After a 35% reduction on last year, Namibia's health and welfare cluster has a development budget of only N\$216-m in 2022/23 - one third of the security cluster's N\$680.5-m, where per capita expenditure on Swapo's 24,000 war veterans is nine times more than investments catering for 773,463 impoverished Namibians, including 339.735 children.

including 339,735 children.

The 34.5% or N\$114-m reduction in the health and welfare cluster's development budget to N\$216-m from last year's revised N\$330-m is the biggest out of five clusters, ranking it fourth and second-last in the central government's N\$5.5-b budget for capital projects.

The security cluster, on the other hand, suffered only a 12% or N\$87.7-m reduction on its capital projects budget to N\$680.5-m for 2022/23 from last year's N\$735-m revised expenditure.

Although health and welfare's initial 2022/23 development budget of N\$216-m was unaffected midyear, the security cluster's increased by 5% or N\$33-m midyear from N\$647.5-m at the beginning of 2022/23, to N\$690.5-m.

In the process, health and welfare's stare of the overall development ceiling fell by 0.4% from 4.3% to 3.9%, while that of the security cluster's fell by a bigger 0.57% margin from 12.96% to 12.38%.

But the caveat is that health and

But the caveat is that health and welfare's post-midyear development ceiling is still only one third of the security cluster's.

And closer analysis shows that per capita development expenditure on Swapo war veterans within the security cluster is still nine times more than health and welfare's development budget for vulnerable Namibians – narrowing from 21:1 at last count.

As we reported in *Bulletin 1476*, the N\$33-m additional midyear supplement to the defence vote's development budget equals the N\$33-m removed from the educational cluster in the midyear reshuffling of voted expenditure for capital projects.

Closer examination on this N\$33-m switch in spending piorities on capital projects first reported in *Bulletin 1474*, reveals that the defence vote is the sole beneficiary of the midyear windfall within the security cluster. This N\$33-m midyear gain in the security cluster's development budget elevates

its allocation to N\$680.5-m or a 12.4% share of N\$5.495-b overall development expenditure that is 1% more than the social sector's N\$626-m or 11.4% share of the post-midyear total.

of the post-midyear total.

This is a reversal from the beginning of the year, when the social sector (education plus health and welfare) enjoyed a 13.2% share with N\$659-m of the N\$5-b initial development budget, compared to the security cluster's lesser N\$647.5-m or 12.96%.

The security cluster's N\$33-m additional development ceiling at midyear in 2022/23 is 5.1% more than the N\$647.5-m with which it started the year, while the social sector's allocation for capital projects was reduced by N\$33-m or 7.45% to N\$626-m – 8% less than the security cluster's N\$680.5-m after midyear compared to the beginning of the year, when the social sector's N\$659-m was 1.75% more than the security cluster's N\$647.5-m.

This reversal between the security cluster in relation to the social sector is one of the outcomes of the 10% or N\$500-m increase in the national development budget to N\$5.5-b midyear in October 2022, alongside generous additional operational spending increments that also left the Defence and Veterans Affairs votes better off.

Despite this 5.1% midyear increase to N\$680.5-m in the security cluster's development ceiling, its share of the development budget fell marginally from 12.96% at the beginning of the year to 12.38%.

Security cluster scored most last midyear

At the time of 2021/22's midyear reallocations last year, the security cluster also benefited more from reallocated investments in capital projects than the education and health/welfare clusters.

The security sector was the only one to walk away with a higher development budget after midyear, despite a N\$280-m cutback in overall capital projects voted expenditure – in addition to scoring the biggest slice of the additional N\$2.2-b allocated to the operational budget after midyear in 2021/22.

The security cluster retained its second-biggest share of national development expenditure after November 2021's midyear budget revisions

Welfare investment

that saw allocations for capital projects reduced from N\$5.5-b by N\$280-m or 5.08% to N\$5.2-b and operational expenditure increased by N\$2.2-b or 4.09% from N\$54-b to N\$56-b.

The Ministry of Defence & Veterans Affairs received N\$477-m - by far the biggest slice of the 2021/22 midyear top-up in operational expenditure - accounting for 21.7% of the additional N\$2.2-b operational spending supplement and 11.5% of the higher N\$56-b overall operational budget, compared to a lesser 11.1% of overall N\$54-b operational expenditure at the beginning of the year.

The operational budget of the Ministry of Education, Arts & Culture, on the other hand, was increased midyear by only N\$400-m or 3% from N\$13.37-b to N\$13.774-b last year – far less than the 8% increase in the operational ceiling of the Ministry of Defence & Veterans

Affairs (Bulletin 1474).
As noted last year in Bulletin 1422, almost the entire N\$280-m midyear cutback in 2021/22's development budget was reallocated to operational expenditure, where N\$458-m of the Ministry of Defence & Veterans Affairs' additional N\$477-m was "to meet the funding shortfall on personnel expenditure"

expenditure".

Not only did the security cluster benefit most from the midyear operational budget reallocations, it did so too in the case of revisions to development expenditure ceilings.

Health and welfare lost the most last midyear

n contrast to the security cluster, the health and welfare sector suffered the biggest midyear cutback of N\$63-m or 16% to its 2021/22 development budget amongst five clusters, reduced to N\$330-m with which to build clinics, hospitals and amenities for the needy less than half the security cluster's N\$735-m to spend on military bases, police stations, courtrooms and prisons (Bulletin 1430).

At the beginning of the year, the health and social welfare cluster's initial N\$392.8-m allocation from the central government for capital projects was over half security's N\$733.7-m, which was increased by 0.2% to N\$735.2-m – still ranked second compared to health and welfare's unchanged fourth ranking out of five clusters.

Health and welfare's development ceiling was cut by N\$63-m midyear

from N\$392.8-m to N\$330-m, its share of voted development expenditure falling from over 7% at the beginning of the year to 6.3%, while the security cluster's capital projects allocation was increased by 0.2% or N\$1.5-m from N\$733.7-m to N\$735.2-m, its share of the development budget increasing from 13.33% to 14.07% after midyear.

In the process, the health and welfare cluster's cutback contributed the most - 22.5% - to the N\$280-m reduction in the development budget as a whole.

Health and welfare also lost the most in 2020/21 midyear cutbacks

The 2021/22 midyear cutback in the development budget was a rerun of the previous year, when the health and welfare cluster suffered the biggest, 16.45% reduction 2020/21, compared to a loss of only 1.45% for the security cluster's expenditure ceiling on capital projects.

This meant that relative to their respective allocations, the health and welfare cluster lost eleven times more of its development funding at midyear than the security cluster.

At 2020/21's midyear development budget revisions, health and welfare had a N\$52.5-m haircut compared to only N\$12-m for the security cluster.

After these midyear revisions in 2020/21, the security cluster's N\$813-m development budget was treble the health and welfare cluster's N\$266.6-m.

After the 2021/22 midyear revisions, the security cluster's N\$735.2-m was 2.2 times more than health and welfare's N\$330-m and 1.5 times more than the education cluster's N\$475-m.

The 2020/21 midyear budget review

The 2020/21 midyear budget review saw Namibia's development expenditure increase by a moderate N\$100-m or 1.56% to N\$6.5-b – a refreshing reversal on past years at the time – now repeated in 2022/23.

Pendulum swings back to security

In terms of 2021/22's revised development expenditure according to this year's midterm budget statistics, the social sector's combined N\$805-m capital projects expenditure exceeded the security cluster's N\$735.2-m by 8.7%.

Although this 8.7% gap was reversed at the beginning of 2022/23 in favour of the social sector, whose combined N\$659-m exceeded the security cluster's N\$647.5-m by 1.8%, the pendulum has now swung back in the latter's favour after the latest midyear revisions, with the security cluster's N\$680.5-m exceeding the social sector's N\$626-m by 8% for the remainder of 2022/23.

Taking the social sector's two clusters – education and health/welfare – separately, however, the security cluster's allocation for capital projects expenditure is bigger by far in terms of the domestically-funded development budget, as has traditionally been the case.

Midyear 2022/23 recap

Unlike this midyear's increase, the finance ministry has in past years consistently reduced its development budget midyear, in order to reallocate funds voted for investment in capital projects at the beginning of the year into the operational budget to prop up shortfalls remuneration, utilities and other current expenditure.

But thanks to higher-than-expected revenues and lowered debt servicing costs, the fiscus was able to break the mould for the first time in recent years.

As reported earlier, not only has the operational budget has been increased by 6.2% from N\$56.6-b to N\$60.1-b mid-

year in 2022/23, the development budget was raised by a significantly higher 10% from N\$5-b to N\$5.5-b.

N\$2.9-b extra remuneration costs in this year's midterm budget accounts for 83% of the entire N\$3.5-b additional operational expenditure, compared to midyear in 2021/22 when N\$865-m additional allocations for remuneration accounted for a far lesser 40% of the N\$2.2-b overall increase in the operational budget.

The 2022/23 development budget across the other clusters

The economic cluster has the usual biggest share of the development budget in 2022/23, its initial N\$3.5-b increased midyear by a generous N\$486.2-m or 13.86% to N\$3.99-b - the biggest midyear increase of all clusters, ing its share of the total from 70.17% to 72.66% and accounting for over 97% of the entire N\$500-m midyear increase in the domestically-funded development

budget.
* Retaining its second-place ranking from the beginning of 2022/23, the se-curity cluster's development budget was boosted by N\$33-m midyear – a 5.1% increase to N\$680.5-m, its share of the development budget falling marginally from 12.96% at the beginning of the year to 12.38%, however.

But this N\$33-m midyear increase is the third-biggest increment amongst five clusters — all accruing to the Defence Vote - and is identical to N\$33-m cut from the educational cluster's development budget - the only cluster to suffer a midyear reduction in its development

budget.
* In third place, the education cluster cutback in its development budget in 2022/23, its N\$443-m ceiling at the beginning of the year was reduced by 7.45% to N\$410-m, its share of the total falling from 8.86% to 7.46%.

* Ranked fifth and last, the admin-

istrative cluster's development budget was increased by N\$11.5-m or 6.2% midyear from N\$184.2-m to N\$195.7m, its share of the total falling marginally from 3.69% of N\$5-b at the beginning of 2022/23 to 3.56% of N\$5.5-b after midyear.

Children versus veterans

hankfully, 2022/23 is the fifth consecutive year that the Veterans Affairs Vote in the security cluster has a smaller development budget N\$3-m - than the Gender Equality, Poverty Eradication & Social Welfare Vote in the health and welfare cluster N\$11-m. Both allocations were unaffected midvear.

As we noted when covering the security cluster's development budget for 2021/22 in Bulletin 1428, while the

VA vote's N\$7-m post-midyear allocation in 2021/22 was still higher than the previous year's N\$5-m, the Social Welfare Vote's N\$13.75-m was almost

half 2020/21's revised N\$25.67-m. This was after the VA Vote's N9-m allocation at the beginning of this year was cut midyear by N\$2-m or 22.22% to N\$7-m, while the Social Welfare Vote's initial N\$23.55-m allocation was cut midvear by almost twice as much - 41.6% or N\$9.8-m - to N\$13.75-m.

As a result, the VA Vote's N\$7-m post-midyear development allocation in 2021/22 was over half Gender Equality, Poverty Eradication & Social Welfare's N\$13.75-m – a sharp reversal on the previous year's one-fifth disparity in favour of the Social Welfare Vote.

Comparing the VA's N\$7-m postmidyear development budget for 24,000 war vets in 2021/22 to the Gender Equality, Poverty Eradication & Social Welfare Vote's N13.753-m for 360,000 impoverished children, it worked out to N\$291.66 for each war vet, compared to N\$38.20 for each impoverished child – a ratio of 7:1 in favour of the war vets.

This disparity was far greater in previous years, however.

Historical disparities between war vets and kids

n 2020/21, it was the third consecutive year that the GECW vote's budget for capital projects had been higher than Veterans Affairs.

VA's initial N\$5-m was unaffected midyear, while Gender Equality, Poverty Eradication & Social Welfare's initial N\$25.67-m was also unaffected midyear – leaving the latter with five times more than the veterans.

VA's initial N\$5-m allocation in 2020/ 21 was 41% less than 2019/20's revised N\$8.5-m, while the social welfare vote's initial N\$25.67-m was a massive 751% increase on 2019/20's N\$3-m.

In 2019/20, the N\$8.5-m Veterans Affairs had to spend on development projects (unaffected by the midyear revisions), was a generous 240% increase over 2018/19's revised N\$2.5-m, which had been a 42% reduction on its original N\$6-m voted at the beginning of that year.

Gender Equality, Poverty Eradication & Social Welfare (Vote 36), on the other hand, had a revised N\$3-m plus N\$9.67-m for the since-discontinued Gender Equality & Child Welfare (Vote 12), totaling N\$12.7-m.

However, Gender Equality & Child Welfare's revised N\$9.67-m for 2019/20

came after N\$82-m had originally been voted, reduced to N\$77.8-m midyear – a disappearance of N\$65-m that remains

unexplained to this day.

ance was restored in the government's development priorities for the first time only in 2018/19 when, in a reversal on the previous two years, Gender Equality & Child Welfare had – marginally - more project funding than Veterans Affairs, with a development budget of N\$7.5-m compared to N\$6-m for the war vets.

At the time of 2018/19's midyear revisions, however, the VA Vote's N\$6-m was not reduced - unlike all votes in the health and welfare cluster.

VA's development budget in 2018/ 19 was 51.5% below 2017/18's revised N\$12.38-m, which commenced with just below N\$15-m.

In 2017/18, Veterans Affairs had N\$14.9-m to spend on capital projects, up 55% from the previous year's revised

In contrast, Gender Equality & Child Welfare had N\$8.2-m - not quite double 2016/17's revised N\$4.2-m, when N\$9.6-m development project funding for war veterans was more than double the N\$4.2-m allocated for social welfare, while in the same year (2016/17) the much-heralded new Ministry of Poverty Eradication & Social Welfare had its development budget slashed 99% in its first year, affecting the construction of the new food bank in Katutura, where N\$39.1-m was suspended midyear from an initial N\$39.7-m voted

PLAN's favoured retirees

he same disproportionate allocation of development funding between war vets and poverty-af-fected children also applied in 2015/16 (Bulletin 1141).
The Tender Bulletin had pointed

two years earlier that "the development budget shows a distinct bias favouring the gracefully retired members of the Peoples Liberation Army of Namibia, with the construction of housing and recreational facilities for veterans supplementing their generous financial

grants under the operational budget.
"On the other hand, vulnerable civil society groups such as old age pen-sioners and children living in poverty are biting the bullet when it comes to

development funding."
As we pointed out in our assessment of development spending in 2015/16, there were an estimated 360,000 children living in poverty in Namibia in 2010, according to a UNICEF report at the time.

Yet, the Ministry of Gender Equality & Child Welfare's development spending in 2015/16 specifically targeting vulnerable children totaled only N\$1.8-m, compared to N\$4.5-m in 2014/15 - a 60% reduction.

In contrast, for about 24,000 Swapo war vets, 2015/16's development budget for the Ministry of Veterans Affairs amounted to N\$44.5-m – exceeding the N\$1.8-m benefiting vulnerable children 25-fold and more than double 2014/15's N\$19-m for the war vets (Bulletin_1190).

Fast forward three years, when the N\$8.5-m Veterans Affairs had to spend in 2019/20 (unaffected by the midyear revisions), was a generous 240% increase over 2018/19's revised N\$2.5-m, which had been a 42% reduction on its original N\$6-m voted at the beginning of that year – all for one project.

At the time of 2018/19's midyear

revisions, however, the Vote's N\$6-m was not reduced - unlike all votes in the health and welfare cluster.

Poor record on poverty

t was reported in February 2022 that 51.3% of Namibia's children are living in poverty, according to a UNICEF socio-economic impact analysis, which found that at least 45,000 children and 200,000 Namibians were pushed into poverty during the Covid-19 pandemic, making children the poorest demo-graphic group in the country, according to the World Bank.

According to another UN agency, more than half Namibia's population has experienced food insecurity since 2020, while 1.4 million were unable to afford a healthy diet.

With an estimated 339,735 vulnerable children receiving social grants in Namibia in 2022 out of a total 773,463 recipients, 51.3% of children and 43.3% of the total population are living in poverty.

According to the World Bank, Namibia's poverty rapidly declined between 1993/94 and 2015/16, but remains high relative to the country's level of development, where Namibia is ranked 117 out of 157 on the human capital index (The Namibian, 28-Jul-22).

Amongst the key findings of a special report by UNICEF, 'Namibia Nutrition Budget Brief 2019/20', are a lack of expenditure data on nutritionspecific intervention makes it difficult to undertake a comprehensive analysis of government spending on nutrition.
"The government is encouraged

to strengthen its budget classification system to give visibility to nutrition-specific interventions in the national budget and make such information publicly available.

Between 2015/16 and 2019/20, total spending on nutrition-specific interventions is estimated to have averaged only 0.11% of the total budget and 0.04% of GDP. "This low level of spending, to a large extent contributes to the some-

Health and welfare's 2022/23 development budget

he health and welfare cluster has 35 projects under implementation in 2022/23, compared to 42 last year - one more than 2020/21's 41, 39 in 2019/20, below 2018/19's 42 (33 of which were scaled back midyear), 2017/18's 46 projects (none affected midyear), 55 in 2016/17 (35 scaled back midyear) and 2015/16's 64 (affected projects not disclosed).

The health and welfare cluster consists of:

- * Health & Social Services (Vote 13) 26 projects (30 last year;
- * Labour, Social Welfare & Employment Creation (Vote 14) – two projects (same as last year):

Health & Social Services

As usual, most of the health and welfare cluster's development budget lies with the Ministry of Health & Social Services (Vote 13), which has N\$200-m to spend on its 26 projects in 2022/23, accounting for 92.6% of the N\$216-m cluster total, which was unaffected in the midyear revisions.

This is 35.34% less than last year's revised N\$309.3-m when it accounted for 93.75% of the N\$330-m cluster total, following a N\$51.2-m or 14.2% cutback midyear from its N\$360.5-m initial allocation for capital projects, accounting for 91.77% of the N\$392.8-m cluster total

at the beginning of 2021/22.

Vote 13's initial N\$360.5-m ceiling for 2021/22 had been a generous 51.2% or N\$122-m increase over 2020/21's actual N\$238.4-m expenditure accounting for 89.4% of the N\$266.6-m cluster total.

In 2020/21, Health & Social Services had its development budget for 29 projects reduced by 16.47% or N\$47-m midyear from N\$285.43-m voted at the beginning of the year to N\$238.43-m.

As result, its share of the health and welfare cluster total dropped from 92.47% of N\$319-m at the beginning of the year to 89.43% of the lowered N\$266 6 m poet midwar cluster total.

N\$266.6-m post-midyear cluster total.

Nationally, Vote 13 enjoys only 3.64% of the N\$5.5-b total post-midyear development budget, compared to 4% of N\$5-b at the beginning of the year and 5.9% of the N\$5.2-b development budget after midyear 2021/22, significantly lower than the beginning of the year.

total at the beginning of the year.

After 2022/23's midyear revisions, this ranks it eighth, behind the Transport Vote's 49.8%, Urban & Rural Development's 6.82%, Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety & Security's 6.45%, the Water Vote's 6.32%, Agriculture & Land Reform's 6.19%, Education, Arts & Culture's 5.46% and the Defence Vote's 5.37%.

This ranking is unchanged from the beginning of 2022/23, but is lower in terms of last year's revised N\$5.2-b development expenditure, when Health & Social Services ranked sixth with 5.92% behind Transport's 40.9%, Urban & Rural Development's 10.18%, Education, Arts & Culture's 7.63%, Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety & Security's 7.18 and Agriculture & Land Reform's 5.97% - but ahead of Defence's 5.7%.

However, Vote 13's eighth-place ranking in 2022/23 is half of its fourth placing after midyear in 2021/22 with a 5.92% share of the total behind the Transport Vote's 40.89%, Urban & Rural Development's 10.2% and Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety & Security's 7.2%.

From being ahead of Defence's 5.7% last year, Health & Social Services is presently behind with a 3.64% share after midyear in 2022/23, compared to Defence's 5.37%; but Vote 13 has lagged behind Home Affairs, Immigration Safety & Security all the time

Vote 13 accounted for 4.45% of the
overall N\$6.4-b development budget
at the beginning of 2020/21, dropping
to 3.66% of the N\$6.5-b higher postmidyear total.

The N\$285.4-m allocated to Health & Social Services at the beginning of 2020/21 was 24.3% or N\$55.8-m more than its revised N\$229.6-m actual expenditure in 2019/20 as reflected in the 2020/21 development budget.

This N\$229.6-m was higher than the N\$198.2-m to which its develop-

ment budget allocation was reduced in 2019/20's midyear revisions.

Vote 13's development ceiling was slashed by 51% or N\$206.2-m midyear in 2019/20 from N\$404.4-m to N\$198.2-m, its share of the cluster dropping from 83% to 71.8% and its share of the national total almost halving from 51% to 2.87%

5.1% to 2.87%.
This 51% midyear cutback in 2019/20 was far more severe than the following year's 16.47% reduction and 2021/22's 14%.

This year's 26 projects under implementation by the Ministry of Health & Social Services is below last year's 30, compared to 2020/21's 29, 31 in 2019/20, 34 in 2018/19, of which 29 were scaled back in that midyear – all ongoing in both years, compared to two new projects in 2020/21 but none over the following two years.

None of Vote 13's projects in 2022/23 are above N\$42-m, compared to two above N\$50-m last year, one in 2020/21, two in 2019/20 and three the previous year.

Its biggest project in 2022/23 is the same as last year - nationwide primary health care clinics construction and upgrading - for which only N\$42-m has been voted, compared to N\$74.7-m last year.

This was Vote 13's second-biggest project in 2020/21, when N\$40-m was voted and it also ranked as the project with the biggest total of N\$740-m – the last time such information was disclosed in the national budget.

N\$35-m has been voted in 2022/23 for Vote 13's second-biggest project - maintenance and repair of health infrastructure nationwide - compared to N\$60-m in each of the previous two years, as the second-biggest project in 2021/22 and the biggest the year before

While there have been no midyear adjustments to Vote 13's development ceiling in 2022/23, the midyear budget does not disclose which of the Ministry of Health & Social Services' projects were affected midyear – or by how much – as was the case in past three years.

Only four of the Ministry's other projects in 2022/23 have been allocated N\$10-m or more (compared to seven last year):

Vote 36 has N\$11-m to spend on seven projects in 2022/23 (ten last year), accounting for a little over 5% of the unchanged N\$216-m cluster total before and after midvear.

before and after midyear. This is 20% or N\$2.75-m less than last year's N\$13.75-m revised expenditure accounting for 4.17% of the N\$329.9-m cluster total, after its original N\$23.55-m voted at the beginning of 2021/22 when it accounted for 6% of the N\$393-m cluster total was cut by 41.6% or N\$9.8-m.

In its first year of existence, Vote 36 started 2020/21 with a N\$25.674-m development allocation for 10 projects, unchanged after those midyear revisions – accounting for 9.6% of the N\$266.6-m post-midyear cluster total.

For some unknown reason, 2020/21's budget recorded Vote 36 with a revised development ceiling of N\$3.017-m for 2019/20 for a project count of nil, which meant its allocation in 2020/21 was a 750.98% increase over 2019/20.

This N\$3.17-m carry-over from 2019/20 must be related to balances brought forward from the now defunct Vote 12 - Gender Equality & Child Welfare.

The reshuffling of these welfare votes comes as no surprise, given their dismal underperformance over past years.

No more Poverty Eradication & Social Welfare

n 2019/20, it was the third year that the inaptly named Poverty Eradication & Social Welfare (Vote 33 – now discontinued) had nothing to spend on capital projects, four years after its establishment.

In 2018/19, the PESW vote still had no development budget for the second consecutive year, after 99% of its funding was wiped in 2016/17's midyear spending cuts – leaving the construction of food banks dead in the water.

Only one year after it was created in fiscal 2017, the new Poverty Eradication & Social Welfare vote – under which the much-heralded food banks resorted – also had a zero capital projects budget.

In its first year in 2016/17, its original N\$40-m budget was slashed midyear by 99% to N\$520,000, affecting the construction of its only project – the Katutura Food Bank.

No more Gender Equality & Child Welfare

ECW (Vote 12) was also discontinued and merged with the new Vote 36 - Gender Equality, Poverty Eradication & Social Welfare in 2020/21.

But something perplexingly mysterious occurred in this vote's final year in 2019/20 for which the 2020/21 midyear budget reflected a mere N\$9.672-m revised expenditure in its last year of existence, compared to N\$77.8-m at the time of that year's midterm revisions – a N\$68.128-m discrepancy for which 2020/21's budget offered no explanation.

Vote 12 had started 2019/20 with N\$77.8-m to spend on eight development projects after its original allocation of N\$82-m was reduced by N\$4.2-m or 5.12% midyear, its 16.87% share of the N\$486.4-m cluster total at the beginning of the year ballooning to 28% of the low-ered N\$276-m cluster total – due to the drastic reduction in the Health & Social Services Vote at the time.

Its original N\$82-m allocation in 2020/21 was a massive N\$74.5-m or 993% more than 2019/20's N\$7.5-m, when Gender Equality & Child Welfare had only N\$7.5-m to spend on five projects.

This was reduced midyear by N\$2.15-m or 28.7% to N\$5.35-m

GECW's biggest project in 2019/20 was N\$57.4-m voted at the beginning of the year for the construction of early childhood development centres - one of its two new projects. These ECD projects obviously did not materialize, given the disappearance of N\$68-m from its budget that left only N\$9.67-m.

Gender Equality, Poverty Eradication & Social Welfare's 2022/23 projects

f the new Vote 36's seven projects in 2022/23 (ten in each of the previous two years), the biggest is N\$6.25-m for the construction of the Keetmanshoop community empowerment centre (N\$8.2-m last year).

This was also its biggest project in 2020/21, when the N\$8.22-m had also been allocated.

The Keetmanshoop community centre project totaled N\$86.8-m that year - the last time project totals were disclosed

Its biggest project total in 2021-22 the last time project totals were disclosed - was a whopping N\$651.747-m for the renovation of an after-school centre in Khomasdal, for which only N\$1.5-m was voted - down to a mere N\$200,000 this year (N\$353,000 in 2021/22).

Its second-biggest project total was N\$138.77-m in 2020/21 - for the construction and renovation of regional and constituency offices, for which N\$4.227 m was voted. N\$3-m (N\$2.5-m last year) has been voted in 2022/23 for what is its second-biggest project.

None of Vote 36's other projects have been allocated more than N\$500,000 in 2022/23. Compared to none this year, one

of Vote 36's ten projects in 2021/22 was new - N\$1-m for the construction of the Khomas Community Empowerment Centre. In 2020/21 Vote 36 also had one

new project - N\$12.9-m for the renovation and upgrading of Farm Kaukurus No. 79, Unit B, for which N\$2.66-m was voted, with N\$2.3-m last year.

The farm was "donated" to the new vote by the Ministry of Land Reform to provide "accommodation, agricultural and vocational skills development for street children". N\$400,000 has been voted for this project in 2022/23.

Its initial N\$8.757-m in 2021/22 had been a whopping 250% or N\$6.257-m increase over 2020/21's revised N\$2.5m, accounting for only 0.9% of the N\$266.6-m cluster total.

Its N\$8-m voted at the beginning of 2020/21 for the same two projects was slashed by N\$5.5-m or 68.75% midyear to N\$2.5-m

Labour, Industrial Relations & Employment Creation had N\$10-m to spend on two projects – both ongoing at the beginning of 2019/20, accounting for 0.36% of the N\$2.8-b cluster total, before it was reduced by N\$4-m or 40% to N\$6-m midyear, accounting for 0.26% of the lowered N\$2.3-b cluster total.

In 2018/19, Vote 14 also had two In 2016/19, vote 14 also had two (ongoing) development projects for which N\$8.715-m was voted at the beginning of the year, which was reduced by half – N\$4.356-m – midyear, with both projects scaled back.

Vote 14's two projects in 2022/23 are the same as last year (see detailed listing below).

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NOTES TO THE STATE
PROCUREMENT BUDGET
This scoping of what we call government's 'procurement budget' as part of the overall budget is unique to the Tender Bulletin, has been undertaken for most financial years since 1993 and is unreplicated in Namibia. Its purpose is to alert tenderers to forthcoming procurement opportunities.
Procurement spending relates to heads of expenditure normally directed through public procurement channels (with abbreviations):

* Materials and Supplies (M&S): Expenditure relating to the acquisition of store items of consumable nature to be utilized in the process of government services/operations, such as provisions, spares, stationery and other materials.

* Other goods, services and expenses (OSE): Generally relating to recurrent spending on items sourced in the real economy, i.e. excluding remuneration, other conditions service relating to the public service, transport provided by the government garage, utilities, property rental etc. OSE consists of consultancy services unrelated to construction as well as non-consultancy services such as advertising, catering, cleaning, entertainment, event management, gifts, legal, printing, security, travel, training services etc.
These two spending heads are form part of government's current expenditure in the operational budget as well as in the development budget.

Other procurement spending components occurring both as capital expenditure in the operational budget as well as in the development

ment budget.

Other procurement spending components occurring both as capital expenditure in the operational budget (i.e. not current expenditure) and also in the development budget are:

* furniture and office equipment (FOE)

* operational equipment, machinery and plant (OEMP);

* vehicles (V).

Procurement components occurring only

Procurement components occurring only within the development budget are:
* construction, renovations and improve-

ment (CRI);

* feasibility studies, design and supervision

Maintenance expenses consists of expenditure relating to maintaining capital assets, including office and operational equipment, buildings, roads and bridges, and other capital assets

Although annual and multi-year tenders are issued in this area (e.g. minor capital works, water infrastructure, vehicle, plant, electrical and electronic maintenance), we deliberately exclude it from our analysis to err on the safe side, since some of this maintenance is sourced internally within certain government ministries (e.g. the departments of works and of water affairs).

Although our coverage of the development budget overlaps with some of the operational budget, a project-by-project presentation of the development budget concretizes tendering opportunities more specifically with reference to actual project implementation and is presented separately from the estimates of operational expenditure.

President Hage Geingob felt the need to explain that due to the separation of powers he is not in a position to instruct the health minister to cancel the clinical tender, contrary to his cancellation of the N\$7-billion HKI Airport tender awarded to Anhui Foreign Economic Construction Group in 2015, which happened before the Public Procure-

ment Act came into force.
Only the CPB had the statutory power to evaluate and award bids or cancel the procurement process, he said, while expressing concern over what appeared to be serious allegations of dereliction of duty and lack of due diligence on the part of the CPB.

Geingob said in a statement he expected "consequences of law to take place" in the case of discovery of corruption or collusion in the tender process.

Ninety offers from N\$58,656 up to N\$3,333,533,795

Tender G/OAB/CPBN-02/2022 for the supply and delivery of clinical products for the MHSS closed on 14-Jul-22 with 90 offers, only half of which appeared to be from appropriately

appeared to be from appropriately specialized vendors.

The names of all tenderers and total prices ranging from N\$58,605 to N\$3,333,533,795 were published in Bulletin 1461.

The tender was reserved for entities incorporated in Namibia with no less than 51% equity owned by Namib-ian citizens of which no less than 30% is owned by previously disadvantaged persons in line with provisions in the Public Procurement Act 15 of 2015.

This Open Advertised Bidding tender was advertised only in The Namibian of 29-Apr-22 with a closing date of 15-Jun-22, which was then extended by a month.

Six months after closing, the award of the tender was made public after the first recommendations were rejected in October last year.

According to the executive summary of the bid evaluation report for this tender posted on the CPB website six months later on 11-Jan-23, the CPB's cost estimate for this tender was N\$400,000,000 including VAT.

This cost estimate is inconsistent with the total award amount of N\$1.58billion all for 421 items.

The recommendations of the Bid Evaluation Committee (BEC) for the clinical products tender were approved by the CPB on 06-Dec-22. But, prior to that, on 27-Oct-22, the first request for approval of the BEC recommendations had been declined, according to a notice under Board Decisions posted on the CPB website

Of the 90 bids received, 52 companies were disqualified for various reasons.

The 158 page 'Bid Evaluation Report' reveals details on the bids received with pricing for all 429 items [incorrectly quoted by health minister

Shangula as 492].

This is the first such detailed disclosure on medical supply tenders the Tender Bulletin is aware of over the past 31 years.

According to the award notice, a total of 421 items were awarded but according to the Bid Evaluation Report there should be a total of 429 items.

The successful bidders include many general traders and investment entities, as well as an immigration consultant.

The accompanying table shows all 38 successful bidders with the number of items awarded to each - only adding up to 421 our of 429 items.

Amnics Trading

the main beneficiary despite inflated prices

The biggest beneficiary of this tender by far is Amnics Trading with a contract value of N\$652,961,869 over

two years.
The *Bulletin* noted all the items that were awarded to this company or where Amnics was short-listed as alternative for the award of certain items

Interestingly, the CPB BEC found a conflict of interest between Amnics Trading and Facai Investment on five items, which made Amnics "not eligible" for the award despite being short-listed.
While the public outcry has focused

on seemingly unjustified awards of some items at overpriced amounts for condoms and surgical gloves to Amnics on the basis of its 'local manufacturing' preference, the *Bulletin* found several instances where this company was awarded other items on which it was not the lowest evaluated bidder.

In other cases, Amnics's price was higher than the successful bidder and the company was only recommended as alternative.

Local manufacturing favours only Amnics - at an extra cost of N\$327-m

Section 55(1) of the Public Procurement Act 15 of 2015 clearly states that public entities must award a procurement contract to the bidder with the lowest evaluated substantially responsive bid which meets the qualification

But 'Part 11 - Preferences' makes provision for local preferences i.a. for goods manufactured in Namibia.

The 'local manufacturer' argument was only used to recommend Amnics for syringes, some (but not all) Foley 2-way catheters, some thermoplastic transparent material and absorbent dressing pads - in all these cases the company's price was significantly higher than the next contender's.

But this was not consistent for the 'surgeons gloves' where the CPB only stated 'locally manufactured' in one case but Amnics was awarded six items of gloves at highly inflated prices.

Amnics Trading was recommended as successful bidder on 31 items for a total of value of N\$652,961,869.

According to information extracted from the 'Executive Summary', the CPB was quite happy to spend a whooping N\$327,111,466 more than the MHSS needed to pay by awarding 23 overpriced items to Amnics.

The accompanying table on page 8 shows all items awarded to Amnics, where this company's price was considerably more than that of the next contenders

A 'locally packaged in Namibia preference was used to recommend Amnics for the award of the condoms. In fact, on the two items of condoms awarded for N\$112,424,500, Amnics was the lowest bidder, justifying the award of latex condoms, as shown in the accompanying table.

From what we could see no other company was given preference for manufacturing or packaging locally, when it came to the awards. In most cases the lowest substantially responsive bidder was recommended

CPB tries to explain

During a hastily-convened press conference on 20-Jan-22 the Central Procurement Board asserted that it did not have the capacity to investigate whether companies who claimed to be local manufacturers indeed had local

manufacturing facilities.

Because of the number of bids received, it would be difficult for the CPB to verify the existence of pharmaceutical plants and validity of the obligatory documents for all bidders.

A certificate of registration as factory was issued to Amnics Trading on 20 July last year - a week after bids had closed. The certificate could therefore not have been part of Amnics Trading's bid submission.

Only if there were grounds for suspicion "we can investigate", CPB head Amon Ngaventene explained.

He also said that in terms of the

Public Procurement Act 15 of 2015, the Board "can award an advantage in terms of local manufacturing". Ngaven-tene confirmed that "some bidders" who were more expensive than others were allotted awards on the basis of being local manufacturers in terms of Section 28(2) and (2)(b) of the PPA.
On its CC2 form with BIPA, Amnics

Trading describes itself as a manufacturer and supplier of disposable hygiene and pharmaceutical goods. The CPB was given documentation that this bidder has a manufacturing plant and was therefore evaluated as

a local manufacturer.
The Bid Evaluation Committee evaluated all bidders' documents according to their documentation submitted to the CPB. Bidders were required to submit financial statements for the past two years, a requirement which all recom-mended bidders met. The documentation in the CPB's possession shows that Amnics had been in operation for more than two years.

The CPB admitted that there was a

discrepancy in the estimated required quantity of item number 270 (disposable surgeon's gloves), which stated 30 million in the bidding document, while the correct quantity was only three million.

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
GRN'S DOMESTIC DEBT UP 13.6% TO N\$104.4-B



Namibia's domestic govern-ment debt rose to N\$104.4-b during January – an increase of 1.2% from the previous month and 13.6% annualized, according

to the Bank of Namibia's latest monthly report.

The increase was reflected in the issuance of additional internal registered stock, which rose by 2.3% to N\$69.4-b, while treasury





bills declined by 0.8% to N\$35-b.

On an annual basis, the issuance of TBs and IRSs, increased by 10.3% and 15.4%, respectively

As percentage of GDP, domestic debt rose by 0.5 percentage point month-on-month and 3.5 percentage points annualized. The 53.2% ratio of debt to GDP

at the end of January reflects increased ratios of both IRSs and TBs to GDP of 2.9 percentage point and 0.6 percentage point, respectively.

"The rectification of these errors may result in the reduction of the current recommended amounts from hundreds of millions to tens of millions," according to a CPB statement dated 20-Jan-23. A revised notice for selection of the procurement award would be issued

in this regard.

The CPB also clarified the misconception that a condom would cost more than N\$100. The rates stated in the 'Notice for Selection of Procurement Award' was for a box containing 144 condoms. So if a bidder's unit rate was N\$100, this would translate to N\$0.69 per condom.

Ngavetene told the media that the CPB had received complaints and requests for reconsideration from 29 of the 90 bidders who had participated in the bidding process. The standstill period for raising objections was from 12 to 20 January.

The notice for selection of the

procurement award was thus not the final award and "may change upon the reconsideration of any issues that may be raised by bidders," the CPB statement said.

The CPB will respond to each reconsideration request and considering its merits based on the bidding document and applicable provisions of the law.

"Any bidder who remains aggrieved after the Board pronounces itself on the reconsideration applications, may approach the Review Panel for a review of the procurement process in terms of Section 59 of the PPA."

Bidders also have the option to ap-

oach the High Court for further relief if they are not satisfied with the Review Panel's decision.

Ngavetene is of the opinion that can-celing the controversial clinical tenders would result in higher costs for urgently needed medical equipment, because the health ministry would have to resort to Emergency Procurement.

The Bulletin is aware that the MHSS is already procuring most consumable items for state hospitals on an 'Emergency' or 'Request for Proposal' basis via its website.

108 million condoms awarded, but only 90 million needed

over two years

Health minister Dr Kalumbi Shangula said that the ministry cannot interfere with a tender handled by the CPB. But canceling it would have huge implica-tions on the health ministry's operations and its patients. He rejected accusations of insider trading and collusion in MHSS

procurement processes.

Most people do not understand how procurement works, the minister added. The ministry would identify their needs and then send the draft documentation to the Procurement Policy Unit at the

finance ministry.

The bidding document is then sent to the CPB, which advertises and receives the bids and decides on the award on behalf of the MHSS.

During a press conference on the status of HIV/AIDS, Health Director, Ben Nangombe, claimed that 726,000 men use 45 million government-issued condoms annually: 37.8 million are needed for the 52mm and 7.2 million for the 49mm size.

According to the CPB's bid evaluation report, 750,000 'packs' of condoms were awarded to Amnics. The rates stated in the 'Notice for Selection of Procurement Award' was for a 'box containing 144 condoms. This works out to 108 million condoms over two years - more than the 45 million said to be required annually.

Shapwa Kanyama took over Amnics Trading in December 2021

The Namibian businessman who owns Amnics Trading that was awarded 31 items of the controversial medical supply tender for N\$653-m is Shapwa Kanyama.

The company previously belonged to Dr Vikramkumar Naik, a Zimba-bwean-born pharmaceutical businessman who is a Namibian national, and a Taiwanese-born South Africa national,

Chun-Yen Wu.
The company was sold at the end 2021 to Kanyama but documents at BIPA still show the former owners as directors of the company. Naik distanced himself from the tender since he had sold his 50% shares in December 2021.

In the past, Kanyama has been fighting allegations of corruption relating to his company selling medical supplies to

the health ministry.
In July 2022 he filed a law suit against a nurse who had alleged that Kanyama - who celebrated a lavish wedding two months earlier - was committing financial crimes and unlawfully pocketing government money while public health facilities lacked basic sup-

plies due to a shortage of funds. In June last year, Kanyama was quoted by *Confidente*, rebuffing similar allegations and claiming that he had other income streams from various businesses, including construction.

Reporters who visited the Amnics

Trading medical manufacturing plant in Windhoek's Northern Industrial Area at 27 Birmingham Street found that there was very little going on. An undercover reporter from Cosmos Radio found boxes of condoms from India already marked "Namibian Ministry of Health & Social Services" ready for delivery as well as yellow household gloves but no sign of any manufacturing machinery.

According to newspaper reports, Amnics Trading has three employees registered with the Social Security Commission but Kanyama claimed that he employs 50 workers on a permanent basis and runs at full capacity with 80

Factory registration a week after tender closed

Kanyama confirmed that a certificate of registration as factory was issued to Amnics Trading on 20-Jul-22 - less than three months after the tender was advertised and a week after bids had closed. The certificate from the Ministry of Labour, Industrial Relations & Employment Creation could not have been part of Amnics' bid submission.

The labour ministry's spokesperson, Maria Hedimbi, confirmed that the certificate was issued in terms of health and safety regulations after an inspection was done. The factory was then registered under the Labour Act of 2007 for the manufacturing of disposal hygiene and pharmaceutical goods. Kanyama is the son of medical

doctor Álughodi Paulus Kanyama and is said to be close to the South Africa medical group Avacare Health Group, which owns Supra Health Care, which emerged as a favourite of Namibian health tenders in 2020.

Namibia at one point actually had a condom-manufacturing factory, which was commissioned by former health minister Libertina Amadhila in 2002.

Forty-five people were employed at the Commodity Exchange factory producing Smile and other condoms. Namibian entrepreneur Johny Maritz built the factory in partnership with the Global Fund.

The factory is now abandoned due to lack of support from the health ministry. At the time it was one only three condom manufacturing plants in Africa. All condoms produced by Commodity Exchange carried the SABS

quality seal.

The initial investment to set up the company was N\$150-m and the factory could produce 210,000 condoms a day. At the time, Kalumbi Shangula was the Permanent Secretary of the health ministry and congratulated the investors.
