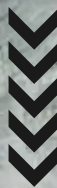

BACKGROUND

Metals and minerals form the backbone of India's industrial growth, infrastructure development, clean energy transition, and strategic manufacturing. With rising domestic demand, increasing import dependence on critical raw materials, global supply-chain disruptions, and growing geopolitical uncertainties, **raw material securitization** has emerged as a national imperative.



Aligned with the vision of **Atmanirbhar Bharat**, raw material securitization seeks to enhance self-reliance by reducing import dependence and strengthening indigenous capabilities in exploration, mining, processing, and value addition. Equally important is building resilience—enabling Indian industries to withstand global shocks, price volatility, and supply disruptions through diversified, transparent, and sustainable supply chains.

Critical minerals are essential inputs for clean energy, electric mobility, electronics, defence, and advanced manufacturing. Minerals such as lithium, cobalt, nickel, graphite and tungsten are vital for batteries, semiconductors, renewable energy systems, and strategic technologies.

The **National Conclave on Raw Material Securitization for Metals & Minerals खनिज से सुरक्षा तक** aims to bring together policymakers, industry leaders, miners, technology providers, financial institutions, and global experts to deliberate on strategies for securing sustainable, resilient, and reliable access to raw materials required for Steel production, Aluminum production and Rare Earth minerals critical to India's economic and industrial future.

The Conclave will focus on **innovative strategies for raw material securitization, sustainable mining practices, circular economy approaches, and leveraging emerging technologies to reduce import dependency while strengthening domestic production capabilities.**
