STATE BUDGET FOR NEW WHEELS GOES INTO OVERDRIVE

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Namibia's central government has raised its budget for new vehicles in 2024/25 by 7.6% to a ten-year high of N\$285.5-m, with the security cluster driving away with half, most of which goes to Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety & Security, followed by the defence ministry – neither of whom have issued any public tenders so far this year - while the Government Garage has been left high and dry for the eighth year running - page 2



With its biggest share of the budget, Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety & Security did not issue a single tender for new vehicles during the whole of calendar 2023 and none until the end of August 2024.

amibia's central government has raised its budget for new vehicles in 2024/25 by 7.6% to a ten-year high of N\$285.5-m, with the security cluster driving away with half, most of which goes to Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety & Security and the defence ministry - neither of whom have issued any public tenders to date - leaving the health, welfare, agriculture and water ministries to share most of the remaining half, with the Government Garage high and dry for the eighth year running.

The N\$285.5-m budget for new government vehicles, accounts for a little over 2% of all N\$13.4-b voted procurementexpenditurefollowingits N\$20.17-m increase over last year's N\$265.3-m revised spending after starting out with

only N\$210-m.
This year's N\$285.5-m budget for acquiring new vehicles comes at the end of a five-year moratorium announced in 2020 but is 71.45% off 2014/15's N\$1-b peak expenditure eleven years ago. This year's 7.6% increase in the budget for new wheels is a rather mild affair, however, compared to last year's massive 246% or N\$188.7-m increase over 2022/23's actual N\$76.6-m expenditure - before the five-year moratorium had quite ended

penditure - before the five-year moratorium had quite ended. Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety & Security accounted for almost half (47%) of last year's N\$265.3-m revised expenditure on acquiring new vehicles, spending N\$124.6-m, while in 2022/23, the MHAISS and the defence vote accounted for 63.5% of the N\$76.6-m total in actual expenditure, spending N\$48.63-m between them.

N\$48.63-m between them.

The increase in voted and revised expenditure for the acquisition of new vehicles this and last year lifted it to six out of seven procurement spending heads after languishing at the bottom of the government's procurement priorities over the previous five years, accounting for 2.13% of this year's

N\$13.4-b procurement total and 2.4% of last year's N\$11-b.

Already in 2022/23, the N\$76.6-m actual expenditure on new vehicles was more than that year's N\$54.5-m midyear revised allocation – both constituting an unprecedented 100% increase on the previous year's nil, after the N\$7-m initial allocation in 2021/22 was completely wiped out midyear.

Government wheels turn haphazardly

entral government's annual budgets and expenditure on vehicles is a rather haphazard affair, displaying wildly erratic fluctuations between allocated ceilings and eventual spending.

Its budget for the purchase of vehicles at the beginning of 2021/22 had been a ludicrous N\$500,000 - the second-lowest ever, after 2020/21's laughable N\$450,000, which was 92% below 2019/20's N\$6.4-m, when the police accounted for virtually all expenditure.

diture - without a single public tender.

Despite 2023/24's increase in the budget for new vehicles, it is also the eighth consecutive year that the Government Garage has not been allocated any funding for new vehicles, following 2016/17's unprecedented first zero expenditure recorded since independence.

Government Garages throughout the country are littered with wrecks, with a promised shakeup to reverse endemic corruption and graft by the end of 2020/21 having been delayed and only now beginning to bear fruit.

Already at an all-time low of a laughable N\$4.95-m at the time, the central government budget for new vehicles in 2020/21 was slashed by 91% midyear to a pitiful N\$450,000 – the lowest ever.

But due to a spending spree on new wheels by a number of ministries and central government offices – all without public tender – this has now transformed into N\$23.9-m actual expenditure for

State budget for new

2020/21 - a 273.5% increase on 2019/ 20's actual expenditure of N\$6.4-m.

And this all unfolded after then president Hage Geingob announced a five-year ban on the purchase of new vehicles in 2020.

The N\$200-m saving it was meant to achieve, was significantly eroded by 2020/21's N\$24-m actual expenditure, reversed in the following year's unprecedented nil spending, but sharply overturned by 2022/23's N\$76.6-m actual expenditure and last year's huge N\$265-m spending spree – far exceeding the N\$210-m budgeted for initially.

The N\$23.9-m actual expenditure in 2020/21 was 97.6% off the N\$1-b peak seven years earlier in 2014/15.

Prior to 2020/21's actual N\$23.9-m expenditure, that year's original N\$4.95-m budget was 2.44% below 2019/20's revised N\$5.074-m – less than half the N\$10-m originally voted at the beginning of that year (since reflected as N\$6.4-m actual expenditure for 2019/20).

Punctured vehicle budgets and expenditure

fter 2014/15's N\$1-b peak expenditure on new vehicles eleven years ago, 2016/17's N\$175-m actual spending had been the next highest until being overtaken 2023/24 and again this year, continuing the upward trend initiated with 2022/23's N\$54.5-m revised expenditure, which was slightly more than the N\$52-m initially budgeted in the wake of sharp declines over previous years.

The original N\$10-m budget for the

The original N\$10-m budget for the purchase of vehicles in 2019/20 - since reflected as only N\$6.4-m actual expenditure - was already 16% or N\$1.9-m less than 2018/19's N\$11.9-m with a 0.09% share of the N\$11.2-b procurement budget in 2019/20, compared to 2018/19's 0.12% share of the actual N\$10.1-b procurement spending total.

The N\$6.4-m actual expenditure on vehicles in 2019/20 constituted 0.68% of N\$9.36-b actual procurement expenditure.

In its heyday in 2014/15, government's all-time record actual expenditure on vehicles topped N\$1 billion - N\$1,033,418,506 to be precise (as reported in the 2016/17 budget.

Following generous budgetary expansions since independence, replenishing government's vehicle fleet has declined sharply since the 2014/15 bonanza.

In 2004/05, N\$68-m was spent on purchasing new motor vehicles, expanding to N\$427-m by 2012/13 and N\$469-m the following year before ballooning to just over N\$1-b in 2014/15.

The following year, in 2015/16, this was halved to N\$506-m, only to be reduced by a further 14% to N\$436-m in that year's midterm spending suspensions.

The budget for government's vehicle

The budget for government's vehicle fleet declined even further to N\$184-m in 2016/17 and was again reduced to N\$175-m expenditure, translating into a 60% reduction on fiscal 2016's N\$436-m.

Already prior to 2020/21's midyear cutbacks, vehicle purchases accounted for only 0.05% of that year's procurement budget, compared to 0.09% of 2019/20's original N\$11.2-b procurement expenditure, 0.12% in 2018/19, 0.45% in 2017/18 and 1% in 2016/17.

The N\$7-m revised expenditure on vehicles in 2021/22 constituted 0.07% of the N\$9.5-b revised procurement total but has since been reported as nil.

but has since been reported as nil.

In 2020/21, the N\$24-m actual expenditure on vehicles accounted for only 0.2% of the N\$11.15-b procurement total.

In 2019/20, the N\$6.4-m actual expenditure on new vehicles was 0.7% of the N\$9.4-b actual procurement expenditure.

In 2014/15, new vehicle purchases enjoyed a 7% share of all procurement spending, up from 5% in 2013/14, before falling to 3% in 2015/16

fore falling to 3% in 2015/16.

Compared to its last-placed ranking amongst procurement categories in 2020/21 and the previous three years, government vehicle purchases enjoyed

The procurement

budget in 2024/25 Ithough Namibia's central Agovernment has increased its procurement budget by 22% to a ten-year high of N\$13.5-b in 2024/25, this is the second consecutive year that the budget for construction – N\$3.2-b this year - is less than each of the allocations for materials and supplies as well as for other services and expenses, both of which are heads of current expenditure mainly in the operational

budget that do not add value.

Within this year's N\$13.495-b procurement budget spread across eight

heads of expenditure:

* N\$4.4-b has been voted for materials and supplies in 2024/25, accounting for the biggest, 32.8% of the total, fol-lowing a N\$722.55-m or 19.6% increase on last year's revised N\$3.68-b expenditure when it accounted for 33.27% of N\$11-b – also the biggest and ahead of construction's N\$2.24-b with only 20%, in third place.

- The N\$3.8-b set aside for other services and expenses accounts for 28% of the procurement total in second place and is 17% or N\$550.6-m more than last year's revised N\$3.25-b expenditure, when it accounted for 29.5% - also in second place and ahead of construction.
- The N\$3.2-b voted for construction, renovations and improvements accounts for only 23.7% of the procurement budget in third place amongst eight procurement heads of expenditure and has been surpasses in eight of the past twelve years, despite a 42.45% or N\$951.7-m increase over last year's N\$2.24-b when it accounted for only 20% N\$2.24-b when it accounted for only 20% of the N\$11-b total – its lowest share since 2013/14 and also in third place. This is also the second consecutive year that the budget for public works is less than that for the procurement of materials and supplies as well as for other services and expenses, both of which are heads of current expenditure that do not add value.
- In its usual fourth place, accounting for 7.77% of the procurement total, a little over N\$1.48-b has been voted for operational N\$1-b for the second consecutive year, following a 4.34% or N\$47.586-m reduction on last year's N\$1.1-b revised expenditure.
- A little below N\$500-m has been voted for Flassibility studies, design and supervision in its usual fifth place out of eight procurement hadas, accounting for 3.7% of the procurement budget - the highest FSDS budget since 2013/14, following a 34% or N\$126.6-m increase over last year's N\$373.3-m revised evenerables. revised expenditure.
- The budget for acquiring new vehicles has hit a multi-year high in 2024/25 with N\$285.5-m, accounting for a little over 2% of all voted procurement expenditure in sixth place following a 7.6% or N\$20.17-m increase over last year's N\$265.3-m revised spending.
- Again in seventh and second-last place, N\$197.7-m has been voted for furniture and N\$197.7-In has been voted for furniture and office equipment (including ICT) – the highest in the past eight years, accounting for 1.46% of the procurement total, following a N\$42.7-m or 27.5% increase over last year's revised N\$155-m expenditure.
- N\$68.265-m has been voted for the pur chase of buildings, accounting for 0.5% of the procurement total in its traditional of the procurement total in its traditional eighth and last place, following a colossal N\$64.265-m or 1,606% increase on last year's N\$4-m expenditure – double the N\$2m initially voted.

Obscure public procurement for new wheels

ith its lion's share of expenditure on new wheels this year and the previous two - 34.84%, 47% and 35.4% respectively, most of the Ministry of Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety & Security's spending is probably attributed to the Namibian Police where a shortage of vehicles has become a constant complaint about its inability to

But the MHAISS has a dismal track record on public procurement for new wheels - having issued not a single such tender during the whole of calendar 2023 and until this week in 2024 - out of only nine issued by all central government offices and ministries so far this year, six during the whole of 2023, compared to only two in 2022 and none whatsoever over the previ-

ous four years.

With the second-biggest allocation for new wheels this year and 2023/24, the Ministry of Defence & Veterans Af-fairs issued one tender for unspecified Toyota vehicles during the whole of 2023 and none to date this year.

New vehicle tenders in 2024

ntil mid-August in calendar 2024, central government ministries issued only nine tenders for the purchase of new vehicles, none of which were from Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety & Security with its 35% share or N\$99.5-m allocation and none by the defence ministry, with its 14.85% or N\$42.4-m allocation for 2024/24.

These nine public tenders for new vehicles by central government votes so far during calendar 2024 are:

- * Central Procurement Board on behalf of the Namibia Statistics Agency supply and deliver 47x vehicles; the National Planning Commission, under which the NSA resorts, has only N\$5-m in its budget, however.
- With a combined budget of N\$52-m under the Agriculture and Water votes, the Ministry of Agriculture Water & Land Reform issued three tenders - one for an unspecified number of unspecified vehicles, another for a 4-wheel quad bike and one for 2x tractors with 3-bar rippers.

With the second-biggest allocation for new wheels this year and 2023/24, the Ministry of Defence & Veterans Affairs issued one tender during the whole of 2023 and none to date this year.

- ing foreign loans, the MAWLR and Water Affairs issued a further four tenders one 1,500L water tanker diesel-driven; unspecified vehicles for Water Affairs; another un-
- The Ministry of Defence & Veterans Affairs issued one tender for an undisclosed number of "Toyota vehicles".
- With no allocation or revised expenditure, Fisheries & Marine Resources called for a custom designed flat deck trailer for the aquarium in Swakopmund.
- With N\$24-m revised spending, Health & Social Services issued one tender supply, repair and service 3x stackers for Central
- * With no initial budget but N\$2.5-m revised expenditure, the Ministry of Justice issued a tender for leasing an undisclosed number of vehicles over three years.
- * The Ministry of Mines & Energy also had no budget for new vehicles - only N\$300,000 revised spending - but issued a tender for the supply of 2x new 4x4 "double cabs of-froad" vehicles nevertheless.
- * The National Council, which had no budget for the purchase of vehicles, issued three tenders for hiring vehicles – without resorting to the Government Garage. The vehicles hired are for thirteen 4x4s for its Standing Committees on oversight tours and two luxury Toyota Fortuners for an overseas delegation.
- With no budget or revised spending for new vehicles, the Ministry of Education, Arts & Culture issued a tender for the supply and delivery of an unspecified number of

No vehicle tenders in 2021/22

ith 2021/22's N\$7-m revised expenditure on new vehicles (all for Health & Social Services) turning into nil actual expenditure, fivé other votes issued tenders for the purchase of new vehicles - none of which had any budget.

Three of the tenders involved foreign

Central government offices and ministries have issued only nine tenders for new wheels so far this year, six during the whole of 2023, compared to only two in 2022 and none whatsoever over the previous four years.

- * With no budget for new wheels at all, Fisheries & Marine Resources issued a tender for unspecified vehicles and accessories.
- * With N\$3.5-m in its budget, Finance & Public Enterprises issued one tender for five unspecified vehicles.
- * With no budget at all under the Transport Vote, the Ministry of Works & Transport issued two tenders for the Government Garage fleet – one for 30x new mid-size SUVs and another for 18x new SUVs.

New vehicle tenders in 2023

uring the whole of calendar 2023, central government ministries issued only twelve tenders for the purchase of new vehicles, none of which were from Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety & Security with its 47% share or N\$124.5-m revised expenditure and only one from the defence ministry with its 28% share or N\$28.85-m revised expenditure in 2023/24.

Of these twelve public tenders, seven were issued by the Ministry of Agriculture & Land Reform:

- Two tenders financed by the European Development Fund 2x 5-Ton 4x4 trucks and 2x pick-ups 4x4 single cab V6; 1x 5-ton 4x4 truck and 3x pick-up single cab 4x4 V6.
- * The MAWLR issued one tender financed by the AfDB for 15x 4WD single cabs and 3x 4WD double cabs.
- * With revised expenditure of N\$35-m exclud-

funding, ostensibly outside the State Revenue Fund, therefore not restricted by the budget:

- The Office of the President, together with the National Planning Commission and the Ministry of Agriculture & Land Reform issued a tender financed by the European Development Fund for the supply, delivery, maintenance and after-sales services of off-road passenger and livestock transport vehicles under the 11th EDF Support to the Livestock Sector in the Northern Communal Areas of Namibia Programme with an estimated total value of €1,335,000. This tender consisted of 11x 4x4 double cab off-road vehicles; 5x 30-ton trucks with trailers; 2x 5-ton 4x4 trucks / lorries and 4x 4x4 single-cab off-road vehicles.
- Assisted by Germany's KfW and the EU, the Ministry of Agriculture, Water & Land Reform
- issued a tender for unspecified vehicles.
 Although it had no budget for new vehicles in 2021/22, the Ministry of Fisheries & Marine Resources issued a tender for the supply and delivery of an undisclosed number of vehicles and accessories.

Vehicle tenders go off-road

ctual expenditure on the purchase of new vehicles in 2019/20 was N\$6.4-m - slightly over half the N\$10-m originally voted at the beginning of the year.

Almost all of the N\$6.4-m actual expenditure on new vehicles in 2019/20 -

Despite a 20% or N\$25-m reduction on last year's N\$124.6-m revised expenditure when it accounted for almost 47% of the N\$265.3-m total, Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety & Security has retained its first place with N\$99.476-m to spend on new wheels in 2024/25, accounting for the biggest 34.8% of the N\$285.5-m total N\$5.7-m - was spent by Safety & Security (Vote 6) – all without public tender. In 2020/21, the procurement of ve-

hicles was still offroad, when two votes with allocations for new vehicles did not issue any public tenders and four votes with no allocations, merrily issued tenders for new vehicles:

- Central Procurement Board an undisclosed number of motor vehicles, although the Finance Vote, under which the CPB resorts, had no allocation for vehicles at the time.

 Ministry of Fisheries & Marine Resources
- an undisclosed number or vehicles and accessories.
- Namibia Fish Consumption Promotion Trust - one 16-ton truck with a fitted freezer. The fisheries vote, under which the NFCPT re-
- sorts, had no funding for vehicles that year.

 procurement of vehicles and conversion into ambulances including medical equipment for a period of two years.

Vehicle procurement in the recent past

s we noted in 2019/20 (Bulletin 1341), all state vehicle purchase tenders over the previous two years were also issued below the public radar.

In 2019/20, central government entities issued hardly any public tenders for the purchase of vehicles – including the Ministry of Health & Social Services which had the entire N\$10-m to itself at the time (subsequently completely wiped out and to be rescued by the USA's benevolence. Five tenders were issued in 2018/19 for the purchase of vehicles by ministries who had **no** budget allocations whatsoever:

- The Ministry of Mines & Energy issued a tender for the "procurement of four vehicles for Diamond Affairs".
- * The Ministry of Urban & Rural Development issued a tender for the "commissioning, supply and delivery of rapid intervention fire fighting vehicles".
- * The Central Procurement Board (in the Ministry of Finance) issued a tender for the supply and delivery of two 4x4 double cab bakkies and one sedan"
- * The Ministry Agriculture, Water & Forestry issued two vehicle acquisition tenders under an AfDB loan (in addition to various tenders for tractors and agricultural plant under the same loan).

Yet, none of the three votes that had budget allocations in 2018/19 issued any public tenders for the purchase of vehicles:

- The Auditor General with N\$1.4-m;
- * Health & Social Services with N\$10-m (same
- as the following year);

 * Justice, with N\$500,000.

Vehicles in the development budget

Two of eleven votes have portions of their vehicle budgets channeled through the development budget in 2024/25, compared to two of eleven votes in 2023/24 and two out of five votes in 2022/23.

- The two votes in 2024/25 are:
 Agriculture & Land Reform with N\$20.5-m or 64% of its N\$31.9-m, compared to N\$10-m of its N\$15-m revised expenditure last year and all N\$19.656-m of its actual expenditure in 2022/23:
- the Water Vote with its entire N\$20-m allocation channeled through the development budget, the same amounts as last year's revised spending and all N\$3.5-m of its actual expenditure on new vehicles in 2022/23. Neither vote reflected any vehicle

expenditure in 2021/22

Distribution of the budget for vehicles in 2024/25



This was followed in October 2023 with the donation by the US Embassy of sixteen vehicles to the MHSS by the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), with funding from PEPFAR to improve the visitation by clinical mentors to visit clinics in all regions of Namibia.

At that stage, the USA had provided over US\$1.5-b over the previous 18 years towards Namibia's HIV and TB response (not all in vehicles).

And last month (Jul-24), the US Embassy donated a five-bed mobile ICU worth N\$20-m stocked with N\$600,000 medicines to the Walvis Bay State

Hospital.
These donations relate only to vehicles (https://na.usembassy.gov).

Water

Ater (Vote 38) has N\$20-m to spend on buying new vehicles in 2024/25, accounting for 7% of the total in fifth place, the same amount as last year's revised expenditure which accounted for 7.5% when it was ranked fourth.

This is the same as its initial budget in 2023/24 and was over 471% more than its actual N\$3.5-m spending the

than its actual N\$5.5-in spending the previous year – also in fourth place.

This was the same as its N\$3.5-in budget at the beginning of 2022/23.

All its expenditure on vehicles over these three years is classified as 'development'.

Vote 38 recorded no actual expenditure in 2021/22, after starting the year with a N\$500,000 allocation for new vehicles - comprising the entire budget at the time – all of which was also supposed to be channeled through the development budget.

Prior to that Water was part of the now discontinued Agriculture, Water & Forestry Vote.

That leaves ten votes with budgets for new vehicles in 2024/25:

- Environment, Forestry & Tourism (Vote 18) has N\$13-m to spend on vehicle purchases in 2024/25, accounting for 4.55% of the total, following no expenditure over the previous two years.
- Gender Equality, Poverty Eradication & Social Welfare (Vote 36) has N\$10-m accounting for 3.5%, following a N\$1-m or 11% increase over its N\$9-m revised expenditure in 2023/24 - the same as its initial allocation the first since its creation as a new vote
- * National Assembly (Vote 3) has N\$8.5-m accounting for 2.98%, following no expenditure the previous two years.
- Urban & Rural Development (Vote 17) has N\$8-m (2.8% of the total) following no expenditure over the previous two years.
- Information & Communication Technology (Vote 29)'s budget of N\$7-m accounts for 2.45% of the total following a N\$1-m or 16.67% increase over last year's revised 6-m spending – well above its N\$1-m allocation, with no expenditure in 2022/23. It was allocated N\$1.4-m last in 2016/17 but

Nothing was spent of its N\$1.362-m midyear revised allocation from N\$1.062-m at the beginning 2020/23 beginning 2022/23.
- Finance & Public Enterprises (Vote 9) has N\$3.5-m to spend on purchasing vehicles in 2024/25 accounting for 1.2% of the total – 16% more than its N\$3-m revised spending last year, following no expenditure in 2022/23.
- International Relations & Cooperation (Vote 7)'s N\$2.4-b budget for new vehicles in 2024/24 is 76% less than last year's revised N\$10-m, following no expenditure in 2022/23.
- The Anti Corruption Commission (Vote 30) has N\$2.3-m to spend on vehicles this year – 70% more than its N\$1.35-m revised spending in 2023/24, which was slightly more than its N\$1.2-m allocation and almost half its N\$2.5-m actual spending in 2022/23 – much more than its N\$800,000 midyear allocation after starting with nil.
- Sport, Youth & National Service (Vote 28) has the smallest, N\$2-m budget for vehicles in 2024/25 – the same as its revised expenditure last year - its first since spending N\$3.75-m in 2016/17.

Government Garage

his is the eighth consecutive year that the Government Garage has not been allocated any funding for new vehicle acquisitions, following 2016/17's unprecedented first zero budget since independence. Yet, as pointed out above, the

Transport Vote has somehow managed to issued two tenders until the end of August this year for the purchase of new vehicles for the GG fleet:

- * G/ONB/24-01/2023-24 for the supply and delivery of 30x new mid-size SUVs to the Government Garage fleet closed 17-Jan-
- G/ONB/24-01/2024-25 for the supply and de-livery of 18x new SUVs to the Government Garage fleet closed 02-Aug-24.
 Both open national bidding tenders

were advertised in local newspapers and not on the GRN eProcurement website where they should have been and no bid information of award details

were made public. It would seem that the funds for these tenders will once again be source from the Road Fund Administration, which has been providing vehicles to Nampol and the Windhoek City Police over the past few years - outside the

formal budget.
The GG resorts under Transport (Vote 24) and was owed N\$1.5-b by

other ministries and central government institutions for vehicle leasing fees over the previous five years, it was reported in August 2022.

The central government fleet consists of an estimated 3,300 vehicles (New Era, 30-Aug-22). In 2015/16, the GG spent N\$10-m

less than its initial N\$45-m allocation.

Most recently, the Auditor General found that the National Assembly owed the Government Garage an accumulated N\$21.3-m in 2021/22 for maintenance on vehicles allocated to it (Namibian Sun; Republikein, 04-Jul-23).

The GG's original budget for new vehicles – which it leases out to other ministries – was dramatically slashed in 2015/16 by 87% from 2014/15's N\$345.3-m, when it accounted for one third of the N\$1-b budget for new vehicles – the biggest share ahead of Police, with N\$277.6-m and Health & Social Services, with N\$50-m that

In 2015/16 the Transport Vote lost its top spot from the previous two years, with only N\$45-m to spend on acquiring new vehicles - an 87% reduction on 2014/15's N\$345-m, when it enjoyed a third of the total vehicle purchasing budget – a 90% increase on fiscal 2014.
The Transport Vote ranked third in

2015/16, compared to the previous year, when its N\$182-m constituted 39% of the central government's budget for vehicle purchases in first place

LUCKY CHINA RAILWAY LANDS N%138-M ROAD CONTRACT

The Ministry of Works & Transport has awarded a N\$138-m contract to China Railway Seventh Group to upgrade Auas Road in Windhoek, linking the newly renamed Dr Hage Geingob Freeway to the Hosea Kutako International Airport - without issuing a tender for the project that is not listed on its annual procurement plan and therefore not budgeted for.

According to media reports, a groundbreaking ceremony took place in July when the Minister of Works & Transport John Mutorwa, announced that the project will be undertaken in two phases.

N\$30-m was allocated for Phase 1, which has already commenced and should be completed within nine months. Phase 1 consists of clearing and de-bushing, storm water and other drainage structures, small bridges and ancillary road works.

The second phase is scheduled to begin early in the 2025/26 financial year at a cost of N\$108-m, with completion scheduled within twelve months.

Mutorwa explained that the presence of China Railway Seventh Group - "currently undertaking another construction project in Windhoek" - would save government an estimated N\$28-m due to reduced site establishment and material costs for gravel.

Lithon Project consultants are

providing advice throughout the project, while the Roads Authority of Namibia will oversee the entire management process, the minister said.

According to Mutorwa, a portion of

The Ministry of Works & Transport has awarded a NS138-m contact to China Railway 7th Group to upgrade Auas Road in Windhoek which will link it to the airport highway currently under construction.

The award came out of the blue and without public tender or budget in the ministry's 2024/25 procurement plan, raising the value of the charmed Chinese firm's work to N\$1.087-b when combined with its existing contract for Phase 1 of airport highway

the road from Hosea Kutako Drive up to Blackwood Street will also be expanded to accommodate three lanes in each direction to cater for ever-increasing traffic volumes.

Also speaking at the groundbreak ing ceremony was CEO of the Road Fund Administration, Ali Ipinge, who said rehabilitation and upgrading were "part of the package". Small businesses, especially the wood vendors at the end of Auas Road would be accommodated with a small market, he added (The Brief 26-Jul-24)

The N\$138-m Auas Road upgrade is not listed in the 2024/25 procurement plans of the MWT or the RFA.

China Railway working on the N\$949-m Phase I of the Windhoek - HKIA highway since 2016

China Railway 7th was awarded Phase 1 of the Windhoek - Hosea Phase 1 of the Windhoek - Hosea Kutako International Airport dual carriageway project under tender RA/DC-CR/06-2014 in 2015. Phase 1A of the project, fully funded by the Namibian government, commenced in Janu-ary 2016 and was estimated to cost N\$922-m.

The tender was for a 8.2km stretch from Main Road 49 at UNAM to the Sam Nujoma Drive extension and was awarded to China Railway in joint venture with Onamagongwa Trading for N\$799-m. Phase 1A was supposed to be completed by Jan-18 but was extended by 3km in 2019 at an additional N\$150-m.

Phase 1A includes 15km ramp roads, four interchanges and thirteen new bridges

In Feb-21, the Roads Authority announced the partial opening to traffic of Phase 1 of the Windhoek-HKIA highway between Auas Road and Robert Mugabe Avenue (Tender Bulletin 1392,

16-Apr-21).
Phase 2A of the Windhoek - HKIA
project, 19.5km from Sam Nujoma Avenue close to Avis to the Dordabis intersection, is co-funded through an African Development Bank loan. It was awarded on 18-Dec-19 to China's AVIC awarded on 16-bec-19 to Clinia's AVIC International Project Engineering Com-pany for N\$949,992,389.10. Phase 2B, covering the remain-ing 23.5km (revised to 21.3km) from

the Dordabis interchange to the HKIA was funded through a grant from the

People's Republic of China and was awarded in November 2021 to another Chinese company, Zhong Mei Engineering Group for over N\$1.035-b - after a tender process behind closed doors

exclusively for Chinese contractors.

The latest award brings the total cost of the freeway to about N\$3-b - all sections of which will have been built by Chinese contractors (see report in Tender Bulletin 1424).

City of Windhoek announces road works
