On June 28, 2023, the Ministry of Government Power. India. launched the Carbon Credit Trading Scheme 2023, aiming to enforce greenhouse gas emission reduction targets for entities. Subsequently, on December 19, 2023, the CCTS introduced an offset mechanism allowing non-obligated entities to register projects for greenhouse gas emission accounting, removal, or avoidance, thereby facilitating the acquisition of Carbon Credit Certificates.
