Executive Summary

SEBI in May 2021 introduced the Business Responsibility and Sustainability Reporting (BRSR) for listed entities to include sustainability in business reporting. In BRSR, the businesses will be required to report the positive and negative impacts of their operations, to ensure compliance of their societal and environmental accountability on the basis of three parameters; ESG (environment, social and governance). This will ensure transparency and enable stakeholders to make informed decisions related to investment in new ventures. In BRSR the organisation portrays its plan and performance in terms of sustainability, which is becomes a stakeholder to identify and assess sustainability-related risks and opportunities to take wise decisions. It is aimed to encourage organisations to stride towards sustainability, which is the larger objective for a tenable financial and ecological system.

A conventional supply chain is the process of producing and selling of products covering all the stages, from material procurement, manufacturing of products and its distribution and sale. For a Supply Chain to achieve sustainability, proper management and coordination tools should be in place. Effective management of supply chain can be beneficial in lowering costs, and faster production cycle. A value chain is a procedure describing the activities required to create a product or service. A company analyses its value-chain by evaluating the detailed course of action involved in each step of its business. The purpose of a value-chain analysis is to increase production efficiency so that a company can deliver maximum value at the least cost. Without effective management of these, companies may have the risk of reducing its customers, and losing a competitive edge in respective industries. Today, adherence to social and environmental standards and compliance with these standards has become inevitable. The idea is to create a smooth flow of sustainable practices throughout the supply chain.
