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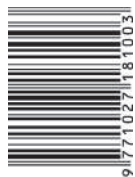
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Industry stranded at the roadside

DESPITE A 30% CUTBACK IN THE NAMIBIAN CENTRAL GOVERNMENT'S DEVELOPMENT BUDGET FOR ITS TRANSPORT AND INDUSTRIAL CLUSTER TO N\$4.4-B MIDYEAR IN 2024/25, TWO THIRDS IS BEING SPENT ON ROAD AND RAIL PROJECTS - LARGELY FOR THE EXPORT OF UNPROCESSED MINERALS - WITH MOST OF THE BIGGEST PROJECTS BEING IMPLEMENTED BY CHINESE CONTRACTORS, WHILE ONLY 1.36% IS BEING SPENT ON EXPANDING DOMESTIC INDUSTRIAL CAPACITY - PAGE 2

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Most of the N\$1.5-b midyear reduction in foreign development funding in 2024/25 came from the Transport Vote, which had N\$1.1-b or 60% cut from its initial N\$1.85-b allocations outside the State Revenue Fund at the beginning of the year.

Industry stranded

over its N\$310.3-m revised development expenditure last year when it accounted for 4.78% of the total which, although lower than this year, was marginally ahead of the administrative cluster's 4.7%.

Still, the health and welfare cluster* domestically funded development allocation in 2024/25 is only slightly more than half the security cluster's N\$867 and less than half the administrative cluster's N\$975-m.

But the cluster received a massive shot in the arm to its foreign development funding midyear in 2024/25, which increased by over 391% or N\$72.5-m to N\$91-m from N\$18.5-m in foreign grants outside the SRF, raising its overall total from N\$493.5-m to N\$562.3-m from N\$493.5-m, taking into account positive and negative midyear adjustments.

Foreign development funding

As noted in our review of the midyear budget (*Bulletin 1567*), when foreign loans and grants are included, the 18% reduction in the N\$12.6-b overall development budget to N\$10.35-b is far more severe than the 7.88% cutback in domestically funded capital projects from N\$9.47-b to N\$8.7-b.

On their own, foreign development loans and grants were slashed midyear by 48.4% or N\$1.5-b from N\$3.16-b to N\$1.6-b, composed of a N\$156-m or 21.4% reduction in foreign grant-funded development projects from N\$730-m to N\$574-m and a N\$1.375-b or 56.5% cutback in foreign development projects loans from N\$2.43-b to N\$1.06-b for the rest of the year.

The resulting 18% cutback in overall development expenditure inside and outside the State Revenue Fund contrasts with a 4.7% increase in operational spending for the rest of the year from N\$74.6-b to N\$78.156-b.

The severe midyear cutback in the uptake of foreign development loans for the remainder of 2024/25 also conveniently served to keep in check the government's spending on foreign interests payments for the rest of the year to avoid 2023/24's devastating midyear increase in the provision for servicing debt.

Foreign funded midyear project cutbacks in the transport and industrial cluster 2024/25

Most of the N\$1.5-b midyear reduction in foreign development funding in 2024/25 came from the Transport Vote, which had N\$1.1-b or 60% cut from its initial N\$1.85-b allocations outside the State Revenue Fund at the beginning of the year.

* Of the Transport (Vote 24)'s eleven externally funded projects active in 2024/25 for which N\$1.85-b had been voted at the beginning of 2024/25, three were unaffected, seven were cut back and one was increased midyear.

The bulk of Transport's cutbacks were on two rail projects, both financed through a N\$4.7-b AfDB loan package.

* Upgrading of Walvis Bay-Kranzberg Railway, for which N\$670-m was initially voted, was reduced by over N\$505-m or 75% to N\$164.54-m – according to the finance ministry's midyear budget.

But according to the National Planning Commission's development budget for this project, only N\$21.767-m was voted at the beginning of the year, all funded inside the State Revenue Fund, with no mention of the AfDB loan whatsoever.

* A new project in 2024/25, upgrading of Kranzberg-Otiwarongo Railway, for which N\$494.8-m had been voted at the beginning of 2024/25, was reduced by N\$487.26-m or 98.5% to only N\$7.55-m – according to the finance

ministry's midyear budget.

But according to the NPC's development budget for this project, N\$1.946-b was voted for the Kranzberg-Otiwarongo rail project in 2024/25 before midyear, consisting of N\$691.5-m inside the SRF plus N\$1.254-b from the AfDB.

The remaining five Transport projects – all for roadworks – were reduced by N\$120.6-m midyear.

Alongside these cutbacks to many of its foreign funded projects, Transport had N\$500,000 added to one project (see accompanying table).

In addition to Transport, other industrial cluster votes affected in their foreign funded development projects midyear in 2024/25 are:

- * Mines & Energy (Vote 15) - N\$32,000 culled from two grant funded projects; and
- * Industrialisation & Trade – N\$10,000 added to its N\$17.5-m grant on one project.

Counting projects in the economic cluster

The economic cluster's eight votes have an all-time high of 299 projects under implementation in 2024/25, compared to 266 last year, 244 in 2022/23, 248 in 2021/22, 254 in 2020/21 and 247 in 2018/19, 129 or 52% of which were cut back midyear – the last time that such midyear-affected projects were identified.

The *Tender Bulletin* groups the economic cluster into two sub-clusters:

- * industrial (transport, mining, energy and industrial) – 238 projects this year; and
- * the green/blue economy (agriculture, environment, land reform, water and fisheries) – 61 projects this year (reviewed last week in *Bulletin 1572*).

The industrial sub-cluster's 238 projects under implementation in 2024/25 (204 last year, 183 in 2022/23) constitute the bulk of the economic cluster's 299, compared to 187 projects in 2021/22 out of the economic sector's 248.

As usual, most economic cluster projects resort under Urban & Rural Development, with 149, compared to 137 last year, 138 in 2022/23 and 136 in 2021/22, although the Transport Vote's 52 projects under implementation in 2024/25 (37 last year, 25 in 2022/23 and 30 in 2021/22) account for most by far in terms of value.

We continue our procurement guide this week to the Namibian Government's 2024/25 national development expenditure estimates with a detailed examination of 89 projects under implementation in the transport and industrial sector this year – excluding the Urban & Rural Development Vote's 149 projects to be covered next week.

The industrial sub-cluster

In 2024/25, the industrial sub-cluster's N\$3.6-b domestically funded development budget after midyear makes up almost 71% of the economic cluster's N\$5.1-b after midyear, compared to last year when the former's N\$3.3-b revised expenditure accounted for 78.5% of the economic cluster's N\$4.2-b.

In terms of 2022/23's actual development expenditure inside the State Revenue Fund, the industrial sub-cluster's N\$2.95-b amounted to 83% of the economic cluster's N\$3.55-b as a whole.

In terms of 2021/22's actual expenditure, the industrial sub-cluster's N\$2.6-b accounted for 83% of the economic cluster's N\$3.15-b.

The industrial cluster's share has therefore declined from 83% in 2021/22 to only 71% this year – as the green economy's share rose, mainly as a result of higher expenditure on projects in the agriculture and water sectors.

Excluding the Urban & Rural Development Vote, the industrial cluster's 89 projects under implementation in 2024/25 is a significant increase on last year's 67, most of which is attributable a high number of new roads being built under the Transport vote.

Despite a 30% cutback in the Namibian central government's development budget for its transport and industrial cluster to N\$4.4-b midyear in 2024/25, two thirds is being spent on road and rail projects – largely for the export of unprocessed minerals – with most of the biggest projects being implemented by Chinese contractors, while only 1.36% is being on expanding domestic industrial capacity.

Including foreign loans, the N\$6.25-b development budget for the industrial and transport cluster was reduced by almost 30% or N\$1.85-b to N\$4.4-b midyear in 2024/25, most of it culled from the Transport Vote, whose N\$4.8-b ceiling at the beginning of the year was reduced by N\$1.85-b or over 38% to N\$2.94-b.

Including external funding, N\$4.1-b or 89.5% of the Transport Vote's N\$4.578-b development budget in 2024/25 before midyear is allocated for road and rail infrastructure, translating into over 65% of the transport and industrial cluster's N\$6.25-b.

Although still in its usual first place amongst five clusters, the economic sector had its domestically funded development budget reduced by the most – 12.7% or N\$742.658-m to N\$5.1-b midyear in 2024/25 from N\$5.85-b voted at the beginning of the year.

As a result, the economic cluster's share of the development budget declined from 61.77% to 58.5%.

Despite the N\$1.6-b or 38.5% increase in the economic cluster's domestically funded development budget at the start of 2024/25 over its revised expenditure last year, its 61.77% share at the start of 2024/25 was already lower than 2023/24's 65%, with N\$4.2-b out of the N\$6.487-b total.

Its revised expenditure last year was almost 19% or N\$672.45-m more than its N\$3.55-b actual expenditure in 2022/23 when it accounted for a much higher 72% share of the N\$3.55-b total.

The economic cluster had N\$2.85-b in foreign loans and grants (outside the State Revenue Fund) supplementing its N\$5.85-b domestically funded development budget (inside the SRF) at the start of 2024/25, resulting in a N\$8.7-b total overall.

But this foreign funding was reduced by N\$1.46-b or 49% midyear to N\$2.4-b, following severe cutbacks in development loans and grants on some major projects, alongside increases on others – but on a smaller scale.

Excluding foreign funding, in 2021/22, the economic cluster's actual expenditure of N\$3.15-b accounted for 67% of all N\$4.7-b development expenditure, which was higher than in 2020/21 when the economic cluster's N\$3.9-b actual expenditure accounted for 60.7% of all N\$6.456-b actual development expenditure.

Comparing clusters after the midyear development revisions

As noted in earlier installments of our procurement guide to the development budget, the Namibian government cut its development budget midyear in 2024/25 by 18% to N\$10.3-b from N\$12.6-b including foreign funded projects that were slashed by 60% to N\$1.362-b from N\$3.16-b at the beginning of the year.

On its own, the domestically funded development budget contracted by a lesser 7.88% or N\$746.36-m to N\$8.7-b from N\$9.47-b voted initially.

Only two of the five clusters had their development budgets revised after midyear 2024/25 – both downwards, affecting only the economic and health/welfare clusters.

The education cluster

In a repeat of last year, the education cluster enjoys the second-biggest share of 2024/25's domestically funded development budget, with N\$1.3-b – its first allocation above N\$1-b – accounting for 13.77% of the total at the beginning of the year and almost 15% after midyear, following a N\$422.3-m or 48% increase over its N\$881.67-m revised expenditure in 2023/24 when it accounted for 13.6% of the total.

Although its domestically funded development budget is unchanged after midyear 2024/25, the education cluster's share of the total rose to 14.95%.

But its N\$153-m foreign grant project funding was slashed by 71% or N\$108-m midyear and replaced with a N\$10.88-m midyear loan under the AfDB's Education and Training Quality Improvement Project (ETQIP), not provided for at the beginning of the year, resulting in a N\$98-m or 64% net reduction.

As a result, the educational cluster's overall development budget contracted by 7% to N\$1.36-b midyear in 2024/25 following the N\$98-m or 64% cutback in its foreign project funding.

The security cluster

Despite being unaffected by the midyear development budget revisions, the security cluster's N\$867-m development budget – all domestically funded – remains the third-biggest in 2024/25, with its share of slightly over 9% of the total at the beginning of the year increasing to almost 10% (9.94%) after midyear – almost double the health and welfare cluster's 5% and 5.4% before and after midyear.

The security cluster's development allocation at the beginning of this year followed a N\$99.4-m or almost 13% increase – the lowest of five clusters – over last year's N\$767.57-m revised expenditure on capital projects when it accounted for a higher 11.8% of the total – also in third place behind the education cluster and 2.5 times more than health/welfare's 4.78%. There is no foreign funding in the security cluster's development budget.

The administrative cluster

Also with no external funding in its development budget, the administrative cluster's N\$975-m allocation in 2024/25 was unchanged midyear, again accounting for the fourth-biggest share of 10.3% of the total out of five clusters before midyear and 11.2% after midyear – both more than double the health and welfare cluster's 5%.

Its ranking is a reversal of the two previous years when had the smallest allocation – trailing health and welfare.

The administrative cluster's 2024/25 development budget follows a very generous N\$670-m or 220% increase over last year's N\$305-m revised expenditure when it accounted for only 4.7% of the total – less than half this year's 10.3%.

Its 220% increase over last year's expenditure is by far the biggest of all five clusters.

Health and welfare cluster

With N\$475-m to spend on development projects at the beginning of 2024/25 and N\$471.3-m after midyear following a marginal N\$3.7-m reduction, the health and welfare once more has the smallest domestically funded development budget out of five clusters, accounting for 5% initially but a higher 5.4% of the total after midyear.

This is still a downgrade over the past two years when it ranked second-last – ahead of the administrative cluster.

This is despite a 53% or N\$164.7-m increase at the beginning of 2024/25

at the roadside

In 2022/23, there were only 45, 51 in 2021/22, 50 in 2020/21 and 54 in 2019/20 - significantly less than 2018/19's 75, 42 of which were scaled back midyear, when the cluster's budget for capital development projects was reduced by N\$750.5-m or 30.2% to N\$1.7-b midyear - above the overall national development budget's reduction of 24.5% or N\$1.8-b to N\$5.56-b.

This was the last time that midyear cutbacks to the development budget were disclosed under then finance minister Calle Schlettwein.

Transport within the industrial cluster

As a result of the midyear cutbacks to its N\$2.95-b domestically funded allocation in 2024/25, the Transport Vote's 67% share of the industrial economic cluster's N\$4.4-b at the beginning of the year fell to N\$2.2-b or 60% of N\$3.6-b - well below last year's 78% in terms of revised expenditure and the 84% that was actually spent on rail and road infrastructure in 2022/23 - most of it flowing to Chinese contractors.

In 2023/24, the ministry of industrialization's allocation was reduced by the biggest, 37% midyear cutback to only N\$34-m for local manufacturing projects.

In terms of actual expenditure in 2021/22, transport projects amounting to a little over N\$2-b accounted for over 78.5% of the industrial sub-cluster's N\$2.6-b domestically-financed development expenditure.

Adding foreign development funding, the Transport Vote's N\$2.94-b ceiling after midyear in 2024/25 is almost double the rest of the industrial cluster's N\$1.575-b - despite Transport losing 60% of its original foreign funding at the beginning of the year.

In terms of last year's revised expenditure, the Transport Vote's N\$3.4-b development spending was 4.65 times greater than the rest of the cluster's N\$730.5-m that includes no foreign development funding.

In 2022/23, the Transport Vote's N\$4.1-b actual development expenditure including foreign funding was eight times that the rest of the industrial cluster's N\$507-m, that included no foreign funding.

In terms of 2021/22's actual development expenditure, Transport's N\$2.8-b including foreign funding was over 4.8 times more than the rest of the cluster's N\$578-m, which again had no foreign development grants or loans.

While in 2024/25's midyear revisions only the Transport and Industrialisation & Trade Votes suffered cutbacks to their allocations, in 2023/24, the Transport Vote's N\$2.558-b domestic budget was left intact at midyear, alongside cutbacks of 37% for Industrialisation & Trade to N\$34-m and 11% to N\$80 for Mines & Energy, with only Urban & Rural Development enjoying a 3.4% increase to N\$616.5-m.

In 2022/23, the Transport Vote had its domestic development ceiling raised by 19.6% or N\$449-m midyear to N\$2.7-b, compared to increases of only N\$75-m to N\$375-m for the Urban & Rural Development Vote and N\$25-m to N\$79-m for Industrialisation & Trade, while Mines & Energy's ceiling remained unchanged at N\$53-m.

When, in 2021/22's midyear, all votes in the industrial sub-cluster had their development allocations cut back, the Transport Vote suffered the least, with a 2.86% reduction - almost half the cluster's overall 4.35% cutback, consisting of reductions of 16% for Mines & Energy, 8.3% for Urban & Rural Development and 5.25% for Industrialisation & Trade.

In 2020/21's midyear revisions, all votes in the industrial sub-cluster had their development budgets reduced except the Transport Vote.

This favouritism towards the Transport Vote underscores Namibia's official development paradigm that seeks to make the country the Southern African sub-region's logistics hub, with little accruing domestically except in the form of service linkages, rather than home-grown industrialization.

Foreign loans for transport infrastructure

In terms of actual development expenditure combining domestic and foreign funding in 2021/22, when N\$2.04-b domestic financing for transport projects was supplemented by N\$780-m to a total of N\$2.82-b, Transport accounted for 45.7% of the overall N\$6.17-b development total.

The Transport Vote's N\$780-m foreign development loans in 2021/22 more than doubled to N\$1.7-b in 2022/23, before falling to N\$855.6-m in 2023/24, its share of all foreign development funding rising from 52.77% of N\$1.478-b in 2021/22 to 63% of N\$2.7-b in 2022/23.

In previous years, road and rail infrastructure projects consumed as much as 54% of all foreign funding in the development budget, reaching 66% in 2023/24 before falling to 46% after midyear in 2024/25.

In 2020/21, one third of Transport's N\$3-b development budget was supported by foreign loans, while all projects in the remaining industrial votes were financed solely from Namibia's own limited domestic inputs.

This situation prevailed up to 2022/23 - until other votes also joined the foreign funding in 2023/24.

This prominence of transport infrastructure projects in Namibia's development expenditure all reflects the central government's penchant for maximizing raw mineral exports - much of it on the back of foreign loans - at the expense of investing in facilities for homegrown industrialization.

Chinese implement many of Transport's biggest projects

Continuing on the past three years, Chinese contractors are working on at least six of the Transport Vote's biggest projects in 2024/25 (same as last year).

A total of N\$975-m has been voted for these projects (N\$2.8-b last year), accounting for almost a quarter of its N\$4.1-b being spent on road and rail projects and one third of its N\$2.94-b overall budget including foreign funding after midyear - probably a gross undercount, since not all contract awards for other projects have been disclosed.

These five Chinese-executed projects in 2024/25 are:

- * N\$21.7-m for the Walvis Bay - Kranzberg rail upgrade (N\$338-m last year, N\$1.597-b in 2022/23, N\$923.6-m in 2021/22), supported by an undisclosed tranche of an AfDB loan (N\$13.4-m last year, N\$784-m in 2022/23, N\$523.6-m in 2021/22, N\$1.238-b in 2020/21);
- * N\$83.15-m for the Windhoek - Hosea Kutako International Airport highway (N\$1.008-b last year, N\$1.086-b in 2022/23, N\$456.326-m in 2021/22) supported by a N\$267.8-m grant from China (N\$886-m tranche from the AfDB loan in 2022/23, N\$350-m AfDB loan in 2021/22 and a N\$587-m AfDB loan tranche in 2020/21);
- * N\$215-m for the Swakopmund - Henties Bay - Kamanjab road (N\$263.347-m last year, N\$120-m in 2022/23, N\$200-m in 2021/22, N\$116-m in 2020/21);
- * N\$109.85-m for the Windhoek - Okahandja highway upgrade (N\$302.84-m last year, N\$337-m in 2022/23, N\$200-m in 2021/22, N\$291-m in 2020/21);
- * N\$140-m for the Walvis Bay - Swakopmund road upgrade (N\$317.176-m last year, N\$237.36-m in 2022/23, N\$150-m in 2021/22, N\$185-m in 2020/21);
- * N\$187-m for the Karibib-Usakos road upgrade (N\$0 last year), as part of a N\$375-m contract funded through a loan from Germany's KfW Bank).

N\$1.946-b was voted for a new project in 2024/25, upgrading of Kranzberg-Otjiwarongo Railway, including a N\$494.8-m tranche of a N\$1.254-b AfDB loan that was reduced by N\$487.26-m or 98.5% to only N\$7.55-m midyear.

The N\$2.8-b flowing to Chinese contractors last year comprised 80% of the Transport Vote's entire N\$3.5-b development budget including foreign loans, compared to N\$3.377-b or 77% of N\$4.4-b in 2022/23, N\$923.6-m in 2021/22 and N\$2.4-b in 2020/21 - totaling N\$10.475-b over the five years including 2024/25.

N\$3.377-b was voted for these same projects in 2022/23 - 76.75% of Transport's N\$4.4-b development allocation including foreign funding, compared to N\$924.456-m in 2021/22 (25% of N\$3.6-b) and N\$2.4-b in 2020/21 (80% of N\$3-b).

Not a bad haul for China at all, considering a sizeable portion of this income is paid for through foreign loans to Namibia - excluding the N\$267.8-m grant from Beijing for the airport highway last year - the first time China was mentioned by name as a provider of foreign development funding in the development budget.

As was the case over the past four years, there are probably several more projects awarded to Chinese contractors that have not been made public - including the Gobabis-Aminuis-Aranos and Gobabis-Grootfontein road upgrades.

The contract for trunk road 14/2: Gobabis - Grootfontein Phase 2, Section A: Otjinene - Okamatapi (127.6 km) was awarded in 2014 to a joint venture involving China Henan International Cooperation Group, completed in 2016.

The Transport Vote's budget

Vote 24 traditionally has the biggest share of the development budget, with N\$2.2-b to spend inside the State Revenue Fund on 52 projects in 2024/25, accounting for over 60% of the N\$3.64-b industrial cluster total after midyear, following a N\$737-m or 25% cutback midyear on its N\$2.95-b initial allocation accounting for 67% of the N\$4.4-b cluster total at the beginning of the year.

This N\$2.95-b ceiling at the beginning of 2024/25 was N\$391.8-m or 15.3% more than its N\$2.5-m revised expenditure last year when it accounted for 77.8% of the N\$3.288-m cluster total.

Transport's revised expenditure in

2023/24 had been 3% or N\$72.25-m more than its N\$2.485-b actual expenditure in 2022/23 accounting for over 84% of the N\$2.95-b cluster total.

Transport's N\$2.558-b revised expenditure inside the SRF on 37 projects in 2023/24 was unaffected in the midterm revisions, alongside cutbacks in most other votes in the industrial cluster.

Nationally, Transport's share accounts for over 25% of the N\$8.7-b global total inside the SRF after midyear, compared to 31% before midyear, over 39% last year and over half in 2022/23 - all in first place amongst all votes.

Its actual N\$2.485-b actual development expenditure in 2022/23 followed a handsome N\$449-m or 19.6% midyear increase on its initial N\$2.288-b domestically-funded allocation at the beginning of the year.

Transport's N\$2.288-b allocation at the beginning of 2022/23 was 12% more than 2021/22's actual domestic development expenditure of N\$2.04-b.

This, in turn had been 8% or N\$322-m more than its N\$1.977-b actual domestic expenditure in 2020/21.

N\$449-m of all N\$497.7-m added to the development budget midyear in 2022/23 was "to settle outstanding invoices and cater for potential shortfalls on critical ongoing projects to ensure continuity and avoid further penalties on road projects", finance minister Iipumbu Shirmi disclosed in his midyear budget address in the National Assembly that year.

This was an echo of the previous year, when N\$300-m was voted for Transport's "major roads projects and honoring their outstanding payments" which in 2021/22 involved "complete planned activities and settle accounts".

As discussed above, Transport's share of the development budget increases significantly when its N\$741.6-m foreign loans after midyear 2024/25 are included, accounting for over 45% of the N\$1.6-b total, second only to the agriculture and water votes whose N\$771-m external funding accounts for 48%.

External funding raises Transport's total budget in 2024/25 to N\$2.94-b, ac-

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counting for over 67% of the industrial cluster's N\$4.34-b after midyear.

Transport's projects profile

Of the 52 projects under implementation by the Transport Vote in 2024/25 (37 last year, 25 in 2022/23, 30 in 2021/22), seven are new, compared to ten last year, none in 2022/23 and one in 2021/22.

Four of Vote 24's new projects in 2024/25 are for roads and three for rail infrastructure, compared to last year when all but one of its ten new projects were for roadworks, of which there were 21, almost double 2022/23's twelve and thirteen in 2021/22) compared to this year's 30 out of its 52 projects.

Three of the four new road projects and 24 of all 30 roads projects are in the northern regions.

Last year, all new roads projects were in the northern regions, with fourteen out of the 21 roadworks in the northern regions, compared to six out of thirteen over the previous two years, seven out of twelve in 2020/21 and three out of ten road-building projects in 2019/20.

Of Transport's 52 projects under implementation in 2024/25, 22 are for roadworks with over N\$1.5-b voted before midyear, accounting for almost one third of its N\$4.578-b total.

Last year, 25 out of its 37 projects were for roadworks, totaling N\$3.24-b, comprising over 92.5% of its N\$3.5-m development budget.

Ten of Transport's 52 projects under implementation in 2024/25 are for rail

infrastructure, for which N\$2.578-b was voted before midyear, accounting for over 56% of the N\$4.578-b total – of which four are new, although no funds are voted for two of them.

Four of last year's 37 projects were for railway upgrading (same as 2022/23, five in 2021/22).

The remaining projects are for aviation, maritime and meteorological infrastructure.

Of the Transport Vote's 52 projects currently underway in 2024/25, nine are supported by external funding, compared to five out of last year's 37 and three in each of the two preceding years.

Vote 24's detailed project listing below indicates all new projects as well as those with foreign funding.

Transport's top projects

Including foreign funding, N\$4.578-b has been voted for Transport's 52 projects under implementation in 2024/25 before midyear, compared to N\$3.5-b in 2023/24, N\$4.4-b in 2022/23 (all ongoing) – 58.5% more than 2021/22's actual N\$2.8-b expenditure.

* N\$1.946-b was voted before midyear 2024/25 for Transport's biggest project this year by far – Kranzberg-Otjiwarongo Railway Section – one of its new projects and including a N\$494.8-m tranche of a N\$1.254-b AfDB loan.

However the N\$494.8-m external funding component reflected in the finance ministry's midyear budget was reduced midyear by over 98% to only N\$7.5-m.

* N\$488-m has been voted for Transport's second-biggest project in 2024/

N\$1.946-b for new Kranzberg-Otjiwarongo

25 - rehabilitation of the southern railway line section from Sandverhaal to Buchholzbrunn in //Kharas Region, for which N\$200-m was voted last year as Transport's eighth-biggest project. N\$76.2-m was voted in 2022/23, now reflected as a revised estimate.

N\$42.575-m was voted in 2021/22 and N\$39.3-m in 2020/21, when the project totaled N\$1.4-b, as disclosed for the last time.

Yet, no previous actual expenditure is reported until 2022/23 (not updated from last year's budget until 2021/22) since starting in 2014/15, although the project was first listed as new only in 2016/17 with a total of N\$315-m and N\$105.4-m balance, with N\$19.5-m voted revised to N\$9.5-m midyear.

This complete absence of previous expenditure is highly questionable.

There are three further Transport projects for which N\$200-m or more has been voted in 2024/25 – before midyear.

* N\$218-m has been voted for the third-biggest project - upgrading of MR91 from Gobabis to Aminuis and MR40 from Aminuis to Aranos (245km) to bitumen standard, reflecting N\$257.87-m revised expenditure last year – as voted for Transport's sixth-biggest project.

No expenditure is reflected for this project in 2022/23 out of N\$150-m voted, following N\$120-m allocated in 2021/22 out of the N\$1.24-b total for this project last disclosed in 2020/21.

Again, nothing has been spent on this project until 2022/23 out of N\$5.8-m cumulative funding available since starting in 2014/15 – which cannot be accurate.

The contractor for this project has

never been officially announced.

* N\$215-m has been voted for Transport's fourth-biggest project in 2024/24 - excluding midyear revisions - construction of the Swakopmund - Henties Bay - Kamanjab Link (412km), reflecting N\$263.347-m revised expenditure for last year – as voted for the fifth-biggest project.

No revised expenditure is reflected for 2022.23 out of N\$120-m voted. N\$200-m was voted in 2021/22, but no actual cumulative expenditure is reported until 2022/23, out of a mere N\$3.4-m project funding since starting in 2015/16.

The project total was last disclosed in 2020/21 as N\$1.216-b, when it was awarded to a Chinese contractor who has been actively working on it since - yet no expenditure to date is reported.

It is highly unlikely that nothing could have been spent on this project, since project planning and construction has been ongoing since before 2021/22.

* N\$200-m has been voted for the fifth-biggest project - construction of a new area control tower for Windhoek, reflecting N\$70.5-m revised expenditure last year.

Nothing has reportedly been spent on this project since starting in 2007/08 out of N\$282.296-m funding until 2022/23 – a rather dubious contention.

Over N\$100-m has been voted for a further three of Transport's projects before midyear 2024/25:

* N\$187-m was allocated before 2024/25 midyear for the sixth-biggest project - TR7/1 Karibib-Usakos road rehabilitation (new), involving a N\$149-m tranche of the KfW loan – one of the projects being executed by a Chinese contractor.

Actual expenditure outside the SRF for previous years is not disclosed in the 2024/25 budget documents - NPC estimates from previous years are used instead, excluding midyear revisions which are also not disclosed.

Amounts for votes marked * exclude additional external development funding outside the SRF in 2024/25, of which there are seven in the Economic Cluster:

* Vote 15 = N\$32.08-m in the main budget reduced to nil midyear 2024/25 (N\$10-m last year amended to nil in 2024/25 midyear budget; none the previous two years).

* Vote 18 = N\$0 (none last year and 2022/23; N\$53.998-m in 2021/22).

* Vote 19 = N\$17.5-m in main 2024/25 budget increased to N\$17.51-m midyear (N\$17.51-m last year amended to nil in 2024/25 midyear budget; nil the previous year).

* N\$140-m was voted before mid-year 2024/25 for the seventh-biggest of Transport's projects this year - upgrading of MR44 from Swakopmund to Walvis Bay (44km), reflecting N\$302.8 revised expenditure last year as voted for the third-biggest project and N\$237.36-m revised expenditure in 2022/23 (as voted) when it was Transport's fourth-biggest project.

N\$150-m was spent in 2021/22 and N\$185-m in 2020/21 when the project totaled N\$1.215-b (as last disclosed that year).

Yet, cumulative expenditure until 2021/22 is reported as nil since commencing in 2014/15, when the project totaled N\$41.35-m, with no balance and N\$11-m was voted with midyear revisions unreported.

By 2015/16 the total escalated to N\$1.3-b with a N\$1.17-b balance and N\$20-m voted unaffected midyear.

In 2020/21 the last disclosed project total was N\$1.2-b with the balance undisclosed and N\$20-m voted (midyear undisclosed). It is being carried out by a Chinese contractor.

* N\$109.85-m was voted before midyear 2024/25 for Transport's eighth-biggest project - rehabilitation of TR1/16 from Windhoek to Okahandja road (67km), reflecting N\$302.8-m revised expenditure last year as voted when it was the fourth-biggest project, with no expenditure in 2022/23 out of almost N\$337-m voted as the third-biggest project and on which N\$200-m was spent in 2021/22.

This was Transport's fourth-biggest project totaling N\$3.46-b in 2020/21 (when project totals were last disclosed).

There is no mention in 2024/25 of a N\$450-m KfW concessional loan signed in 2017, part of which was earmarked for this project.

This project was supported by a N\$151.857-m loan from Germany's KfW, but how much of which has been deployed over the previous three years has not been disclosed, because no mention was made of this loan for four years.

Except in the project's first phase, the rest has also been awarded to a Chinese contractor.

According to the 2024/25 budget document, nothing has been spent on this project since starting in 2014/15 - which is obviously not the case.

Only 2020/21's estimated N\$291-m previous expenditure was reported previously. Yet when the project was first listed in 2014/15 as new it had a total of N\$11.2-m with no balance and N\$12-m voted (midyear revisions unreported).

In 2019/20, the total increased to N\$3.46-b with mention of external funding but without disclosure of the source, a N\$2.3-b balance and N\$349-m voted, followed by N\$291-m in 2021/22, with midyear revisions undisclosed over both years.

Between N\$500,000 and N\$83-m has been voted for the Transport Vote's remaining 44 projects in 2024/25.

The appended table provides full details of Transport's fourteen projects with external loan or grant funding in 2024/25 that were affected midyear - include:

- * Windhoek-Hosea Kutako International Airport Road Phase III - supported by a N\$1-b grant from China's Exim Bank, of which this year's N\$303.6-m tranche was completely eliminated midyear, after N\$358.4-m was deployed last year.
* A N\$669.6-m tranche for the upgrading of the Walvis Bay-Kranzberg Railway was reduced by 75% to only N\$164.446-m midyear, after N\$97-m was spent last year out of a N\$4.2-b AfDB loan - executed by a Chinese contractor.
* A N\$494.8-m tranche of a N\$517.66-m AfDB loan for the upgrading of the Kranzberg-Otjiwarongo Railway (new) was reduced by 98.5% to N\$7.55-m midyear.
* A N\$149-m tranche of a N\$571.6-m loan from an undisclosed source was completely

wiped out midyear.
* Seven road projects in the north for which N\$237-m in undisclosed grant-funded tranches had been voted were reduced to only N\$117-m midyear.

Industrial underdevelopment

N\$215-m has been voted for the construction of the Swakopmund - Henties Bay - Kamanjab Link (412km) - being executed by a Chinese contractor.

As noted over past years, official development policies in the mining sector focus on the continued and expanded exploitation of Namibia's raw minerals by foreign multinationals - aided by homegrown compradors - without beneficiation, in addition to the rampant speculation with exploration and mining concessions for the private enrichment of a handful of politically connected players.

In the quarrying and associated building materials sectors, considerable manufacturing potential lies untapped to supply government's mass public housing initiatives that are instead being pursued with inputs from imported supplies.

In the energy sector, industrialization opportunities are being overlooked in the creation of electrification networks to power rail transport, as well as alternative energy projects with potential for considerable local manufacturing inputs instead of imported components.

In the case of Industrialization, Trade & SME Development, the emphasis remains on rudimentary processing of agricultural products and gemstones and providing light manufacturing, repairs and maintenance inputs to the tertiary industrial sector.

The upshot of all this is that while large-scale industrial minerals (and fisheries)-based industrial linkages are largely overlooked, trade continues to trump manufacturing, where turbo-charged SME tenderpreneurial procurement promotion erodes established businesses through the mercantilist displacement of existing business linkages rather than diversification of the narrow manufacturing base.

This emphasis on trade within the industrial cluster's development budget reflects and reinforces Namibia's dependency on imports for consumer consumption as well as tertiary industrial inputs.

But neither job creation nor the multiplication of SME businesses translate automatically into economic development, which is (qualitatively) different from (quantitative) GDP growth, and which is currently prioritized at the expense of the former.

In the context of the government's existing development paradigm, its manufacturing projects consist largely of secondary processing in agriculture, fishing, textiles, gemstones and jewelry, while trade projects target tourism and crafts.

The development budget for the country's two key primary economic resource sectors - mining and fishing - also reflects official ongoing support of value extraction by foreign firms in these essentially enclave sectors - at the expense of inward industrialization, manufacturing and value-addition.

In 2015, the fisheries and mining sectors accounted for 63% of Namibia's

export earnings, with mining contributing about 50% on its own.

Yet their contribution to GDP was little more than 15% (mining 11.5%) - a gap reflecting the accrual of locally extracted value in foreign hands.

On the other hand, mining generates about 25% of government revenue in its predominantly extractive form - leaving the potential of revenue from minerals beneficiation untapped.

Off-budget industrial initiatives

Instead, the central government launched two mega industrial initiatives in 2021/22 outside the ambit of the formal development budget - the Walvis Bay Industrial Development Initiative (WIDI) and the Green Hydrogen Project.

Neither of these projects is included in the National Planning Commission's development budget, with both being driven by the newly established Namibia Investment Promotion Board - co-located in the Presidency, alongside the National Planning Commission (responsible for compiling the development budget).

Both these new projects highlight the government's shift to a neo-liberal mindset in which domestic industrial development is outsourced to foreign public private partnerships.

This policy only serves to deepen the externalisation of profits by foreign multinationals which will now drive Namibia's major industrialization initiatives - in addition to their dominance of the extractive sectors such as minerals and fisheries - with the energy sector now included.

The WIDI

As we reported in *Bulletin 1424* (26-Nov-21), the Walvis Bay Industrial Development Initiative (WIDI) tender was launched as an expression of interest for investors to partner with the government in the National Single Window, the New Container Terminal at the Port of Walvis Bay and the Special Economic Zone in Walvis Bay - without having been widely publicized.

The EOI was issued by the Namibia Investment Promotion & Development Board only on its website on 04 October 2021.

The EOI sought a WIDI partner involving Namport's New Container Terminal (NCT) at the Port of Walvis Bay, under the development of a Special Economic Zone (SEZ).

As part of Namibia's "ambition to develop into a regional logistics hub, a National Single Window (NSW) has also become a priority project and is being considered alongside the development of a SEZ and the management of the NCT by private developers and

operators respectively", according to the tender notice.

The SEZ's purpose is to "aid the conversion of Namibian raw materials and resources to finished and semi-finished products and components as part of the nation's drive to diversify Namibia's economy".

WIDI consists of three project components:

- (1) management and operation of the existing NCT at the Port of Walvis Bay by a private operator (who has subsequently been awarded the 25-year concession);
- (2) development and deployment of an NSW facility;
- (3) development and operation of a SEZ near Walvis Bay.

The EOI, launched on 30-Aug-21 - two months before the notice was published by the NIPDB - invited "leading global developers and operators with significant capability and well proven experience in port and container terminal management, shipping and logistics sector operations, developers and operators of special economic zones and business development experts ... to partner with government in the WIDI."

A National Coordinating Committee, led by the NIPDB, was constituted "to identify and approach global market leading operators, and to facilitate the EOI from potential operators and developers on behalf of the government" - with little public accountability.

Aside from outsourcing the operation of the container terminal at the Port of Walvis Bay, little progress has been disclosed on the WIDI to date.

Industrialization & Trade's budget

In its usual last place within the transport and industrial cluster, Vote 19 has N\$49.5-m to spend on 20 projects inside the State Revenue Fund after midyear 2024/25, accounting for a mere 1.36% of the cluster total, following a N\$500,000 or 1% reduction on its N\$50-m ceiling at the beginning of the year.

Its initial development budget this year was N\$16-m or 47% more than its N\$34-m revised expenditure in 2023/24 accounting for a little over 1% of the domestically funded total, following a 37% or N\$20-m midyear cutback to its initial N\$54-m ceiling when it accounted for 1.64% - all in fourth and last place within the sub-cluster.

This, in turn had been N\$40.56-m or 54.4% less than its N\$74.56-m actual expenditure in 2022/23 when it

consumed 2.5% of the total in third place ahead of Mines & Energy.

Its actual spending in 2022/23 was below its N\$79-m ceiling after midyear following a N\$25-m or 46% increase on its initial N\$54-m development ceiling.

Its initial N\$54-m allocation for capital projects at the beginning of 2022/23 was N\$9-m or 20% more than its N\$45-m actual expenditure in 2021/22.

Vote 19's initial N\$47.6-m development allocation at the beginning of 2021/22 was N\$5.6-m or 13.3% more than 2020/21's N\$42-m expenditure.

The Industrialization & Trade Vote has seen its development budget reduced significantly over recent years and its project count fall from nineteen five years ago to six in 2022/23 and seven in the previous two years, before increasing to fourteen in 2023/24.

Its N\$42-m actual expenditure in 2020/21 resulted from a N\$10-m or 19% cutback midyear from its initial N\$52-m.

Vote 19 was left with N\$64.4-m spread across the same number of seven projects - all ongoing - for 2019/20, after its original N\$130.4-m voted at the beginning of the year was cut back by N\$66-m or 50.6% midyear.

Industrialization & Trade's N\$34-m development spending in 2023/24 was less than half 2022/23's N\$74.5-m and one fifth of its N\$180-m eight years ago in 2016/17 - reflecting the government's waning commitment in building domestic industrialization capacity.

In a new turn, Industrialisation & Trade had N\$17.5-m in foreign development funding at its disposal in 2023/24, but this is not reflected in the finance ministry's midyear budget in 2024/25.

Instead, the same N\$17.5-m external funding is now listed for 2024/25, increased by N\$10,000 to N\$17.51-m after midyear for its Market Access Support Programme, funded through a USAID grant.

Industrialization & Trade's projects

Six of Vote 19's 20 projects under implementation in 2024/25 are new, after half its 14 projects in 2023/24 were new. All its projects since 2018/19 had been ongoing, compared to two new projects the year before.

* N\$23-m has been voted for Vote 19's biggest project in 2024/25 - 'Market Access Support' promoting MSMEs - co-funded by a N\$17.5-m USAID grant outside the SRF, reflecting N\$19.5-m revised expenditure last year - below the N\$21.5-m voted, also as its biggest project starting in 2023/24.

N\$4-m voted for the establishment of an

Industrialization & Trade's six new projects in 2024/25 consist of:

- * N\$500,000 for the construction of an international convention centre in Windhoek;
- * N\$4-m for an 'Informal Economy Traders Platform' in various regions;
- * N\$1-m for the construction of a beef cold storage facility in Swakopmund;
- * N\$2.5-m for the construction of the Nara Namibia Industrial Park at an undisclosed location in Erongo Region;
- * N\$2-m for the expansion of the Naute Vineyard in //Kharas, consisting of the establishment of 630ha under date palm, table grapes, pomegranates, cactus pear and pecan nuts - which should resort under the agriculture ministry; and
- * N\$3-m for 'Strengthening of National Quality Infrastructure', consisting of a system of metrology, standardization, accreditation and conformity assessment - akin to the SA Bureau of Standards.

* N\$3-m has been voted for Vote 19's only other project involving external funding - the 'Special Industrialization Programme' - also promoting MSMEs with unquantified GIZ support, the format of which is also not disclosed as was the case last year when the same amount was voted.

According to the NPC's inaccurate budget document, nothing has been spent on this project until 2022/23 since starting in 2014/15, which reflects revised expenditure of N\$627,000 in 2022/23 and for which N\$5-m was voted in 2020/21.

The project started in 2014/15 with N\$1.8-m total and N\$1.687-m balance, N\$20,000 voted with midyear revisions unreported.

In 2015/16 the total increased to N\$1-b with a balance of N\$640-m, N\$50-m voted halved midyear.

In 2016/17 total was reduced to N\$450-m, where it remained until 2020/21, with N\$215-m balance, N\$65-m voted reduced to N\$21-m midyear.

GIZ support for this project was mentioned for the first time in 2021/22.

This year's projects include two garment factories, after three new ones were listed last year, alongside others established in earlier years and appear to be initiatives in desperation to supplement generate income amongst impoverished rural communities, rather than sustainable manufacturing development.

N\$1.5-m was voted in 2022/23 for what was Vote 19's second-biggest project in 2021/22, with N\$12-m expenditure the previous year - the construction of garment factories in various regions - about which we know hardly anything and which seems to be somewhat superfluous.

This is because of the Defence Force's August 26 Textiles Company's monopolization of garment supplies to the government, the latest of which involves the supply of customs uniforms to the Namibia Revenue Agency (NAMRA).

The Namibian Defence Force has in the past imported uniforms from China - without public tender and for which its own August 26 Textiles was obviously not up to the task.

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NOTES TO THE STATE PROCUREMENT BUDGET

This scoping of what we call government's 'procurement budget' as part of the overall budget is unique to the Tender Bulletin, has been undertaken for most financial years since 1993 and is unparalleled in Namibia. Its purpose is to alert tenderers to forthcoming procurement opportunities. Procurement spending relates to heads of expenditure normally directed through public procurement channels (with abbreviations):

- * Materials and Supplies (M&S): Expenditure relating to the acquisition of store items of consumable nature to be utilized in the process of government services/operations, such as provisions, spares, stationery and other materials.
- * Other goods, services and expenses (OSE): Generally relating to recurrent spending on items sourced in the real economy, i.e. excluding remuneration, other conditions service relating to the public service, transport provided by the government garage, utilities, property rental etc. OSE consists of consultancy services unrelated to construction as well as non-consultancy services such as advertising, catering, cleaning, entertainment, event management, gifts, legal, printing, security, travel, training services etc.

These two spending heads are form part of government's current expenditure in the operational budget as well as in the development budget. Other procurement spending components occurring both as capital expenditure in the operational budget (i.e. not current expenditure) and also in the development budget are:

- * furniture and office equipment (FOE)
- * operational equipment, machinery and plant (OEMP);
- * vehicles (V).

Procurement components occurring only within the development budget are:

- * construction, renovations and improvement (CRI);
- * feasibility studies, design and supervision (FSDS).

Although our coverage of the development budget overlaps with some of the operational budget, a project-by-project presentation of the development budget concretizes tendering opportunities more specifically with reference to actual project implementation and is presented separately from the estimates of operational expenditure.

N\$1.5-B CHINESE GRANTS FOR POLICE HOUSING - AND MORE

The Chinese government is courting Namibia's security apparatus with grants totaling N\$1.5-b for a police village to be built in Windhoek, with another N\$500-m in the pipeline for future projects, while what was paid for two military aircraft worth almost N\$2-b already delivered to the air force remains unclear.

The Namibian Air Force received two new Y-9E medium transport aircraft in December, built by China National Aero-Technology Import & Export Cooperation according to Namibia Defence Force specifications.

The cargo planes were officially handed over to the Commander in Chief of Namibia's armed forces, President Nangolo Mbumba at the Grootfontein air base in December last year.

Although Mbumba did not disclose the cost of the aircraft or what was paid, military online platforms say the Y-9E aircraft cost around U\$55-m or N\$982.7-m each – for an estimated N\$1.965-b cost for the two machines.

The acquisition of the medium sized transport aircraft "will go a long way in improving and increasing the operational capability and readiness of the NDF to respond at short notice to any situation that may require the use of our soldiers, both in peace time and in war time," Mbumba said during the handover.

According to media reports, the transaction was finalized in early 2023 with Namibia becoming the first international customer of China's Shaanxi Aircraft Cooperation, a subsidiary of the Aviation Industry Corporation of China (AVIC).

The Y-9E can transport cargo up to 20 tons and travel at a top speed of 660km/hour. The aircraft is 36m in length with a 38m wingspan.

Namibia is the first international customer for China's Y-9E tactical transport aircraft. They bear symbolic tail numbers: NAF 1990 marking Namibia's independence year and NAF 1962, the birth year of Air Marshal Martin Kamburu Pinehas, Chief of Defence Forces.

Namibia's existing fleet includes aircraft such as the Antonov An-26, two Harbin Y-12, JL-8s, and F-7s, reflecting a historical reliance on Chinese and Soviet-origin platforms (*Namibian Sun 16-Dec-24; Die Republiekein 18-Dec-24*).

N\$1-b grant for police housing project

The aircraft donations follow the announcement in September last year that the Chinese government will provide Namibia with a N\$1-b grant for the construction of a police village in Windhoek.

The announcement by the Office of

the Presidency came after Namibia's president Mbumba had traveled to Beijing to attend the 9th Forum on China-Africa Cooperation (FOCAC) and conduct bilateral talks with President Xi Jinping.

President Xi informed Mbumba that a technical team would be sent to Namibia to undertake feasibility studies for the housing project for police officers.

The Chinese president also promised N\$500-million in grants for future projects and committed N\$50-million worth of assistance towards the Namibian government's drought relief efforts.

During the bilateral meeting, Mbumba expressed interest in working closely with China to develop green hydrogen, solar manufacturing, hydro, wind and nuclear energy infrastructure.

One of the projects discussed under the bilateral cooperation arrangement involves drilling boreholes in all 14 regions to address water scarcity related

to the prolonged drought.

Mbumba also mentioned that the Namibian government plans to establish agro-processing centres country-wide with technical support from China and capacity building for the agronomic industry.

The Namibian grants are part an overall US\$50-b in financial credits throughout Africa over the next three years.

According China's ambassador to Namibia, Zhao Weiping, China-Namibia bilateral trade reached US\$1.3-billion in 2023 and China accounts for about 30% of the total foreign direct investment in Namibia (*The Namibian, Namibian Sun, New Era 09-Sep-24; Die Republiekein 10-Sep-24*).
