8% of the N\$11.8-b procurement budget. This 3.24% increase occurs within the overall 17.2% decrease in the procurement budget as a whole.

The N\$2.34-b revised expenditure on materials and supplies in 2020/21 had been a considerable 16% increase over 2019/20's N\$2-b actual expenditure when it enjoyed an even higher 21.3% share of the N\$9.4-b procurement total. Its 16% increase last year was below the 26.5% increase in the procurement budget as a whole.

Measured year-on-year, 2020/21's 27.66% post-midyear increase in the budget for materials and supplies was significantly higher than 2019/20's 10.25% increase on the previous year.

The N\$1.836-b voted for materials and supplies in 2019/20 accounted for a revised 16.4% of all procurement spending compared to 2020/21's post-midyear 20.3% - much of it (inappropriately) classified as development expenditure.

At the time of 2019/20's midterm adjustments, the budget for materials and supplies was increased from N\$1.836-b by 12.36% or N\$226.7-m to N\$2.063-b, its share of overall pro-

curement spending rising sharply from 16.4% at the beginning of the year to 20.26% midyear, within a procurement budget lowered by 4.5% from N\$11.8-b originally to N\$10.2-b midyear.

## Earlier M&S disparities among votes

The preferential treatment in M&S allocations in favour of the health and defence votes at the expense of education in 2021/22 and last year, was also demonstrated in 2019/20's midyear budget revisions, when the health ministry received a N\$211-m shot in the arm to catch up on critical shortages of medicines and clinical consumables, alongside a boost in funding for military materials and supplies to N\$249-m - four times the N\$61-m for grossly under-resourced schools, whose allocation was not increased.

Already at the beginning of 2019/20,

In 2018/19, the discrepancy was 2:1 in favour of defence – before and after those midyear revisions.

It is also noteworthy that education's M&S budget at the beginning of 2019/20 was half its allocation the previous year, while defence's was only 11% below its 2018/19 ceiling for materials and supplies.

## Materials & supplies in the development budget

N\$130.6-m or 5.46% of 2021/22's N\$2.4-b budget for materials and supplies is channelled through the development budget – less than half last year's revised expenditure when N\$334-m or 14.5% of N\$2.3-b was classified as development spending.

The ceiling for materials and supplies voted through the current operational budget in 2021/22 increased by 15% from last year's revised N\$2-b to N\$2.285-b.

This slowdown in the increase of the development M&S component this year is in line with last year's N\$10-m or 3% decrease on 2019/20's actual N\$344-m expenditure on materials and supplies that accounted for 20.6% of the M&S total.

The same five votes as last year have development components in their expenditure ceilings for materials and supplies in 2021/22.

And in all cases, their development components are far greater than their M&S ceilings voted through the operational budget – as was the case last year, compared to only one of 2018/19's five.

The channeling of M&S expenditure through the development budget is a distortion of spending conventions, since materials and supplies are consumables that do not necessarily add value to investment in state infrastructure.

In fact, expenditure on materials and supplies is specifically described as 'operational' in the budget book's definition of this spending head.

\* The Transport Vote's N\$70-m development M&S component accounts for 96% of its overall N\$73-m allocation and over half (53.6%) of all N\$130.6-m development expenditure on materials and supplies in 2021/22.

Last year, Transport's N\$261.5-m development component accounted for a higher 99% of its N\$264-m revised expenditure on materials and supplies

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and 78% of the N\$334-m total across all votes.

In 2019/20, Transport's N\$240-m actual development expenditure on materials and supplies also accounted for 99% of its N\$241.5-m M&S spending and 69.5% of the N\$344-m total M&S expenditure channeled through the development budget.

\* Agriculture & Land Reform has the second-biggest development M&S allocation in 2021/22, with N\$38-m accounting for 73% of its N\$51.8-m M&S budget and 29% of the N\$130.6-m development total across all votes.

Last year, Agriculture & Land Reform's N\$56.7-m development component accounted for a higher 79% of its N\$71.5-m revised expenditure on materials and supplies and 17% of the N\$334-m total across all votes. In 2019/20, Agriculture & Land Reform did not exist as an independent vote.

\* The newly-created Water Vote has the third-biggest development M&S allocation in 2021/22, with N\$10.7-m accounting for over 96% of its N\$11.1-m M&S budget and 8.2% of the N\$130.6-m development total across all votes.

Last year, the Water Vote's much lower N\$1.5-m development component accounted for 93.7% of its N\$1.6-m revised expenditure on materials and supplies and only 0.45% of the N\$334-m total across all votes. In 2019/20, it did not exist as an independent vote.

\* Of Mines & Energy's N\$8.1-m allocation for materials and supplies in 2021/22, N\$7-m or 87.5% is classified as development expenditure and accounts for 5.36% of the N\$130.6-m total across all votes.

Last year, Mines & Energy's N\$6.78-m development component accounted for a lower 83% of its N\$8.2-m revised expenditure on materials and supplies and 2% of the N\$334-m total across all votes.

Its development M&S allocation last year was more than double 2019/20's N\$3.2-m that constituted a much lower 65.8% of its N\$4.86-m M&S budget.

\* Of Environment, Forestry & Tourism's N\$6.8-m M&S allocation this year, N\$4.9-m or 72% is classified as development expenditure, accounting for 3.75% of the N\$130.6-m development M&S budget across all votes.

Last year, Environment, Forestry & Tourism's N\$7.4-m development component accounted for a lower 69% of its N\$10.7-m revised expenditure on materials and supplies and 2.2% of the N\$334-m total across all votes.

Its development M&S allocation last year was over three times more than 2019/20's N\$1.4-m that constituted an even lower 42% of its N\$3.27-m M&S budget.

Seven votes have allocations for the procurement of materials and supplies exceeding 1% of the total in 2021/22 - the same number as last year.

The Attorney-General's office, oddly, is the only vote out of 35 that has no M&S allocation this year, compared to last year, when all 34 votes recorded expenditure for materials and supplies.

One wonders how the AG's office is managing to function this year without any materials and supplies at all.

**Health & Social Services**

**H**ealth & Social Services (Vote 13) has N\$1,677,582,000 to spend on materials and supplies in 2021/22, accounting

for an unprecedented 69.4% of the N\$2.4-b total, following a 27% or N\$359-m increase over last year's revised N\$1.3-b, accounting for 56% of the N\$2.34-b M&S budget.

Its revised M&S expenditure in 2020/21 had been 17% more than 2019/20's actual N\$1.1-b, when it accounted for 55.7% of N\$2-b.

Vote 13's N\$1.18-b allocation for materials and supplies at the beginning of 2020/21, accounting for 53.75% of the overall N\$2.2-b M&S budget was increased by N\$188.867-m or 16% mid-year to N\$1.37-b, with a higher 57.3% of the revised N\$2.4-b M&S total.

Its ceiling at the beginning of the year had been only 2% or N\$23.18-m more than its revised N\$1.16-b in 2019/20 when it accounted for a far higher 61.6% of the N\$1.88-b M&S total at the time.

The Health & Social Services Vote was also allocated an additional N\$210.72-m for pharmaceuticals and clinical supplies in 2019/20's mid-term revisions, increasing its original N\$958.5-m allocation by just below 22% to N\$1.169-b, its share of all M&S expenditure climbing from 52% at the beginning of the year to 56.68%.

At the beginning of 2019/20, the Health & Social Services Vote's M&S budget was increased by only 0.78% or N\$7.389-m to N\$958.522-m from 2018/19's N\$951.133-m, retaining its lion's share of M&S voted expenditure, although this had shrunk from 2018/19's 57% (of N\$1.666-m) to 52% of 2019/20's N\$1.84-b original ceiling for materials and supplies.

As we reported at the beginning of the 2018/19 financial year (*Bulletin 1254*), then Minister of Health & Social Services, Bernard Haufiku, admitted in June 2017 that his ministry continued to be held hostage by corruption and inflated tender prices to the extent that much of its multi-billion budget as a whole has little positive impact on actual service delivery.

The corruption was particularly evident with the procurement of anti-retroviral medication and medical consumable supplies, for which prices were in most cases inflated by at least three times, he said at the time.

In a concerted effort to end the crippling shortages of medical supplies to state healthcare institutions, the government had radically increased the budget for materials and supplies to the ministry by over 50% to N\$1.7-b for the 2016/17 financial year.

Things only deteriorated since however, with widespread shortages of anaesthetics and medicines at state hospitals.

Most of the MHSS budget for materials and supplies is disbursed through the Central Medical Stores as medical sundries and pharmaceuticals, where a raft of scandals since 2014 still remains largely unresolved, despite the findings of a commission of inquiry confirming critical failures in the ministry's procurement system.

The health ministry's M&S budget at the beginning of 2018/19 was a 21.3% reduction on 2017/18's revised N\$1.21-b.

And while the budget allocation was insufficient, its utilization was also not efficient and corrupt practices at the ministry had impacted negatively on its effectiveness, it was officially acknowledged.

Yet, almost immediately after this

admission, the Ministry's Procurement Management Unit placed a "notice to all potential bidders/suppliers" that it was advertising its tenders/requests for quotations as from 14-Jun-18 only on its website and no longer in the printed public media.

**Defence**

**I**n second place in the budget for materials and supplies, the Defence Vote's N\$360.8-m allocation for 2021/22 accounts for 15% of the N\$2.4-b total after an 11% or N\$45.86-m reduction on its N\$407.7-m revised expenditure last year, accounting for a higher 17.4% of the N\$2.3-b total.

Its N\$406.7-m allocation in 2020/21 was left untouched in the midyear revisions, its share of the M&S total falling from 18.5% of the initial N\$2.2-b.

However, the Defence Vote's M&S allocation last year was a very generous 49% or N\$134-m increase over 2019/20's N\$272.7-m actual expenditure on materials and supplies, when it enjoyed only 13.5% of the N\$2-b total.

Defence's N\$223.576-m allocation at the beginning of 2019/20 was actually an 11.5% or N\$29-m reduction on 2018/19's revised N\$252.6-m, its share of the total declining from 15% of 2018/19's N\$1.67-b M&S total to 12% of 2019/20's original N\$1.8-b - both also in second place behind health.

As could be expected, the Defence Vote's fortunes improved with 2019/20's midyear revisions, when its M&S budget was boosted by 11.25% or N\$25.162-m to N\$248.738-m.

According to the 2020/21 budget

book, however, Vote 8's further revised spending for the previous year climbed by a further N\$25.86-m to N\$274.6-m.

It also enjoyed a N\$25-m or 9.9% midyear increase in 2018/19 to N\$277.6-m, lifting its share of the N\$1.5-b total from 15.15% to 16.58% of N\$1.7-b.

But its latest revised ceiling for 2018/19 according to the following year's budget was back to its original N\$252.6-m at the beginning of 2018/19, which had been a 25% reduction on 2017/18's revised N\$337.8-m - notably below the 30% overall reduction in M&S spending for government as a whole at the time.

**Transport**

**T**ransport (Vote 24) has the third-highest budget for the procurement of materials and supplies in 2021/22, with N\$73.145-m accounting for 3.03% of the N\$2.4-b total, following a dramatic 72% or N\$190.76-m reduction on its revised N\$264-m M&S expenditure last year, when it accounted for over 11% of the N\$2.34-b total.

Its revised M&S expenditure last year had been a 9.3% or N\$22.4-m increase over 2019/20's actual N\$241.5-m, when it accounted for 12% of the N\$2-b total.

But between 2019/20 and this year, there has been considerable retro-accounting on the Transport Vote's spending on materials and supplies - especially in its development component.

At the time of 2020/21's midyear revisions, Transport's M&S development allocation was unaffected, although its operational M&S allocation was reduced marginally by N\$130,000 (0.5%) to N\$2.4-m.

As noted at the time, most of 2020/

21's N\$319-m increase in overall M&S voted expenditure was attributable to the Transport Vote, where N\$261.5-m or 99% of its N\$264-m M&S ceiling was classified as development expenditure, with only N\$2.5-m channeled through the operational budget.

This was a reversal on 2019/20, when all of Transport's N\$2.3-m total M&S allocation was initially classified as operational expenditure.

But in the 2021/22 budget, Transport's M&S actual expenditure in 2019/20 was restated as consisting of N\$239.2-m development expenditure, alongside N\$2.275-m operational expenditure, totaling N\$241.5-m.

That means its N\$2.3-m development M&S expenditure in 2019/20 as stated in 2020/21's budget suddenly transformed into almost N\$240-m, according to the 2021/22 budget.

This translates into an inordinate 10,334% increase on its 2019/20 revised ceiling of N\$2.3-m (according to the 2020/21 budget) to N\$240-m - as stated in the 2021/22 budget.

During our analysis of this last year, we noted that this restatement of Transport's M&S expenditure in 2019/20 was most odd, since it had N\$211.136-m to spend on materials and supplies at the beginning of 2019/20 (N\$208.8-m development plus only N\$2.3-m operational).

Only N10-m was removed from its development allocation midyear in 2019/20, reducing its M&S budget to N\$201.136-m.

Its original allocation at the beginning of 2019/20 had been a generous 72.8% or N\$89-m increase over 2018/19's revised N\$122.154-m when it ac-

counted for only 7.33% - also in third place behind Defence.

The Transport Vote temporarily dropped from third to fourth place after the midyear revisions to the M&S budget in 2018/19, behind also the Education Vote.

Transport's M&S expenditure ceiling was lowered 2018/19 midyear by 9.3% to N\$110.65-m, after which it accounted for 6.6% of the N\$1.675-b revised higher total.

But according to the 2019/20 budget book, 2018/19's further M&S revised expenditure was back to its original N\$122.154-m voted at the beginning of 2018/19.

**Gender Equality, Poverty Eradication & Marginalized Affairs**

**C**reated in 2020/21, Gender Equality, Poverty Eradication & Marginalized Affairs (Vote 36) has N\$73.1-m to spend on materials and supplies in 2021/22 - in fourth place.

This is N\$45,000 less than the Transport Vote, but accounting for the same 3.03% of the N\$2.4-b M&S total as Transport does - slightly ahead in third place.

Vote 36's M&S allocation this year is 1.06% or N\$783,000 less than 2020/21's revised N\$73.88-m when it accounted for 3.16% of the N\$2.34-b total.

Its revised expenditure on materials and supplies last year was the result of a N\$4.255-m or 6% midyear increase to N\$73.88-m in 2020/21, elevating it from fifth to fourth place, overtaking the Agriculture & Land Reform Vote.

Vote 36 had N\$69.6-m to spend on materials and supplies at the beginning of 2020/21 in fifth place, with the same

# budget falls 72%

3% share of the total.

The new vote's ceiling for materials and supplies in 2020/21 is a relative improvement on its predecessor, Poverty Eradication & Social Welfare (Vote 33), which ranked sixth in 2019/20 (behind Safety & Security) with N\$62.756-m to spend on materials and supplies, not revised midyear, and accounting for 3.42% of the total at the beginning of 2019/20 and 3.04% post-midyear, which is 17% or just over N\$9-m more than 2018/19's revised N\$53.6-m when it accounted for 3.22% in fifth place.

Its N\$62.8-m M&S budget in 2019/20 was 17% or just over N\$9-m more than 2018/19's revised N\$53.6-m when it accounted for 3.22% in fifth place.

The new Vote 36's other associated vote - Gender Equality & Child Welfare (Vote 12 - also now discontinued) had a N\$43-m M&S ceiling in 2019/20 and hardly featured significantly in previous years.

and supplies budget was only 3.3%, falling further to 2.96% post-midyear (of N\$2.1-b), compared to 2018/19's fourth-ranking when it accounted for 7.2% of the revised N\$1.67-b M&S total.

The 49% reduction in Education's M&S budget in 2019/20 was the biggest cutback amongst all votes, with Defence's 11.5% a distant second.

After 2018/19's midyear revisions, Namibia's under-resourced schools also still had their original N\$120.2-m to spend on materials and supplies.

Measured at the beginning of 2018/19, Vote 10's expenditure ceiling may have been a massive 330% increase on 2017/18's revised N\$27.9-m, but it was off a pitifully low base, when it represented a mere 1.2% of the N\$2.4-b M&S total - also in seventh place.

At 2017/8's midyear revisions Education, Arts & Culture ranked fifth, with only N\$36.9-m to spend on materials and supplies - one tenth of Defence's

sified as development expenditure, with the remaining N\$13.8-m operational.

Last year, N\$56.7-m or 79% was channeled through the development budget and the remaining N\$14.8-m was classified as operational expenditure.

This is a sharp reversal on its predecessor, Agriculture, Water & Forestry, whose N\$118-m M&S budget in 2019/20 was all classified as operational expenditure.

Agriculture, Water & Forestry (Vote 20 - now discontinued) was also in fourth place in 2019/20, with an original budget of N\$107-m for materials and supplies, accounting for 5.8% of the N\$1.836-m M&S total, following a massive 110.8% or N\$56.3-m increase on 2018/19's revised N\$50.8-m when it accounted for only 3% in fifth place.

N\$1.5-m was removed from its development allocation midyear in 2019/20, resulting in a lower revised N\$105.65-m total, with a slightly lower 5.12% share of the revised N\$2.1-b M&S expenditure.

Agriculture's original allocation in 2018/19 was 54% more than 2017/18's revised N\$33-m, when it consumed only 1.4% of the revised N\$2.4-b total.

## Safety & Security

Newly created this year, Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety & Security, Vote 39 consolidates Home Affairs & Immigration (Vote 5) and Safety & Security (Vote 6 - that incorporated 'Police') - both now discontinued.

Vote 39 is the last of the seven votes accounting for over 1% of 2021/22's budget for materials and supplies.

Its N\$25-m M&S budget accounts for 1.04% of the N\$2.4-b total.

This is a dramatic 47.8% reduction on the combined N\$48.1-m M&S allocations for its predecessors last year, when Home Affairs & Immigration (Vote 5) recorded N\$8.6-m and Safety & Security (Vote 6) N\$39.5-m revised expenditure on materials and supplies in 2020/21, jointly accounting for 2.06% of the N\$2.34-b total.

The combined actual expenditure on materials and supplies of these two now-discontinued votes in 2019/20 had been a much higher N\$73.87-m (by 34.8% or N\$25.7-m), accounting for 3.66% of the N\$2-b total.

From 2019/20 to 2020/21, Home Affairs & Immigration saw its expenditure on materials and supplies increase by 42.5% or N\$2.57-m from N\$6-m to N\$8.6-m, while Safety & Security's much bigger N\$67.8-m actual M&S expenditure in 2019/20 plunged by N\$28.3-m or 41.7% to only N\$39.5-m.

Vote 6 was briefly renamed from Safety & Security to 'Police' in 2020/21, when its N\$35.8-m M&S ceiling was increased by 10.3% or N\$3.7-m to N\$39.5-m midyear, its 1.63% share of the N\$2.2-b total rising marginally to 1.65% of N\$2.4-b.

The former Safety & Security Vote was then split into Police (then still Vote 6) and Prisons & Correctional Services (Vote 21 - previously Judiciary, but Correctional Services is now part of the new Vote 39, with the Judiciary back in its place).

For the Police (Vote 6), the N\$35.8-m voted at the beginning of 2020/21 represented a 53.5% or N\$41.2-m reduction on 2019/20's revised N\$77.05-m, its share of overall M&S expenditure falling from 4.1% (of N\$1.88-b) to only 1.63% of 2020/21's N\$2.2-b in seventh place.

Vote 21's hardly credible N\$5-m budget for materials and supplies (with which to keep correctional facilities stocked) in 2020/21 was unaffected midyear. This N\$5-m was only N\$435,000 or 9.5% higher than 2019/20's N\$4,565-m.

Despite being swollen by 290% or N\$58.7-m to N\$79-m at the beginning of 2019/20 accounting for 4.3% of the N\$1.8-b total, the then Safety & Security Vote's budget for materials and supplies was supplemented by an additional N\$7.58-m midyear, raising its total to N\$86.51-m with a marginally lower 4.19% share of revised M&S spending.

## Education, Arts & Culture

Briefly renamed 'Education' last year (with 'Culture' lumped together with the Youth & Sport Vote 27), Vote 10 has regained its full title, with N\$65-m to spend on the materials and supplies in 2021/22, accounting for 2.7% of the N\$2.4-b M&S total in fifth place.

This is 25.8% or N\$13.36-m more than last year's revised N\$51.7-m when it accounted for 2.2% of the N\$2.34-b total in sixth place.

Its revised M&S expenditure last year had been 16.25% or N\$10-m less than 2019/20's actual N\$61.7-m, accounting for 3.06% of the N\$2-b total.

In relative terms, therefore, Vote 10 enjoys a lower, 2.69% share of this year's materials and supplies budget than it did two years ago with 3.06% in 2019/20.

Its N\$51.7-m revised expenditure for last year as recorded in the 2021/22 budget is less than its N\$52.5-m original and post-midyear allocation, according to the 2020/21 budget, when it ranked sixth, its share of the total declining from 2.39% at the beginning of the year to 2.19% post-midyear.

Its budget for school stationery and other consumable stores then less than 13% of the Defence Vote's N\$406.7-m - also unaffected midyear.

Although this is an improvement on its seventh placed ranking in 2019/20 behind Safety & Security, this is scant compensation for the fact that Vote 10's N\$51.7-m latest revised expenditure for materials and supplies in 2020/21 was over 16% less than 2019/20's actual N\$61.7-m.

Education, Arts & Culture's M&S budget for 2019/20 was not revised midyear, after being reduced by half (49%) or N\$59-m to N\$1-m at the beginning of the year, from 2018/19's revised N\$120.2-m - compared to the Defence Vote's lesser 11.5% reduction.

As a result, Vote 10's share of 2019/20's original N\$1.8-b materials

budget for consumable stores and its lowest ranking ever alongside other votes.

## Agriculture & Land Reform

The newly-created Vote 37 has N\$51.8-m for the procurement of materials and supplies in 2021/22, accounting for 2.14% of the N\$2.4-b M&S total in sixth place - 27.6% or N\$19.7-m less than last year's revised N\$71.5-m when it accounted for over 3% of the N\$2.34-b total, ranked fourth.

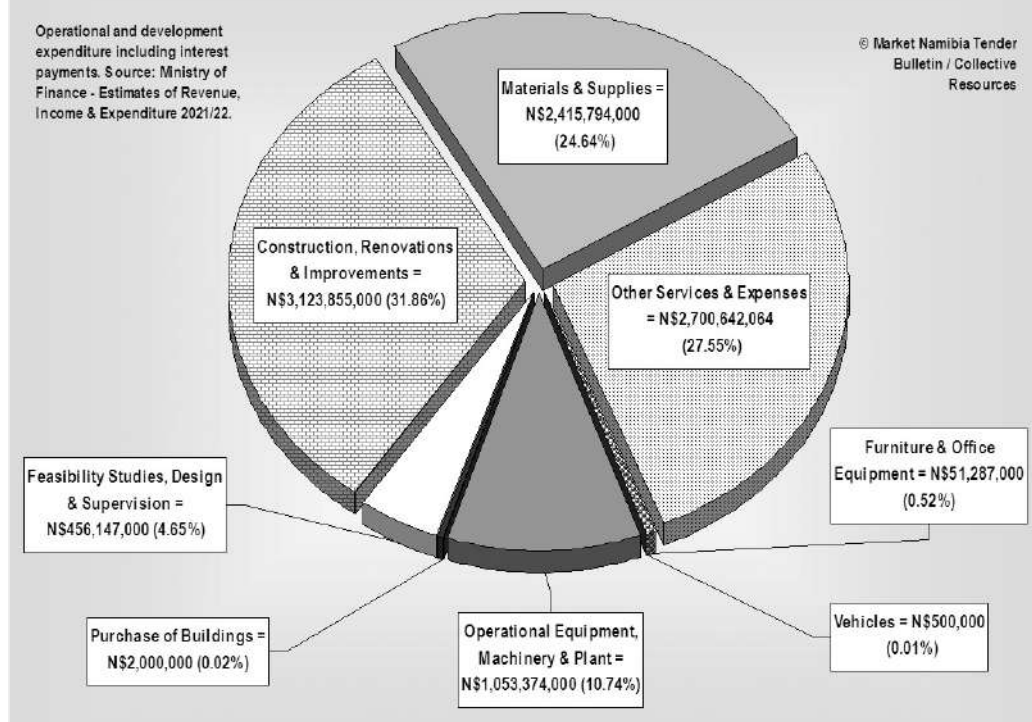
Vote 37's N\$71.5-m M&S expenditure in 2020/21 was unaffected midyear, when it accounted for 3.25% of the N\$2.2-b M&S total initially, before declining to 2.99% of the post-midyear N\$2.4-b total in fifth place.

Of Vote 37's total N\$51.8-m M&S ceiling this year, N\$38-m or 73% is clas-

Both the police and prisons divisions are notorious for channeling the greatest part of their procurement of goods and services (not only stores purchases) through tender exemptions.

Vote 6's N\$20.26-m in 2018/19 accounted for only 1.2% of the N\$1.665-b total in seventh place - unaffected by those midyear revisions.

Measured at the beginning of 2018/19, its M&S allocation was a 41.5% decrease on 2017/18's revised N\$34.6-m when it consumed 1.45% of the total in fifth place.

The rest

In addition to these seven, there are no further votes accounting for over 1% of 2021/22's N\$2.4-b budget for materials and supplies, compared to eight votes in 2019/20.

There are a further three vote (same number as last year) with M&S allocations of N\$10-m or more in 2021/22:

- \* The new Water Vote (Vote 38) has N\$11-m - a sharp 595.75% or N\$9.5-m more than last year's revised N\$1.6-m, when it was created as a new vote previously falling under Agriculture, Water & Forestry.
- \* Justice (Vote 16) has N\$10.5-m - 18.7% or N\$1.65-m more than last year's revised N\$8.8-m, which had been over 176% or N\$5.65-m more than its N\$3.2-m actual expenditure in 2019/20.
- \* Finance (Vote 9)'s N\$10-m is a little over N\$1-m or 12% more than last year's N\$8.9-m, which was 25% or N\$3-m less than 2019/20's N\$12-m actual expenditure on materials and supplies.

Central Govt Stores

Still conspicuous by its absence in any meaningful allocation for materials and supplies this year is Central Government Stores, resorting under the Department of Works (Vote 23).

In terms of the new procurement system introduced in April 2017, public tendering activity at the CGS remains disconcertingly obscure, with only one goods supply quotation issued so far in 2021 and a handful in 2020.

So far in 2020/21, the MWT issued only one goods supply tender in the form of a quotation listed on its website.

- \* G/RFQ/23-03/2021-22 that closed 04-Jun-21 was for the supply and delivery of cleaning

# Central Govt Stores corruption report still gathering dust

materials, consisting of 15 items such as soap, bleach, polish, etc. plus cardboard containers, refuse bags and toilet rolls - all in large quantities, so this could have been a CGS tender although this was not mentioned.

In calendar 2020, the MWT issued only nineteen 'goods supply' tenders. Of these, only six were open national bidding tenders, of which five appeared to have been stores tenders (again, there is no specific mention of Central Government Stores):

- \* G/ONB/23-01/2020/2021 closing 11-Sep-20 - supply and delivery of toilet paper;
  - \* G/ONB/23-02/2020/2021 closing 18-Sep-20: Invitation for bids - supply and delivery of photocopy paper;
  - \* G/ONB/23-03/2020/2021 closing 21-Sep-20 - supply and delivery of school desks and chairs;
  - \* G/ONB/23-04/2020/2021 closing 25-Sep-20 - supply and delivery of brush ware (brooms and mops);
  - \* G/ONB/24-02/2020/21 closing 16-Oct-20 - supply and delivery of tyres and tubes to Government Garage vehicle fleet country-wide for a period of two years.
- In addition, the MWT issued twelve quotations for 'goods supplies', of which eleven were for its own use and only one appeared to be for general stores that could be on behalf of other ministries:
- \* G/RFQ/23-23/2020-2021 closing 28-Jul-20 - supply and delivery of cleaning materials (7 items in Windhoek - 500x dish washing liquid 5L; 100x liquid soap dispensers 1L; 100x Handy Andy 25L; 800x pine gel 5kg; 100x all purpose cleaner 25L; 200x toilet cleaner 25L.

In addition, the MWT issued an unreferenced notice in Feb-20 that "As from 10- Feb-20 all Requests for Informal and Sealed Quotations will be placed on the ministerial website and official Facebook page: www.mwt.gov.na and Ministry of Works & Transport, Namibia Facebook page". Again, no mention of Central Government Stores.

It issued another unreferenced notice in Nov-20 inviting "all Namibian manufacturers of building materials and products ... to register their particulars and the particulars of such products or materials with the MWT".

So much for public tenders from government stores, which is not mentioned specifically in any of the tenders

issued by the MWT.

The Dept of Works (Vote 23) has a pitiful N\$4.6-m to spend on the procurement of materials and supplies in 2021/22 - 44% or N\$3.65-m less than last year's revised N\$8.28-m, which was another 44% or N\$6.5-m below 2019/20's actual N\$14.8-m expenditure.

The DOW had only N\$8.8-m to spend on materials and supplies at the beginning of 2020/21, after which it was reduced by 5.8% or N\$511,000 to N\$8.3-m midyear.

Its ceiling at the beginning of the year was a N\$942,000 or 9.7% reduction on 2019/20's actual N\$9.7-m expenditure, having started 2019/20 with N\$10.7-m.

The Works Vote's budget for materials and supplies is supposed to service the rest of government with all sorts of standard stores items through the Central Government Stores.

The DOW's M&S original budget in 2019/20 was 93.5% or N\$5.2-m more than 2018/19's N\$5.5-m - also unaffected by those midyear revisions.

As reported nine years ago in the context of unresolved issues around daily tender quotations for Central Government Stores supplies that bypassed the former Tender Board's annual and multi-year tenders, tenderpreneurs are today increasingly benefiting from M&S procurement at the expense of established local companies.

This is even more the case under the new procurement regime, where the threshold for tender exemptions has been raised from N\$40,000 to N\$2-m.

So the non-public quotations for materials and supplies must be flowing thick and fast at the CGS, where no tender awards have been made public since 2016.

It also is now nine years after it was undertaken, that nothing has been heard of the Anti Corruption Commission's investigation into alleged malpractices at the Central Government Stores in 2012 - extensively reported on by the *Tender Bulletin* at the time ('The daily tender gravy train at the Central Government Stores' - *Bulletin* 974).

So much for its boast in 2017/18, when the Central Government Stores website reflected a broadened scope in terms of the new Public Procurement Act of 2015, that its vision is: "To be the preferred supplier for the entire Government, Regional Councils, Local Authorities and Parastatals for all day-to-day items needed in their normal operations."

# UNLUCKY NUMBER 13 IN SECURITY TENDER DISPUTE

30 JULY 2021

Bertha Security Services has launched an urgent court application to set aside the award of a Central Procurement Board tender for the award of security services to the ministry of Health & Social Services under bid NCS/ONB/CPBN-05/2019.

According to a notice by Ndaitwah Legal Practitioners published in *The Namibian* on 26-Jul-21, the 85 respondents had until 17:00 on 26-Jul-21 to state their intent to oppose the application and deliver their answering affidavits until 01-Aug-21.

The applicant would then file a reply by 03-Aug-21 so that on 05-Aug-21 at 09:00 counsel for Bertha Security Services could apply to the High Court of Namibia for an order of non-compliance aimed at all the lots awarded under this tender and to declare any signed contacts null and void and to be set aside.

Respondents 1 to 5 are the Chairperson of the Review Panel, the Review Panel at the finance ministry, Chairperson of the Central Procurement Board of Namibia, the CPBN and the Government of Namibia.

Respondents 6 to 85 are listed as 80 security companies, of which respondents 6 to 19 were presumably selected for the award. The urgent court application aims at restraining and interdicting the companies from executing work under the contract.

Almost a year after the tender had closed on 20-Jul-20 the CPB seems to have informed bidders on 09-Jul-21 about the intended award of the contracts to 13 bidders, with whom contracts had to be concluded.

Bertha Security is asking for an order to review and set aside the Review Panel/CPB decision of 09-Jul-21, so that the matter can be remitted back to the Review Panel for a re-hearing or alternatively for the CPB to re-evaluate the bids submitted.

According to the legal notice, the applicant also asked for an order that respondents electing to oppose the ap-

plication would be directed to pay the applicant's cost.

### N\$220-m contract over three years

Under the 'Awards' section on its website, the CPB mentions a revised 'Executive Summary' for this tender processed on 06-Jul-21, as well as a 'Revised Notice for Selection of Procurement Award' under tender NCS/ONB/CPBN-05/2019.

On 23-Jul-21, the 'award of procurement contract' for NCS/ONB/CPBN-02/2019 [sic] for the MHSS was posted on the website.

The revised Bid Evaluation Report was the result of applications for reconsideration and review before the Review Panel.

### Sixty tenderers disqualified - mostly for expired certificates that

### would have been valid for the original closing date

The prices of 60 bidders were not considered, after they had failed the Stage 1 'Responsiveness' for reasons such as missing ID documents, no registration with Nampol as bona fide security service provider, etc.

But the most frequent reasons stated for rejection were expired good standing certificates from the Receiver of Revenue and the SSC (valid for one month) or expired AA compliance certificates.

The certificates of most companies would have been valid had the tender closed on the original closing date of 04-Mar-20, as advertised in *New Era* of 03-Feb-20.

Many other company certificates were still valid in April, May, June or until mid July - but no longer on the final closing date of 20-Jul-20.

For example, the only reason why Bertha Security Services was disqualified was an SSC good standing certificate issued on 09-Jun-20 that expired on 09-Jul-20.

According to a Covid-19 lockdown notice on the CPB website, the Board had extended the submission deadline from 04-Mar-20 to 25-Mar-20, only to postpone it on 02-Apr-20 to an unknown date.

When the *Tender Bulletin* enquired after the lockdown, the CPB gave said the new closing date was 26-May-21, then 11-Jun-20, and

again on 06-Jul-20.

The final deadline turned out to be 20-Jul-20 - long after the hard lockdown had ended on 05-May-20.

Of the 21 tenderers not disqualified during Stage 1, another two fell out during Stage 2 (Tanhwe Security Force, Tulikumo Investment).

Then a further six were not considered after the Stage 3 & 4 evaluation for reasons such as missing information on qualifications, lack of experience, unclear vehicle registration, no training programme, not enough guards with Grade 12 certificates, no letter of undertaking from auditors, no samples of uniform/badge/card, etc. - Nkasa Security Services, FAN Investments, CIS Security Services, Salambala Investment, Amutanga Trading Enterprises, Royal Security Services.

That meant the remaining thirteen companies were awarded one Lot each.

The elimination of all these tenderers comes down to a convenient coincidence that matches precisely the only thirteen bidders not disqualified and the thirteen lots in the tender - one for each of the thirteen regions requiring security services.

The Ministry of Health & Social Services also happens to be Vote 13 in the national budget.

# Tar road to Baynes Dam on the drawing board
