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
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THE BIGGEST, 12.75% INCREASE TO N\$882-M OF ALL SECTORS IN ITS 2023/24 MIDYEAR DEVELOPMENT BUDGET, THIS HARDLY COMPENSATES FOR ITS GROSS UNDER-FUNDING OVER PAST YEARS AND STILL FALLS DISMALLY SHORT OF THE COUNTRY'S N\$5-B BACKLOG ON NEW PUBLIC SCHOOLS THAT WILL TAKE DECADES TO CLEAR - PAGE 2

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The social sector's 8.96% midyear increase includes a 3.78% or N\$12.2-m cutback in the health and welfare's development budget from N\$322.5-m at the beginning of 2023/24 to N\$310.3-m.

A lthough the education cluster gained the most in the Namibian central government's 2023/24 midyear development budget reallocations of all sectors, this hardly compensates for its gross under-budgeting over past years and still falls dismally short of the country's N\$5-b backlog on new public schools that will take decades to clear.

The education cluster as a whole received a 12.75% or N\$99.67-m increase to N\$881.67-m from its N\$372-m allocation for 42 projects at the beginning of the year. In the process, its share of the N\$6.487-b midyear development budget rose to 13.6% from 12% of the N\$6.5-b invested in capital projects at the beginning of the year.

But this applies to all three of the cluster's ministries – not only the ministry of education responsible for providing classrooms to the growing number of

The security cluster was the only other to have its development budget increased midyear – by a marginal 0.13% compared to the education cluster's 12.75%. The remaining three clusters all had their development budgets cut in October's midyear revisions.

Following 2023/24's midyear development budget revisions, the social sector also overtook the security and administrative clusters in their respective shares of the total compared to this year's original allocations as well as last year's revised share of expenditure on development projects.

development projects.

After 2023/24's midyear revisions, the social sector – consisting of the education, health and welfare clusters – had its development budget increased by 8.96% or N\$87.466-m to N\$1.2-b, while the administrative and security clusters had their budgets reduced by 19.12% or N\$71.7-m to N\$1.07-b.

As a result, the social sector's share of the development budget rose from 16.97% of N\$6.5-b to 18.37% of N\$6.486-b, while the administrative and security clusters' combined share fell from 17.6% to 16.5%.

These latest comparative shares are a sharp reversal on 2022/23's revised development expenditure when the social sector's N\$626-m amounted to only 11.46% of the N\$5.46-b total

compared to the administrative and security clusters' combined N\$841.2-m accounting for 15.4%.

The midyear development budget and the education cluster

Although finance minister lipumbu Shiimi said in his midyear budget speech development expenditure had remained a constant N\$6.5-b, this is strictly speaking not the case (*Bulletin 1520*).

According to the budget book, development expenditure was decreased from N\$6.507-b voted at the beginning of 2023/24 to N\$6.487-b – a difference of N\$20.067-m or 0.3% that was diverted into the operational budget.

Shiimi also tried to justify the stalled Independence Stadium renovations by the Ministry of Youth, Sport & National Service in the educational cluster, insisting that N\$50-m had been voted in 2022/23 for upgrading and renovation of the Independence Stadium in order to meet the requirements for hosting international [football] fixtures – without mentioning that the ministry had its N\$66-m development budget for 2022/23 slashed midyear by N\$43-m or 65% to only N\$23-m – seriously jeopardising its rehabilitation of the stadium, for which it had been allocated N\$50-m initially

The N\$37.5-m budgeted for the Independence Stadium in the 2023/24 development budget currently under implementation is even less than last year's already inadequate N\$50-m before it was slashed midwed.

before it was slashed midyear.
 Of the N\$167.3-m reallocated to the development budget midyear in 2023/24:

* Defence received N\$12.8-m to cover the retention fee for the Karibib Air Force Base, rehabilitation of old bases, upgrade of sewer pump at Mpacha Airport as well as the Cassinga project. [Whatever project this refers to, it is not on this year's development budget.]

* Education, Arts & Culture received N\$129.7m for upgrading of basic education facilities.

Comparing the administrative, security, education, health and welfare clusters after midyear 2023/24

The class(nessness)

But this most recent improvement of the social sector's relative share of the development budget conceals important changes upon closer examination.

For a start, the social sector's 8.96% increase includes a 3.78% or N\$12.2-m cutback in the health and welfare's development budget from N\$322.5-m at the beginning of 2023/24 to N\$310.3-m after midyear, while the education cluster's allocation increased by 12.75% or N\$99.67-m from N\$782-m at the beginning of 2023/24 to N\$881.67-m after midyear.

In the case of the other two votes, the security cluster's N\$972,000 or 0.13% marginal gain to N\$767.57-m was accompanied by a 19.25% or N\$72.7-m cutback in the administrative cluster from N\$377.7-m at the beginning of 2023/24 to N\$305-m.

However, this punishing midyear reduction for the administrative cluster was preceded by a whopping 135% or N\$217-m increase to N\$377.7-m over 2022/23's revised N\$160.7-m development expenditure – the biggest increase by far of the five clusters, followed by the education cluster's 90.7% or N\$372-m increase from last year's revised N\$410-m expenditure to N\$782-m at the beginning of 2023/24.

Comparing the administrative, security, education, health and welfare clusters after midyear 2022/23

ewind to 2022/23 – 'Uneducated capital gain for state security apparatus' (Bulletin 1474), the education cluster's good fortune in 2023/24's reallocations should be viewed against its misfortune last year when N\$33-m was cut midyear from the education cluster midyear in 2022/23, while an identical amount was allocated to the security apparatus for additional expenditure on capital projects.

This N\$33-m midyear gain in the

This N\$33-m midyear gain in the security cluster's development budget elevated its share to N\$680.5-m or 12.4% share of the N\$5.495-b total that was 1% more than the entire social sector's N\$626-m or 11.4% share of the post-midyear total.

This was a reversal from the beginning of the year, when the social sector

(education, health and welfare) enjoyed a 13.2% share with N\$659-m of the N\$5b initial development budget, compared to the security cluster's N\$647.5-m or 12 96%

The security cluster's N\$33-m additional development ceiling at midyear in 2022/23 was 5.1% more than the N\$647.5-m with which it started the year, while the social sector's allocation for capital projects was reduced by N\$33-m or 7.45% to N\$626-m – 8% less than the security cluster's N\$680.5-m after midyear compared to the beginning of the year, when the social sector's N\$659-m was 1.75% more than the security cluster's N\$647.5-m.

The security cluster retained its second-highest ranking among five clusters in the development budget after midyear in 2022/23, following the receipt of the third-biggest increase – trailing the economic cluster's top ranking in both cases, as was the case traditionally – until 2023/24's midyear, when it was overtaken by the education cluster to second place.

All of the social sector's N\$33-m

All of the social sector's N\$33-m midyear reduction in 2022/23 came from the education cluster, whose development ceiling shrank 7.45% from N\$443-m to N\$410-m, while the health and welfare cluster's N\$216-m allocation for capital projects remained unchanged.

As a result, the education cluster's share of the development budget dropped from 8.86% to 7.46%, while health and welfare's relative share of the total fell from 4.3% to 3.9%, despite not suffering any cutbacks.

This reversal between the security cluster in relation to the social sector was one of the outcomes of the 10% or N\$500-m increase in the national development budget to N\$5.5-b midyear in 2022/23, alongside generous additional operational spending increments.

The security cluster's N\$647.5-m

The security cluster's N\$647.5-m development ceiling at the beginning of 2022/23 was N\$87.7-m or just below 12% below the previous year's revised N\$735-m. This was almost double education's 6.77% reduction but one third of health and welfare's 34.5% reduction.

In contrast to security's 5% increase last midyear, education suffered a 7.45% cutback, while the health and welfare cluster's allocation was unaffected.

In 2022/23, the security cluster's revised N\$680.5-m development expenditure exceeded education's N\$410-m domestically-funded capital projects spending by N\$270.5-m or 66%

At the beginning of that year, the security cluster's N\$647.5-m exceeded education's N\$443-m by N\$204.5-m or a much lesser 46%.

Comparing clusters in the 2023/24

development budget

* In its traditional first place, the economic cluster has N\$4.222-b to spend on development projects after midyear 2023/24, accounting for 65.09% of the N\$6.486-b total following a marginal N\$35.8-m or 0.84% cutback on its N\$4.258-b at the beginning of the year when it accounted for 65.44% of the N\$6.5-b total, which had been a 6.64% or N\$264.97-m increase over 2022/23's N\$3.99-b development expenditure accounting for a much higher 73.3% of the N\$5.46-b total.

The economic cluster's domestically-funded development budget in 2023/24 is augmented by N\$2.074-b in foreign loans outside the State Revenue Fund:

- * In third place, the security cluster has N\$767.57-m to spend on development projects after midyear 2023/24, accounting for 11.83% of the total following a 0.13% or N\$972,000 increase over its N\$766.6-m allocation at the beginning of the year accounting for 11.78%, which had been N\$86-m or 12.65% more than its N\$680.5-m revised expenditure last year accounting for a higher 12.46% of the total. All the security cluster's development budget is funded internally through the SRF.

* The health and welfare cluster has N\$310.297-m to spend on development projects after midyear 2023/24, accounting for 4.78% of the total in fourth place, following a N\$12.2-m or 3.78% cutback on its N\$322.5-m ceiling at the beginning of the year accounting for 4.96%, which had been a generous 49.3% or N\$106.5-m increase over last year's revised N\$216-m development expenditure accounting for a much lower 3.96% of the total.

All the health and welfare cluster's

development budget is funded domesti-cally through the SRF.

* Fifth and last, the administrative cluster has a development budget of N\$305-m after midyear 2023/24 accounting for 4.7% of the total - only marginally behind health and welfare marginally behind health and welfare – following a 19.25% or N\$72.7-m cutback on its N\$377.7-m allocation at the beginning of the year accounting for a much higher 5.8% of the total, following an enormous 135% or N\$216.98-m increase over its N\$160.716-m revised expenditure in 2022/23 accounting for a much lower 2.94% of the total.

Although it receives foreign loans for its operational expenditure, all the administrative cluster's development budget is funded domestically

Development in the education cluster

n second place, the education cluster's post-midvear N\$881.67-m development budget in 2023/24 accounts for

13.6% of the N\$6.486-b total following a N\$99.67-b or 12.75% increase – the biggest of all clusters – over its N\$782-m allocation at the beginning of the year, which had been a huge 90.7% or N\$372-m increase on last year's revised N\$410-m development expenditure accounting for a much lower 7.5% of the N\$5.46-b total.

The education cluster was the only one to suffer a midyear cutback in its development budget in 2022/23.

Its N\$443-m ceiling at the beginning of that year was reduced by N\$33-m or 7.45% to N\$410-m, its share of the total falling from 8.86% of N\$5-b, to 7.46% of N\$5.5-b - in third place behind security and the economic cluster in both cases

The educational cluster's N\$410-m revised development expenditure in 2022/23 (lower than its initial N\$443-m) turned out to be N\$52-m or 11.25% less than 2021/22's actual N\$462-m when it accounted for 9.85% of the N\$4.7-b actual development expenditure total.

The education cluster's lowered ceiling at the beginning of last year came alongside cross-the-board reductions for all except the economic cluster.

The education cluster's 2023/24 domestically-funded development budget is augmented by N\$291-m in foreign loans outside the State Revenue Fund (see details below).

Development expenditure in the education cluster historically

he education cluster's N\$462-m actual development expenditure in 2021/22 was N\$708-m or 60.5% less than its actual N\$1.17-b expenditure on capital projects in 2020/ 21, when it accounted for 19.47% of the N\$6-b overall development total.

The educational cluster's budget allocations have increased dramatically since, after years of serial neglect.

But there is still not a single new construction project on the education ministry's agenda, which remains largely directed at refurbishing dilapi-dated schools or continuing with ongoing projects, including the construction of new schools that had started in earlier years.

Already at the beginning of 2020/21 the education cluster's development budget was increased by 89.89% or N\$470.6-m to N\$994.2-m from 2019/20's N\$523.567-m, before being boosted by a further 19.56% or N\$194.5-m to N\$1.2-b in October's midyear revisions a combined increment of 109.45% or N\$665-m on 2019/20.

But this was undone in 2021/22, with the cluster's development ceiling almost 60% below the previous year, when its midyear boost in project funding for education infrastructure derived from the reallocation of N\$100-m from other votes was for the Covid-19 response programme at schools, together with N\$100-m redirected from the operational budget.

The never-ending backlog

Ithough the Ministry of Education, Arts & Culture's N\$706.67-m postmidyear development budget in 2023/24 is more than double last year's revised N\$300-m expenditure, it is a drop in the bucket, considering the ministry has a backlog of 4,479 classrooms that will cost an estimated N\$2.5-b to clear.

Confirming the 4,479 classroom backlog from a ministerial audit conducted last year, basic education minister Anna Nghipondoka told the National Assembly during the 2023/24 budget debate the ministry would build 510 classrooms as a matter of urgency this year to accommodate the mushrooming number of learners - in addition to 70 school ablution facilities.

Because of the urgency, these contracts would be allocated on publicto-public entity basis to expedite the procurement process.

In September last year the Construction Industries Federation lashed

out at the award of a contract to build classrooms and ablutions to the Na-mibian defence ministry's August 26 Construction Company with funds from the public purse.
The N\$255-m construction tender

excludes the private sector from participating as there was no public procurement process (Bulletin 1510).

Nghipondoka also reported that her ministry had completed three projects last year in addition to fiteen funded by the AfDB fall of which were for renovations and upgrades] (Namibian Sun, 29-Mar-23)

In February last year, basic education ministry executive director, Sanet Steenkamp, said 1,248 classroom were needed for the 2023 school year to accommodate 839,579 pupils, with 2,837 needed over the medium term - a lower figure than her minister's estimate.

Repeating earlier calls, she again called on the private sector to bail the ministry out of its classroom backlog (*The Namibian*, 17-Feb-23).

Detailing the findings of an infra-

structural audit conducted by the ministry, Nghipondoka told the National Assembly during the 2022/23 budget debate in March 2022, the ministry had constructed only 14 schools at a cost of N\$749-m between 2014 and 2021 and currently had 947 schools accommodating 822,574 learners.

Four major renovations completed between 2015 and 2021 had cost the ministry N\$368-m, as part of renovations to 552 schools nationwide, the minister said.

A ministerial report in July 2021 identified 251 ablution facilities needing renovation and 305 still to be built, while renovations and upgrading was underway at 78 schools.

The ministry's executive director, Sanet Steenkamp, had earlier said 98% of the MEAC's total budget was spent on operational expenditure, including salaries for 40.000 staff and N\$500m on hostels accommodating 65,000 learners (The Namibian 09-Mar-22; Die Republikein 07,08-Mar-22, Nambian Sun 07-Mar-22).

At the start of the 2023 school year, tents had to be erected at five schools in Kavango East to accommodate 1,090 learners who could not be accommodated in existing classrooms (The Namibian, 12-Jan-23)

A report by the auditor general in 2022 found serious dilapidation at government schools and hostels countrywide, where maintenance had not been done between 2017 and 2021. AG Junias Kandieke asked the education ministry to explain the deplorable condition of school and hostel facilities that often posed a threat to learners' health and safety (The Namibian, 20-Jul-22;

Die Republikein, 19-Jul-22).

The Communications Regulatory Authority of Namibia revealed in 2022 that of the 1,800 public schools in the country, only 500 have basic ICT and telecoms infrastructure installed.

The education ministry also revealed that about 614 schools or 32%, had no telecoms connectivity, 346 schools or 18% are without electricity and 250 or 13% are without proper sanitation.
In 2020, only 13,000 learners – less than 2% of the 804,000 total

in public and private schools had access to e-learning during the Covid-19 lockdown.

Of the education ministry's N\$43b budget over the past three years since 2020, only N\$815-m was for development projects (The Namibian, 20-Jul-22).

A decade - or more behind the curve

he MEAC's Steenkamp told a national conference on education in 2022 that the government should legislate a Corporate Social Investment Act targeting the private sector to contribute to public education, with ICT firms ensuring that government

schools have digital access.
Only 16% of the government's education budget provides for learning materials and infrastructure, only 3% is spent on pre-primary education, while 84% is spent on salaries (The Namibian,

09-Aug-22). At rate of the current N\$706.67-m development budget for the Education, Arts & Culture Vote, it will take at least three years to clear the N\$2.5-b backlog in classrooms - without taking into account maintenance on existing facilities or the installation of ICT and other services, which could double the time-lag to six years.

Already a decade ago, Namibia had a backlog of over fifty schools to add to its existing 1,600 public schools to accommodate a scholar population of over 600,000 (since growing to 822,574

at last count in 2022).
At an average of N\$80-m per school, according to the education ministry at the time, a conservatively estimated N\$5-b was therefore needed to be invested in new schools and classrooms.

And this is not counting the 3% growth in scholar numbers annually and the higher-than-inflation rate at which building costs are escalating (Bulletin 1330)

AfDB's N\$1-b ETQIP loan

African Development Bank loan outside the SRF is supplemented by a Namibian government contribution of N\$300-m.

The increasing role of this N\$1-b ETQIP loan to the education ministry was highlighted by 2018/19's midyear revisions when 18 of 20 school construction projects on its development programme were scaled back midyear by 85% to only N\$45-m - hot on the heels of the loan that includes eleven other school construction projects.

The AfDB loan covers the construction/upgrade of eleven schools, three vocational training centres and three educational institutions. Eight of these eleven school construction projects are in the 'four O' regions.

No new schools in eight years

This is the eighth consecutive year that there are no new projects for school construction on the Namibian central government's development budget: only additional classrooms at existing schools or renovations to old schools by the Ministry of Education, Arts & Culture.

Ministry of Education, Arts & Culture.
Vote 10's 22 projects under implementation in 2023/24 is the lowest ever, compared to 24 last year, 32 the previous year, 27 in 2020/21 and 39 in 2019/20

All but one of 2023/24's projects relate to ongoing construction, renovations and upgrades at basic educational institutions, compared to all but one of 24 last year and one of 2021/22's 32.

A small N\$52.087-m tranche from the AfDB's ETQIP loan being rolled out in 2023/24, compared to N\$250-m last year, which followed N\$350-m tranches in each of the previous two years and N\$283-m in 2019/20; but none of this is for new schools, however.

Only one of Vote 10's educational

Only one of Vote 10's educational facilities construction projects underway in 2023/24 involve new schools initiated in previous years, compared to two last year, and one in each of the previous two years), compared to 11 out of 2019/20's 31 projects.

In 2018/19, twenty of Vote 10's 33 projects involved construction, renovations and improvements at public schools and hostels, of which only five were at new institutions - all ongoing projects initiated previously, however.

Of the twenty school construction

Of the twenty school construction or upgrading projects, eighteen were scaled back midyear in 2018/19, of which only four were in the 'four O' regions.

This year's projects in the education cluster

The education cluster's three votes have 42 projects under implementation in 2023/24, more than last year's 39 but fewer than 2021/22 45, which had been a welcome increase on 38 projects in 2020/21, but significantly fewer than 2019/20's 47, compared to 41 in 2018/19, 29 or 71% of which were scaled back that midyear.

This was far short of 67 projects in 2017/18 and 87 in 2016/17 - of which 70 were either suspended completely or scaled back midyear in October 2016.

The number of projects scaled back midyear in 2019/20 and since remains undisclosed.

Only one of the education cluster's 38 projects under implementation in 2020/21 was new - upgrading and renovation of education infrastructure countrywide. No new projects have been initiated since

The education cluster consists of:

Education, Arts & Culture

n its traditional first place within the education cluster, Education, Arts & Culture (Vote 10) has N\$706.67-m to spend on 22 projects in 2023/24 – more than double its N\$300-m for 24 projects in 2022/23 (compared to N\$398.8-m on 32 projects in 2021/22), accounting for 80.15% of the N\$881.67-m cluster total after midyear, compared to 73.8% of the N\$782-m cluster total initially and 73.17% of last year's N\$410-m revised expenditure.

Vote 10's N\$706.67-m development budget after midyear 2023/24 is 22.47% or N\$129.67-m more than its N\$577-m at the beginning of the year and 92.33% or N\$277-m more than last year's N\$300-m revised expenditure, which was 24.78% or N\$98.8-m less than 2021/22's actual N\$98.8-m expenditure when it consumed 83.9% of N\$475-m, which, in turn had been a devastating N\$680.2-m or 63% reduction on 2020/21's actual N\$1.08-b expenditure when it accounted for 92% of the N\$1.17-b cluster total.

Vote 10's N\$402.8-m allocation at the beginning of 2021/22 was cut by N\$4-m midyear, while its N\$1.1-b actual development expenditure in 2020/21 followed a 22.35% or N\$200-m increase on its N\$895-m voted at the beginning

Nationally, Education, Arts & Culture's N\$706.67-m post-midyear development budget in 2023/24 accounts for 10.9% of the N\$6.486-b grand total, behind only the Transport Vote's 39.44% with N\$2.558-b.

At the beginning of the year, its N\$577-m development ceiling accounted for a lower 8.87% of the N\$6.5-b national total in third place behind Urban & Rural Development's 9.16% with N\$596-m and Transport's 39.3% with N\$2.558-b.

Its N\$300-m revised development expenditure in 2022/23 accounted for a lower 5.5% of N\$5.46-b nationally – in sixth place behind Transport's 50%, followed by Urban & Rural Development, Homes Affairs, Immigration, Safety & Security, the Water Vote and Agriculture & Land Reform which each accounted to above 6% of the total.

This was significantly below its N\$385.8-m actual expenditure in 2021/22 which equated to 8.22% of N\$4.7-b overall development expenditure - less than half 2020/21's 16% share when it spent N\$1.04-b as part of N\$6.456-b actual development expenditure - ranked third behind only Transport's 43.45% and Urban & Rural Development's 10.3%.

Vote 10's domestically-funded development budget in 2023/24 is augmented by a N\$52.087-m tranche of the N\$1-b AfDB ETQIP loan.

This is probably incorrectly reported as N\$250-m in the NPC's development budget book, although N\$250-m was voted last year and N\$350-m in 2021/22.

MEAC's biggest projects this year

of surprisingly and in a repeat of last year, Education, Arts & Culture's biggest project by far in 2023/24 is an unchanged N\$285-m for the renovation of dilapidated schools in all regions, funded by a N\$250-m tranche of the AfDB's ETQIP loan (same as last year) - all for construction, with the government contributing N\$35-m for furniture and office equipment (same as last year).

According to the National Planning Commission's highly suspect compilation of the development budget, nothing has been spent on this project since starting in 2019/20, except for 2022/23's voted N\$285-m, with no account given of the N\$350-m voted in 2021/22.

This was the MEAC's second-biggest project in 2020/21, when its biggest project was the Covid-19 response costing N\$600-m for upgrading and renovations to education infrastructure countrywide.

Vote 10's second-biggest project in 2023/24 is N\$213-m for the upgrade of basic education facilities – all funded domestically and implemented internally by the government (August 26 Construction without competitive bidding). Only N\$20-m was voted for this project last year, on which N\$510.6-m has been spent until 2021/22.

Education, Arts & Culture has a further two projects for which over N\$50-m has been voted in 2023/24:

* A puzzling N\$62-m for "Upgrading and renovation of education infrastructure - Covid-19 Response", which started in 2020/21 with N\$1.2-b budgeted, but of which nothing has been spent until 2021/22 – according to the NPC's inaccurate development budget.

* N\$53-m for building and maintenance of education facilities nationwide, which had been its third-biggest project last year, with N\$33.8-m voted now reported as only N\$28.7-m revised expenditure.

There are a further three projects on which over N\$20-m is being spent in 2023/24.

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Still, its N\$80.4-m actual expenditure in 2020/21 was almost quadruple 2019/20's actual N\$22.3-m for five projects.

Vote 32's biggest project by far in 2023/24 is N\$124-m for the construction of the satellite ground data receiving station and processing system in Windhoek that started in 2021/22, when N\$122,000 was purportedly spent, with N\$10-m voted last year, according to the NPC.

Two of its projects in 2023/24 are new, compared to none last year, two in 2021/22, none in 2020/21, one the previous year, none in 2018/19 and one n 2017/18 - which had been the first in

three years.
A further two of Vote 32's projects have over N\$50-m voted in 2023/24:

- * N\$66-m for the construction of the School of Medicine Phase 3 at UNAM's Hage Geingob Campus, Windhoek. 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NOTES TO THE STATE
PROCUREMENT BUDGET
This scoping of what we call government's 'procurement budget' as part of the overall budget is unique to the Tender Bulletin, has been undertaken for most financial years since 1993 and is unreplicated in Namibia. Its purpose is to alert tenderers to forthcoming procurement opportunities.

* operational equipment, machinery and plant

* operational equipment, machinery and plant (OEMP);
* vehicles (V).
Procurement components occurring only within the development budget are:
* construction, renovations and improve-

ment (CRI);
* feasibility studies, design and supervision

reasibility studies, design and supervision (FSDS).

Maintenance expenses consists of expenditure relating to maintaining capital assets, including office and operational equipment, buildings, roads and bridges, and other capital assets. Although annual and multi-year tenders are issued in this area (e.g. minor capital works, water infrastructure, vehicle, plant, electrical and electronic maintenance), we deliberately exclude it from our analysis to err on the safe side, since some of this maintenance is sourced internally within certain government ministries (e.g. the departments of works and of water affairs).

Although our coverage of the development budget overlaps with some of the operational budget, a project-by-project presentation of the development budget concretizes tendering opportunities more specifically with reference to actual project implementation and is presented separately from the estimates of operational expenditure.

The Ministry of Works & Transport confirmed that the government will purchase 32 new vehicles for the car pool for N\$25-m in 2023/24 despite the moratorium. Ministry spokesperson, Julias Ngweda, explained that when offices, ministries and agencies (OMAs) want to procure vehicles they need to seek permission or approval

Namibia's central government cabinet has approved a plan to buy 32

Ngweda could not say what cars the ministry would procure. Questions should be directed to the various OMAs running their own fleets, he said. For the 2022/23 financial year

government had budgeted N\$29.7-m for vehicles. This increased to N\$180m for the current financial year, with N\$184.2-m projected vehicle expenditure for 2024/25 and N\$195.7-m in 2025/26

According to The Brief, the govern-



ment plans to spend about N\$210-m on new vehicles to increase operational efficiencies (Mar-23).

In November last year, the government bought the Minister of International Relations & Cooperation and SWAPO presidential candidate, Netumbo Nandi-Ndaitwah, and Prime Minister Saara Kuugongelwa-Amadhila new vehicles worth N\$4-m – both reported as Toyota SUVs (The Namibian 23-Oct-23; The Namibian 06-Dec-23).

According to the Tender Bulletin database, the MWT has not issued a single public tender for new vehicles during 2023.

There is also no record on the procurement process followed for the two vehicles purchased for minister Nandi-Ndaitwah and PM Kuugongelwa-Amadhila.

The African Development Bank has awarded the contract for the construction of the Ohangwena II Wellfield Water Supply Schemes to controversial Chinese firm Unik Construction in December 2023 for N\$248.3-m – below the project's N\$289-m cost estimate.

According to the award notice posted on the AfDB's website in December 2023, the contract will be signed by the Namibian Water Corporation, the Ministry of Agriculture, Water & Land Reform, the AfDB and Unik Construction on 19 January.

The contract amount for tender W/

OIB/NW-002/2024 is N\$248,327,381.87, with 66.71% or N\$165.670.000 financed through an AfDB loan for capital works. The Namibian Government is liable for N\$82,657,381.87 for capital works and N\$37,249,107.28 for taxes on these

The contract period is 397 days (thirteen months) plus a Defects Liability Period of twelve months.

The Chinese contractor was listed with a Windhoek address in the award notice posted on the AfDB website. Unik's Namibian sub-contractor is Aqua

Services & Engineering (Pty) Ltd.
The Bid Evaluation Report was received by the AfDB on 09-Nov-23 and approved on 13-Nov-23 after two objections to the award were received and addressed, according to the 'Approval & Publication of Award of Contract' notice, which provided no further details on the objections.

The contract entails enhancing The contract entails enhancing water supply infrastructure, equipping boreholes, expanding a reverse osmosis plant, constructing brine disposal ponds, replacing and installing new pipelines, separating bulk and rural water supply lines, building elevated reservoirs and constructing concrete groundwater reservoirs.

The roject aims to meet the 2037 water demand and improve water supply reliability on the Omafo - Eenhana and Omakango - Onambutu - Eenhana Schemes, including Eenhana Town.

Nine offers from N\$233-m to N\$352-m

Under the headline 'Chinese tsunami drowns water projects' Tender Bulletin 1510 published the 27 bids from 16 Chinese and three South African contractors on three water infrastructure projects in northern Namibia financed through a N\$1.8-b AfDB loan - leaving local contractors high and dry.

Tender W/OIB/NW-002/2024 for the construction contract for the Ohangwena II Wellfield Water Supply Schemes, was one of the three projects, for which nine bids were received from ten Chinese contractors, offering between N\$233-m and N\$323-m. Bids had to be accompanied by a bid security of N\$8,000,000 in the form of an unconditional bank guarantee.

The outcome of the other two ten-

ders of even higher value have not been announced:

- W/OIB/NW-001/2024: Rundu Purification Plant - nine bids including eleven Chinese and two South African firms offering from

The stringent technical and financial criteria ruled out any participation by Namibian contractors, sparking protests from the Construction Industries Federation who at the time called for the cancellation of the tenders and their reissue in smaller lots

NamRA probes Unik and AfDB found

'corrupt practices'

Under the headline 'Taxing times China's Unik Construction', Tender for China's Unik Construction', Tender Bulletin 1521 reported that the Namibia Revenue Agency is in the process of auditing Unik Construction for possible

The finance manager of the Chinese company was arrested in November last year after allegedly buying a good standing tax certificate to obtain work permits for four Chinese staff members

involved in the N\$1-b SWAPO head of-fice construction project.

During the verification process, staff at the Ministry of Home Affairs & Immigration discovered that the good standing tax certificate was not on NamRA's system.

NamRA did not issue Unik with any tax certificates because the company was being audited. Unik is the beneficiary of many large Namibian government contracts, such as the highway between Swakopmund and Walvis Bay, rehabilitation of the Walvis Bay
- Kranzberg railway line and another
NamWater project for the replacement
of the Collector 1 - Schwarzekuppe -Swakopmund pipeline.

Unik has been accused of bribing procurement officials and unfair labour practices in the past and has also been implicated in scandals in other countries such as Botswana and Eswatini.

The AfDB itself found that Unik Construction Botswana had engaged in "corrupt practices' on a water project in Eswathini, but then lifted a 12-month debarment from 11-Oct-23 provided that the company enhances its anti-bribery and integrity compliance programme – clearing the way for its award of the Ohangwena II Wellfield tender to Unik.

A PERMANENT WATER SUPPLY FOR NORTHERN NAMIBIA

The Ohangwena II aquifer's estimated volume was quadrupled from 5-b to 20-b cubic metres - a potentially permanent water source for northern Namibia recharged from rainfall in southern Angola

According to a Guardian newspa-per report in 2017 updated in 2022, the German Federal Institute for Geosciences and Natural Resources (BGR) announced their discovery of the Ohangwena II aquifer in 2012, with an estimated volume of 5bn cubic metres equivalent to the current demand in the north of Namibia for 400 years.

According to the BGR's Martin Quinger that estimate has quadrupled to 20bn cubic metres, with the aquifer capable of naturally recharge from surface water from southern Angola, provided extraction rates remain tolerably low.

With careful husbandry, Ohangwena II could be a permanent drinking water reserve for northern Namibia.

The BGR is working in partnership with the Namibian ministry of agriculture, water and forestry and the water supplier NamWater to establish Ohang-

wena II as a working resource.

The team has drilled three boreholes

- costing €700,000 (£627,000) each - to deliver two water supply schemes, the design of which can be copied in other locations as funds for drilling become

The current scheme (in 2016) in Eenhana delivers 40 cubic metres of water

per hour for around 20 000 people with a potential to increase production to up to 120m³/h. In the Omundaunguilo constituency further north, a proposed wellfield capable of drawing 10 million cubic metres annually could serve rural communities with water so clean that it would fulfill the criteria required of European mineral water.

Quinger was leading a project to draw drinking water from Ohangwena II – an ancient aquifer under Namibian and Angolan soil that spans an area roughly 70km by 40km on the Namibian side of the border, 250m-350m deep.

The incidence of drought in northern Namibia appears to be increasing – but despite Namibians' demands for water security, the funding for the BGR's work to tap into Ohangwena II was drying up at the time.

"We are under time constraints," says Quinger. "This project is going to come to an end in September next year [2017], and before then we were hoping we could at least get a real large-scale extraction scheme on-track – to more or less back-up-supply the whole of central-northern Namibia. We need the initial project funds to do this, and at the moment these are not available.

"Namibia is in financial crisis, and a vicious circle of no funds for investment leading to no development is downgrading the economy.'

Drilling boreholes to tap into Ohangwena II is costly, but Quinger says the BGR's approach will be cheaper in the long-term than developing an equivalent supply from surface water. Natural hydraulic pressure causes the aquifer's water to rise to 10m-20m below the surface when a borehole breaches it, which means extraction by pump is energy- and cost-efficient.

the BGR's cooperation with the Namibian ministry wound down in 2016, work was underway on a sustainability focused infrastructure for future development of Ohangwena II.

He pointed out that this was

Namibia's first time managing a large-scale groundwater resource of this kind, prompting the development of a new groundwater database for the whole country, "to store monitoring data and observe the quality and quantity of the resource being used".

The Ministry of Justice has issued a massive tender to furnish the Master of the High Court in Windhoek only as a 'Request for Quotation' posted on its website. This high-value tender for 2,938 items should have been issued under Open Advertised Bidding and published in the local media, since RFQs are meant only for readily available goods valued up to N\$2-m, according to the Public Procurement Act.
Tender G/RFQ/16-72/2023/24 for

the supply, delivery and installation of furniture at the Master of the High Court was posted on the Ministry of Justice's website dated 06-Dec-23 - but was still not visible two days later on 08-Dec-23. It closes 15-Jan-24 and was listed in Tender Bulletin 1522.

The same reference was used for a tender for fingerprint scanners closing on the same day.

The furniture quotation is the re-

issue of tender G/RFQ/16-06/2023/24 that had closed on 25-Jul-23 after a short 15-day notice period.

The Justice Ministry's website carries a notice informing tenderers that this tender was cancelled on 29-Nov-23 because "it does not create or achieve the expected outcome". No bid opening record of the earlier tender is visible on the ministry's website.

Justice ministry issues another massive quotation for 2,938 items to refurnish the Master of the High Court in Windhoek after the tender from July 2023 did not "achieve the expected outcome"





Namibia's domestic government debt rose to N\$112.1-b during December, reflecting increases of 0.6% on the previous month and 8.4% year-on-year, according to the Bank of Namibia's lat-

est monthly report.
The rise was reflected in both Treasury Bills and Internal registered stock which rose by 1.0% and 0.4% respectively from the previous month to N\$38.0-b and N\$74.0-b.





The annualized increase reflected an increase in the issuance of both TBs and IRS, which rose by 8.3% and 8.5% respectively.

As percentage of GDP, domestic debt increased both on a monthly and yearly basis, at the end of December 2023 by 0.3 percentage point month-on-month and 1.2 percentage points an-nualized to 48.8%, reflecting increased ratios of both IRSs and TBs to GDP of 0.8 percentage points and 0.4 percentage point, respectively
