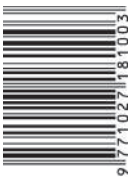

THE CENTRAL PROCUREMENT BOARD OF NAMIBIA HAS AWARDED TENDERS WORTH LESS IN THE FOUR YEARS TO 2020 THAN ITS PREDECESSOR, THE TENDER BOARD, DID FIVE YEARS AGO IN ONLY TWO YEARS – SUCH IS THE DEGREE TO WHICH PUBLIC TRANSPARENCY HAS BEEN OBSCURED UNDER NAMIBIA'S NEW PROCUREMENT REGIME - PAGE 7.

State's vanishing vehicles budget

NAMIBIA'S CENTRAL GOVERNMENT HAS BUDGETED A LUDICROUS N\$500,000 FOR THE PURCHASE OF NEW VEHICLES IN 2021/22, LEAVING THE GOVERNMENT GARAGE RUNNING ON EMPTY FOR THE SIXTH YEAR. THIS IS THE SECOND-LOWEST ALLOCATION EVER, AFTER LAST YEAR'S LAUGHABLE N\$450,000, AND 92% BELOW 2019/20's N\$6.4-M – WHEN THE POLICE ACCOUNTED FOR VIRTUALLY ALL EXPENDITURE, BUYING ALL THEIR NEW WHEELS WITHOUT PUBLIC TENDERS - PAGE 2.

This year's N\$500,000 budget for vehicles is less than 100th of the N\$51.3-m voted for furniture and office equipment.

Namibia's central government budget for the purchase of vehicles in 2021/22 is a ludicrous N\$500,000, leaving the Government Garage running on empty for the sixth year. This is the second-lowest allocation ever, after last year's laughable N\$450,000 and 92% below 2019/20's N\$6.4-m – when the police accounted for virtually the whole budget, buying all their new wheels without public tenders.

This is the sixth consecutive year that the Government Garage has not been allocated any funding for new vehicles, following 2016/17's unprecedented first zero budget since independence.

Government Garages throughout the country are littered with wrecks, while a promised shakeup to reverse endemic corruption and graft by the end of last year is yet to bear fruit.

Already at an all-time low of N\$4.95-m the central government budget for new vehicles in 2020/21 was slashed by 91% midyear to a pitiful N\$450,000 – the lowest ever.

This has now been followed by this year's 11% increase to a mediocre N\$500,000, which is 92% below 2019/20's actual N\$6.4-m expenditure.

Already prior to 2020/21's mid-year cutback, government spending on new vehicles was less than it was 23 years ago in 1998 and 0.5% of its N\$1-b peak six years ago in 2014/15.

Prior to last year's midterm cutbacks, 2020/21's original N\$4.95-m budget for new vehicles was 2.44% below 2019/20's revised N\$5.074-m – which is less than half the N\$10-m originally voted at the beginning of that year.

It was also less than the N\$12-m spent by the Windhoek City Council during 2020/21 (courtesy of the Road Fund Administration) for the purchase of eight Golf GTIs for VVIP escort and twelve LDVs for the city police – all without public tender.

This thriftless spending by the CoW coincided with central government's decision to put the brakes on its acquisition of new vehicles due to a lack of funds.

The presidency announced in May 2020 that the five-year freeze on buying new vehicles would translate into an approximate N\$200-m saving.

At the same time, an undis-

closed cap was announced on monthly fuel consumption by government officials – also over five years (*The Namibian 15-May-20*).

As a result, central government has had to put out the begging bowl to donors to provide it with wheels.

Free wheels from the USA

In a happy coincidence in March 2020, the US Embassy in Windhoek handed over three ambulances and medical equipment to assist the Ministry Health & Social Services with its response to the Covid-19 pandemic.

This followed the USA's donation of six new 4X4s to the MHSS the month before, for use by clinical and nurse mentors, adding to the existing fleet of twelve vehicles donated by the USA to the ministry in 2016.

And in October 2020, the US donated a further four Hilux LDVs valued at N\$2.4-m to a local NGO (DAPP) that partners with the PEPFAR program (US President's Emergency Plan For AIDS Relief) and the MHSS to fight HIV.

This was followed in December 2020 by the donation of three Toyota Hilux Double Cabs to the Namibia Institute of Pathology (NIP), allowing the NIP to ensure quality HIV testing at regional laboratories. The value of these vehicles is N\$1,716,000 (N\$572,000 per vehicle) (<https://na.usembassy.gov>).

The procurement budget in 2021/22

Namibia's central government slashed its procurement budget from an all-time high of N\$11.8 billion last year, by over 17% or N\$2-b to N\$9.8-b in 2021/22.

The 17.2% reduction in procurement expenditure is far higher than the 5.76% reduction in the national budget to N\$68-b from 2010/21's revised N\$72-b and the 0.77% reduction in central government's personnel expenditure to N\$28.46-b from last year's revised N\$28.68-b, both of which are in sharp contrast to the 9.85% increase in debt servicing costs to N\$8.5-b from last year's revised N\$7.7-b.

As a share of procurement, current operational expenditure has increased by 11 percentage points over the past three years

– from 38% to 49%, compared to operational capex, which has increased by only 0.4 percentage points from 7.2% to 7.6%.

In sharp contrast to procurement expenditure's miserable 1.12% average annual increase over the past nine years, government's debt servicing costs have ballooned by 41.35% annually, overall budget expenditure by 5%, government remuneration by 6.55%, accompanied by a 2.8% average annual decline in domestically-funded development expenditure, which has fallen by 14% to N\$5.55-b in 2021/22 from last year's revised N\$6.456-b.

Across the eight heads of procurement spending:

- * Construction, renovations and improvements (CRI) and feasibility studies, design and supervision (FSDS) are both channeled entirely through the development budget.
- * Expenditure on materials and supplies (M&S) and other services and expenses (OSE) are items of consumption spending, provided for mostly as part of current operational expenditure, but with some allocations channeled through the development budget to specific projects.
- * Expenditure on operational equipment, machinery and plant (OEMP), furniture and office equipment (FOE) and vehicles (V) is classified as capital expenditure under the operational budget, with some allocations to specific development projects.
- * Since 2019/20, the budget has itemized 'purchase of buildings' - as part of development expenditure.

Procurement allocations in 2021/22

Although the N\$3.124-b 2021/22 budget for construction, renovations and improvements accounts for the – usual – biggest share of procurement expenditure, it is at a nine-year low and suffered the second-most severe reduction of all procurement categories on last year's revised expenditure (after 'other services and expenses').

- * 'Other services and expenses' has the second-biggest share of 2021/22's procurement budget with N\$2.7-b, accounting for 27.55% of the procurement total after a 35.44% decrease on last year - the biggest reduction within the procurement budget.
- * The 2021/22 budget for materials and supplies totals N\$2.4-b in third place, accounting for 24.6% of procurement expenditure – a 3.24% increase on last year.
- * N\$1.05-b has been voted for operational equipment, machinery and plant in 2021/22, accounting for 10.7% of the procurement budget in fourth place, after a 9.95% increase over last year.

State's vanishing

- * Voted expenditure for feasibility studies, design and supervision has been increased by 70.47% to N\$456-m, more than doubling its share to 4.65% of 2021/22's procurement total, in fifth place.
- * N\$51.3-m voted for furniture and office equipment (including ICT) in 2021/22 accounts for 0.59% of the procurement budget, following a 2.65% reduction on last year.
- * N\$500,000 budgeted for vehicle purchases in 2021/22 is an 11% increase over last year's revised all-time low of N\$450,000.
- * The N\$2-m has been voted for the purchase of buildings in 2021/22 is 94% less than last year's revised N\$35.6-m.

Vehicle budget blowout

Already prior to 2020/21's midyear wipe-out, the year's second-lowest-ever budget for new vehicles came in the wake of sharp declines over recent years.

The original N\$10-m budget for the purchase of vehicles in 2019/20 was 16% or N\$1.9-m less than 2018/19's N\$11.9-m with a 0.09% share of the N\$11.2-b procurement budget in 2019/20, compared to 2018/19's 0.12% share of the revised N\$10.1-b.

After those midyear revisions, the share of vehicle purchases within the revised N\$10.2-b 2019/20 procurement budget fell further marginally to 0.1% - remaining in last place behind all other procurement categories (as it was over the previous two years).

In its heyday in 2014/15, government's all-time record budget for vehicles topped N\$1 billion – N\$1,000,083,000 to be precise.

The N\$10-m original budget for vehicles in 2019/20 translated into a 99% decrease or 1% of what it was then.

The N\$10-m original allocation for vehicles in 2019/20 (before being halved midyear) was also preceded by a 60% lowering in 2018/19 on the previous year's revised N\$29.4-m total and 74% below that year's midterm N\$45.1-m.

The budget for vehicle procurement in 2017/18, in turn, was 67.6% below 2016/17's revised N\$139-m.

Following generous budgetary expansions since independence, replenishing government's vehicle fleet has declined sharply since the 2014/15 bonanza.

In 2004/5 N\$68-m was budgeted for purchasing new motor vehicles, expanding to N\$427-m by 2012/13 and N\$469-m the fol-

Five votes have issued tenders for new vehicles so far this year – none of which have any allocation for new vehicles.

lowing year before ballooning to just over N\$1-b in 2014/15 – the highest ever budget for acquiring vehicles to date.

The following year, in 2015/16, this was halved to N\$506-m, only to be reduced by a further 14% to N\$436-m in that year's midterm spending suspensions.

The budget for government's vehicle fleet declined even further to N\$184-m in 2016/17 and was again reduced to N\$175-m mid-year, translating into a 60% reduction on fiscal 2016's N\$436-m.

Already prior to 2020/21's mid-year cutbacks, vehicle purchases accounted for only 0.05% of that year's procurement budget, compared to 0.09% of 2019/20's original N\$11.2-b procurement expenditure, 0.12% in 2018/19, 0.45% in 2017/18 and 1% in 2016/17.

In 2021/22 it constitutes only a fraction of that - 0.005% of the N\$9.8-b procurement total. And this is an improvement on last year when the N\$450,000 vehicle budget accounted for 0.003% of

equipment.

This differential worsened even further after 2020/21's mid-year cutback, when the N\$4.95-m budget for vehicles was 1/17th of the N\$87.1-m voted for furniture and office equipment.

Vehicle tenders in 2021/22

All of the N\$500,000 voted for the purchase of new vehicles in 2021/22 is allocated to the new Water Vote 38, which has to date (five months after the financial commenced in April) not issued a tender.

However, five other votes have issued tenders for new vehicles so far this year (since 01 April 2021) – none of which have any allocation for new vehicles.

Three of the tenders involve foreign funding, ostensibly outside the State Revenue Fund, therefore not restricted by the budget:

* The Office of the President, together with the National Planning

& Culture issue issued tender NCS/ONB/010-02/2021-22 that closed 17-May-21, for leasing vehicles for the MEAC's head office and the National Institute for Educational Development (NIED) for a period of 36 months from 01-Nov-21 to 31-Oct-24. Funding for this tender is probably routed through 'other services and expenses' since it is not provided for under the budget for new vehicles.

Vehicle tenders go off-road

According to the 2021/22 budget, actual expenditure on the purchase of new vehicles in 2019/20 was N\$6.4-m – higher than the revised N\$5-m reflected in last year's budget – which was half the N\$10-m originally voted at the beginning of 2019/20.

Almost all of the latest N\$6.4-m actual expenditure on new vehicles in 2019/20 – N\$5.7-m – was spent by Safety & Security (Vote 6) – all without public tender.

In 2020/21 the procurement of vehicles was still offroad, when two votes with allocations for new vehicles did not issue any public tenders and four votes with no allocations, merrily issued tenders for new vehicles:

* Central Procurement Board - G/ONB/CPB-01/2020 closing 12-May-20 for the supply and delivery of motor vehicles (bids in *Bulletin 1348*) – the finance vote, under which the CPB resorts, has no allocation for vehicles.

* Ministry of Fisheries & Marine Resources - G/ONB/022-01/2020 closing 10-Aug-20 for the supply and delivery of vehicles and accessories (bids in *Bulletin 1361*).

* Namibia Fish Consumption Promotion Trust - G/ONB/NFCPT-04/2020 closing 03-Aug-20 for the supply and delivery of a 16-ton truck with a fitted freezer. The fisheries vote, under which the NFCPT resorts, has no funding for vehicles this year.

* Ministry of Health & Social Services - G/ONB/1302GF-10/2020 closing 13-Nov-20 for the procurement of vehicles and conversion into ambulances including medical equipment for a period of two years.

The two votes which did have budgets for vehicle acquisitions at the beginning of 2020/21 both failed to issue any tenders before the midyear cutback in October 2020 were:

* Justice (Vote 16) with N\$4.5-m and

* Agriculture & Land Reform (Vote 37) with an allocation of N\$450,000 – which was indeed spent, but with no public tender.

Vehicle procurement in the recent past

As we noted in 2019/20 (*Bulletin 1341*), all state vehicle purchase tenders over the previous two years were issued below the public radar.

In 2019/20, central government entities issued hardly any public tenders for the purchase of vehicles – including the Ministry of Health & Social Services which had the entire N\$10-m to itself at the time (subsequently completely wiped out and to be rescued by the USA's benevolence).

Five tenders were issued in 2018/19 for the purchase of vehicles by ministries who had no budget allocations whatsoever:

* The Ministry of Mines & Energy issued a tender for the "procurement of four vehicles for Diamond Affairs".

* The Ministry of Urban & Rural Development issued a tender for the "commissioning, supply and delivery of rapid intervention fire fighting vehicles".

* The Central Procurement Board (in the Ministry of Finance) issued a tender for the "supply and delivery of two 4x4 double cab bakkies and one sedan".

* The Ministry Agriculture, Water & Forestry issued two vehicle acquisition tenders under an AfDB loan (in addition to various tenders for tractors and agricultural plant under the same loan).

Yet, none of the three votes which had budget allocations in 2018/19 issued any public tenders for the purchase of vehicles:

* The Auditor General with an allotted N\$1.4-m;

* Health & Social Services with N\$10-m (same as the following year);

* Justice, with N\$500,000.

Distribution of the vehicle budget

The sharp reduction in funding for vehicle purchases has been accompanied by a shakedown in budgetary allocations to different ministries, where rankings were radically reshuffled in line with spending reprioritizations.

As recently as 2015/16, seventeen of central government's 35 votes received funding for the acquisition of vehicles. At the peak in 2014/15, 22 votes had a slice of the vehicle procurement pie.

Three votes were allocated funding for the purchase of vehicles in 2017/18, compared to ten in 2016/17, reduced to five with that year's midyear austerity suspensions.

In 2018/19 three votes were allocated funding for vehicles and in 2019/20e, compared to two at the start of 2020/21 – reduced to one after the midyear cutbacks.

The two votes with allocations for new vehicles originally in 2020/21 were:

* Justice (Vote 16) has N\$4.5-m compared to nil the year before – completely removed with the midyear revisions;

* The new Vote 37 - Agriculture & Land Reform has N\$450,000 – comprising the entire budget for new vehicles.

Water

And in 2021/22, there is also only one vote with a N\$500,000 allocation for new vehicles, comprising the entire budget – the new Water Vote 38. All of this is channelled through the development budget.

the N\$11.8-b procurement total. In 2019/20, the N\$6.4-m actual expenditure on new vehicles was 0.7% of the N\$9.4-b actual procurement expenditure.

In 2014/15, new vehicle purchases enjoyed a 7% share of all procurement spending, up from 5% in 2013/14, before falling to 3% in 2015/16.

Compared to its last-placed ranking amongst procurement categories in 2020/21 and the previous three, government vehicle purchases enjoyed the fifth highest procurement spending share in 2016/17 – before being relegated to the bottom for the first time.

More furniture than wheels

This year's N\$500,000 budget for vehicles is less than 100th of the N\$51.3-m voted for furniture and office equipment.

This is an improvement on last year's revised N\$450,000 vehicles budget, which was less than 150th of the N\$69-m allocated for furniture and office equipment.

The N\$6.4-m actual expenditure on vehicle purchases in 2019/20 compared to N\$48.7-m for furniture and office equipment translates into a ratio of 1:7.

Central government's N\$45-m original budget for purchasing new vehicles in 2017/18 was less than the N\$52.5-m for buying furniture and office equipment for the first time.

At the beginning of 2019/20, the N\$10-m allocation for vehicles was also one seventh of the N\$73.5-m budgeted for furniture and office

Commission and the Ministry of Agriculture & Land Reform issued tender INTPA/WDH/2021/EA-OP/0076 [NPC reference on website was DEVCO/WDH/2020/EA-OP/0029], financed by the European Development Fund for the supply, delivery, maintenance and after-sales services of off-road passenger and livestock transport vehicles under the 11th EDF Support to the Livestock Sector in the Northern Communal Areas of Namibia Programme with an estimated total value of €1,335,000.

This tender, that is still to close on 18 October 2021, consists of four lots:

- (1) 11x 4x4 double cab off-road vehicles;
- (2) 5x 30-ton trucks with trailers;
- (3) 2x 5-ton 4x4 trucks / lorries;
- (4) 4x 4x4 single-cab off-road vehicles.

* Assisted by Germany's KfW and the EU, the Ministry of Agriculture, Water & Land Reform issued tender G/01/ICBV that closed 03-May-21, for the procurement of unspecified vehicles.

* The Namibia Training Authority, assisted by Germany's GIZ, issued tender 91149667 that closed 31-Mar-21 for the provision of an automatic transmission training vehicle for the Valombola VTC.

However, two other ministries with no allocation for new vehicle acquisitions in 2021/22, have issued tenders since April 2021, when the financial year started:

* The Ministry of Fisheries & Marine Resources issued tender G/ONB/022-01/2021 that closed 07-Jul-21, for the supply and delivery of vehicles and accessories.

* The Ministry of Education, Arts

As recently as 2015/16, 17 of central government's 35 votes received funding for vehicles from a peak of 22 in 2014/15, declining to three in 2018/19 and only one in the following three years.

Since there's not much to write home about as far as this year's budget for new vehicles is concerned, a review of vehicle expenditure and budget allocations since 2019/20, as detailed in the 2021/22 budget is in order.

Safety & Security

According to this year's budget book, Vote 6 actually spent N\$5.7-m on new vehicles in 2019/20 – more than its N\$4.374-m revised allocation for the year, after having started the year with a zero allocation.

In the process, Vote 6 (mainly police) accounted for 89% of the N\$6.4-m actual expenditure on new vehicles in 2019 – one of only two votes with the privilege.

Safety & Security's convenient midyear revival from zero to hero in 2019/20 was a repeat of the previous two years, when it was also saddled with a – hardly believable – zero budget for new wheels with which to help stem the rising crime tide.

In 2016/17, Vote 6 enjoyed 3.8% of all funding for new vehicles, with a budget of only N\$8.7-m out of N\$229.3-m.

Police took the back seat after 2015/16's N\$264-m revised al-

location, which translated into a 97% reduction in that midyear's wholesale suspensions.

The Police Vote overspent its initial budget of N\$258-m in 2015/16 – by a modest 2.6%, accounting for half the vehicle purchasing budget.

This had represented a negligible 7% decrease on the N\$278-m it had to spend in 2014/15 when it ranked second, accounting for 28% of the total.

This, in turn, had been an astronomical 486% increase over 2013/14, when the Police Vote had the third largest budget for new wheels.

Vote 6, has been phased out this year and replaced by the new Vote 39 – Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety & Security, which – suspiciously – again has no allocation for new vehicles.

This means Safety & Security has started the past five years without a budget allocation for new vehicles – not always borne out by actual expenditure and never involving any public tenders.

Mines & Energy

Vote 15 was also fortunate to land up spending N\$696,708 on new vehicles in 2019/20 – accounting for the remaining

Defence & Police have no budgets

10.88% of the N\$6.4-m actual expenditure total, after Safety & Security.

Agriculture & Land Reform

Newly created in 2020/21, Vote 37 is the only vote that has left a trace on the budget for new vehicles last year – all N\$450,000 of it, which was unaffected by 2020/21's midyear cutbacks.

Its predecessor Agriculture, Water & Forestry (Vote 20), which also had no funding for vehicles over the past two years, had the second biggest share of 2017/18's budget, its N\$4.362-m accounting for 9.7% of the total – all development funding.

This was 53% less than 2016/17's revised N\$9.4-m, below its original allocation of N\$106-m voted at the beginning of that year.

In terms of 2016/17's original allocation, Agriculture, Water & Forestry had the third largest share of funding for vehicles, with N\$10.6-m voted – a 48% increase over 2015/16's revised N\$7.2-m.

Its 6% share of the vehicles budget in 2016/17 was virtually unchanged from 2015/16's 5.5%, when the Ministry underspent its ceiling for vehicles by 74%, with only N\$7.2-m out of a N\$27.9-m

initially voted. It dropped back to fifth place in 2015/16 from fourth the previous year, its N\$28-m initial allocation almost half of 2014/15's N\$50-m, which had been an 11% increase over fiscal 2014.

In fiscal 2015, Agriculture, Water & Forestry was the fourth biggest spender on vehicles, with just short of N\$50-m available – an 11% increase over 2013/14.

The associated, Vote 25 – Land Reform (now merged with Vote 37) – also had no funding for vehicles in 2019/20 and the previous year, after it had been one of only three votes with a budget for vehicles in 2017/18.

Its insignificant N\$500,000 accounted for 1.1% of the total and was unchanged from the previous year's revised expenditure – all development funding.

Its revised funding in 2017/18 was 75% below its original allocation of N\$2-m.

In 2016/17, Land Reform's N\$2-m budget accounted for 1.14% of the total, which had been a reduction from its initial N\$7.8-m voted in 2015/16, of which it spent nothing.

It is informative to review those votes that previously enjoyed sizeable shares of government's expenditure on vehicles over recent years.

This is the fifth consecutive year, we are led to believe, that both the Defence and Safety & Security votes have no funding for new vehicles at the beginning of the year.

Justice

With N\$4.5-m originally allocated in 2020/21, Justice (Vote 16) had the biggest share of that year's vehicle budget, accounting for 91% of the N\$4.95-m total. As it turns out, Justice spent nothing on new vehicles in 2020/21 and has no allocation this year.

Although Vote 16's initial allocation at the beginning of last year was reflected as a 100% increase on last year's revised N\$0, it was in fact the only other vote besides Health & Social Services with a budget for vehicles in 2019/20 – all N\$500,000 of it – accounting for 4.2% of the total voted at the beginning of the year.

This too, was 100% up on 2017/18's zero – as has been the case since at least 2016/17.

In 2015/16 Justice was allocated N\$10-m originally in a N\$506-m total, which turned out at N\$1.262-m revised in a N\$426.75-m revised total. It had no funding for vehicles in the previous two years.

Health & Social Services

Health & Social Services (Vote 13) – where 100 vehicles in its 1,950 fleet went missing five years ago – has had the biggest share of the original vehicle budgets over the previous five consecutive years to 2019/20 – with little public procurement to show for it.

Vote 13, which now relies on the US Embassy for vehicle donations, has no budget for 2021/22.

Its 100% share of 2019/20's N\$10m original vehicles budget disappeared in last year's budget book as N\$0 revised expenditure, with no actual expenditure for the year recorded in the 2021/22 budget.

Its N\$10-m to spend on purchasing new vehicles in 2018/19, also accounting for the entire N\$10-m total, was N\$14.561-m or 59.3% less than 2017/18's revised N\$24.561-m, when it accounted for 83.5% of the N\$29.423-m total.

At 2017/18's midterm revisions Health & Social Services retained its original allocation of N\$40.242-m for vehicles, accounting for over 89% of the N\$45.104-m total.

The difference between its midyear revised N\$40.242-m as at 2017/18 and the N\$24.56-m latest revised according to 2018/19's budget book points to a 39% underspend of N\$15.7-m in 2017/18.

Its N\$40.242-m in 2017/18 was over 71% less than 2016/17's revised N\$140.3-m, although only N\$100-m had originally been voted, translating into a 40% overspend in that year.

With 2016/17's original allocation, Health & Social Services was also the biggest recipient of funding

for the purchase of new vehicles, its N\$100-m comprising 57% of the total.

That was nearly 400% more than 2015/16, when its N\$50-m budget was only 10% of the N\$506-m revised total.

The Ministry then underspent its vehicle budget in 2015/16 by N\$30-m, however, spending only N\$20-m of its allocated N\$50-m – 60% under budget.

Health's original vehicle budget for 2015/16 had been a 70% reduction on 2014/15's N\$167-m, accounting for only 10% of the total, compared to 17% of the total in 2014/15 following a 173% increase on 2013/14.

Over these years, all of this vote's vehicle budget has been operational, with no development component.

Government Garage

This is the sixth consecutive year that the Government Garage has not been allocated any funding for new vehicle acquisitions, following 2016/17's unprecedented first zero budget since independence.

In 2015/16, the GG had an initial budget of N\$45-m, but spent N\$10-m less – 22.5% under budget.

Its original budget for new vehicles – which it leases out to other ministries – was dramatically slashed in 2015/16 by 87% from 2014/15's N\$345.3-m, when it accounted for one third of the N\$1-b budget for new vehicles – the biggest share ahead of Police, with N\$277.6-m and Health & Social Services, with N\$50-m that year.

In 2015/16 the Transport Vote – under which the GG resorts – lost its top spot from the previous two years, with only N\$45-m to spend on acquiring new vehicles

– an 87% reduction on 2014/15's N\$345-m, when it enjoyed a third of the total vehicle purchasing budget – a 90% increase on fiscal 2014.

The Transport Vote ranked third in 2015/16, compared to fiscal 2015, when its N\$182-m constituted 39% of the central government's budget for vehicle purchases – in first place.

Defence

This is the fifth consecutive year, we are led to believe, that the Ministry of Defence has no budget for new vehicles.

This is a big drop from 2016/17 when it had the second biggest allocation for new vehicles, with just over N\$44-m, comprising 25% of the total and translating into a 37% increase over 2015/16's N\$39-m initially voted, when it accounted for only 7.7% of the total budget for vehicles.

This, in turn, had been a moderate 4% increase over 2014/15's N\$37.5-m.

The MoD underspent its budget for vehicles in 2015/16 by 17%, spending only N\$32-m of its allocated N\$39-m.

The Defence Vote was ranked the fourth in funding for new vehicles in 2015/16, when its budget represented a nominal 4% increase on 2014/15, ranking it fifth with N\$37.5-m, which had been a 36% increase over fiscal 2014.

Still, Defence's initial allocation in 2016/17 was almost double the previous year's share below 4% and also higher than fiscal 2014's 5.8% of all central government vehicle purchases.

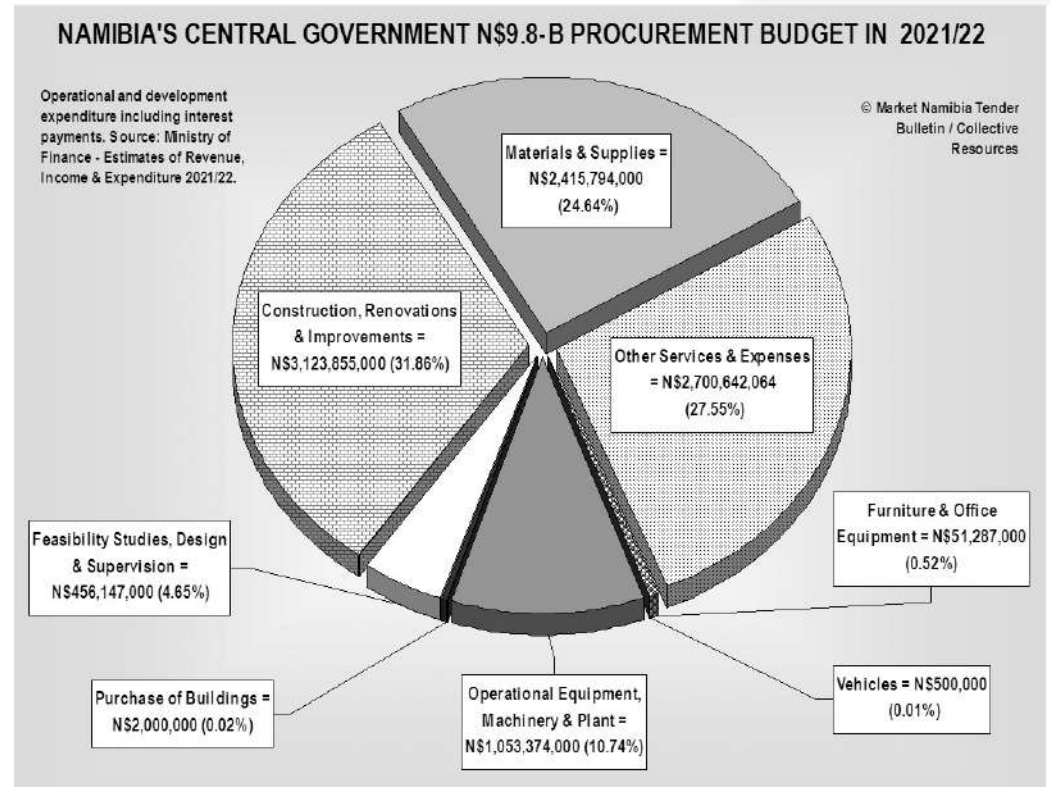

THE PROCUREMENT OF OBSCURITY

The CPB awarded contracts worth N\$1.6-b to Namibians, N\$752.1-m to foreigners and N\$65.5-m to joint ventures 2017 to 2020 – 36% of what the former Tender Board in two years

The CPB issued a total of 71 public tenders in four years from 2017 to 2020 – one tenth of the 783 issued by the former Tender Board in only two years from 2013 to 2014.

The Central Procurement Board of Namibia has awarded tenders worth less in the four years to 2020 than its predecessor, the Tender Board, did five years ago in only two years – such is the degree to which public transparency has been obscured under Namibia's new procurement regime.

The Central Procurement Board awarded tenders worth N\$2.4 billion over four years to between 1017 and 2020 – over one third (36%) less than its predecessor, the Tender Board of Namibia did over two years from 2013 to 2014, when it awarded procurement contracts worth N\$3.75-b. Put differently, the Tender Board issued over half as many (55%) more tenders in the two-year period than the CPB did in the four-year period.

Between 2017 and 2020 the Central Procurement Board of Namibia awarded tenders worth about N\$1.6 billion to Namibian companies, while contracts worth N\$752.1 million were awarded to foreign-owned companies and N\$65.5-million to joint ventures of Namibian and foreign owned companies, according to figures published in *The Namibian* of 18-Mar-21. This totals N\$2,417,600,000.

The information was contained in a presentation to the media - to which the *Tender Bulletin* was not invited.

According to the last statistics provided by the now defunct Tender Board, tenders worth N\$3.75 were awarded during 2012/13 and

2013/14. This means the CPB issued tenders over four years worth 36% less than the Tender Board did in two years – six years ago. Put differently, the Tender Board issued tenders worth 55% more in two years than the CPB did in four years.

These are nominal amounts, not taking inflation into account.

The CPB did not disclose how many public tenders it issued over the four years between 2017 and 2020, but according to the *Tender Bulletin* database, the Tender Board issued over 100 times more public tenders in two years between 2013 and 2014 than the Central Procurement Board did in four years.

The CPB issued a total of 71 public tenders in four years:

- * one in 2017,
- * 12 in 2018,
- * 25 in 2019 and
- * 33 in 2020.

Over the two years from 2013 to 2014, the Tender Board issued 783 public tenders:

- * 356 in 2013 and
- * 427 in 2014.

According to CPB spokesperson Johanna Kambala, ownership identification was based on citizenship, company registration certificates and obligatory documents such as good standing from SSC, Receiver of Revenue and Affirmative Action certificate.

The 2018/19 financial year was one of the best in terms of public entities submitting **procurement plans** worth N\$8-billion for approv-

al to the CPB. But in 2019/20 the value of procurement plans submitted fell to below N\$6-billion.

By March this year the CPB had only received individual procurement plans from public entities for 2020/21 worth about N\$2-billion.

This decline in the submission of procurement plans over the past three years is another indicator of how more procurement is being conducted below the radar independently of the Central Procurement Board.

Contract extensions worth N\$2.8-billion were also approved during 2018/19. This dropped to N\$1.8-billion during the next financial year.

Direct procurement approved by the CPB started with N\$1.2-billion in 2018/19, which increased to over N\$1.5-billion for the next year.

The drop in public procurement through the CPB can partially be attributed to suspension of some public procurement due to the Covid-19 pandemic, it was explained, but this only compounds the problem of how the CPB is being side-stepped by state ministries, offices, SOEs and councils on regional and local level.

A promise by the finance ministry to publish a summary on procurement by public entities has not yet materialised (*The Namibian* 18-Mar-21).

Not much information can be obtained from the CPB website on the volume and value of public tenders processed by the CPB. The last annual report is for 2017/18.

The statistics posted on the website cover the period Apr-18 to Jan-19 and merely list number of bids adjudicated and evaluated, the bid documents sold/submitted and number of tenders by direct procurement.

Then there is also a status update on active projects as at 31-Mar-21.

These figures represent only a fraction of all procurement spending of public entities in Namibia.

After all, the CPB only handles high value tenders, where the procurement thresholds for the three categories of state entities exceed:

- * N\$5-m to N\$15-m for non-consultancy services;
- * N\$10-m to N\$20-m for consultancy services;
- * N\$15-m to N\$25-m for goods and
- * N\$20-m to N\$35-m for works contracts.

All other procurement is handled directly by the numerous procurement committees at ministries, offices, SOEs, regional and local councils - these days more often than not by way of 'Request for Sealed Quotation', 'Informal Quotation' or 'Restricted Bidding' invitations.

The CPB is also not involved in those high-value contacts co-funded by the AfDB, for which many tenders were issued by the ministries of Agriculture, Water & Land Reform, Education, Arts & Culture and Finance. Many other AfDB funded high-value tenders are issued and awarded by the Roads Authority - mostly to Chinese contractors.

Germany's KfW-funded projects are generally issued by the respective ministries such as Environment, Forestry & Tourism or other institutions without CPB involvement.

Namibian public works contracts funded by China are generally completely off the public radar.
