Millets are the Superfoods

Millets, the simple grasses always faced the stigma of being called poor man's food were the first crops to be domesticated when humans decided to leave their huntergatherer lifestyle. The archaeological evidence shows that small millets like finger millet, Kodo millet, foxtail millet, little millet, and barnyard millet played a major role in early farming. These small grasses are rich in dietary energy, vitamins, and minerals (especially micronutrients such as iron, calcium, and zinc). Due to its rich antioxidant properties, millets help against several chronic diseases like ischemic strokes, cardiovascular diseases, cancers, obesity, and Type II diabetes and are called "Nutri-cereals".

"International Year of Millets (IYOM)-2023"


At the suggestion of the Government of India, The United Nations has designated 2023 as the 'International Year of Millets'. Considering the unique opportunities afforded by millets, Food and Agriculture Organization has pledged to serve as the technical lead to support the organization and celebration the same. The International Year aims to (i) elevate awareness of the contribution of millets for food security and nutrition (ii) inspire stakeholders on improving sustainable production and quality of millets, and (iii) draw focus for enhanced investment in research and development and extension services to achieve the other two aims. "The year will promote the diversity, ecological benefits, and nutritional value of millets to producers, value chain actors, and consumers and encourage decision-makers in order to improve agrifood systems.

- Millets market is set to grow from its current market value of more than USD 9 billion to over USD 12 billion by 2025
